GENTLEMEN, September 19, 1878.

WE hereby beg to give notice that, subject to approval, we intend erecting a length of river wall on land situate about midway between New Ferry Pier and Bromboro' Pool, and immediately to the south of the Sanitary Authority's premises, in accordance with plans and sections herewith deposited, and as required by section 6 Mersey Conservancy Act, 1842.

The wall is to be based on the foreshore at a level of 16½ feet above the Old Dock Sill, to be constructed of concrete, and will run parallel to the existing river bank for about 180 yards in length.

It is designed as a protection to various buildings, and to serve as a loading wharf.

We propose to commence such works in January next.
