At half-past Twelve o'clock Her Royal Highness the Bride, accompanied by Her Supporters, Her Father, His Royal Highness The Prince Frederick Charles of Prussia, G.C.B., and His Imperial and Royal Highness the Crown Prince of Germany and of Prussia, K.G., and the respective Suites of Their Royal Highnesses, proceeded in Carriages from the Queen's Entrance of the Castle to the West Entrance of St. George's Chapel, attended by the Captain's Escort of the Royal Horse Guards, in the following order:—
