Board of Trade, 1, Whitehall, Junuary 13, 1879.

THE Board of Trade have received from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs the following translation of a Notice issued by the Russian Consulate at Galatz, respecting the formalities required on the importation of goods at Russian Ports on the Danube:—

The Imperial Russian Consulate, in conformity with a communication received from the Chief of the Customs at Tobac, gives notice to merchants and captains or masters of vessels that, to avoid fines or confiscation, goods imported by sea to the Russian ports on the Danube should be accompanied by a bill of lading or a manifest, and those imported by land or by river by an invoice in duplicate showing the name of the carrier.

By the provisions of the 403rd Article of the 6th Volume of the Customs' Regulations the bill of lading should show:

1. The name of the sender or of the importer of the goods as well as the name of the person to whom they are addressed.

2. The place of origin and the destination of the goods.

3. The name of the vessel in which the goods are carried, and the name of the captain or master;

cotton, woollen, silk, or other material.

4. The net and the gross amount.

5. The value.

Captains and masters are also obliged to furnish the Custom-house with a list of passengers, and to refuse a passage on board their vessel or steamer to all persons not being Russian subjects whose passports have not been viséd at a Russian Consulate.
