And whereas it is further provided by the said Act that the said Act shall not come into operation until Her Majesty shall by Order in Council direct that the said Act shall have effect within the Island as if it were part of the "Extradition Act, 1870," but that the said Act shall thereafter come into operation as soon as such Order in Council shall have been publicly made known in the Island ;

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, in pursuance of "The Extradition Act, 1870," and in exercise of the power in that behalf in the said Act contained, doth by this present Order, by and with the advice of Her Majesty's Privy Council, direct that the said Act shall have effect in the Island of Barbadoes, without modification or alteration, as if it were part of "The Extradition Act, 1870."

And the Right Honourable Sir Michael Edward Hicks-Beach, Bart., one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, is to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

And whereas it is further provided by the said Ordinance that the said Ordinance shall not come into operation until Her Majesty shall by Order in Council direct that the said Ordinance shall have effect within the Settlement as if it were part of the "Extradition Act, 1870," but that the said Ordinance shall thereafter come into operation as soon as such Order in Council shall have been publicly made known in the settlement ;

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, in pursuance of "The Extradition Act, 1870," and in exercise of the power in that behalf in the said Act contained, doth by this present Order, by and with the advice of Her Majesty's Privy Council, direct that the said Ordinance shall have effect in the Settlement of Sierra Leone, without modification or alteration, as if it were part of "The Extradition Act, 1870."

And the Right Honourable Sir Michael Edward Hicks-Beach, Bart., one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, is to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS by section one of "The Trade Marks Registration Extension Act, 1877," 40 and 41 Victoria, cap. 37, it is enacted that in so far as relates to the registration of trade marks used in the textile industries, but not further or otherwise, section one of the Trade Marks Registration Amendment Act, 1876, shall be construed as if for the words "from and after the first day of July, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven, there were substituted the words "from and after the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight, or such further time as Her Majesty may by Order in Council determine."

Whereas by an Order in Council, bearing date the 12th day of December, 1877, Her Majesty by

and with the advice of Her Privy Council was pleased, in accordance with the above-recited enactment, to prolong till the 30th day of June, 1878, the time for the registration of trade marks used in the textile industries.

And whereas by another Order in Council, bearing date the 29th day of June, 1878, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, was pleased, in accordance with the above-recited enactment, further to prolong till the 31st day of December, 1878, the time for the registration of such trade marks as aforesaid.

And whereas it is deemed expedient that in so far as regards that portion of the trade marks used in the textile industries which is applied to cotton piece goods, such time should be further extended beyond the said 31st day of December, 1878 :

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, is pleased, in accordance with the above-recited enactment, to prolong till the 31st day of May, 1879, the time for the registration of trade marks applied to cotton piece goods.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the thirtieth of September, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight, in the words and figures following, viz. :-

"Whereas by the twentieth section of an Act passed in the twenty-ninth year of your Majesty's reign, chapter eighty-nine, entitled 'An Act to provide for the better Government of Greenwich Hospital,' it is among other things enacted, that the regulations for the admission of children into Greenwich Hospital School, shall be vested exclusively in the Admiralty, but any such regulations shall not have effect unless and until they are approved by your Majesty in Council.

"And whereas your Majesty has been pleased, by Orders in Council of ninth August one thousand eight hundred and seventy, sixteenth January one thousand eight hundred and seventy-three, and fourth February one thousand eight hundred and seventy-five, to approve of certain regulations for the admission of boys into the school.

"And whereas we are of opinion that it is desirable further to promote the entry into the Royal Navy, or Mercantile Marine, of the boys educated and maintained in the school. We beg leave to recommend that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to sanction the establishment of the following regulations in lieu of those previously authorised :-

"REGULATIONS for the Admission of Boys to Greenwich Hospital School.

"I. The school will consist of one thousand boys, the sons of petty officers and seamen, and of non-commissioned officers and privates of marines, who have served or are now serving in the Royal Navy or Coast Guard, and of other seafaring persons.

"II. All claims for admission to the school will be judged by a Committee of Selection appointed by the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, in

the following order of precedence, special consideration being given to length of service at sea:—

- “(1.) Orphans, both parents dead.
- “(2.) Sons of fathers killed, drowned, deceased, wounded, or seriously maimed in Her Majesty's service, or while employed by Her Majesty on board a Merchant ship, or in action with an enemy, pirate, or rebel.
- “(3.) Those whose fathers, having served in the Royal Navy or Marines, are dead.
- “(4.) Those whose fathers are serving and whose mothers are dead.
- “(5.) Sons of naval and marine pensioners, sons of seamen, and marines now serving, both parents living.
- “(6.) Sons of seamen or marines entitled to the benefits of Greenwich Hospital not included in the foregoing classes.\*
- “(7.) Sons of other seafaring persons:

“N.B.—The sons of commissioned and other officers are not absolutely excluded, provided that the peculiar circumstances of their case render them eligible for this charity.

“III. Applications for admission are to be made to the Secretary of the Admiralty (Greenwich Hospital Branch), London, when the necessary forms will be sent, which, when properly filled up, must be returned as directed, with the following documents:—

- “(a.) A certificate of the marriage of the parents; or, if not attainable, other satisfactory proof thereof.
- “(b.) A certificate of registry of the boy's birth.
- “(c.) A certificate from the clergyman of the parish to which the boy belongs, or from the minister of his denomination, or from the master of the school at which the boy has been educated, as to his character and moral conduct.
- “(d.) An agreement, signed by the boy and his parents or guardians, that he shall serve in the Royal Navy for a period of ten years, continuous and general service from the age of eighteen, in addition to whatever period may be necessary until he shall have attained that age, if found physically fit and up to the prescribed standard on his discharge from the school; otherwise that he shall be bound apprentice in the Merchant Service for four years, and enrolled in the Royal Naval reserve.

“IV. The services of the fathers upon which the claim is founded, will be ascertained at the Admiralty, and due notice will be given without further application, should the boy be selected for admission into the school.

“V. Boys are eligible for admission between ten and a half and thirteen years of age. They must be physically fit for sea service, according to the prescribed standard, able to read an easy sentence and possess a knowledge of the four simple rules of arithmetic.

“VI. Applications will not be received until the candidates are ten and a half years of age.

“VII. After admission to the school, boys will be examined monthly by the Medical Officer, and specially at thirteen years of age, as to their physical condition, and if at any time found to be unfit for further retention in the school, they will be at once discharged:—otherwise, they will be kept in the school, until they reach the age of

fifteen and a half years, when they will be entered for continuous service in the Royal Navy, if found physically fit, and up to the prescribed standard. If found unfit for entry into the Royal Navy they will be bound apprentices in the Merchant Service for four years, and enrolled in the Royal Naval Reserve.

“VIII. Vacancies occasioned by the discharge of boys found physically unfit at thirteen years of age, will, as far as possible, be filled by selection from the sons of seamen and marines, who must be thirteen years of age, fit and willing for service in the Royal Navy, and able to pass a sufficient examination, in reading, writing, and arithmetic.

“IX. Applications for the admission of boys at thirteen years of age must be made one month previously, in the same manner as directed in Clause III.

“X. The Nautical Division is not to exceed one hundred and twenty boys, who will be selected from the general school, by competitive examination, as a rule, at thirteen years of age. They will be educated to fill the positions of pupil teachers, writers, and ships' stewards' boys in the Royal Navy. No boy will be eligible to be transferred to this division of the school after fourteen and a half years of age. Boys failing to come up to the prescribed standard at fourteen and a half years of age will be bound apprentices in the Merchant Service.

“XI. The education of the boys in the General Division will comprise the usual elements of a sound English education, alternating with practical seamanship, and other industrial occupations designed to prepare them for a seafaring life.

“XII. In the Nautical Division, elementary mathematics and mechanics, navigation, nautical astronomy, and French will be taught.

“XIII. A thorough knowledge of the art of swimming being one of the requirements for entry into the Royal Navy, all boys in the school will be taught to swim, and be periodically examined as to their proficiency.

“XIV. Children of Roman Catholics, or of Protestants not being members of the Church of England, will not be required to learn the Church Catechism, and will be allowed to attend convenient places of public worship, in accordance with the religious persuasions of their fathers, provided application be made to that effect at the time of admission by the father, if living; and if the father be dead at the time of the child's admission, then the marriage certificate of the parents, or baptismal register of such child according to the rights and ceremonies of any established religious community of a date previous to the said father's death, will be received as evidence of the religious tenets of the father: that is, provided no authentic document written by the deceased father be produced, expressing a contrary wish or direction as regards the religious instruction of such child.”

Her Majesty having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed. And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS by the 333rd section of "The Merchant Shipping Act, 1854," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for every Pilotage Authority, by Bye-law made with the consent of Her Majesty in Council, from time to time to do within its district all or any of the things specified in that behalf in the said section :

And whereas the Llynvi Valley Railway Company, being the then Pilotage Authority for the Bay and Harbour of Pwll Cawl or Porth Cawl, in the county of Glamorgan, within the meaning of the said Act, have, in exercise of the powers in them vested thereby, made and submitted for the consent of Her Majesty certain Bye-laws and Regulations which have been approved by Order in Council dated the sixth day of May, 1857 :

And whereas the Great Western Railway Company and the Llynvi and Ogmere Railway Company together constitute the present Pilotage Authority or Pilotage Authorities for the said Bay and Harbour of Porth Cawl within the meaning of the said "Merchant Shipping Act, 1854," and have made and submitted for the consent of Her Majesty certain alterations of and additions to the existing Bye-laws and Regulations of the Llynvi Valley Railway Company with respect to Pilots, pilotage, and pilotage dues within their district and under their jurisdiction (a copy whereof as altered is set forth in the schedule hereunto annexed) :

And whereas it has been made to appear to Her Majesty that the said Bye-laws and Regulations so set forth as aforesaid are reasonable and proper :

Now therefore, Her Majesty, by virtue of the power vested in Her by the said "Merchant Shipping Act, 1854," by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, is pleased to approve of and signify Her consent to the said Bye-laws and Regulations of the said Great Western Railway Company and Llynvi and Ogmere Railway Company with respect to pilotage within their district and under their jurisdiction, in lieu of the existing Bye-laws and Regulations.

#### SCHEDULE.

##### Bay and Harbour of Porth Cawl. Pilotage Bye-Laws.

BYE-LAWS OR REGULATIONS for the government of Pilots licensed to navigate and conduct vessels into and out of the Bay and Harbour of Pwll Cawl otherwise Porth Cawl in the county of Glamorgan and for the fixing of the rates, prices, or remuneration to be demanded and received by the said Pilots, made by the Great Western Railway Company and the Llynvi and Ogmere Railway Company as being the Pilotage Authorities or Pilotage Authority for the said Bay and Harbour under and by virtue of "The Merchant Shipping Act, 1854" "The Llynvi Valley Railway Act, 1855," "The Llynvi and Ogmere Railways Act, 1864," "The Llynvi and Ogmere Railways (Amalgamation) Act, 1866," and "The Llynvi and Ogmere and Cardiff and Ogmere Valley Railway Companies Act, 1876."

1. In construing the following Bye-laws and Regulations the following terms shall have the

respective meanings hereinafter assigned to them (if not inconsistent with the context or subject matter) that is to say:—

"The Company" shall mean and include the Great Western Railway Company and the Llynvi and Ogmere Railway Company and each of the said Companies. "Harbour Master" shall mean any person appointed by the Company to be Harbour Master and any person appointed by him to act for him during his absence. "Master" shall include every person (except a Pilot) having command or charge of any ship. "Ship" shall include every description of vessel used in navigation not propelled by oars; and "Pilot" shall mean any person duly licensed by the Company to conduct ships to which he does not belong.

2. An alphabetical list of the Pilots shall be kept at the office of the Harbour Master, and they shall take their duty in rotation from such list, and each Pilot shall remain on duty for such time as the Harbour Master shall direct, at the end of which time he shall be relieved by the next Pilot in rotation on such list, and so on; and if any Pilot shall neglect, omit, or refuse to take his duty at his proper time (unless prevented by illness) he shall be liable to be dismissed from his office, or shall incur a penalty not exceeding five pounds; and in case of such neglect, omission, or refusal the next Pilot on the said list shall be required to go on duty, and so on, and shall be liable to dismissal or shall incur a similar penalty for neglect, omission, or refusal.

3. Every Pilot whilst on duty shall keep a close watch and look-out for ships about to enter and depart from the harbour, and no Pilot shall take charge of more than one ship entering or departing from the harbour at the same time; and if any ship shall be compelled to enter or depart from the harbour without the assistance of a Pilot in consequence of the neglect, omission, or refusal of duty of any Pilot, such Pilot shall incur a penalty not exceeding five pounds, unless he is prevented by stress of weather. If any ship shall enter or depart from the harbour or bay without a Pilot having previously tendered his services to pilot the same, the Pilot during whose watch or look-out such event shall have occurred, unless he is prevented by stress of weather, shall, if such occurrence shall take place by day, incur a penalty not exceeding ten shillings, and if the same shall take place by night, incur a penalty not exceeding one pound; or he shall in either case be liable to be dismissed from his office.

4. Every Pilot shall be subject to the control, order, and direction of, and liable to be suspended by, the Harbour Master, but shall be liable to dismissal by order of the Directors of the Company only.

5. Every Pilot passing in his boat any ship inward bound shall, unless prevented by stress of weather, tender his services as Pilot to the master of such ship, and in default thereof he shall incur a penalty not exceeding five pounds.

6. No Pilot shall engage himself to any ship in any other capacity than as Pilot without having first obtained the leave in writing of the Harbour Master for that purpose, and every Pilot offending against this regulation shall on complaint of the Harbour Master incur for every such offence a penalty not exceeding five pounds.

7. That the rates prices and remunerations to be demanded and received for the time being by



Pilots licensed by the Company shall be as follows, that is to say :—

For piloting any ship from any place between Sker or Nash Points and inside the sands into the harbour and safely mooring her therein, and out of the harbour to every such place, sailing vessels *2d.* per ton register and steam vessels *1½d.* per ton register : the same to be payable as soon as the ship is moored in the harbour, or before leaving the harbour as the case may be.

Provided always that nothing herein contained shall affect the provisions of the 47th George 3rd cap. 33, which relate to the exemption from compulsory pilotage of coasting vessels and Irish traders.

**W**HEREAS by an Act passed in the first session of the Parliament holden in the first and second years of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "An Act to abridge the holding of benefices in plurality, and to make better provision for the residence of the clergy," after reciting that, "Whereas from the increase of population, or from other circumstances, it may be expedient that two or more benefices which have been heretofore united or which may be hereafter united under the provisions of this Act should be disunited," it is amongst other things, enacted, "That when two or more benefices shall have been united, or may be hereafter united into one benefice, and with respect to his own diocese it shall appear to the Archbishop of the Province, or the Bishop of any diocese shall represent to the said Archbishop of the Province, that one or more of the benefices within his diocese, of which such united benefices shall consist, may be separated therefrom with advantage to the interests of religion, the said Archbishop shall enquire into the circumstances of the case; and if on such enquiry it shall appear to him that such union may be usefully dissolved, so far as respects such benefice or benefices, he shall six weeks at least before certifying such inquiry to Her Majesty as hereinafter directed, cause, with respect to his own diocese, a statement, in writing, of the facts, and in all other cases a copy, in writing, of the aforesaid representation to be affixed on or near the principal outer door of the church or in some public and conspicuous place in each of the benefices forming part of the united benefice, with notice to any person or persons interested that he, she, or they may within such six weeks show cause, in writing, under his, her, or their hands to the said Archbishop against any such disunion; and if no sufficient cause be shown within such time, the Archbishop shall certify the inquiry and consent, when the patron's consent is necessary, to Her Majesty in Council, and thereupon it shall be lawful for Her Majesty to issue an Order for separating such last-mentioned benefice or benefices from such united benefice, and for declaring the rights of patronage of the several patrons, if there be more than one patron, and such Order shall be registered in the registry of the diocese to which such united benefice shall belong, which Order the Registrar

of such diocese, immediately, on the receipt thereof, is hereby required to register accordingly, and thereupon immediately if such united benefice shall be then vacant, otherwise on the first avoidance thereof, such union shall be ipso facto dissolved, so far only as regards such benefice or benefices so proposed to be separated from such united benefice, but in all other respects shall remain in full force and effect, and thenceforward such last-mentioned benefice or benefices shall be and be deemed and taken to be a separate and distinct benefice or benefices to all intents and purposes whatever as if no such union had taken place, and the patron or patrons thereof shall and may according to the terms of such Order present or nominate thereto respectively, and so from time to time upon each and every avoidance of the same: Provided always, that no benefices which have been united for more than sixty years before the passing of this Act shall be disunited without the consent in writing of the patron or patrons thereof."

And whereas the Lord Bishop of Norwich on the twentieth day of May, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight, made a representation to the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury in the words following :—

"To the Most Reverend Archibald Campbell, Lord Archbishop of the Province of Canterbury.

"I John Thomas Lord Bishop of Norwich do hereby represent to your Grace that it appears to me that the disunion of the rectory of Swannington with the vicarage of Wood Dalling annexed in the county of Norfolk and my diocese of Norwich by the separation of the said rectory of Swannington from the said vicarage of Wood Dalling may be made with advantage to the interests of religion.

"Witness my hand this twentieth day of May in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight.

*"John T. Norwich."*

And whereas the said Lord Archbishop having enquired into the circumstances of the case it on such enquiry appeared to him that the said union might be usefully dissolved. He therefore six weeks before certifying such enquiry to Her Majesty in Council caused a copy in writing of the aforesaid representation to be affixed to the principal outer door of each of the parish churches of the said united benefice with notice to any person or persons interested that he she or they might within such six weeks show cause in writing under his her or their hand or hands against such disunion, as required by the said Act, and no such cause being shown, the said Archbishop hath, pursuant to the said Act, certified the enquiry and the consent of the patrons to the proposed disunion to Her Majesty in Council, by his certificate in writing in the words following :—

"To the QUEEN'S Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

"We the undersigned Archibald Campbell Lord Archbishop of the Province of Canterbury Primate of all England and Metropolitan do hereby certify to your Majesty in Council.

"That the Honorable and Right Reverend John Thomas Lord Bishop of Norwich as Bishop of the diocese within which is situate the united benefice consisting of the rectory of Swannington with the vicarage of Wood Dalling annexed in the county of Norfolk having represented unto us that the disunion of the said rectory of Swannington with

the vicarage of Wood Dalling annexed by the separation of the said rectory of Swannington from the said vicarage of Wood Dalling might be made with advantage to the interests of religion we inquired into the circumstances of the case.

"That on such enquiry it appeared to us that such union might be usefully dissolved and that the Keeper or Master of the College or Hall of the Holy Trinity in the University of Cambridge and the Fellows and Scholars of the same College or Hall being the patrons or persons entitled to present to the said united benefice if the same were now vacant consent to the proposed disunion.

"That six weeks and upwards before certifying such enquiry and consent to your Majesty in Council we caused a copy in writing of the aforesaid representation of the said Lord Bishop to be affixed on the principal outer door of each of the parish churches of the said united benefice with notice to any person or persons interested that he she or they might within such six weeks show cause in writing under his her or their hand or hands to us the said Archbishop against such disunion and no such cause has been shown.

"The representation of the said Lord Bishop of Norwich, our enquiry into the circumstances of the case, statement of circumstances in reply thereto, the consent in writing of the patrons and the copies of the representation and notice before-mentioned are hereunto annexed.

approval of one of such Secretaries of State, should be prohibited, or that burials in any city or town, or within any other limits, or in any burial-ground or places of burial should be wholly discontinued, or should be discontinued subject to any exception or qualification, it shall be lawful for Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order that no new burial-ground shall be opened in any city or town, or within such limits, without such previous approval, or (as the case may require) that, after a time mentioned in the Order, burials in such city or town, or within such limits, or in such burial-grounds or places of burial, shall be discontinued wholly, or subject to any exceptions or qualifications mentioned in such Order, and so from time to time as circumstances may require; provided always, that notice of such representation, and of the time when it shall please Her Majesty to order that the same be taken into consideration by the Privy Council, shall be published in the London Gazette, and shall be affixed on the doors of the churches or chapels of, or on some other conspicuous places within, the parishes affected by such representation, one month before such representation is so considered; provided also, that no such representation shall be made in relation to the burial-ground of any parish until ten days' previous notice of the intention to make such representation shall have been given to the Incumbent and Vestry Clerk or Churchwardens of such parish:

And whereas the Right Honourable Richard Assheton Cross, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, after giving to the Incumbents and the Churchwardens of the parishes hereinafter mentioned ten days' previous notice of his intention to make such representation, has made a representation stating that, for the protection of the public health, no new burial-ground should be opened in the undermentioned parishes without the previous consent of one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, and that burials should be discontinued therein, with the modifications hereinafter specified:

And whereas Her Majesty was pleased, by Her Order in Council of the fourteenth day of September last, to give notice of such representation, and to order that the same should be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council on the twenty-eighth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight, and such Order has been published in the London Gazette, and copies thereof have been affixed, as required by the said Act:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that no new burial-ground shall be opened in the undermentioned parishes, without the previous approval of one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, and that burials in the said parishes shall be discontinued (except as herein otherwise directed), as follows, viz. :—

**EARL SOHAM.**—Forthwith wholly in Earl Soham Church, in the county of Suffolk; and in the churchyard, except in vaults and walled graves, every coffin buried in which shall be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented.

**BRIXHAM.**—Forthwith wholly in Brixham Church, in the county of Devon; and in the churchyard, except in vaults and walled graves, every coffin buried in which shall be separately enclosed by stonework or brick-

work properly cemented; and except in earthen graves which can be opened without the exposure of coffins or the disturbance of entire bones.

**DUXFORD.**—Forthwith wholly in St. Peter's and St. John's Churches, Duxford, in the county of Cambridge; and in the churchyards, after the thirty-first of December next, except in vaults and walled graves, every coffin buried in which shall be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented.

That the said Order of the twelfth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven, be read and construed as if the words "and except, also, until the thirtieth of June, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine, for the burial of parishioners who do not die within the city of Worcester" had been inserted at the end of the paragraph in the said Order which relates to burials in the churchyard of St. John's Bedwardine, Worcester.

**ULVERSTON.**—In Saint Mary and in Holy Trinity Churchyards, Ulverston, except in vaults and walled graves existing on the first of July, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight, every coffin buried in which shall be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented, and except in graves not before buried in or in those to be used for the burial of the widowers, widows, parents or children of those already buried therein.

**KNIGHTON.**—Forthwith wholly in Knighton Church, in the county of Radnor; and in the churchyard, after the thirtieth of June, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine, except in now existing vaults and walled graves, every coffin buried in which shall be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented; and except in earthen graves to be used only for the burial of the widowers or widows of those already interred therein.

**THORNBURY.**—Forthwith wholly in Thornbury Church, in the county of Gloucester; and in the churchyard, except in now existing vaults and walled graves, every coffin buried in which shall be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented; and except also in earthen graves not less than five feet deep, which can be opened without the exposure of coffins.

## SCHEDULE No. 4.

REGULATIONS AND CONDITIONS, &c., as to the Posting, Forwarding, Conveyance, and Delivery of Postal Packets, conveyed or delivered for conveyance by Post as mentioned and described in Schedules Nos. 1, 2, and 3.

*Part I.—General Regulations and Conditions.*

1. Any postal packet posted in the United Kingdom, Malta, Gibraltar, Cyprus, or at either of the British Post Offices in Constantinople, Smyrna, and Beyrout, respectively, addressed to any colony mentioned in the first column of Schedules 1, 2, and 3, or to the United Kingdom, may be registered, provided that all rates of postage and additional sums for registration chargeable thereon be fully prepaid.

2. There shall not be conveyed or delivered for conveyance by post to any colony mentioned in the first column of Schedules 1, 2, and 3 any postal packet which shall contain either gold or silver money, any jewel or precious article, or any other article liable to customs' duties in such colonies respectively; and any such packet shall, if posted, be detained and returned, or given up to the sender thereof.

3. There shall not be conveyed or delivered for conveyance by post to any colony mentioned in the first column of Schedules 1, 2, and 3 any newspaper, packet of newspapers, or book packet exceeding two pounds in weight, nor any pattern or sample packet exceeding one half of a pound in weight; and any such newspaper or packet shall, if posted, be detained and returned, or given up to the sender thereof.

4. There shall not be conveyed or delivered for conveyance by post, unless by the special permission in any case or class of cases of the Postmaster-General, any postal packet, the dimensions of which shall exceed two feet in length or one foot in breadth or depth; and any such packet shall, if posted, be detained and returned, or given up to the sender thereof.

5. There shall not be conveyed or delivered for conveyance by post any postal packet which shall contain anything which might by pressure or otherwise be rendered injurious either to the Officers of the Post Office or to the contents of the mail bags, nor any book packet or pattern or sample packet which shall not be securely packed and guarded in such manner as to furnish complete protection against injury to the Officers of the Post Office and to the contents of the mail bags; and any such packet shall, if posted, be detained and returned, or given up to the sender thereof.

6. There shall not be conveyed or delivered for conveyance by post any indecent or obscene print, painting, photograph, lithograph, engraving, book, or card, or any other indecent or obscene article, or any letter, newspaper, supplement, publication, packet, or card having thereon, or on the cover thereof, any words, marks, or designs of an indecent, obscene, libellous, or grossly offensive character, and if anything shall be posted which shall *prima facie* fall within the aforesaid prohibition, it shall be stopped and submitted at the General Post Office in London to the inspection of an Officer duly authorised in that behalf by the Postmaster-General.

7. Any postal packet addressed to and received in the United Kingdom which shall be redirected in the United Kingdom to any colony mentioned in the first column of Schedules 1, 2, and 3 shall not be liable to be chargeable with any British postage in respect either of such redirection or of retransmission thereof by post to the colony to which the same shall be so redirected.

8. On every postal packet posted in any colony mentioned in the first column of Schedules 1, 2, and 3 addressed to some part of the same colony, and which shall be redirected in such colony, and transmitted from thence by the post respectively to the United Kingdom, there shall be charged and paid in the United Kingdom on the delivery thereof, in addition to any postage charged thereon in respect of the inland service of the colony in which such packet shall have been posted such a rate or rates of postage as such postal packet would have been liable to if the same had been originally posted in and addressed to a place within the United Kingdom.

9. The Postmaster-General may, in any case in which he may consider it just or reasonable so to do, remit any postage made payable by any regulation contained in this Schedule.

10. In this Warrant and the Schedules thereto, the expression "United Kingdom" means the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, the Channel Islands, and the Isle of Man.

*Part II.—As to Post Cards.*

11. Post Cards bearing an impressed stamp shall be issued by the Postmaster-General, and the cards so issued and no others shall be deemed to be post cards within the meaning of this Warrant.

12. The address and nothing else shall be written, printed, or otherwise impressed on the side of the post card which bears the impressed stamp, and no part of the address shall be written, printed, or otherwise impressed across such stamp.

13. Anything including a letter or communication in the nature of a letter may be written, printed, or otherwise impressed on the side of the post card which does not bear the impressed stamp.

14. Nothing whatever shall be in any manner attached to a post card except a postage stamp or stamps in payment of any deficient postage or additional sum for registration chargeable thereon; nor shall a post card be cut or folded or otherwise altered.

15. If any post card is posted without the postage chargeable thereon being fully prepaid, or is posted otherwise than in conformity with these regulations, it shall be detained and returned or given up to the sender thereof.

*Part III.—As to Newspapers.*

16. The regulations and conditions made and prescribed by a Treasury Warrant, dated the 27th day of December, 1870, shall in all respects apply to registered newspapers conveyed or delivered for conveyance by post as mentioned and described in Part I of Schedule No. 1.

17. If any newspaper or packet of newspapers is posted in the United Kingdom, Malta, Gibraltar, Cyprus, or at either of the British Post Offices in Constantinople, Smyrna, and Beyrout, respectively, without the postage chargeable thereon being fully prepaid, or is posted otherwise than in conformity with the regulations for the time being in force applicable to its transmission, it shall be detained and returned or given up to the sender thereof.

*Part IV.—As to Book Packets.*

18. In this Warrant and the Schedules thereto, the expression "Book Packet" shall mean and comprise not only books but also all packets consisting of articles of the following kinds, not

being trade patterns or samples of merchandize, that is to say:—

- (1) Paper or any other substance in ordinary use for writing or printing, whether such paper or other substance be plain or with anything (except a letter or communication in the nature of a letter) written, printed, or otherwise impressed thereon, and whether the same be in the form of books or in any other form.
- (2) Printed, engraved, or lithographed circulars, notwithstanding that such circulars may be letters or communications in the nature of a letter.
- (3) Photographs or other things of a like kind, when not on glass or in frames containing glass or any brittle substance of a like kind.
- (4) Anything usually attached or appurtenant to any of the before-mentioned articles in the way of binding, mounting, or otherwise, and anything convenient for their safe transmission by post, which shall be contained in the same packet.

19. Every book packet shall be posted either without a cover or in an open cover, so that the same can be easily removed for the purpose of examination.

20. No book packet shall be posted which shall contain anything sealed or otherwise closed against inspection, or which shall contain any letter or communication in the nature of a letter written on any part of the packet or the cover thereof (although the same may be open to inspection), or which shall contain any separate letter or communication in the nature of a letter not being a circular within the meaning of these regulations, but any circular may bear the written signature and address of the sender with his trade or profession and the date.

21. If any book packet comprising printed papers, such as circulars, notices, and documents of a like kind, is posted in the United Kingdom, Malta, Gibraltar, Cyprus, or at either of the British Post Offices at Constantinople, Smyrna, and Beyrout, respectively, addressed to any Colony mentioned in the first column of Schedules 1, 2, and 3, or to the United Kingdom without the postage chargeable thereon being fully prepaid, it shall be detained and returned or given up to the sender thereof.

22. If any book packet comprising printed papers such as circulars, notices, and documents of a like kind, is sent by post otherwise than in conformity with the regulations hereinbefore contained, numbered respectively 18, 19, and 20, it shall be detained and returned or given up to the sender thereof.

23. If any book packet (except any packet comprising printed papers such as circulars, notices, and documents of a like kind) is sent by post otherwise than in conformity with the regulations hereinbefore contained, numbered respectively 18, 19, and 20, it shall be dealt with and charged in all respects as an unpaid letter.

*Part V.—As to Patterns or Sample Packets.*

24. In this Warrant, the expression "Pattern or Sample Packet" shall comprise such articles only as consist only of trade patterns or samples of merchandize.

25. No patterns or samples shall be of any saleable value, or consist of articles or things having a value of their own apart from their mere use as patterns or samples.

26. Patterns or samples shall, when practicable, be posted in covers open at both ends, and so that the same may be easily removable for the

purposes of examination. Nevertheless, such articles as cannot be posted in open covers (but such articles only) may be posted enclosed in boxes or in bags of linen or other material fastened in such a manner that they may be readily opened so as to enable the Officers of the Post Office to satisfy themselves as to the nature of the contents.

27. There shall be no writing upon any pattern or sample packet, or on the cover thereof, except the address of the person for whom it is intended, the name and the trade or profession of the sender thereof, a manufacturer's or trade mark or number, and the price of the articles patterns, or samples of which are contained therein, nor shall there be any writing or other thing enclosed in any such packet, except the name and the trade or profession of the sender thereof, a manufacturer's or trade mark or number, and the price of the articles of which patterns or samples are contained therein, and any such permitted writing in any such packet may be on labels attached to the patterns or samples.

28. If there shall be posted any packet containing a pattern or sample of any saleable value or having a value of its own apart from its mere use as a pattern or sample, such packet shall be detained and returned or given up to the sender thereof.

29. If any pattern or sample packet be sent by post otherwise than in conformity with the regulations hereinbefore contained, numbered respectively 26 and 27, it shall be dealt with and charged in all respects as an unpaid letter.
