THE following Despatches have been received at the India Office:—

From Major-General F. S. Roberts, C.B., V.C. Commanding Kuram Column, dated 16th December, 1878, to the Quartermaster-General in India.

I HAVE the honour to submit, for the information of his Excellency the Commander-in-Chief and of the Government in India, the following report of the reconnaissance which I have lately made to the summit of the Shutar Gardan Pass.

2. I may be allowed to state that I considered it very desirable to complete the defeat which the Afghan Army had suffered on the 2nd instant by marching troops to the Shutar Gardan, as this movement would show the determination of the British Government to establish its power to the watershed of the Kuram Basin, and would moreover be likely to bring over to our side the Ahmadzai section of the great Ghilzai tribe, who were believed to be willing to join us if they saw clear evidence of our intention to remain in the country.

3. It was also very important, from a military point of view, to obtain an exact knowledge of the present nature of the road from Ali Kheyl to the Shutar Gardan, which would form the route of the Kuram Field Force should it advance towards Cabul next spring.

4. These considerations, and the settled appearance of the weather, determined me to make this reconnaissance, although the season was far advanced, the cold intense, and the troops fatigued from previous hard marching and exposure.

As the head men of the Ghilzai were known to be in Cabul, and as the route for some distance lay in Ghilzai territory, I sent messengers in advance of the column and took every means to keep myself informed of the state of affairs in our front.

6. It will be remembered that after the capture of the Peiwar Kotal height on the 2nd December,

the troops remained halted at Zabardast Killa to allow of the large stores of ammunition and supplies which had been abandoned by the enemy being collected and sent to the rear.

7. On the 6th December the following troops marched under my command to Ali Kheyl:—

4 guns F-A Royal Horse Artillery on elephants.

No. 1 Mountain Battery.

Wing 72nd Highlanders.

5th Goorkhas.

2nd Punjab Infantry.

5th Punjab Infantry.

23rd Pioneers.

8. On the 7th December, leaving the remainder of the troops at Ali Kheyl, I marched with the following reconnoitring column to Rokian:—

No. 1 Mountain Battery.

250 men 72nd Highlanders.

250 men 5th Goorkhas.

The 2nd Punjab Infantry and 5th Punjab Infantry being ordered to follow us to Rokian the next day, and halt there as a support.

9. On the 8th instant the reconnoitring column moved to two miles beyond Jaji-Thana.

10. On the 9th December, I left the camp standing in charge of 100 men from the detachments of the 72nd Highlanders and 5th Goorkhas, and marched to the top of the Shutar Gardan, returning to camp in the evening.

11. The next day the troops returned to Ali Kheyl.

12. The road from Ali Kheyl to the foot of the Surkai Kotal lies in the bed of the Hazar-darakht torrent, sometimes ascending for a short distance the hill-side, but as a rule passing over the rough stony bed of the nullah. The ascent is gradual throughout, and it would not be difficult at this season of the year to make the route passable for wheeled carriages. From Ali Kheyl to Rokian the valley is wide and well cultivated, and several villages are met with. Beyond Rokian there are no habitations of any sort, except the police-station at Jaji Thana, and the valley varies in width from a defile of 200 yards, with high precipitous sides, to an open valley bounded by sloping hills of comparatively easy accessibility, and of about half a mile or less in breadth.

During the summer months, when the stream is full of water from the melting snows, the passage of this route by troops would no doubt be more difficult than it is in the winter, but I can see no reason why it should not be always practicable, and as a matter of fact we know that caravans of camels do traverse this road at all seasons of the year. The force of the stream when in flood must be considerable, as its bed is now strewn with large rocks and trunks of trees that have been washed down from above, and it has cut its way at some places through thick beds of hard conglomerate.

The sides of the valley from Rokian to the Surkai Kotal are sparsely clothed with weather-beaten juniper trees, with a few deodars scattered amongst them, but in no place is the forest thick enough to impede military operations.

At Surkai Kotal the road leaves the river bed and mounts by a short but steep zig-zag ascent up the northern side of the valley. It then passes round a hill on which is perched a watch tower of the Ghilzais, and enters an open valley devoid of trees, and presenting an altogether Thibetan aspect of sterile desolation. Crossing the plain the road passes through the small hamlet of Kasim Kheyl, and winds through rounded open hills by the side of a now frozen torrent, and by a

gentle ascent to the summit of the pass. At no place in this part of the route would there be any great difficulty for the passage of wheeled guns.

13. The view from the pass towards Cabul is very extensive and commands the whole of the valley of the upper Sagar, which was seen to be richly cultivated and thickly studded with villages; but the country had assumed its wintry aspect, and the colouring of the landscape was entirely composed of various shades of brown and red.

14. I was met near Jaji Thana by the Ghilzai officials of the Surkai Thana, who tendered their submission to the British Government, and accompanied me throughout the day's journey. The inhabitants of Kasim Kheyl also welcomed the approach of the troops, and preceded our party up the pass.

15. The troops remained halted near Kasim Kheyl, and for the remaining two miles, to the top of the pass, our escort entirely consisted of friendly Ghilzais, lately the subjects and officials of the Amir.

16. The top of the pass was found (by aneroid) to be 11,200 feet above sea level, and not 13,500 feet as had been previously estimated.

17. Throughout the march from Ali Kheyl to the Shutar Gardan and back again, we experienced no hostile demonstration of any kind, nor was a shot fired.

18. The marching was fatiguing for the troops, and the cold was very severe. The thermometer stood 5° Fahr. at seven A.M. at the camping ground near Jaji Thana, being 27° of frost.

19. The cheerfulness and spirit of the troops have never flagged in spite of the hardship they endured, and I desire again to bear witness to the high military spirit which animates the officers and soldiers of this force.

I HAVE the honour to submit, for the information of his Excellency the Commander-in-Chief and of the Government of India, the following report of the march of a brigade of troops under my command from Ali Kheyl to Fort Kuram.

2. It had been ascertained that, besides the regular route through the Peiwar Kotal, two roads connected these above-mentioned places, one following the course of the Hazar-darakht stream till its junction with the Kuram, and then passing down the valley of that river; the other cutting off the angle thus formed by crossing the range of hills, which at this point runs south from the peak Sita Ram.

3. As it was important to have an exact knowledge of the lines of communications between the Kuram Valley proper and the Trans-Peiwar district of Hariab in which Ali Kheyl is situated, I determined to explore one of those alternative routes.

4. I selected that which passed through the hills—first because it was the shorter of the two, and secondly, because it had been used by the Amir three years ago when sending a mountain battery to Fort Kuram.

5. The route was described as easily practicable for camels, and was known to be entirely in the territories of the Jagi and Chakmani tribes, whose head men were in camp.

6. On the 12th December the following troops

marched from Ali Kheyl for the village of Sapari:—

No. 1 Mountain Battery.

Wing 72nd Highlanders.

5th Goorkhas.

23rd Pioneers.

7. The route lay for the first four miles along the river valley, and then turned sharp to the left, leading up a narrow glen thickly wooded with pine trees (chiefly the edible pine), till an open elevated plateau was reached on which stood the hamlet of Sapari.

8. When I arrived at the village of Karmanah, about three miles from Ali Kheyl, the head men came to pay their respects, and informed me that it was probable the force would be annoyed by the men of the Mangal tribe when passing through the defile which lay between Sapari and the next halting place Kiraiyah, on the Kuram River.

9. Although I was anxious not to come to blows with the Mangals, yet it was now too late to turn back. I therefore determined to occupy the head of the defile that evening, and to march early the next morning, so as to get as much baggage as possible over the Kotal before the Mangals should have time to collect.

10. The 23rd Pioneers accordingly bivouacked for the night at the head of the pass, which was about 2½ miles beyond our camp at Sapari, and at two A.M. on the morning of the 13th December the baggage was sent on in advance of the column in charge of Captain F. T. Goad, Assistant Superintendent of Transport.

11. Although it was a bright moonlight night, the camels were able to make but slow progress owing to the steepness of the ascent, and at daylight not a single camel had reached the summit of the pass, though all the mules had crossed over. The camels were much delayed by their slipping on the frozen surface of a stream which frequently crossed the road.

12. Being desirous that the progress of the column should not be delayed, I directed four companies of the 23rd Pioneers to form the advance guard and the remainder of the regiment to assist in guarding that part of the baggage which had already crossed the Kotal. The 5th Goorkhas were ordered to act as rear guard, and the 72nd Highlanders and No. 1 Mountain Battery were passed to the front.

13. I proceeded myself with the 23rd Pioneers. We observed a few men moving about the hill tops, but no shot was fired at us, though their hostility was shown by their cutting down two camp-followers of the 23rd Pioneers, who had unfortunately lingered behind the baggage guard.

14. About 11 A.M. the last of the camels had passed over the Kotal, and as the long column of animals was descending the steep and narrow valley, the Mangals (of whom nearly a hundred men had now collected, and who subsequently increased considerably in number) commenced firing into the baggage-guards and pressing the 5th Goorkhas.

15. From this time till nearly four P.M., when the column cleared the hills, the Mangals never ceased annoying the rear guard, and sometimes became so bold in their attacks as to oblige the Goorkhas to charge up the hill and drive them back.

16. It was about this time that Captain Goad, who had been most active in keeping order in the baggage train, received the wound from the effects of which I deeply regret to say he subsequently died. I desire here to record the high value which I placed on the services of this officer. Belonging to the 5th Regiment of the Infantry of the Hyderabad Contingent, Captain Goad volunteered for active service, and owing to his experience of

transport work, and to his natural ability and zeal, he had already rendered most valuable aid in the difficult task of organizing the transport trains. I much deplore his death, both personally, and on account of the loss which the public service has sustained.

17. The conduct and steady behaviour of the 5th Goorkhas on this occasion merit my warmest commendations. For nearly five hours this regiment maintained a rear guard fight over most difficult ground, with a bold and active enemy thoroughly acquainted with the locality; and so successfully was their duty performed, that not a single baggage animal or load was lost. It is therefore my pleasure and my duty to bring the gallant conduct of this fine regiment once more to the special notice of his Excellency and of the Government of India.

18. The British officers present with the corps on this occasion were Major A. FitzHugh, Commanding, Captain J. Cook, Captain C. F. Powell, Lieutenant A. R. Martin, Lieutenant C. C. Lucas, and Surgeon-Major G. Farrell. All these officers set an excellent example to their men, and were, Major FitzHugh reports, ably seconded by the native officers and non-commissioned officers.

19. But the 5th Goorkhas did not perform their duty without sustaining severe loss. Captain C. F. Powell, who was most forward and gallant in the fight, was very severely wounded; three Goorkha sepoy were killed, and eleven wounded, of whom one has since died. The whole force mourns the loss of these brave men.

20. Valuable service was also rendered by some men of the 72nd Highlanders (especially by Sergeant William Greer) who were on baggage guard, and who by their cool behaviour and excellent shooting did much to keep back the enemy.

21. The whole of the baggage and rear guard had cleared the hills before night-fall.

22. On the 14th December, Field Force headquarters moved to Kuram Fort, but I left the troops in camp at Kharaiah, pending the result of enquiries which I have caused to be made by the Political Officers attached to the column, regarding the possibility of punishing the Mangal tribes for the attack made on us.

23. I may add that from the fact of an Enfield rifle having been picked up in the Pass, and from a few of the men being partially dressed in uniform, it is probable that the attack was incited and shared in by some of the refugees from the Amir's troops, who were driven out of the Peiwar Kotal position on the 2nd instant.

24. The road from Kharaiah to Kuram Fort lies entirely along the left bank of the river, and presents no features worthy of report.

25. The Kotal and defile of Sapari are now ascertained to be unsuited for the passage of convoys or troops with camel carriage. Infantry and mountain guns could traverse the route, though the natural features of the ground would always make it difficult to force a passage if the defile were held by an enemy.

THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a translation of an Italian Maritime Health Ordinance, which is as follows:—

1879.—ORDINANCE OF MARITIME HEALTH.

No. 3.

THE Minister of the Interior:—

In view of the Law upon Public Health of the 20th of March, 1865, § C., and the Instructions of the 26th of December, 1871:

In view of the Ordinances of Maritime Health Nos. 5 and 6, of the 14th and 29th of April, 1878, by which the importation into the kingdom of rags, old clothes, and unwashed linen coming from the ports of the Black Sea and Sea of Azov, of the Ottoman Empire, of Greece and Montenegro, was prohibited;

In view of the Ordinance of the 3rd instant, No. 2, by which a rigorous quarantine of seven days was imposed upon ships coming from the Black Sea and the Sea of Azov;

Decrees:—

ART. 1. The quarantine of seven days imposed by the above-mentioned Ordinance of the 3rd instant, for arrivals from the Black Sea and Sea of Azov, is prolonged to twenty days, and is from to-day extended to arrivals from the ports of Greece, Montenegro, and the Ottoman Empire, including Egypt, Tripoli, and Tunis.

ART. 2. The prohibition of the importation into the kingdom of rags, old clothes, and unwashed linen, prescribed by the above-mentioned Ordinances Nos. 5 and 6 of 1878, is from to-day extended, as regards arrivals from places men-

tioned in the preceding Article, to the following objects:—

a. Furs and furriers' stuff, skins and leather of all sorts.

b. Bladders and entrails, fresh and prepared, feathers, bristles, hair, and all animal produce in general.

c. Dried, salted, or smoked fish, and its produce.

d. Hair, silk stuff, silk cuttings, and refuse of paper.

e. Felt, wool, and cotton.

ART. 3. The Ministry reserves to itself the right of determining, according to circumstances, the treatment to be applied to merchandize which may have left the above-mentioned ports before the 4th instant, as also of admitting, in an exceptional manner, even in future, to the lazarettos which may be properly adapted for the purpose, the less susceptible kinds of merchandize, after the disinfection which may be prescribed.

The Prefects of the Maritime Provinces of the kingdom are charged with the execution of the present Ordinance.

THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs information to the effect that—on account of the epidemic diseases which have made their appearance in Russia and Turkey, and in order to prevent quarantine being established against France by other countries—the French Government have decided that vessels arriving in French ports from the Black Sea or any part of the Ottoman Empire are to be considered and treated as *suspected*, until further orders.

Such vessels will in consequence be subjected, even when they have clean bills of health, to the regulations which apply to vessels having foul bills of health because of plague.

The following is a translation of the regulations in question:—

A.—Sanitary Measures applicable in Mediterranean Ports to Vessels coming from Countries where Plague exists.

1. Suspected Vessels.

Vessels which are *suspected* (Article 36 of the General Regulations), that is on board of which there has been no case of plague during the voyage, are subject to a quarantine which can be passed only at a port having a lazaretto.

For persons there will be a quarantine of observation, lasting from five to ten days, to be passed either at the lazaretto, or, if there is not room there, on board.

Unloading of cargo for sanitary purposes, and disinfection of personal effects and susceptible goods, as well as of the vessel itself, are obligatory.

For persons staying on board during the unloading there will be a quarantine lasting from five to ten days, and commencing only after the disinfection of the vessel has been completed.

2. Infected Vessels.

As regards vessels having had, or still having, cases of plague on board (Article 36 of the General Regulations), if there are cases of sickness they are to be immediately sent to the lazaretto; and persons not sick are subject to a quarantine of

from ten to fifteen days, counting from the time of their entering the lazaretto.

Unloading of cargo for sanitary purposes, and the most complete disinfection possible of personal effects and susceptible goods, as well as of the vessel itself, are to be rigorously enforced.

For persons staying on board there will be a quarantine lasting from ten to fifteen days, and commencing only after the disinfection of the vessel has been completed.

B.—Sanitary Measures applicable in Ports on the Atlantic and the Channel to Vessels coming from Countries where Plague exists.

1. Suspected Vessels.

Vessels in this category (Article 36 of the General Regulations), that is on board of which there has been no case of plague during the voyage, are subject to a quarantine to be passed, as far as practicable, at a port having a lazaretto.

For persons there will be a quarantine of observation lasting from three to five days, to be passed either at the lazaretto or on board.

Disinfection of personal effects and susceptible goods, as well as of the vessel itself, together with unloading of cargo for sanitary purposes, are obligatory.

For persons staying on board during the unloading there will be a quarantine lasting from three to five days, and commencing only after the disinfection of the vessel has been completed.

2. Infected Vessels.

As regards vessels having had, or still having, cases of plague on board (Article 36 of the General Regulations), if there are cases of sickness they are to be immediately sent to the lazaretto, and persons not sick are subject to a quarantine of from five to ten days, counting from the time of their entering the lazaretto.

Unloading of cargo for sanitary purposes, and the most complete disinfection possible of personal effects and susceptible goods, as well as of the vessel itself, are to be rigorously enforced.

THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Acting Consul at Trieste, reporting that, in addition to the restrictions imposed upon commerce by the Maritime Circular No. 974 issued by the Austro-Hungarian Government, the following precautionary measures have been adopted by that Government, in consequence of the appearance of plague in Russia:—

Passengers coming from Russia by sea are not permitted to land until twenty days have elapsed from the date of their leaving the last Russian port at which the vessel touched.

The clothes and linen of such passengers, and all woollen goods which have not passed through a cleansing process during manufacture, are to be subjected to disinfection by the fumes of sulphur for three hours in a closed building.

The coverings in which woollen goods are packed are, in every case, whether the wool has been previously cleansed or not, to be disinfected in a solution of carbolic acid of a strength of 2 per cent.

All Austro-Hungarian ships bound to Austro-Hungarian ports are strictly prohibited from loading any of the goods mentioned in paragraph 1 of the Circular No. 974.

The Circular No. 974 above referred to was published in the London Gazette of the 14th instant.

The translation is as follows:—

ORDER of the Ministry of the Interior, dated 9th February, 1879, publishing further Regulations with respect to the permission to Travellers from Russia to cross the Frontiers of the Monarchy.

In continuation of the Order of the Ministry of the Interior, dated the 2nd of February, 1879, respecting the conditions upon which permission is granted to travellers from Russia to cross the frontiers of the monarchy, the following further regulations are published in accordance with an understanding with the I. and R. Ministry for Foreign Affairs and the Royal Hungarian Government:—

The declaration required in the Order above referred to, as to the residence of the holder of the passport in unsuspected territory within the last 20 days, must be provided with the visa of the I. and R. Embassy, or of an I. and R. Consular Officer in Russia.

The I. and R. representatives in Russia are at the same time empowered to insert this declaration upon the passport.

In order to obtain the declaration on the visa of it on the part of the above-mentioned representatives, the information as to the required residence in unsuspected territory is to be proved in a credible manner.

This Order, with respect to the power given to the I. and R. representatives to insert the declaration, comes into immediate operation, but in other points eight days after its promulgation.

THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs copies of Despatches from Her Majesty's Consul at Copenhagen, reporting that the Government of Denmark

have declared all ports in the Black Sea and Sea of Azov to be "suspected of plague."

In consequence of this declaration, all vessels arriving in Danish waters from any of the above ports, or which may have communicated during their voyage with vessels from any of those ports, will be subject to quarantine.

The Danish Government have adopted the following measures with regard to quarantine:—

Quarantine Inspectors will be stationed along the coast at distances of about nine miles from each other.

Except in urgent cases, no communication with the shore will be permitted in respect of either persons or goods from vessels arriving from places suspected of plague, unless the vessels have a clean bill of health from some Danish port.

Every vessel arriving in a Danish port from a suspected place will be subjected to quarantine observation, and every shipmaster will, immediately on arrival, be questioned by the Quarantine Inspector as to the incidents of the voyage.

Should the vessel have come from a clean port, and have had neither sickness nor death on board during the voyage, and should she not have communicated with any other vessel on the way, the crew may be allowed to land; and if, in other respects there is no cause for suspicion, she shall be admitted to free pratique.

On the other hand, should anything have occurred during the voyage to make the master suppose that his vessel may be suspected he shall hoist a green flag on arrival in Danish waters. In order to assist masters in doing this, Danish pilots are to be provided with suitable green flags when at sea.

The Quarantine Inspector will examine the master and the vessel's papers, and decide whether the vessel shall be placed in strict quarantine, or kept under observation on the spot, or admitted to free pratique.

Conformably to an understanding come to with the Swedish and Norwegian Governments strict quarantine is to be undergone at the quarantine station at Kansö, near Gothenburg.

The nature of the quarantine to be imposed on any vessel will depend to a great extent upon the character of the goods on board.
