WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the sixteenth and seventeenth years of Her Majesty, chapter fifty, and of the Act of the twenty-third and twenty-fourth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and twenty-four, duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the sixteenth day of January, in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine, in the words and figures following; that is to say:

" We the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England in pursuance of the Act of the sixteenth and seventeenth years of your Majesty chapter fifty; and of the Act of the twenty-third and twenty-fourth years of your Majesty chapter one hundred and twenty-four have prepared and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council the following scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to a certain benefice namely, the church and cure of Bluntisham (being a rectory) cum Earith (being a chapelry in the parish of Bluntisham) in the county of Huntingdon and in the diocese of Ely by way of exchange for

the ownership of the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to each of five other several benefices all of which are in the diocese of Peterborough namely, the cure (being a rectory) of Daventry in the county of Northampton which cure has two churches the parish church of Holy Cross and the chapel of ease of Saint James, and the church and cure (being a perpetual curacy or a vicarage) of Market Harborough in the county of Leicester and the church and the church and cure (being a perpetual curacy or a vicarage) of Great Bowden in the said county of Leicester and the church and cure (being a vicarage) of Ravensthorpe in the said county of Northampton and the two churches and cure of Badby (being a vicarage) cum Newnham (being an ancient chapelry in the parish of Badby) in the said county of Northampton.

" Whereas the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Bluntisham cum Earith in the diocese of Ely is vested in the Bishop of the diocese of Peterborough for the time being.

" And whereas the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to each of the said five benefices of Daventry, Market Harborough Great Bowden, Ravensthorpe and Badby cum Newnham is vested in the Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral Church of Christ in Oxford of the foundation of King Henry the Eighth and in their successors.

" And whereas the Right Reverend William Connor now Bishop of the said diocese of Peterborough and the said Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral Church of Christ in Oxford have respectively signified to us their desire that the patronage of the said six several benefices may be assigned and transferred by way of exchange in manner hereinafter recommended and proposed.

" And whereas we have made due enquiry and calculation as to the circumstances and relative values of the said benefices and patronage and we do hereby certify to your Majesty that the circumstances and present values of the said benefices respectively are as set forth in the schedule hereto annexed.
