A Guard of Honour of the Second Battalion of Coldstream Guards mounted in the Quadrangle, opposite the Principal Entrance of Windsor Castle, under the command of Lieutenant-Colonel Sterling, and remained until after the departure of the Bride and Bridegroom for Claremont.

A Guard of Honour of the First Battalion of the Rifle Brigade also mounted at St. George's Chapel, under the command of Captain E. A. P. Burnell.

The Castle Guard, furnished by the Second Battalion of Coldstream Guards, formed up to the left of the Guard of Honour, at St. George's Chapel, under the command of Lieutenant the Honourable E. Dawnay.

A Royal Salute was fired at the conclusion of the Service by a Battery of the Royal Horse Artillery, stationed in the Long Walk, under the command of Major Nicholson.

The Ladies invited to the Chapel wore Full Dress with Plumes. Those in the Procession Full Dress, with Plumes and Trains.

The Gentlemen wore Uniform, or Full Dress Coat with Trousers.

The Knights of the several Orders present wore their respective Collars.

The Route for all the Carriage Processions was through George the Fourth's Gate, down the Castle Hill, and through Henry the Eighth's Gate, and the Carriage Processions returned to the Castle by the same route.

The line of the Procession from Windsor Castle to St. George's Chapel was kept by the Second Battalion of Coldstream Guards, under the command of Colonel G. R. Fitzroy, and by the Berkshire Volunteers under the command of Lieutenant-Colonel R. Loyd-Lindsay, V.C.

At Four o'clock, Their Royal Highnesses, The Bride and Bridegroom, attended by The Lady Adela Larking and Captain Alfred Egerton, left the Queen's Entrance of Windsor Castle for Claremont, escorted, as far as Chertsey, by Travelling Escorts of the Royal Horse Guards, commanded by Lieutenents Loyd F. Somerset and Classicane by Lieutenants Lord E. Somerset and Gascoigne.

A Special Train for Her Majesty's Guests left the Paddington Station of the Great Western Railway for Windsor, at 10.35 A.M., and returned from Windsor at 3.10 and 4.10 P.M.
