

NOTE.—In cases in which for the performance of any duty a fee involving the payment of a fraction of a penny is to be paid, the officer may receive in discharge of the fee so payable a stamp or stamps denoting the nearest penny below the amount so payable omitting the said fraction. Provided that where duties have to be performed for the same person and at the same time which involve the payment of several fractions the omission of the fraction shall only be made on the sum of such fractions. *For example—*

Knutsford Light and Water.

(Application to Parliament to sanction a Petition for Additional Provisions for the Compulsory Purchase of Lands in the Parishes of Moberley and Nether Knutsford, otherwise Knutsford Inferior, both in the county of Chester.)

NOTICE is hereby given, that application is intended to be made to the House of Commons in the present session by petition, as soon as the forms of the House will permit, for leave to introduce into the Knutsford Light and Water Bill (hereinafter referred to as "the Bill") now pending in that House, additional provisions for the following objects, that is to say:—

To confer upon the Company to be incorporated by the Bill power to purchase compulsorily the following lands, for the purposes of their undertaking, that is to say—

A plot of land forming the site of the existing gasworks of the Knutsford Gas and Water Company Limited, containing by admeasurement 3238 $\frac{1}{2}$  square yards, or thereabouts, and bounded on the south-west by land belonging or reputed to belong to the representatives of the late George Cornwall Legh, Esq., and Mr. John Ogden, or some or one of them; on the north-west, by land belonging to the said Company, and by land belonging or reputed to belong to Mr. Tom Cyrus Turner, and on the other sides by land belonging or reputed to belong to the Right Honourable Lord Egerton of Tatton, which said plot of land above described is situate in the parish of Nether Knutsford, otherwise Knutsford Inferior, in the county of Chester, and is now in the occupation of the said Company.

A plot of land, or land covered with water, and certain other lands adjacent thereto, containing in the whole by admeasurement ten acres two roods and eleven perches, statute measure, or thereabouts, and bounded, as to the whole of such lands, on the north by the public highway leading from Knutsford, in the said county of Chester, to Moberley, in the said county of Chester; on the west by land belonging or reputed to belong to the Knutsford Estates Company Limited and the Knutsford Brick and Tile Company Limited, or one of them; on the south partly by land belonging or reputed to belong to the said Knutsford Estates Company Limited, and partly by land belonging to or reputed to belong to John Pennington Legh, Esq., and his trustees, or some or one of them; and on the east by land belonging or reputed to belong to the said John Pennington Legh and his trustees, or some or one of

them; and which said lands, bounded as aforesaid, are situated partly in the said parish of Moberley, and partly in the said parish of Nether Knutsford, otherwise Knutsford Inferior.
