THE MERCHANT SHIPPING ACT, 1876.

THE name of Captain H. D. Grant, C.B., R.N., has been added to the List of Assessors for Formal Investigations into Shipping Casualties, approved by Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the Home Department, under section 30 of "The Merchant Shipping Act, 1876."

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the 39th and 40th years of Her present Majesty Queen Victoria, entitled "An Act for the preservation of Wild Fowl," it was by the 2nd section provided that any person who shall kill, wound, or take, or attempt to kill, wound, or take any wild fowl as defined by the said Act, or use any boat, gun, net, or other engine or instrument for the purpose of killing, wounding, or taking any wild fowl, or shall have in his control or possession any wild fowl recently killed, wounded, or taken, between the 15th day of February and the 10th day of July in any year, shall be liable to the penalty therein mentioned, and by the 3rd section, power was given to the Home Office as to Great Britain, upon the application of the Justices in Quarter Sessions assembled of any county, to extend or vary the time during which the killing, wounding, and taking of wild fowl was prohibited by the said Act, such extension or variation to be made by Order, under the hand of one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State:

And whereas the Justices of the West Riding of the county of York, in Quarter Sessions assembled, have applied to me to the effect that an Order should be made directing that the time during which the killing, wounding, and taking of wild fowl, as defined by the said Act, is prohibited shall be varied in the West Riding of Yorkshire, so as to be from the 15th day of March to the 1st day of August in each year.

Now, therefore, I, the Right Honourable Richard Assheton Cross, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, in pursuance of the said Act, and on such application as aforesaid, hereby order as follows:—

The time during which the killing, wounding, and taking of wild fowl, as defined by the said Act, is prohibited, shall be varied in the West Riding of Yorkshire, so as to be from the 15th

day of March to the 1st day of August, in each year.

ARTICLE III.—The Churchwardens and Overseers of the Poor of the said township shall pay to the person for the time being appointed to the office of Vestry Clerk for the said township, under the provisions of the above-mentioned Act and of this Order, for the performance of the duties of that office, a salary at the rate of ten pounds per annum, or such other remuneration as the Local Government Board may from time to time direct or approve.

ARTICLE IV.—Such remuneration, in the case of an annual salary, shall be considered as accruing from day to day, and be apportionable in respect of time accordingly, in pursuance of the provisions of “ The Apportionment Act, 1870,” and shall be paid quarterly, on the 25th day of December, the 25th day of March, the 24th day of June, and the 29th day of September, in each year.
