"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The Consolidated Chapelry of the Holy Trinity, Harrow Green, Leytonstone, being:—

"All that portion of the district parish of Leytonstone in the county of Essex and in the diocese of Saint Albans and also all those contiguous portions of the parish of Leyton, of the parish of Wanstead of the parish of West Ham, and of the new parish of Saint Paul Stratford New Town all in the county and diocese aforesaid which said portions of such cures are comprised within and are bounded by an imaginary line commencing at the point where the boundary dividing the said parish of Leyton from the new parish of Homerton in the county of Middlesex and in the diocese of London joins the boundary dividing the last-named new parish from the new parish of Saint Paul Stratford New Town aforesaid, such point being in the middle of the Waterworks River, a little to the south of Temple Mills Bridge and extending thence first southward for a distance of four chains or thereabouts along the last-mentioned boundary thereby following the course of the said Waterworks River, to the point where the same river is joined by Channel Sea River, and where the said last-mentioned boundary joins the boundary dividing the said new parish of Homerton from a certain portion of the parish of West Ham aforesaid and continuing thence still southward for a distance of eight and a half chains or thereabouts along the last-mentioned boundary thereby continuing to follow the course of the said Waterworks River to the point where the same river is joined by Potter's Ditch, and where the said last-mentioned boundary joins the boundary dividing the said new parish of Homerton from a certain detached portion of the parish of Wanstead aforesaid, and containing thence still southward for a distance of nine and a half chains or thereabouts along the last-mentioned boundary thereby still continuing to follow the course of the Waterworks River aforesaid, to the point where the said last-mentioned boundary is joined by the boundary dividing the said detached portion of the parish of Wanstead aforesaid from the new parish of Stratford Marsh in the said county of Essex and in the diocese of Saint Albans aforesaid and extending thence first eastward and then southward along the last-mentioned boundary for a distance of seven chains or thereabouts thereby following in the last-named direction the course of the Channel Sea River aforesaid to the point where the said last-mentioned boundary joins the boundary dividing the said detached portion of the parish of Wanstead aforesaid from the new parish of Saint Paul Stratford New Town aforesaid and extending thence first eastward, then north-eastward then south-westward and finally northward along the last-mentioned boundary for a distance of fifty chains or thereabouts to a point in the middle of the western end of a certain roadway leading into Temple Mills-lane and extending thence eastward from the said last-mentioned boundary along the middle of the said roadway for a distance of three and a half-chains or thereabouts to a point at the junction of the same roadway with Temple Mills-lane aforesaid upon the boundary dividing the said new parish of Saint Paul Stratford New Town from the main body of the parish of Wanstead aforesaid and continuing

thence first eastward and then southward along the last-mentioned boundary for a distance of fifty-six chains or thereabouts (thereby following in one part the course of Temple Mills-lane aforesaid in another part the course of Cut Throat-lane and in another part the course of Leytonstone-road) to the point where the last-mentioned boundary is joined by the boundary dividing the said parish of Wanstead from the new parish of Saint John Stratford, in the county and diocese aforesaid and extending thence first eastward and then south-eastward along the last mentioned boundary for a distance of thirteen chains or thereabouts to the point where the same last-mentioned boundary is joined by the boundary dividing the said parish of Wanstead from the new parish of Forest Gate in the county and diocese aforesaid and extending thence generally north-eastward along the last-mentioned boundary for a distance of sixty-two chains or thereabouts, to the point near Graydon Cottage where the same boundary strikes the western boundary of the common land called or known as Wanstead Flats and extending thence first northward then westward then southward then again westward and finally north-westward along the said western boundary of the said common land, for a distance of forty-seven chains or thereabouts (thereby following in part the course of Harrow-road) to the boundary which divides the said parish of Wanstead from the district parish of Leytonstone aforesaid and extending thence first westward and then south-westward along the last-mentioned boundary for a distance of nineteen chains or thereabouts (thereby following the southern side of the said Harrow-road) to the point where the same boundary leaves the last-named road and continuing thence still south-westward along the south-eastern side of the same road for a distance of nine chains or thereabouts to the point at Harrow Green where the same road is joined by the road or lane which passes across the north-eastern side of the said Harrow Green and extending thence north-westward along the middle of the last-mentioned road or lane for a distance of three chains or thereabouts to its junction at the northern corner of Harrow Green aforesaid with the Leytonstone High-road and extending thence south-westward along the middle of the said high road from a distance of two and three quarters chains or thereabouts to its junction with Cathall-road and extending thence north-westward along the middle of the last-named road for a distance of thirty chains or thereabouts (thereby crossing the line of the Woodford and Loughton Branch of the Great Eastern Railway) to a point at the junction of the same road with Grove Green-lane upon the boundary which divides the said district parish of Leytonstone from the parish of Leyton aforesaid, and extending thence south-westward along the last-mentioned boundary for a distance of twenty-chains or thereabouts (thereby following the course of Grove Green-lane aforesaid) to the point where the same boundary bends sharply to the south-east at the junction of the last-named lane with Union House-lane, and continuing thence that is from the said last-mentioned boundary still south-westward along the middle of Grove Green-lane aforesaid for a distance of six chains or thereabouts to its junction with Leyton-road and extending thence north-westward along the middle of the last-named road for a distance of three chains or thereabouts to its junction with Quatermile-lane and extending thence south-westward along the middle of the last-named lane for a distance of twenty chains or thereabouts to its junction at Ruckholt Farm with Temple
