

that is to say :—All annual sum and sums of money due and payable to the vicar of the said parish of Bayvil by virtue of the award made by the apportionment of the rent-charge in lieu of tithes in the said parish to be paid to the vicar for the time being thereof instead of all the tithes other than the tithes of corn grain pulse hay milk wool and lambs arising from and accruing due upon all the titheable lands including the glebe lands of the said parish.
