## REGULATIONS

TO BE OBSERVED AT THE QUEEN'S LEVEE TO BE HELD BY HIS ROYAL HIGHNESS THE PRINCE OF WALES, ON BEHALF OF HER MAJESTY, AT ST. JAMES'S PALACE.

*By Her Majesty's Command,*

The Noblemen and Gentlemen, who propose to attend Her Majesty's Levee, at St. James's Palace, are requested to bring with them two large cards, with their names *clearly written* thereon, one to be left with the Queen's Page in attendance in the Corridor, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to His Royal Highness.

## PRESENTATIONS.

Any Nobleman or Gentleman who proposes to be presented, must leave at the Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace, *before twelve o'clock*, two clear days before the Levee, a card with his name written thereon, and with the name of the Nobleman or Gentleman by whom he is to be presented. In order to carry out the existing regulations that no presentation can be made at a Levee excepting by a person actually attending that Levee, it is also necessary that an intimation from the Nobleman or Gentleman who is to make the presentation, of his intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's approbation. It is Her Majesty's command that no presentations should be made at the Levee, except in accordance with the above regulations.

It is particularly requested, that in every case the names be *very distinctly written* upon the

cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to his Royal Highness.

The State Apartments will be opened for the reception of Company coming to Court at one o'clock.

## PORT OF BRISTOL (AVONMOUTH).

**T**HE Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do hereby define the following part of the Port of Bristol, in the county of Gloucester, as a foreign animals wharf:

All that space at the Dock and premises called or known as the Avonmouth Dock, belonging to the Bristol Port and Channel Dock Company, situate at or near the confluence of the Rivers Avon and Severn, in the county of Gloucester, commencing at a point at the water edge of the south-

west side of the Lock of the said Dock sixty feet or thereabouts from the corner of the said Dock, thence running in a south-westerly direction at a right angle to the quay side for a distance of twenty-eight feet or thereabouts and bounded by a temporary wooden fence, thence at a right angle in a north-westerly direction for a distance of sixty feet or thereabouts and bounded by a wooden fence, thence at a right angle in a south-westerly direction for a distance of two hundred and fifty-seven feet or thereabouts and bounded by a wooden fence, thence at a right angle in a north-westerly direction for a distance of two hundred and forty-eight feet or thereabouts and bounded by a wooden fence, the south-west wall of a building called the Slaughter-house, and a further wooden fence, thence at a right angle in a north-easterly direction for a distance of one hundred and sixteen feet or thereabouts and bounded by a wooden fence and the north-west wall of a building called the Lairs, thence at a right angle in a south-easterly direction for a distance of two hundred and forty feet or thereabouts and bounded by the north-east wall of the said building called the Lairs, thence at a right angle in a north-easterly direction for a distance of one hundred and forty-two feet or thereabouts and bounded by a wooden fence, thence at a right angle in a north-westerly direction for a distance of one hundred feet or thereabouts and bounded by a wooden fence, thence at a right angle in a north-easterly direction for a distance of thirty-six feet or thereabouts to the water edge of the said Lock and bounded by a temporary wooden fence, thence along the south-western face of the said Lock for a distance of one hundred and sixty-eight feet or thereabouts to the point aforesaid, all which space is coloured pink on the plan of part of the Avonmouth Dock deposited for the purposes of this Order at the Privy Council Office, a copy of which is deposited at the office of the Clerk of the Peace for the county of Gloucester.

**T**HE Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do hereby define the following part of the Port of Cardiff, in the county of Glamorgan, as a foreign animals wharf:

All that space at the Bute Docks, in the Borough of Cardiff, in the county of Glamorgan, situate on the east side of the Roath Basin, bounded by a line commencing at a point at the water edge of the said Basin two hundred and sixty feet or thereabouts from the south-east corner of the said Basin, thence running at a right angle from the edge of the said Basin in an easterly direction for forty-three feet or thereabouts and bounded by a temporary wooden fence, thence at a right angle in a southerly direction for thirty-five feet or thereabouts and bounded by a wooden fence, thence in an angular line in a north-easterly direction for four hundred and sixty-six feet or thereabouts and bounded by a wooden fence, thence at a right angle in a north-westerly direction for one hundred and eighty feet or

thereabouts and bounded by a wooden fence, thence at a right angle in a south-westerly direction for three hundred feet or thereabouts and bounded by a wooden fence, thence in a southerly direction for one hundred and seventy feet or thereabouts and bounded by a wooden fence, thence at a right angle for forty-three feet or thereabouts to the edge of the water of the said Basin and bounded by a temporary wooden fence, thence in a southerly direction along the edge of the said Basin for fifteen feet or thereabouts to the point aforesaid, all which space is coloured pink on the plan of part of the Bute Docks deposited for the purposes of this Order at the Privy Council Office, a copy of which is deposited at the office of the Town Clerk of the borough of Cardiff.

**T**HE following extract of a Despatch has been received at the India Office:—

From Major-General F. S. Roberts, C.B., V.C., Commanding Kuram Field Force, to the Quartermaster-General in India, Army Head Quarters,—Head Quarters, Camp Matun, the 24th January, 1879.

SIR,—With reference to the correspondence forwarded with your No. 107 F-C of the 13th January, 1879, I have the honour to submit, in continuation of my despatch dated the 5th December, 1878, the following supplementary account of the operations which led to the capture of the Peiwar Kotal.

2. In paragraph 18 of my previous despatch, I reported that the following troops under Brigadier-General A. H. Cobbe were left in camp on the night of the 1st December, when the turning force under my personal command marched for the Spin Gawai Kotal, viz.:—

2 guns F.A. Royal Horse Artillery; 3 guns G-3rd Royal Artillery; 12th Bengal Cavalry; 2-8th Foot (wing); 5th Punjab Infantry.

3. The guns under escort of a Company of the 8th Foot were placed in a position about 1,700 yards from the Peiwar Kotal shortly before day-break, and they opened on the enemy's artillery about a quarter-past six o'clock.

4. The infantry were at the same time extended under cover, and slightly in advance of the guns.

5. At 8 A.M., two companies of the 8th Regiment were pushed forward to within 1,300 yards of the enemy's line of defence.

6. At about eleven o'clock, the two Afghan guns which were placed to our left of the pass were silenced.

The infantry simultaneously advanced from ridge to ridge, and by noon had approached to within 1,400 yards of the top of the pass.

7. At this time Brigadier-General Cobbe was severely wounded, and the command of the troops devolved on Colonel Barry Drew, of the 8th Regiment.

8. The 5th Punjab Infantry, who were on the right of the attack, and who had succeeded in gaining a position close under the main ridge, now established communication with and joined the column which had come over the Spin Gawai Kotal.

9. Shortly after one o'clock, the remaining infantry, which consisted of five companies of the 8th Regiment, gained a crest, from which they were able to open fire at a distance of 800 yards upon the enemy's guns at the Kotal.

10. About 2 P.M., the enemy's defence appeared to be so much shaken that Colonel Drew resolved

to deliver his attack. As his infantry were crossing the broken ground to gain the road which led up to the Kotal, they were subjected to a dropping fire; but once on the road all opposition ceased, and shortly before half-past two the troops entered the Afghan position without suffering further loss.

11. The 12th Bengal Cavalry, under Colonel Hugh Gough, C.B., V.C., were immediately sent in pursuit, and captured several guns which had been abandoned by the enemy in their rapid flight.

**In Parliament.—Session 1879.**

Portsmouth, Southsea, and Landport and Portsmouth and Cosham Street Tramways Bill.

(Alteration of Works during Progress of Bill through the House of Commons.)
