REGULATIONS

TO BE OBSERVED AT THE QUEEN'S DRAWING ROOMS AT BUCKINGHAM PALACE.

By Her Majesty's Command,

The Ladies, who propose to attend Her Majesty's Drawing Rooms, at Buckingham Palace, are requested to bring with them two large cards with their names *clearly written* thereon, one to be left with the Queen's Page in Attendance, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to The Queen.

PRESENTATIONS.

Any Lady who proposes to be presented to The Queen must leave at the Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace, *before twelve o'clock*, two clear days before the Drawing Room, a card with her name written thereon, and with the name of the Lady by whom she is to be presented. In order to carry out the existing regulations, that no presentation can be made at a Drawing Room excepting by a Lady actually attending that Court, it is also necessary that an intimation from the Lady who is to make the presentation, of her intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's approbation. It is Her Majesty's command, that no presentations shall be made at the Drawing Room, except in accordance with the above regulations.

It is particularly requested that in every case the names be *very distinctly written* upon the cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to The Queen.

It is not expected that Gentlemen will present themselves at Drawing Rooms, except in attendance on the Ladies of their families.

Any Gentleman who under these circumstances should desire to be presented to The Queen, will observe the same regulations as are in force for Her Majesty's Levees.

The Noblemen and Gentlemen, who propose to attend Her Majesty's Levee, at St. James's Palace, are requested to bring with them two large cards, with their names *clearly written* thereon, one to be left with the Queen's Page in attendance in the Corridor, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to His Royal Highness.

PRESENTATIONS.

Any Nobleman or Gentleman who proposes to be presented, must leave at the Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace, *before twelve o'clock*, two clear days before the Levee, a card with his name written thereon, and with the name of the Nobleman or Gentleman by whom he is to be presented. In order to carry out the existing regulations that no presentation can be made at a Levee excepting by a person actually attending that Levee, it is also necessary that an intimation from the Nobleman or Gentleman who is to make the presentation, of his intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's approbation. It is

Her Majesty's command that no presentations should be made at the Levee, except in accordance with the above regulations.

It is particularly requested, that in every case the names be *very distinctly written* upon the cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to his Royal Highness.

(PORT OF WEYMOUTH.)

AT the *Council Chamber, Whitehall*, the 28th day of *April, 1879*.

By the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

THE Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do hereby define the following part of the Port of Weymouth, in the county of Dorset, as a foreign animals quarantine station :

All that space in the occupation of the Great Western and the London and South-Western Railway Companies under an agreement with the Admiralty made the twenty-ninth day of May, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-four, together with the two lines of railway upon the same, and the archwork and arches upon which the High Level railway line is constructed, being a part of the premises known as Her Majesty's Breakwater and Landing-place, in the Island of Portland, in the county of Dorset, and situate on the north-east side of the Portland station, included within a line commencing at a point six hundred and thirty feet distant from the east end of the Breakwater, extending westward along the face of the sea eight hundred and ninety feet, then across the Breakwater a distance of sixty feet, then eastward a distance of three hundred and seventy feet, then in a north-easterly direction fifty feet, then further eastward one hundred and thirty-six feet, then in a south-easterly direction fifty feet, and then further eastward three hundred and ten feet, and then across the breakwater a distance of sixty feet to the point aforesaid, all which space is coloured yellow on the plan of the Portland Breakwater deposited for the purposes of this Order at the Privy Council Office, a copy of which is deposited at the office of the Clerk of the Peace for the county of Dorset.

This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the sixteenth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine.

THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Consul-General at Christiania enclosing a translation of a Royal Resolution respecting quarantine in Norway, which is as follows :—

(Translation.)

Under date of 7th instant a Royal Resolution was issued to the following effect :—

The Royal Resolutions passed on the 10th of February and the 5th of March last, in pursuance of Sec. 2 of the Quarantine Law of July 12, 1848, providing that certain districts of Russia and Finland should be considered as infected with the oriental plague until further notice, are hereby abolished from this day.

With which all parties concerned have to comply.

Under same date it was most graciously enacted as follows :—

“In pursuance of law relative to precautionary measures for preventing the introduction of plague, passed on April 7, 1879, the following regulations are hereby put into force until further notice, in addition to the Quarantine Law of July 12, 1848 :—

Sec. 1. It shall be prohibited to import the articles specified below from all Russian and Finnish Ports, with the exception of those situated on the Arctic and White Sea :—

Worn linen, old bed clothes and garments, all sorts of rags, carding wool, waste paper, furs and similar articles, skins and hides, manufactured and unmanufactured, leather tanned and untanned, entrails of animals, fresh, dried, or salted, felt, hair, tallow, bristles, wool, if not artificially washed, feathers and down, fish and fish products, caviar, isinglass, sarepta balsam.

This prohibition does not affect articles of dress and luggage, which travellers arriving in this country carry with them for their personal use. Such articles, however, must be disinfected in

accordance with the directions of the local Quarantine Authorities, if it be not proved by certificate from the Consul of the United Kingdoms at the place of departure or, if no such Consul should be there, from the local magistrate, that none of the crew or passengers during the 20 last days previous to the departure has stayed at any place infected with plague.

Sec. 2. Any ship arriving in this country from Russian or Finnish ports, with the exception of those situated on the Arctic or White Sea, or having been in contact during the voyage with another ship arriving from any of the said ports, shall hoist the quarantine flag, and keep the same flying until a medical examination of the condition of health on board has taken place, for which purpose such vessel shall be bound to enter a port where a Quarantine Commission has been established. While the ship is lying under the quarantine flag, no other communication must take place with the shore than is necessary to inform the Quarantine Authorities of the arrival of the ship. Until the said examination has been effected, the pilot or Coast Guard Officer who has boarded the ship must not leave the same, and both of them have to see that no unlawful communication with the shore takes place. The examination in question shall be made by the physician of the Quarantine Board and another of its members. Instead of the medical member the Commission can also employ another physician.

Sec. 3. If the said examination proves that the ship, neither during the voyage has had, nor at the arrival has on board any person suffering of plague or any suspicious malady, the ship is granted free communication with the shore, with the restrictions contained in Sec. 1; and a certificate to this effect is immediately issued by the examining members of the Quarantine Commission. If such disease has appeared on board, the ship is directed to Christiania, and to undergo the discharging quarantine provided for in the Quarantine Law of July 12, 1848.

Sec. 4. The medical member of the Quarantine Commission, or the physician employed in his stead, is entitled to a fee of 5 kroner for every twenty persons on board the ship, and the other member assisting in the examination to 2 kroner for every ship examined.

These sums, as well as the expenses incurred in effecting the disinfection mentioned in Sec. 1, are paid by the State Exchequer.

Sec. 5. This resolution comes into force immediately.

With which all parties concerned have to comply.

Which is hereby made known, with the additional notice that infringements of the above regulations are punishable with fines or imprisonment, if not subjected to higher punishment according to existing laws; furthermore, any articles imported or attempted to be imported contrary to the prohibition contained in Sec. 1, are forfeited to the State Exchequer if not destroyed.

Remarks.—At Sec. 1. The disinfection mentioned in the second part should be effected by sulphurous vapour. A description of a convenient disinfecting method has been forwarded to every Quarantine Commission from the Director of the Sanitary Office.

At Sec. 2. Quarantine Commissions have been established in all towns of the country situated on the sea, with the exception of Holmsbo and Stathellé, and likewise at the harbours of Laurkullen, Fredricksvorn, and Tananger.

As a rule, the nautical member of the Quarantine Commission should be chosen to assist in the medical examination of ships subjected thereto.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the 39th and 40th years of Her present Majesty Queen Victoria, entitled "An Act for the preservation of Wild Fowl," it was by the 2nd section provided that any person who shall kill, wound, or take, or attempt to kill, wound, or take any wild fowl as defined by the said Act, or use any boat, gun, net, or other engine or instrument for the purpose of killing, wounding, or taking any wild fowl, or shall have in his control or possession any wild fowl recently killed, wounded, or taken, between the 15th day of February and the 10th day of July in any year, shall be liable to the penalty therein mentioned, and by the 3rd section, power was given to the Home Office as to Great Britain, upon the application of the Justices in Quarter Sessions assembled of any county, to extend or vary the time during which the killing, wounding, and taking of wild fowl was prohibited by the said Act, such extension or variation to be made by Order, under the hand of one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State:

And whereas the Justices of the county of Merioneth, in Quarter Sessions assembled, have applied to me to the effect that an Order should be made directing that the time during which the killing, wounding, and taking of wild fowl, as defined by the said Act, is prohibited shall be varied in the county of Merioneth so as to be from the 1st day of March to the 24th day of July, in each year.

Now, therefore, I, the Right Honourable Richard Assheton Cross, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, in pursuance of the said Act,

The time during which the killing, wounding, and taking of wild fowl, as defined by the said Act, is prohibited, shall be varied in the county of Merioneth so as to be from the 1st day of March to the 24th day of July, in each year.

FLINT CHANNEL.

(1.) *Leading Lights at Malmö.*

THE Swedish Government has given notice, that on 31st December, 1878, two leading lights were exhibited at Malmö, Flint Channel.

The high light, visible through an arc of 45°, shows a flash of one second duration every four seconds between the bearings S. 3° W. and S. 16° E.; a fixed white light between S. 16° E. and S. 34° E.; and two flashes in quick succession every four seconds between S. 34° E. and S. 42° E.; it is elevated 68 feet above the sea, and should be visible in clear weather from a distance of 12 miles.

The illuminating apparatus is dioptric, or by lenses, of the fourth order.

The lighthouse, constructed of iron, is painted white, with two red bands, lantern, red.

The low light, visible through an arc of 139°, shows a fixed red light between the bearings S. 18° W. and S. 76° E.; a single flash between S. 76° E. and S. 88° E.; a fixed white light between S. 88° E. and N. 78° E.; and two flashes between N. 78° E. and N. 59° E.; it is elevated 32 feet above the sea, and should be visible in clear weather from a distance of 8 miles.

The illuminating apparatus is dioptric, or by lenses, or the fifth order.

The shoalest patch found, now named Hugh Rose Rock, and on which the ship "Inchmarnock" struck in April, 1877, has 3 to 4 feet over it at low water, and lies N.N.E. $\frac{1}{2}$ E. from Alguada Reef Lighthouse, distant $2\frac{1}{2}$ miles.

CAUTION.—This channel is most dangerous, and absolutely barred to shipping.

Thames Conservancy.—Bye-laws.—Fishery.
NOTICE is hereby given, that the Conservators of the River Thames propose to make the following Bye-laws for the Regulation of the Fishery:—

The Conservators of the River Thames, in exercise of the powers and authority vested in them by the Thames Conservancy Acts, 1857, 1864, 1867, and 1878, and by the Thames Navigation Acts, 1866 and 1870, and of every other authority then hereunto in any wise enabling, do order and direct as follows, that is to say:

1. It shall not be lawful for any person to fish for or take or attempt to take any fish by using a wire, or snare, or hooks (baited or unbaited) or any other engine for the purpose of foul hooking, commonly called snatching or snaring.

2. The operation of the following part of No. 23 of the Rules, Orders and Ordinances in force from the 1st day of November, 1785, viz. "Hookermen may hook for eels all the year," is hereby limited to that part of the River Thames between Kew Bridge and Gantlet Creek.

3. It shall not be lawful for any person to lay night hooks or night lines of any description whatever between the City Stone at Staines and Kew Bridge, and any person laying fixed lines or hooks by night or day (commonly called night lines) or taking, or attempting to take, eels or fish of any description by such means, shall be deemed as committing a breach of this bye-law.

4. Bye-law No. 1, allowed by Her Majesty in Council at a Court held on the 30th September, 1873, relating to fence months, shall, after these bye-laws have been allowed by Her Majesty in Council, be and the same is hereby repealed, and in lieu thereof the following is substituted:—

That the fence season for fresh-water fish, as defined in the Freshwater Fisheries Act, 1878, be between the 15th day of March and the 15th day of June, both days inclusive, and any person fishing on or between these dates respectively shall be deemed guilty of committing a breach of this bye-law.

5. So much of the 23rd of the said Rules, Orders, and Ordinances in force from the said 1st day of

November, 1785, as relates to the times during which salmon and trout may be taken, shall, after these present bye-laws have been allowed by Her Majesty in Council, be and the same is hereby repealed, and in lieu thereof the following be substituted:—

No salmon, salmon trout, or trout shall be taken between the 10th day of September in each year and the 31st day of March in the following year, both days inclusive, and any person fishing for or taking salmon, salmon trout, or trout, on or between these dates respectively shall be deemed guilty of committing a breach of this bye-law.

Penalty.—Every person committing any breach of or in any way infringing any of these bye-laws, shall be liable to a penalty of and shall forfeit a sum not exceeding £5, which said penalty shall be recovered, enforced, and applied according to the provisions of the Thames Acts, 1857 to 1878.
