

The Bankruptcy Act, 1869.

In the London Bankruptcy Court.

In the Matter of Edwin Gosling, of No. 11, New Ormond-street, Queen-square, in the county of Middlesex, Bankrupt.

Before Mr. Registrar Brougham, sitting as Chief Judge.

UPON reading a report of the Trustee of the property of the bankrupt, dated the 1st day of April, 1879, reporting that so much of the property of the bankrupt as can be realized without needlessly protracting the bankruptcy, has been realized for the benefit of his creditors, and a dividend to the amount of one penny and one eighth in the pound has been paid, and on hearing the application of the Trustee, Mr. E.
