

The Bankruptcy Act, 1869.

In the County Court of Yorkshire, holden at Kingston-upon-Hull.

In the Matter of a Bankruptcy Petition against W H Knowles, of No. 59, Whitefriargate, in the town and county of the town of Kingston-upon-Hull, Draper.
