WHEREAS it is expedient to make provision
for the exercise of the power and jurisdic-
tion vested by Treaty in

IV. There shall be in the said Island a Legis-
lative Council, constituted as hereinafter men-
tioned.

V. It shall be lawful for the High Commissioner,
with the advice of the said Legislative Council,
to make all such Laws and Ordinances, as may
from time to time be necessary for the peace,
order, and good government of the said Island,
subject, nevertheless to all

instrument under the seal of the Island to appoint provisionally any fit person to be an official or unofficial councillor (as the case may be) in the place of such member; and in all cases where such provisional appointment shall be made by reason of the temporary absence or incapacity of such member, so soon as he shall return to the said Island, or shall be declared by the High Commissioner capable of exercising his office of legislative councillor, the person so provisionally appointed shall cease to be a member of the said Council. Every such provisional appointment may be disallowed by Her Majesty, through one of Her Principal Secretaries of State, or may be revoked by the High Commissioner, by such instrument as aforesaid.

VIII. Every legislative councillor shall, notwithstanding anything hereinbefore contained, hold office during Her Majesty's pleasure, and whenever a councillor shall from any cause cease to hold office, the said Council may continue to transact business, and its proceedings shall be valid, notwithstanding that the proportion between the official and unofficial members may be temporarily altered, pending the appointment, provisionally or otherwise, of a new member in the place of the Councillor ceasing to hold office as aforesaid.

IX. The official members of the Council shall take precedence of the unofficial members, and shall take rank among themselves in the order of precedence of their respective public offices, or, in case of any doubt, as the High Commissioner shall direct. The unofficial members shall take precedence of their appointment,

Sign-Manual and Signet as may be addressed to the High Commissioner in that behalf.

XVI. Any unofficial Councillor may resign his office by writing under his hand, but no such resignation shall take effect until it be accepted in writing by the High Commissioner, or by Her Majesty through one of Her Principal Secretaries of State.

XVII. No Law or Ordinance made by the High Commissioner with the advice of the said Legislative Council shall take effect until the High Commissioner shall have assented thereto in the name of Her Majesty and on Her behalf, and shall have signed the same in token of such assent.

XVIII. Notwithstanding anything in this Order contained, it shall be lawful for the High Commissioner, in cases of emergency, to make and proclaim, from time to time, Ordinances for the peace, order, and good government of the said Island, subject, however, to the disallowance of the whole or any part thereof by Her Majesty through one of Her Principal Secretaries of State; and every such Ordinance shall have like force of law with an Ordinance made by the High Commissioner with the advice of the said Legislative Council as by this Order provided, for the space of not more than six months from its promulgation, unless the disallowance of such Ordinance by Her Majesty shall be earlier signified to the High Commissioner by one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, or unless such Ordinance shall be controlled or superseded by a Law or Ordinance made by the High Commissioner with the advice of the said Legislative Council.

XIX. Any Law or Ordinance, or any part thereof, shall be signed by the High Commissioner, with the

the exercise of his office within the said Island any person exercising the same, which suspension shall continue and have effect only until Her Majesty's pleasure therein shall be made known and signified to the High Commissioner. And in proceeding to any such suspension, he is to observe the directions in that behalf given to him by any such instructions under Her Majesty's Sign-Manual and Signet as may be hereafter addressed to him.

XXV. There shall be in the said Island, for the purpose of advising the High Commissioner, an Executive Council, which shall be composed of such persons and constituted in such manner as may be directed by any instructions which may from time to time be addressed to the High Commissioner by Her Majesty, under Her Sign-Manual and Signet, and all such persons shall hold their places in the said Council during Her Majesty's pleasure; and the said Executive Council shall observe such rules in the conduct of business as may from time to time be contained in any such instructions as aforesaid.

XXVI. In the event of the death, incapacity, removal, or absence from the said Island of the High Commissioner for the time being, all and every the powers and authorities herein granted to him shall, until Her Majesty's further pleasure is signified therein, be vested in such person as may be appointed to administer the same by any instrument under Her Majesty's Sign-Manual and Signet; or if there be not in the Island any person so appointed, then in the senior military officer for the time being in command of Her Majesty's regular troops in the said Island.

XXVII. The following Orders of Her Majesty the Queen in Council, that is to say: the Order of the 12th day of December, 1873, for the Regulation of Consular Jurisdiction in the Dominions of the Sublime Porte; the Order of the 13th day of May, 1875, for the Regulation of Hospital Dues levied on British Shipping within the said Dominions; and the Order of the 26th day of October, 1875, amending the said Order of the 12th day of December, 1873, shall cease to have any force and effect in the Island of Cyprus from and after a day to be named in a proclamation to be issued in the said Island by authority of the High Commissioner, with such saving and exceptions (if any) as may be contained in such proclamation.

XXVIII. This Order shall commence and have effect as follows:—

(a.) As to the appointment of the High Commissioner, and the issue of any instructions immediately from and after the making of this Order.

(b.) As to all other matters and provisions comprised and contained in this Order immediately from and after a day to be named in any Proclamation to be issued in the said Island by authority of the High Commissioner.

And this Order shall remain in force until the same shall be revoked or altered by Her Majesty with the advice of Her Privy Council.

And the Most Honourable the Marquis of Salisbury and the Right Honourable Viscount Cranbrook, two of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, and the Lords Commissioners of the Treasury, are to give the necessary directions herein as to them may respectively appertain.

THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Consul at Galveston, reporting that in consequence of epidemic yellow fever prevailing in the State of Louisiana and elsewhere, the Galveston Board of Health have passed the following resolutions:—

1. Vessels from West Indian Ports will not be allowed to enter the port of Galveston until quarantine is raised.
2. Vessels from European Ports, not having touched at West Indian or other infected ports, and not having passed nearer than three miles of the outer bar of the Mississippi River, and not having communicated with a pilot boat or other boat, otherwise than by flag signal, or trumpet, will be admitted, subject to the regulations existing at Galveston at the time of their arrival.

It is anticipated that, if no outbreak of yellow fever occurs at Galveston, quarantine will be maintained there until December.

Fixed Red Light on Straw Island, Arran Isles.

WITH reference to Notice to Mariners, No. 111, of 14th August, 1878, on the intended exhibition of a light on Straw Island, Killeany Bay, Inishmore:—

The Commissioners of Irish Lights have given further notice, that on 1st September, 1878, the light was exhibited:—

The light is a fixed red light, elevated 30 feet above the sea, and should be visible in clear weather, from inside the Arran Isles, between the bearings of E. by S. $\frac{1}{4}$ S. and N.W., from a distance of six miles.

The lighthouse and dwellings are painted white. Position, lat. $53^{\circ} 6' 55''$ N., long. $9^{\circ} 37' 45''$ W. [The bearings are magnetic. Variation $24\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ Westerly in 1878].

SOUTH COAST.—FARSUND CHANNEL.

(1.) **Fixed Light on South Katland Islet.**

THE Norwegian Government has given notice, that on 1st September, 1878, a light would be exhibited from the low tower of a large white building at the south-west point of South Katland Islet, east side of channel to Farsund.

The light is a fixed light of the fourth order, elevated 51 feet above the sea, and should be visible in clear weather from a distance of 10 miles.

From seaward the light shows white between the bearings N.E. (on this bearing it leads eastward of Færøfluen and Færøkalven Shoals) and North; red between North and N.N.W. $\frac{1}{4}$ W. (over the positions of Roholmfu and Braadsteenens Shoals); and white from N.N.W. $\frac{1}{4}$ W. to West.

Towards and northward of Præstø Sound the light shows white between the bearings S.E. by E. $\frac{1}{2}$ E. and S. $\frac{1}{2}$ W.

In the direction of Færøkalven, a sector of white light is shown through an arc of 5° , between the bearings E. and E. $\frac{1}{2}$ N. The northern limit of this sector leads seaward of Sranefluen and Skvætskjaerstenen Shoals; the southern limit northward of Rævøflu and Rævøsk Shoals. Rævøkræggen (which is clear of danger on the south-west side) is nearly in the centre of this sector, which also shows over the south end of Rævø Islet.

Position, lat. $58^{\circ} 3' 30''$ N., long. $6^{\circ} 50' 35''$ E.

NOTE.—After rounding the south-west side of South Katland Islet, at a distance of a cable, steer N.W., and having passed through that portion of arc in which the light is obscured, anchor in Færø Road when the light is again visible, or proceed through the northern channels.

At the north extreme of Færøkalven a reflector is placed, which reflects a sector of light on a W.N.W. bearing, through an arc of about 12° .

WEST COAST.—STORDØEN ISLAND.

(2.) **Intended Light at Leervig.**

Also, that it is intended, probably in the autumn of 1878, to exhibit a light at Leervig, south-east coast of Stordøen Island.

The light will be a fixed white light of the fifth order.

Position, lat. $59^{\circ} 46' 50''$ N., long. $5^{\circ} 32' 55''$ E.

NORTH COAST.—INGO ISLAND.

(3.) **Alteration in Exhibition of Froholm Light.**

Also, that Froholm Light will be exhibited from 25th August to 31st March, instead of to 31st December, as formerly.

SOUTH COAST.—CHRISTIANSAND FIORD.

(4.) *Fixed Red Light at Outer Grønningen Islet.*

Also, that on 1st September, 1878, a light would be exhibited from the west gable of a large white building on the summit of Outer Grønningen Islet, east side of entrance to Christiansand Fiord.

The light is a fixed red light of the fourth order, elevated 50 feet above the sea, and should be visible in clear weather, between the bearings N.W. (through east) and S.S.E., from a distance of 9 miles.

The light kept on a N.W. bearing leads seaward of Svaetingboen Shoal; on a S.S.E. bearing it leads westward of Outer Kirkebø and Dversøboen Patches.

Position, lat. $58^{\circ} 5' 5''$ N., long. $8^{\circ} 5' 50''$ E.

NOTE.—To pass westward of Grønningboen, Outer Grønningen Islet should not be approached nearer than half a cable.

(5.) *Alteration on Odderø Island Light.*

Also, that on the exhibition of the light at Outer Grønningen Islet on 1st September, 1878, the following alteration would be made in the light exhibited at Odderø Island, Christiansand Fiord:—

The red light previously shown eastward of the channel fairway between Oxø and Grønningen Islets is discontinued, and a fixed white light is now shown eastward of the fairway till obscured by the southern part of Odderø Island.

[The bearings are magnetic. Variation, Far-sund $16\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ Westerly in 1878; Christiansand 16° Westerly in 1878.]
