THE following Addresses and Resolutions of Condolence, on the occasion of the death of Her Royal Highness The Grand Duchess of Hesse, Princess Alice of Great Britain and Ireland, have been transmitted to the Right Honourable Richard Assheton Cross, Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the Home Department, for presentation to the Queen, and have accordingly been presented by him to Her Majesty, who has been pleased to receive the same very graciously :—

To the QUEEN'S Most Excellent Majesty.

Most Gracious Sovereign,

WE, your Majesty's faithful subjects, the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the borough of Portsmouth, in Council, assembled, humbly approach your Majesty with feelings of the deepest sorrow to offer our sincere condolence and sympathy in your Majesty's present sad bereavement, by which your Majesty has lost a loving and affectionate daughter, and the nation a princess, endeared to them by all those virtues and amiable qualities which adorned the character of Her late Serene Highness the Grand Duchess of Hesse Darmstadt.

Her memory will be long cherished ; not less from her excellent personal qualities than by the recollection which we bear of her filial devotion and attention, her anxious care and solicitude throughout the fatal illness which deprived your Majesty of your Royal Consort and the nation of a Prince universally beloved and esteemed for all those high qualities of mind and heart which so eminently distinguished him, the anniversary of whose loss is vividly recalled to us by the sad event which calls forth afresh our sympathy and sorrow.

We fervently pray that in the depths of your Majesty's grief the Almighty Disposer of all things will, in His unbounded mercy, endue your Majesty with that fortitude and resignation under your affliction from which alone real comfort can be derived, and that your Majesty may yet be long spared to sway the sceptre of these realms.

The light will be shown in a north-westerly direction, through an arc of about 6°; the white light should be visible in clear weather from a distance of 9 miles; the coloured lights, 5 miles.

ICE SIGNALS.

When the state of the ice at the stations of Vinga, Elsinore, Sæby, or Frederikshavn is such as to impede the navigation at those places, signals will be shown by means of black tables, hung out on the white painted surface beneath the gallery on the north-west side of Hirtshals Lighthouse.

NOTE.—In order to form correct knowledge of the state of the ice in the Kattegat, the globe signals should be compared with the table signals. When the globe signals indicate that the light-vessels are not at their stations, ice may be met with, whether the table signals are shown or not.

When a white or green light is shown, thereby indicating that Trindelen Light-vessel is not at her station, it is probable that Kobbergrund Light-vessel is also not in position, as this vessel is generally withdrawn earlier than Trindelen Light-vessel. In this case, Knoben Light-vessel will probably have been withdrawn, and the auxiliary light from Anholt Lighthouse will then be shown.

North extreme of Isuburajima (Kosima), N. 87½° E., distant 2½ miles.

Position approximate, lat. 32° 46' 15" N., long. 128° 55' E.

NOTE.—Tobinoko Islet open of the east extreme of Hisaka Sima leads eastward of Keary Rock. The north extremes of Kaba Sima and Isuburajima in line lead to the southward of Keary Rock.

The tides set with considerable velocity in the

vicinity of this danger, great caution should therefore be used when navigating near it.

Applications from persons supposing themselves entitled as Next of Kin should be addressed by letter to "The Under-Secretary of State, War Office, London, S.W.," and marked outside "Soldier's Effects."

No application can be attended to which does not state the date and place of the soldier's birth, enlistment, and death, and the name of his regiment; his regimental number should also be stated if known.

Should these particulars furnished by the applicant not agree with the facts recorded on the War Office documents relating to the deceased soldier, the applicant will be so informed; but should they agree therewith, then within three calendar months the Secretary of State will furnish the applicant with the usual requirements needed for the proof of the alleged relationship.

The application must be authenticated by the signature of the applicant, and his name should be affixed in the presence of the clergyman, or one of the churchwardens of the parish, or a Justice of the Peace; the applicant's address, with the name of the post town, must also be clearly stated. No personal application can receive attention.

Further lists will from time to time be published, and therefore it will facilitate the applicant's inquiries to give the number and date of the notice in which the deceased soldier's name appeared.—EFFECTS, 1877-8.
