**THE SHIPS' COWS AND GOATS ORDER.**

**A**T the Council Chamber, Whitehall, the 13th day of February, 1879.

By the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

**T**HE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, (in this Order referred to as the Act of 1878,) and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. This Order may be cited as The Ships' Cows and Goats Order.
2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the making thereof; and words in this Order have the same meaning as in The Foreign Animals Order.
3. This Order extends to Great Britain only.
4. Unless and until the Privy Council otherwise order, a cow or goat taken on board a
