WHEREAS by the 4th section of "The Medical Act" one of the persons to constitute "the General Council of Medical Education and Registration of the United Kingdom" to be established under or by virtue of the provisions of that Act was to be a person chosen from time to time by the University of Edinburgh and the two Universities of Aberdeen collectively; and by the 5th section of the said Act it was provided that if the said Universities of Edinburgh and Aberdeen should not be able to agree upon some one person to represent them in the Council it should be lawful for each one of the said Universities to select one person and thereupon it should be lawful for Her Majesty with the advice of Her Privy Council to appoint one of the persons so selected to be a member of the said Council for the said Universities:

And whereas the said two Universities of Aberdeen in the said Medical Act mentioned have since the passing thereof been consolidated and united into one university that is to say the University of Aberdeen:

And whereas in the year 1873 the said University of Edinburgh and the said University of Aberdeen collectively chose William Turner, Esquire, Bachelor of Medicine, Professor of Anatomy and Dean of the Faculty of Medicine in the University of Edinburgh, to be their representative in the said General Council for the term of five years:

And whereas under and by virtue of the provisions of the said Act the said William Turner has ceased by lapse of time to be a member of the said General Council.

And whereas the said Universities of Edinburgh and Aberdeen have not been able to agree upon some one person to represent them in the said General Council, and in pursuance of the said 5th section of the said Act, the said University of Edinburgh hath selected the said William Turner, and the said University of Aberdeen hath selected John Struthers, Esquire, Doctor of Medicine, Edinburgh, Professor of Anatomy in the said University of Aberdeen, and have submitted the names of the said two persons to Her Majesty in Council.

Now, therefore, Her Majesty by and with the

advice of Her Privy Council, doth under and by virtue of the provisions in that behalf contained in the said Medical Act appoint the said William Turner to be a member of the said General Council for the said Universities of Edinburgh and Aberdeen for the term of five years from the date hereof.

"and conspicuous place in each of such benefices, sinecure rectories or vicarages, with notice to any person or persons interested, that he, she, or they, may, within such six weeks, show cause in writing under his, her, or their hand or hands, to the said Archbishop, against such union; and if no sufficient cause be shown within such time, the said Archbishop shall certify the inquiry and consent aforesaid to Her Majesty in Council, and thereupon it shall be lawful for Her Majesty in Council to make and issue an Order or Orders for uniting such benefices, sinecure rectory or rectories, vicarage or vicarages, into one benefice, with cure of souls, for ecclesiastical purposes only; and it shall be lawful for Her Majesty in Council to give directions for regulating the course and succession in which the patrons, if there be more than one patron, shall present or nominate to such united benefice, from time to time, as the same shall become vacant."

And whereas the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury pursuant to the provisions of the said Act, hath duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a certificate in writing, bearing date the twenty-first day of November in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight, in the words following, that is to say:—

"To the QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

"We the undersigned Archibald Campbell Lord Archbishop of the Province of Canterbury Primate of all England and Metropolitan do hereby certify to your Majesty in Council—

"That the Right Reverend Christopher Lord Bishop of Lincoln as Bishop of the diocese within which are situate the rectory of Gautby in the county of Lincoln and the rectory of Waddingworth in the same county having represented unto us that the said benefices being contiguous to each other and of which the aggregate population does not exceed one thousand five hundred persons might with advantage to the interests of religion be united into one benefice we inquired into the circumstances of the case.

"That on such inquiry it appeared to us that such union might be usefully made and would not be of inconvenient extent and that the Right Honourable Hugh MacCalmont Earl Cairns Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain the patron or person entitled on behalf of the Crown to present or nominate to the said rectories of Gautby and Waddingworth in case the same or either of them were now vacant has signified his consent in writing to the union of the said benefices into one benefice with cure of souls for ecclesiastical purposes.

"That six weeks and upwards before certifying such inquiry and consent to your Majesty in Council we caused a copy in writing of the aforesaid representation of the said Lord Bishop to be affixed on the principal outer door of the parish church of each of the said benefices with notice to any person or persons interested that he she or they might within such six weeks show cause in writing under his her or their hand or hands to us the said Archbishop against such union and no such cause has been shown.

"The representation of the said Lord Bishop of Lincoln our inquiry into the circumstances of the case the statement of circumstances in reply thereto the consent in writing of the patron and the copies of the representation and notice before mentioned are hereunto annexed.

"And we do hereby certify the inquiry and consent aforesaid to your Majesty in Council to

the intent that your Majesty in Council may in case your Majesty in Council shall think fit so to do make and issue an Order for uniting the said benefices into one benefice with cure of souls for ecclesiastical purposes only.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the first session of the Parliament holden in the first and second years of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "An Act to abridge the holding of benefices in plurality, and to make better provision for the residence of the clergy," after reciting that "Whereas, in some instances, tithings, hamlets, chapelries, and other places or districts may be separated from the parishes or mother churches to which they belong with great advantage, and places altogether extra-parochial may in some instances with advantage be annexed to parishes or districts to which they are contiguous, or be constituted separate parishes for ecclesiastical purposes," it is, amongst other things, enacted, "That when, with respect to his own diocese, it shall appear to the Archbishop of the Province, or when the bishop of any diocese shall represent to the said archbishop that any such tithing, hamlet, chapelry, place, or district within the diocese of such archbishop, or the diocese of such bishop, as the case may be, may be advantageously separated from any parish or mother church, and either be constituted a separate benefice by itself or be united to any other parish to which it may be more conveniently annexed, or to any other adjoining tithing, hamlet, chapelry, place, or district, parochial or extra-parochial, so as to form a separate parish or benefice, or that any extra-parochial place may with advantage be annexed to any parish to which it is contiguous, or be constituted a separate parish for ecclesiastical purposes; and the said archbishop or bishop shall draw up a scheme, in writing (the scheme of such bishop to be transmitted to the said archbishop for his consideration), describing the mode in which it appears to him that the alteration may best be effected, and how the changes consequent on such alteration in respect to ecclesiastical jurisdiction, glebe lands, tithes, rent-charges, and other ecclesiastical dues, rates, and payments, and in respect to patronage and rights to pews, may be made with justice to all parties interested; and if the patron or patrons of the benefice or benefices to be affected by such alteration shall consent, in writing, under his or their hands to such scheme, or to such modification thereof as the said Archbishop may

"approve, and the said Archbishop shall, on full consideration and inquiry, be satisfied with any such scheme, or modification thereof, and shall certify the same and such consent as aforesaid, by his report to Her Majesty in Council, it shall be lawful for Her Majesty in Council to make an Order for carrying such scheme, or modification thereof, as the case may be, into effect; and such Order, being registered in the Registry of the diocese, which the Registrar is hereby required to do, shall be forthwith binding on all persons whatsoever, including the incumbent or incumbents of the benefice or benefices to be affected thereby, if he or they shall have consented thereto in writing under his or their hands."

And whereas the Lord Bishop of Saint Davids hath made a representation in writing to his Grace the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"To the Most Reverend Archibald Campbell Lord Archbishop of the Province of Canterbury.

"I the Right Reverend William Basil Lord Bishop of Saint Davids do hereby represent to your Grace that there is in the county of Brecon and my diocese of Saint Davids, the vicarage of Saint Davids Brecon, otherwise known as Saint Davids Llanfaes Brecon.

"That contiguous to the said parish of Saint Davids Llanfaes and situate within the limits of the said parish there is a place or district known by the name of Christ's College the boundaries whereof are well known and defined and which place or district is altogether extra-parochial.

"That the said place or district is in no way connected with the parish of Saint Davids Llanfaes in respect to rates of any kind, nor are the inhabitants of such district entitled to any accommodation in the said parish church.

"That the said place or district comprises within it the College of Christ of Brecknock including the site of the church, school-house, buildings, ground and premises belonging to the said College vested in the Governing Body of the said College under or by virtue of an Act of Parliament passed in the sixteenth and seventeenth years of Her present Majesty chapter eighty-two for the regulation and management and the permanent endowment of the said College.

"That no minister officiating in the said College Church has the spiritual care of the said extra-parochial place or district, and in fact it would appear that the incumbent for the time being of the said benefice of Saint Davids Llanfaes has voluntarily extended his pastoral care to and over such district. And that all baptisms churchings marriages and burials of persons pertaining to such district have taken place in the church of the said parish of Saint Davids Llanfaes.

"That the population of the said extra-parochial place or district of Christ's College amounts according to the last census of 1871 to one hundred and seven persons.

"That according to the same census of 1871 the population of the said parish of Saint David's Llanfaes amounts to one thousand four hundred and sixty-four.

"That the net annual value of the said vicarage of Saint Davids Llanfaes is three hundred pounds.

"That the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have agreed to assign to the said vicarage of Saint Davids Llanfaes the whole rectorial tithes of the said parish of Saint Davids Llanfaes formerly part of the endowments of the Archdeaconry of Brecon in lieu of (as at present)

such a portion thereof as suffices to make up the net income of the said vicarage to three hundred pounds per annum on condition of the said extra-parochial place or district being annexed to the said parish of Saint Davids Llanfaes.

"That it appears to me that the whole of the said extra-parochial place or district of Christ's College may under the provisions of the Acts of Parliament of the first and second years of Her present Majesty chapter 106 and the second and third years of Her said Majesty chapter 49 be with advantage annexed to the said parish of Saint Davids Llanfaes.

"That pursuant to the direction contained in the twenty-sixth section of the said first mentioned Act of Parliament I the said Lord Bishop have drawn up a scheme in writing appended to this representation describing the mode in which it appears to me that the alteration above proposed may be best effected and how the changes consequent on such alteration in respect to ecclesiastical jurisdiction glebe lands tithes rent-charges and other ecclesiastical dues rates and payments and in respect to patronage and rights to pews may be made with justice to all parties interested. And I do submit the same to your Grace together with the consents in writing of the Venerable Henry de Winton Archdeacon of the Archdeaconry of Brecon the patron of the said vicarage of Saint Davids Llanfaes to the intent that your Grace may if on full consideration and enquiry you shall be satisfied with the said scheme certify the same and such consent to Her Majesty in Council.

"Given under my hand this fourth day of November one thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight.

And whereas the scheme and consents mentioned in the said Representation are in the words and figures following:—

"SCHEME.

"That the said extra-parochial place or district of Christ's College as shown and defined on the map or plan annexed to this scheme by the colour green be annexed to the parish of Saint Davids Llanfaes and become a part of such parish for ecclesiastical purposes of which the parish church for the time being of Saint Davids Llanfaes shall be the parish church.

"That the said parish of Saint Davids Llanfaes so enlarged shall be subject to the same ecclesiastical jurisdiction as the said parish was subject to before being so enlarged.

"That baptisms churchings marriages and burials in respect of the inhabitants of the said extra-parochial place or district of Christ's College shall hereafter be performed in the parish church of Saint Davids Llanfaes and that the fees for all such offices and all ecclesiastical dues offerings and other emoluments arising from or in respect of the said parochial place or district and usually payable to the incumbent of a benefice shall belong to the incumbent of the said vicarage or benefice of Saint Davids Llanfaes.

"That the incumbent of the said parish of Saint Davids Llanfaes shall have exclusive cure of souls within the limits of the said place or district of Christ's College as a part of his parish.

"But that nothing herein contained shall be understood or construed to convey to the incumbent for the time being of the said vicarage of Saint Davids Llanfaes any right or jurisdiction over the church or chapel of the College of Christ of Brecknock or any authority to minister therein or to control the religious services therein per-

formed, nor to convey to the said incumbent or to the churchwardens of the said parish of Saint David's Llanfaes any claim or right to dispose of the alms collected at the offertory in the church or chapel of the said college unless and until such college church or chapel shall by virtue of the provisions contained in the 10th section of the said Act of the 16th and 17th years of Her present Majesty chapter 82 become and be made the parish church of the said parish of Saint Davids Llanfaes in lieu of the present parish church.

"That the right of patronage or presentation to the said vicarage or parish church of Saint Davids Llanfaes shall remain as heretofore.

"To the Most Reverend Archibald Campbell Lord Archbishop of the Province of Canterbury.

"I the Venerable Henry de Winton Archdeacon of the Archdeaconry of Brecon in the Cathedral Church of Saint Davids lawfully founded the patron or the person entitled to present to the vicarage of Saint Davids Llanfaes in the county of Brecon and diocese of Saint Davids in case the same were now vacant, and I the Reverend Rees Price Clerk vicar of the said vicarage do hereby respectively signify to your Grace our consent to the scheme hereinbefore proposed for annexing the extra-parochial place or district of Christ's College to the said parish of Saint Davids Llanfaes.

"As witness our respective hands this ninth day of November in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight.

And whereas the said Lord Bishop hath transmitted the said scheme to the said Lord Archbishop together with the said consents.

And whereas the said Lord Archbishop being on full consideration and enquiry satisfied with such scheme hath certified the same and such consents as aforesaid by his report to Her Majesty in Council dated the 15th day of November 1878, which report is in the words and figures following:—

"To the QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

"We the undersigned Archibald Campbell Lord Archbishop of the Province of Canterbury do hereby report to your Majesty in Council.

"That the Right Reverend William Basil Lord Bishop of St. Davids has represented unto us (amongst other things):—

"That there is in the county of Brecon and diocese of St. Davids the vicarage of St. Davids Brecon otherwise known as St. Davids Llanfaes Brecon.

"That contiguous to the said parish of St. Davids Llanfaes and situate within the limits of the said parish there is a place or district known by the name of Christ's College the boundaries whereof are well known and defined and which place or district is altogether extra-parochial.

"That it appears to the said Lord Bishop that the whole of the said extra-parochial place or district may with advantage be annexed for ecclesiastical purposes to the said contiguous parish of St. Davids Llanfaes.

"That the said Lord Bishop has drawn up a scheme in writing describing the mode in which it appears to him the proposed alteration may best be effected and how the changes consequent on such alteration in respect to ecclesiastical jurisdiction glebe lands tithes rent-charges and other ecclesiastical dues rates and payments and in

respect to patronage and rights to pews may be made with justice to all parties interested which scheme together with the consents thereto in writing of the patron and incumbent of the said benefice of St. Davids Llanfaes has been transmitted by the said Lord Bishop to us for our consideration.

"The representation and scheme of the said Lord Bishop and the consents before referred to are hereunto annexed.

"And we the said Archbishop being on full consideration and inquiry satisfied with the said scheme do hereby pursuant to the Act of the first and second years of your Majesty's reign chapter 106 certify the same and such consents as aforesaid to your Majesty in Council to the intent that your Majesty in Council may in case your Majesty in Council shall think fit so to do make and issue an Order for carrying the said scheme into effect.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the fifty-ninth year of His Majesty King George the Third, chapter one hundred and thirty-four; of the Act of the second and third years of your Majesty, chapter forty-nine; of the Act of the third and fourth years of your Majesty chapter sixty and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of your Majesty, chapter fifty-five, have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following representation as to the assignment of a district chapelry to the consecrated church of Saint John the Evangelist situate at Warley within the limits of the new parish of Christ Church Sowerby Bridge in the county of York and in the diocese of Ripon.

"Whereas it appears to us to be expedient that a district chapelry should be assigned to the said church of Saint John the Evangelist situate at Warley as aforesaid.

"Now therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Robert Bishop of the said diocese of Ripon (testified by his having signed and sealed this representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent, that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all that part of the said new parish of Christ Church Sowerby Bridge which is described in the schedule hereunder written, all which part, together with the boundaries thereof, is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be assigned as a district chapelry to the said church of Saint John the Evangelist situate at Warley as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The District Chapelry of Saint John the Evangelist Warley.'

"And with the like consent of the said Robert Bishop of the said diocese of Ripon (testified as aforesaid), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners,

OVERTIME 30 MINUTES. INCOMPLETE PROCESS.

Order of Secretary of State extending Special Exception.

WHEREAS the Factory and Workshop Act, 1878, section 54, contains a special exception to the effect that if, in any factory or workshop or part thereof to which the exception applies, the process in which a child, young person, or woman is employed is in an incomplete state at the end of the period of employment of such child, young person, or woman, the provisions of the Act with respect to the period of employment shall not prevent such child, young person, or woman from being employed for a further period not exceeding thirty minutes;

Provided that such further periods, when added to the total number of hours of the periods of employment of such child, young person, or woman in that week, do not raise that total above the number otherwise allowed under the Act;

And whereas this special exception is by the Act declared to apply to the factories and workshops referred to in the said section;

And whereas it has been proved to my satisfaction that in non-textile factories and workshops of the class mentioned in the Schedule hereunder, or parts of such non-textile factories and workshops, the time for the completion of a process cannot by reason of the nature thereof be accurately fixed, and that the extension of this exception to such class of factories or workshops or parts thereof can be made without injury to the health of the children, young persons, and women affected thereby;

Now I, the Right Honourable Richard Assheton Cross, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, by this Order, made under Part 2 of the Factory and Workshop Act, 1878, do extend this exception accordingly.

This Order shall come into operation on 1st January, 1879, and shall, unless previously revoked, continue in force until 31st December, 1882, and no longer.

WATER MILLS. LOST TIME.

Order of Secretary of State granting Special Exception.

I, the Right Honourable Richard Assheton Cross, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, by this Order, made under Part 2 of the

Factory and Workshop Act, 1878, grant to every factory falling within the class of factories mentioned in the Schedule hereunder, a special exception permitting the employment therein of young persons and women during a period of employment from 6 A.M. to 7 P.M., for the purpose of recovery of time lost from the stoppage of such factory by drought or flood, subject nevertheless to the following conditions:—

1. No person employed under this special exception shall be thereby deprived of the meal hours by the Act provided, or be so employed on Saturday.
2. Notice of the time lost and the cause thereof shall be reported to the Inspector within three days of such loss.
3. Notice of the recovery of the time lost shall be reported to the Inspector day by day as the same has been recovered.
4. This special exception shall not be available—
 - (a.) for the recovery of any time lost more than twelve months previously;
 - (b.) for the recovery of time lost from the stoppage of the factory by drought, for more than 96 days in any period of twelve months;
 - (c.) for the recovery of time lost from the stoppage of the factory by floods, for more than 48 days in any period of twelve months.
5. This special exception will not authorise the employment of children.

This Order shall come into effect on the 1st January, 1879, and shall, unless previously revoked, continue in force until 31st December, 1882, and no longer.

NIGHT WORK. MALE YOUNG PERSONS
ABOVE 16.

Order of Secretary of State extending Special Exception.

WHEREAS the Factory and Workshop Act, 1878, section 58, contains a special exception to the effect that nothing in the Act shall prevent the employment, in factories to which the exception applies, of male young persons during the night, if they are employed in accordance with the following conditions:

- (1.) The period of employment shall not exceed 12 consecutive hours, and shall begin and end at the hours specified in the notice in the Act mentioned; and
- (2.) The provisions of Part 1 of the Act with respect to the allowance of times for meals to young persons during the period of employment shall be observed with the necessary modifications as to the hour at which the times allowed for meals are fixed; and
- (3.) A male young person employed during any part of the night shall not be employed during any part of the 12 hours preceding or succeeding the period of employment; and
- (4.) A male young person shall not be employed on more than 6 nights, or in the case of blast furnaces or paper mills 7 nights, in any two weeks.

And the said Act declares that the provisions of the Act with respect to the period of employ-

ment on Saturday, and with respect to the allowance to young persons of 8 half holidays in every year or of whole holidays in lieu of them, shall not apply to a male young person employed in day and night turns in pursuance of this exception;

And whereas this special exception is by the Act declared to apply to the factories referred to in the said section;

And whereas it has been proved to my satisfaction that in non-textile factories of the class mentioned in the Schedule hereunder it is necessary, by reason of the nature of the business requiring the process to be carried on throughout the night, to employ male young persons of 16 or upwards at night, and that such employment will not injure the health of the male young persons employed;

Now I, the Right Honourable Richard Assheton Cross, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, by this Order, made under Part 2 of the said Act, extend the said exception to factories of such class so far as regards male young persons of 16 or upwards.

This Order shall come into effect on 1st January, 1879, and shall, unless previously revoked, continue in force until 31st December, 1882, and no longer.

Wandsworth and Clapham Union.—Parish of Wandsworth.

To the Churchwardens and Overseers of the Poor of the Parish of Wandsworth, in the county of Surrey.

WHEREAS on the application of the Churchwardens of the parish of Wandsworth, in the county of Surrey, made in pursuance of a resolution of the Vestry of the said parish duly passed on the thirteenth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-one, the Poor Law Board, by an Order dated the twenty-eighth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-one, ordered, amongst other things, that so much of the Act passed in the fourteenth year of the reign of Her Majesty, intituled "An Act to prevent the holding of Vestry or other Meetings in Churches, and for regulating the Appointment of Vestry Clerks," as relates to the appointment of a Vestry Clerk, should be applied to and be put in force within the said Parish;

And whereas at a Meeting of the Vestry of the said Parish, held at the Vestry of All Saints Church, Wandsworth, pursuant to public notice in that behalf, on Thursday, the 19th day of September, 1878, it was resolved,—

"That the Poor Law Board be requested to issue an Order under their Seal of Office, directing that the Act passed on the 5th August, 1850 (13 and 14 Vict. c. 57), entitled 'An Act to prevent the holding of Vestry or other Meetings in Churches, and for regulating the appointment of Vestry Clerks,' shall be applied to and put in force within this Parish as regards that portion of it only which relates to the providing accommodation for holding Vestry Meetings."

"That the Churchwardens and Overseers be and they are hereby authorised, on obtaining the sanction of the Local Government Board, to purchase a piece of land on the north side of the High-street, having a frontage of about 68 feet, and a depth of about 154 feet, for the sum of £2,000, and to erect suitable buildings thereon for the purpose of holding any Vestry and other Meeting for the transaction of any business of or relating to the Parish, at a cost not exceeding £8,000."

"That the Local Government Board be requested to allow the poor rates of the Parish to be charged with the repayment of the sum of £10,000, and interest thereon, by equal half-yearly instalments spread over a period of thirty years."

And whereas the Churchwardens of the said Parish have made application in writing to the Local Government Board, pursuant to the above resolution:

Now, therefore, we, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given to us by the Statutes in that behalf, hereby order as follows:—

ARTICLE I.—So much of the Act passed in the fourteenth year of the reign of Her Majesty, intituled "An Act to prevent the holding of Vestry or other Meetings in Churches, and for regulating the Appointment of Vestry Clerks," as relates to the providing of a room or suitable buildings for the purpose of holding Vestry or other Meetings, shall forthwith be applied to and be put in force within the said Parish of Wandsworth.

ARTICLE II.—The Churchwardens and Overseers of the Poor of the Parish of Wandsworth shall purchase the land referred to in the above-recited resolution, for a sum not exceeding two thousand pounds.

ARTICLE III.—The said land shall be duly conveyed to the Churchwardens and Overseers of the Poor of the said Parish and their successors, and shall, when so conveyed, be appropriated as a site for the erection of a suitable building for the purpose of holding any Vestry or other meetings for the transaction of the business of or relating to the said Parish.

ARTICLE IV.—The said Churchwardens and Overseers shall borrow a sum of money not exceeding two thousand pounds, for the purpose of purchasing the said land, and shall charge the poor rates of the said Parish with the repayment of such sum by equal annual instalments, together with the interest which shall from time to time accrue on the respective balances.

ARTICLE V.—A copy of this Order shall be published in the London Gazette by the said Churchwardens and Overseers.
