CIRCULAR of the Director-General of the French Customs, received from Her Majesty's Ambassador at Paris :—

(Translation.)

Paris, December 30, 1878.

LAPSE OF THE TREATY OF COMMERCE WITH AUSTRIA.

A TELEGRAM from our Ambassador at Vienna informs the French Government to-day that the negotiations entered upon with Austria-Hungary for the prolongation of the Treaty of Commerce of December 11, 1866, have not been successful.

In default of this extension, our commercial relations with that country will revert from the 1st of January next to the footing of the common law. The products of Austria-Hungary will, in consequence, be subject to the conditions of the general tariff.

The other contracting States will, moreover, cease, on the same date, to enjoy the especial advantages which had been conceded to Austria, and which they only enjoyed in virtue of the clause guaranteeing to them the treatment of the most favoured nation. Their products will then be again placed in the situation in which they were

previously to the Treaty of the 11th December, 1866. This provision applies in particular to sea-going ships, which will in future pay instead of the uniform duty of two francs per ton, the rates specified in the Treaty of 1860 with England. It refers also to the raw materials and manufactured articles employed in the building of merchant ships. The Treaty of the 11th December, 1866, had extended to them the benefits of the law of the 19th May previous. The régime in question, repealed in principle by the law of the 30th January, 1872, was only applicable to arrivals from the contracting countries in virtue of the Franco-Austrian Treaty. It will therefore cease from the 1st of January to be applicable, as far as importation is concerned. For previous importations, the application of the articles to the construction and fitting out of ships will continue to be carried out until the expiration of the periods specified in the tenders.

The table annexed gives the names of the articles on which the rates will be altered.

GENERAL ORDER of the Local Government Board : Altering General Orders : Out-door Labour Test :—

Reading Union.

To the Guardians of the Poor of the Reading Union, in the county of Berks ;—

To the Churchwardens and Overseers of the Poor of the several parishes comprised in the said Union ;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

WE, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given to us by the Statutes in that behalf, hereby order, with respect to the relief of the poor in the Reading Union, in the county of Berks, as follows :—

ARTICLE 1. Every able-bodied male pauper who may receive relief within the Union, and may be relieved out of the Workhouse, with the approbation of the Local Government Board, according to the 6th Article of the Order of the Poor Law Commissioners, dated the 21st day of December, 1844, addressed to the Guardians of the Poor of the said Union, shall be relieved in the following manner ; that is to say :—

Half at least of the relief given to such pauper shall be given in food, clothing, and other articles of necessity.

No such pauper shall receive relief from the Guardians of the Union, or any of their officers, or any Overseer of any parish in the Union, while he is employed for wages or other hire or remuneration by any person ; but every such pauper so relieved shall be set to work by the Guardians.

ARTICLE 2. The Guardians shall within fourteen days after the day when this Order comes into force, and from time to time afterwards as the Local Government Board may require, report to the Local Government Board the place or places at which able-bodied male paupers shall be set to work in the Union, the sort or sorts of work in which they or any of them shall be employed, the times and mode of work, and all such other matters relating to the employment of such able-bodied paupers as the said Guardians shall deem material to be communicated to the Local Government Board, or as the Local Government Board shall require.

ARTICLE 3. If the Guardians of the Union shall depart, in any particular instance, from any of the regulations hereinbefore contained, and shall, within fifteen days after such departure, report the same and the grounds thereof to the Local Government Board, and if the Local Government Board shall approve of such departure, then the relief granted in such particular instance shall, if otherwise lawful, not be deemed to be unlawful, or be subject to be disallowed.

And whereas provision is made in a General Order of the Poor Law Commissioners, bearing date the twenty-fourth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and forty-seven, addressed, among

others, to the Guardians of the Poor of the said Union, for the appointment of an officer, to be termed a Superintendent of Out-door Labour, and for the continuance in office of such officer, and it is expedient to provide for the suspension of such officer on other occasions than those provided for by the last-mentioned Order ;

We therefore further order; that if at any time the number of able-bodied male paupers requiring relief shall be so small as to render the services of such an officer unnecessary, the Guardians may suspend him from the performance of his duties until a further occasion shall arise.
