WHEREAS by "The Weights and Measures Act, 1878," it is (among other things) provided that the Board of Trade shall from time to time cause such new denominations of Standards, being either equivalent to or multiples or aliquot parts of the imperial weights and measures ascertained by the said Act, as appear to them to be required in addition to those mentioned in the second schedule to the said Act, to be made and duly verified, and that those new denominations of Standards, when approved by Her Majesty in Council, shall be Board of Trade Standards in like manner as if they were mentioned in the said schedule :

And whereas it has been made to appear to the Board of Trade that a new denomination of Standard weight of 100 pounds, being a multiple of the imperial weight of one pound ascertained by the said Act, is required, and they have caused the same to be made and duly verified and deposited in their custody :

And whereas the Board of Trade have given to the said new Standard weight the denomination of "Cental or new Hundred weight" :

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by virtue of the power vested in Her by the said Act, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, is pleased to approve of the "Cental or new Hundred weight" as a new denomination of Standard, and doth direct that the same shall be a Board of Trade Standard in like manner as if it was mentioned in the second schedule to "The Weights and Measures Act, 1878."

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by virtue of the power vested in Her by the said Act, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, is pleased to define that the amount of errors set forth in the schedule hereto may from and after the date of this Order be tolerated in local standards when verified or re-verified by the Board of Trade.

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the first session of the Parliament holden in the first and second years of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "An Act to abridge the holding

"of benefices in plurality, and to make better provision for the residence of the clergy," after reciting that "Whereas in some instances, tithings, hamlets, chapelries, and other places or districts may be separated from the parishes or mother churches to which they belong, with great advantage, and places altogether extra-parochial may in some instances with advantage be annexed to parishes or districts to which they are contiguous, or be constituted separate parishes for ecclesiastical purposes," it is, amongst other things, enacted "That when with respect to his own diocese it shall appear to the Archbishop of the Province, or when the Bishop of any diocese shall represent to the said Archbishop that any such tithing, hamlet, chapelry, place or district within the diocese of such Archbishop, or the diocese of such Bishop, as the case may be, may be advantageously separated from any parish or mother church, and either be constituted a separate benefice by itself or be united to any other parish to which it may be more conveniently annexed, or to any other adjoining tithing, hamlet, chapelry, place, or district, parochial or extra-parochial, so as to form a separate parish or benefice, or that any extra-parochial place may with advantage be annexed to any parish to which it is contiguous, or be constituted a separate parish for ecclesiastical purposes; and the said Archbishop or Bishop shall draw up a scheme in writing (the scheme of such Bishop to be transmitted to the said Archbishop for his consideration) describing the mode in which it appears to him that the alteration may best be effected, and how the changes consequent on such alteration in respect to ecclesiastical jurisdiction, glebe lands, tithes, rent-charges, and other ecclesiastical dues, rates, and payments, and in respect to patronage and rights to pews, may be made with justice to all parties interested; and if the patron or patrons of the benefice or benefices to be affected by such alteration shall consent in writing under his or their hands to such scheme, or to such modification thereof as the said Archbishop may approve, and the said Archbishop shall, on full consideration and enquiry, be satisfied with any such scheme, or modification thereof, and shall certify the same and such consent as aforesaid, by his report to Her Majesty in Council, it shall be lawful for Her Majesty in Council to make an Order for carrying such scheme, or modification thereof, as the case may be, into effect."

And whereas by another Act of Parliament passed in the second and third years of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "An Act to make better provision for the assignment of Ecclesiastical Districts to Churches or Chapels augmented by the Governors of the Bounty of Queen Anne; and for other purposes," it is amongst other things, further enacted "That when, by any Order of Her Majesty in Council as aforesaid, a separate parish for ecclesiastical purposes is constituted, the same shall, on registration thereof, and with the consent, in writing, of the incumbent or incumbents of the benefice or benefices to be thereby affected, become a perpetual curacy and benefice, and the minister thereof, duly nominated and licensed thereto, and his successors, shall be a body politic and corporate, with perpetual succession, and may receive and take to himself and his successors all such lands, tenements, tithes, rent-charges and hereditaments as shall be granted unto him or them, and such perpetual curate shall thenceforth have, within the limits of the district

"parish formed under the Church Building Acts, for the church of such perpetual curacy sole and exclusive cure of souls, and shall not in anywise be subject to the control or interference of the incumbent or incumbents of the benefice or benefices to be affected by such Order, if he or they shall have consented to such Order as aforesaid."

And whereas the Lord Bishop of Winchester hath made a representation in writing to His Grace the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"To the Most Reverend Archibald Campbell, Lord Archbishop of the Province of Canterbury.

I the Right Reverend Edward Harold Lord Bishop of Winchester do hereby represent to your Grace that to the rectory and parish church of Cheriton in the county of Southampton and my diocese of Winchester, belong (amongst other places) two ancient parochial chapelries known by the names of Kilmeston and Beauworth the respective limits and boundaries whereof are well known and defined.

"That according to the census of one thousand eight hundred and seventy-one the population of the parish of Cheriton exclusive of the said chapelries of Kilmeston and Beauworth is nine hundred and ninety-eight and the population of the said two chapelries is three hundred and forty-two.

"That there is in each of the said chapelries a church or chapel both distant from the parish church of Cheriton about two miles and in which churches or chapels Divine service is performed by the incumbent of Cheriton or his curate.

"That baptisms marriages churchings and burials have been from time immemorial and are now solemnized and performed in the churches or chapels of the said chapelries and in the burial grounds thereto respectively belonging.

"That the net annual value of the said rectory of Cheriton with its several chapelries (exclusive of the value of the rectory house at Cheriton) is one thousand four hundred and forty pounds or thereabouts.

"That the patronage of the said rectory and parish church of Cheriton belongs to Her Majesty the Queen and the Reverend Alexander Orr is the present incumbent of the said rectory.

"That it appears to me that under the provisions of the Acts of Parliament passed in the sessions holden in the first and second years of the reign of Her present Majesty chapter 106 and in the second and third years of the same reign chapter 49 the said chapelries of Kilmeston and Beauworth may be advantageously separated from the said rectory and parish church of Cheriton and together be constituted a separate parish for ecclesiastical purposes and a perpetual curacy and benefice which shall be endowed with a clear yearly income of four hundred pounds or thereabouts.

"That pursuant to the direction contained in the twenty-sixth section of the said first-mentioned Act I have prepared the following scheme which together with the consents thereto of the patron and of the incumbent of the said rectory I do submit to your Grace to the intent that your Grace may if on full consideration and inquiry you shall be satisfied with such scheme certify the same and such consent by your report to Her Majesty in Council."

And whereas the scheme and consents mentioned in the said representation are in the words and figures following:—

“The **SCHEME** above referred to.

“That the said chapelries of Kilmeston and Beauworth shall be separated from the said rectory and parish church of Cheriton and together be constituted a separate parish for ecclesiastical purposes and a perpetual curacy and benefice by the name or style of ‘The Perpetual Curacy of Kilmeston with Beauworth,’ of which the church or chapel in the said chapelry of Kilmeston shall be the parish church and the church or chapel of Beauworth shall be a chapel of ease to the said parish church.

“That the proposed separate parish and benefice shall be subject to the same ecclesiastical jurisdiction as the said rectory of Cheriton and the incumbent of such separate parish and benefice shall have exclusive cure of souls within the limits of the same.

“That all the rent-charges in lieu of tithe arising within the limits of the said chapelry of Kilmeston and all such of the rent-charges in lieu of tithe arising within the limits of the said chapelry of Beauworth as are specified in the schedule hereto together with one quarter of an acre or thereabouts of land or ground belonging to the said benefice of Cheriton but situate within the said chapelry of Kilmeston shall henceforth belong and be attached to the said proposed separate benefice of Kilmeston with Beauworth for ever and be held received and enjoyed by the incumbent thereof for the time being.

“That all fees and other ecclesiastical dues and payments for churchings marriages burials and other ecclesiastical offices solemnized and performed within the said proposed separate parish and benefice of Kilmeston with Beauworth and all such other ecclesiastical dues offerings and emoluments usually payable to the incumbent of a parish or benefice as shall arise within the said proposed separate parish or benefice shall belong to the incumbent thereof.

“That the sum of sixty-six pounds two shillings and sixpence to which the said rectory of Cheriton with its chapelries is now liable for first fruits shall be apportioned so that twenty pounds part thereof shall attach to the said proposed new

benefice and the said rectory of Cheriton shall continue to be charged with the remaining forty-six pounds two shillings and sixpence.

“That the yearly tenths amounting to six pounds twelve shillings and three pence which the said rectory of Cheriton with its chapelries is now liable shall be apportioned so that the proposed new benefice shall be liable to the yearly sum of two pounds part thereof and the said rectory of Cheriton shall continue to be liable to the remaining four pounds twelve shillings and three pence.

“That the yearly sum of eighty-one pounds eighteen shillings and eight pence payable to the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England for redeemed land-tax and charged upon the whole endowments of the said rectory of Cheriton and its several chapelries shall with the consent of the said Commissioners testified by their common seal being hereto affixed be henceforth charged exclusively upon the endowments which will remain attached to the said rectory of Cheriton with Tichborne and be payable by the rector thereof for the time being in exoneration of the endowments of the proposed new benefice and of the incumbent of the same.

“That the patronage of or right of nomination to the said proposed separate benefice of Kilmeston with Beauworth shall be vested in Her Majesty Her heirs and successors and shall and may from time to time and at all times thereafter be exercised by the First Lord Commissioner of Her Majesty's Treasury acting on behalf of Her Majesty in right of the Crown.

“That the parishioners of the said proposed separate parish shall not be entitled to accommodation in any other church than the churches of Kilmeston and Beauworth respectively nor shall the parishioners of Cheriton be entitled to any accommodation in the churches or chapels of the said separate benefice except nevertheless any person or persons (if any) possessing a legal right by faculty or otherwise to the exclusive use of any pews or sittings in either of the said churches or chapels and who may not be willing to relinquish and give up the same.

“Given under my hand this thirteenth day of November in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight.

"I the Right Honourable Benjamin Earl of Beaconsfield the patron of or person entitled on behalf of Her Majesty to present to the rectory of Cheriton above-mentioned (in case the same were now vacant) and I the Reverend Alexander Orr the incumbent of the said benefice do hereby severally signify our consent to the scheme above proposed and set forth and to every matter and thing therein contained.

"In witness whereof we have hereunto set our hands this twelfth day of November one thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight.

And whereas the said Lord Archbishop being on full consideration and enquiry satisfied with such scheme hath certified the same and such consents as aforesaid, by his report, to Her Majesty in Council, dated the 14th day of November, 1878, which report is in the words following:—

"To the QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

"We the undersigned Archibald Campbell Lord Archbishop of the province of Canterbury do hereby report to your Majesty in Council that the Right Reverend Edward Harold Lord Bishop of Winchester has represented unto us amongst other things.

"That to the rectory and parish church of Cheriton in the county of Southampton and diocese of Winchester belong (amongst other places) two ancient chapelries known by the names of Kilmeston and Beauworth the respective limits and boundaries whereof are well known and defined.

"That there is in each of the said chapelries a church or chapel both distant from the parish church of Cheriton about two miles.

"That it appears to the said Lord Bishop that the said chapelries of Kilmeston and Beauworth may be advantageously separated from the said rectory and parish church of Cheriton and together be constituted a separate parish for ecclesiastical purposes and a perpetual curacy and benefice.

"That the said Lord Bishop has drawn up a scheme in writing describing the mode in which it appears to him the proposed alterations may best be effected and how the changes consequent on such alterations in respect to ecclesiastical jurisdiction glebe lands tithe rent-charges and other ecclesiastical dues rates and payments and in respect to patronage and rights to pews may be made with justice to all parties interested which scheme together with the consents thereto in writing of the patron and incumbent of the said benefice and parish church of Cheriton has been transmitted by the said Lord Bishop to us for our consideration.

"The representation and scheme of the said Lord Bishop and the consents before referred to are hereunto annexed.

"And we the said Archbishop being on full consideration and enquiry satisfied with the said scheme do hereby pursuant to the Act of Parliament of the 1st and 2nd years of your Majesty's reign certify the same and such consents as aforesaid to your Majesty in Council to the intent that your Majesty in Council may in case your Majesty in Council shall think fit so to do make and issue an Order for carrying the said scheme into effect.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the thirteenth and fourteenth years of Her Majesty, chapter forty-one, and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her Majesty, chapter fifty-five, duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the twelfth day of December, in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England in pursuance of the Act of the thirteenth and fourteenth years of your Majesty chapter forty-one and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of your Majesty chapter fifty-five have prepared and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council the following scheme for setting out and constituting a district for spiritual purposes and annexing such district to the consecrated church of Saint Mary situate at Beswick within the limits of the new parish of Christ Church Bradford (some time part of the original parish of Manchester) in the county of Lancaster and in the diocese of Manchester.

"Whereas it appears to us to be expedient that a district for spiritual purposes should be set out and constituted for and annexed to the said church of Saint Mary situate at Beswick as aforesaid.

"Now therefore with the consent of the Right Reverend James Bishop of the said diocese of Manchester testified by his having signed and sealed this scheme we humbly recommend and propose that all that portion of the said new parish of Christ Church Bradford and also all that contiguous portion of the new parish of All Saints Ancoats (also some time part of the original parish of Manchester aforesaid) all which portions are described in the schedule hereunder written and are delineated and set forth in the map or plan hereunto annexed shall upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme be severed and disannexed from such new parishes respectively and shall be set out and constituted a district for spiritual

purposes for and be annexed to the said church of Saint Mary situated at Beswick as aforesaid and that the same district shall be named 'The District of Saint Mary Beswick.'

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the herein named Acts or of either of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

"The District of Saint Mary Beswick being:—

"All that portion of the new parish of Christ Church Bradford within the original limits of the parish of Manchester in the county of Lancaster and in the diocese of Manchester and also all that contiguous portion of the new parish of All Souls Ancoats also within the original limits of the said parish of Manchester which said portions of such new parishes are comprised within and are bounded by an imaginary line commencing at the point at the centre of Holt Town Bridge which carries Ashton New-road over the River Medlock where the boundary dividing the new parish of Saint Philip Bradford-road within the original limits of the said parish of Manchester from the new parish of Christ Church Bradford aforesaid joins the boundary dividing the last-named new parish from the new parish of All Souls Ancoats aforesaid and extending thence south-eastward along the last-mentioned boundary for a distance of eight chains or thereabouts (thereby following the course of the River Medlock aforesaid) to the point where the same boundary leaves the eastern bank of such river, and extending thence first south-westward and then south-eastward along the eastern bank of the same river for a distance of twenty-five chains or thereabouts to a point upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of All Souls Ancoats from the new parish of Saint Silas Ardwick also within the original limits of the parish of Manchester aforesaid and extending thence north-eastward along the last-mentioned boundary for a distance of four chains or thereabouts (thereby passing to the west of the Ardwick Lime Works) to the junction of the said last-mentioned boundary with the boundary dividing the said new parish of Saint Silas Ardwick from the new parish of Christ Church Bradford aforesaid and extending thence eastward along the last-mentioned boundary for a distance of eleven chains or thereabouts to a point in the middle of the line of the Miles Platting Branch of the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of the said branch line of railway for a distance of twenty-one chains or thereabouts to its junction with the private line of railway called or known as the Beswick Branch Railway and continuing thence still north-eastward along the said private line of railway for a distance of fourteen chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the extra parochial territory called or known as Beswick from the township of Bradford both within the limits of the new parish of Christ Church Bradford aforesaid and extending thence north-westward along the said township boundary for a distance of thirteen chains or thereabouts (thereby crossing the Manchester Stockport and Ashton-under-Lyne Canal at the Lock numbered 5) to the point in the middle of the River Medlock aforesaid where the said township boundary joins the boundary dividing the said new parish of Christ Church Bradford from the new parish of Saint Philip Bradford-road afore-

said and extending thence south-westward along the last-mentioned boundary for a distance of thirty-eight chains or thereabouts (thereby following the middle of the said river to the first described point at the centre of Holt Town Bridge which carries Ashton New-road over the same river at which point the said imaginary line commenced."

And whereas drafts of the said scheme have in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore firstly-mentioned Act, been transmitted to the patrons and to the incumbents of the two cures out of which it is intended that the district recommended in such scheme to be constituted shall be taken, and such patrons and incumbents have respectively signified their assent to such scheme.

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Manchester.

THE following Statutes, made by the Governing Body of Hertford College, in the University of Oxford, on the 10th day of December, 1878, and approved by the University of Oxford Commissioners on the 11th day of January, 1879, have been submitted for the approval of Her Majesty in Council, and notice of their having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions contained in the Act 40 and 41 Vic., cap. 48, entitled "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877."

STATUTES made by the Governing Body of Hertford College, in the University of Oxford, under the provisions of "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877," in relation to certain Scholarships and Exhibitions in the said College.

WE, the Governing Body of Hertford College in the University of Oxford, do hereby make the following Statutes in relation to the Scholarships and Exhibitions founded by the bequests of Henry Lusby, John Meeke, Clerk, William Lucy, Clerk, Dr. Thomas White, Clerk; and Dr. Brunsell, Clerk, and the Scholarship founded as a testimonial to Dr. Macbride, late Principal of Magdalen Hall, hereinafter called the Scholarships and Exhibitions on the foundations of Henry Lusby, John Meeke, William Lucy, Dr. Macbride, Dr. White, and Dr. Brunsell respectively.

1. The annual income of the Scholarships on the foundations of Henry Lusby, John Meeke, William Lucy, and Dr. Macbride shall be applied for the maintenance of Scholars to be called Lusby, Meeke, Lucy, and Macbride Scholars respectively.

2. The Principal of Hertford College shall give at least 30 days' notice to the Head-Master of the Free Grammar School at Worcester of every intended election to any of the Scholarships on the foundation of John Meeke. Candidates educated at the said school shall be entitled to a preference in the election to the said Scholarships.

3. The Principal shall give at least 30 days' notice to the Head-Master of the School at Hampton Lucy of every intended election to any of the Scholarships on the foundation of William Lucy. Candidates educated at the said School at Hampton Lucy shall be entitled to a preference in the election to the said Scholarships.

4. In elections to the Scholarships on the foundations of John Meeke and William Lucy, no person shall be entitled to preference in respect of his having been educated at the Free Grammar School of Worcester, or the school at Hampton Lucy, as the case may be, unless he shall have been educated at such school for two years at least last preceding the election, or last preceding his matriculation at the University.

5. Whenever there shall be no Candidate for a Scholarship on the foundations of John Meeke or William Lucy, who shall be entitled to preference in respect of having been educated at the Free Grammar School of Worcester, or the school at Hampton Lucy, as the case may be, and who in the judgment of the Governing Body of Hertford College shall be of sufficient merit, it shall be lawful for the Governing Body to throw such Scholarship open for that turn to general competition.

6. The Scholarships on the foundations of Henry Lusby, John Meeke, William Lucy, and Dr. Macbride shall be tenable for three years, or such longer time, not exceeding five years in all, as the Governing Body shall, with reference to each vacancy, determine. The number of Scholars on each of the said foundations, and the amounts to be paid to them respectively, shall be such as shall from time to time be determined by the Governing Body.

7. The annual income of the Exhibitions on the foundations of Dr. White and Dr. Brunzell shall be applied to the maintenance of Exhibitors, to be called White and Brunzell Exhibitors respectively.

8. The holders of Exhibitions on the foundations of Dr. White and Dr. Brunzell shall be appointed by the Principal, and shall be persons whom he shall have ascertained to be in need of assistance to support them at the University. The number of Exhibitors on each of the said foundations, the amounts to be paid to the Exhibitors respectively, and the period during which the said Exhibitions shall be tenable, shall be such as shall from time to time be determined by the Principal.

9. The election of the Scholars and Exhibitors hereinbefore mentioned, their discipline, and the conditions of their tenure of the said Scholarships and Exhibitions, shall, save in so far as is herein otherwise expressly provided, be determined and regulated by the general statutes of the College in force from time to time.

10. The provisions herein contained shall be in lieu of and shall supersede the ordinances in relation to certain of the said Scholarships and Exhibitions framed by the Commissioners appointed for the purposes of the Act 17 and 18 Vict., cap. 81, and the provisions or terms of the foundations of the said Scholarships and Exhibitions, provided that nothing herein contained shall affect the interests of any Scholars or Exhibitors heretofore elected.
