PRESENT,

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the first session of the Parliament holden in the first and second years of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "An Act to abridge the holding of benefices in plurality, and to make better provision for the residence of the clergy," after reciting that "Whereas in some instances tithings, hamlets, chapelries, and other places or districts may be separated from the parishes or mother churches to which they belong with great advantage, and places altogether extra-parochial may in some instances with advantage be annexed to parishes or districts to which they are contiguous, or be constituted separate parishes for ecclesiastical purposes," it is, amongst other things, enacted "That when, with respect to his own diocese, it shall appear to the Archbishop of the Province, or when the Bishop of any diocese shall represent to the said Archbishop that any such tithing, hamlet, chapelry, place or district within the diocese of such Archbishop, or the diocese of such Bishop, as the case may be, may be advantageously separated from any parish or mother church, and either be constituted a separate benefice by itself or be united to any other parish to which it may be more conveniently annexed, or to any other adjoining tithing, hamlet, chapelry, place, or district, parochial or extra-parochial, so as to form a separate parish or benefice, or that any extra-parochial place may with advantage be annexed to any parish to which it is contiguous, or be constituted a separate parish for ecclesiastical purposes; and the said Archbishop or Bishop shall draw up a scheme in writing (the scheme of such Bishop to be transmitted to the said Archbishop for his consideration), describing the mode in which it appears to him that the alteration may best be effected, and how the changes consequent on such alteration in respect to ecclesiastical jurisdiction, glebe lands, tithes, rent-charges, and other ecclesiastical dues, rates, and payments, and in respect to patronage and rights to pews, may be made with justice to all parties interested; and if the patron or patrons of the benefice or benefices to be affected by such alteration shall consent in writing under his or their hands to such scheme, or to such modification thereof as the said Archbishop may

approve, and the said Archbishop shall, on full consideration and inquiry, be satisfied with any such scheme, or modification thereof, and shall certify the same and such consent as aforesaid, by his report to Her Majesty in Council, it shall be lawful for Her Majesty in Council to make an Order for carrying such scheme, or modification thereof, as the case may be, into effect."

And whereas the Lord Bishop of Sarum hath made a representation in writing to his Grace the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"To the Most Reverend Archibald Campbell  
Lord Archbishop of Canterbury.

"I the Right Reverend George Lord Bishop of Sarum do hereby represent to your Grace that in the county of Wilts and within my diocese of Sarum there is a certain extra-parochial place called HIPPENSCOMBE the boundaries whereof are well known and defined.

"That the said extra-parochial place contains no church or chapel or ecclesiastical benefice having patron or incumbent.

"That according to the last census the population of the said extra-parochial place amounts to fifty-seven; and the area thereof is about eight hundred and thirty square acres.

"That the annual rent-charges in lieu or commutation of tithes arising within the said extra-parochial place formerly awarded and payable to the Dean and Chapter of my Cathedral Church of Sarum, and now vested in the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England amount to one hundred and thirty-two pounds.

"That contiguous to the said extra-parochial place is the perpetual curacy or vicarage and parish of Tidcombe, situate in the said county of Wilts and within my said diocese, the church of which is distant from the centre of the population of the said extra-parochial place two miles and is capable of providing sufficient accommodation for them.

"That the population of the said parish of Tidcombe according to the last census amounts to one hundred and the gross annual value of the benefice is ninety pounds.

"That the right of patronage of and to the said perpetual curacy or vicarage of Tidcombe is vested in the Dean and Canons of the King's Free Chapel of Saint George within his castle of Windsor, and the Reverend Edmund Burkitt Bowman, Clerk, is the present incumbent thereof.

"That if the said extra-parochial place were annexed to the said benefice of Tidcombe the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners are prepared and have undertaken upon such consolidation being effected to convey and assure to the perpetual curate or vicar thereof the before-mentioned rent-charges amounting to one hundred and thirty-two pounds per annum.

"That it appears to me that under the provisions of the Act of Parliament 1 and 2 Victoria chapter 106 the said extra-parochial place of Hippenscombe may be advantageously annexed to the said contiguous perpetual curacy or vicarage and parish of Tidcombe.

"That pursuant to the direction contained in the twenty-sixth section of the before-mentioned Act I the said Lord Bishop have prepared the following scheme, which together with the consent thereto of the patrons and incumbent of the said benefice of Tidcombe, I do submit to your Grace, to the intent that your Grace may, if on full consideration and enquiry you shall be satisfied with such scheme, certify the same, and such consent to Her Majesty in Council."

And whereas the scheme and consents mentioned in the said representation are in the words following:—

"The SCHEME above referred to.

"That the said extra-parochial place called Hippenscombe shall be annexed to the said contiguous perpetual curacy or vicarage and parish of Tidcombe and for ever hereafter be united thereto and be subject to the same ecclesiastical jurisdiction.

"That all fees and other ecclesiastical dues offerings and emoluments usually payable to the incumbent of a parish or benefice, as shall arise within the said extra-parochial place, shall belong to the perpetual curate or vicar of the said benefice of Tidcombe.

"That the inhabitants of the said extra-parochial place in common with the inhabitants of the said parish of Tidcombe, shall be subject and liable to the maintenance and repair of the church of Tidcombe aforesaid and the expenses incidental to the due performance of Divine service therein and shall be entitled to accommodation within the said church and to all other spiritual and ecclesiastical rights as parishioners of the said parish.

Given under my hand this twenty-seventh day of December in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight.

"CONSENTS above referred to.

"We the Dean and Canons of the King's Free Chapel of Saint George within his Castle of Windsor the patrons entitled to nominate to the perpetual curacy or vicarage and parish church of Tidcombe in case the same were now vacant and I the Reverend Edmund Burkitt Bowman, Clerk, the incumbent of the same benefice do hereby signify our consent to the scheme above proposed for annexing the extra-parochial place called Hippenscombe to the said benefice of Tidcombe.

"In witness whereof we the said Dean and Canons have hereunto put our chapter or common seal and I the said Edmund Burkitt Bowman have set my hand this twenty-seventh day of December in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight."

And whereas the said Lord Bishop hath transmitted the said scheme to the said Lord Archbishop together with the said consents.

And whereas the said Lord Archbishop being on full consideration and enquiry satisfied with such scheme, hath certified the same, and such consents as aforesaid, to Her Majesty in Council by his report dated the 1st day of April, 1879, which report is in the words and figures following:—

"To the QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

"We the undersigned Archibald Campbell Lord Archbishop of the Province of Canterbury do hereby report to your Majesty in Council.

"That the Right Reverend George Lord Bishop of Sarum has represented unto us (amongst other things)

"That in the county of Wilts and diocese of Sarum there is a certain extra-parochial place called Hippenscombe the boundaries whereof are well known and defined.

"That the said extra parochial place contains no church or chapel or ecclesiastical benefice having patron or incumbent.

"That contiguous to the said extra-parochial place is the perpetual curacy or vicarage and parish of Tidcombe in the same county and diocese the church of which is distant from the centre of the population of the said extra-parochial place two miles and is capable of providing sufficient accommodation for them.

"That it appears to the said Lord Bishop that under the provisions of the Act of Parliament 1 and 2 Victoria chapter 106 the said extra-parochial place of Hippenscombe may be advantageously annexed to the said contiguous perpetual curacy or vicarage and parish of Tidcombe.

"That pursuant to the direction contained in the 26th section of the said Act the said Lord Bishop has drawn up a scheme in writing describing the mode in which it appears to him the proposed alteration may best be effected which scheme together with the consents thereto in writing of the patrons and incumbent of the said benefice of Tidcombe has been transmitted by the said Lord Bishop to us for our consideration.

"The representation and scheme of the said Lord Bishop and the consents before referred to are hereunto annexed.

"And we the said Archbishop being on full consideration and enquiry satisfied with the said scheme do hereby pursuant to the said Act of the first and second years of your Majesty's reign chapter 106 certify the same and such consents as aforesaid to your Majesty in Council to the intent that your Majesty in Council may in case your Majesty in Council shall think fit so to do make and issue an Order for carrying the said scheme into effect.

And whereas the Lord Bishop of Rochester hath made a representation in writing to his Grace the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury in the words and figures following that is to say:—

"To the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Father in God Archibald Campbell by Divine Providence Lord Archbishop of the Province of Canterbury Primate of all England and Metropolitan.

"I Anthony Wilson by Divine permission Bishop of Rochester do in pursuance of the 26th section of the Act of Parliament of the 1st and 2nd years of the reign of Her present Majesty cap. 106 hereby represent to your Grace that

there is in the county of Kent and my diocese of Rochester a certain place or district known as the parish of Denton near Gravesend (the boundaries whereof are well known and defined) and containing according to the last returns under the authority of Parliament a population of one hundred and eighty-one but which for ecclesiastical purposes is altogether extra-parochial. That the said place or district lies contiguous to the parish of Milton-next-Gravesend and it appears to me that the same place or district may under the provisions of the said Act of the 1st and 2nd Victoria chapter 106 be advantageously annexed to the said parish of Milton-next-Gravesend to the church of which parish the inhabitants of Denton aforesaid have been accustomed to resort for baptism marriage and burial.

"That Her Most Gracious Majesty the Queen is the patron in respect of two out of every three turns of the benefice of Milton aforesaid and that the Bishop of Rochester is patron thereof in respect of every third turn. The Reverend William Downes Johnston is the present incumbent of the benefice of Milton aforesaid.

"That pursuant to the direction contained in the 26th section of the hereinbefore-mentioned Act of Parliament I the said Bishop have drawn up a scheme in writing appended to this representation describing the mode in which it appears to me that the alteration may best be effected and how the changes consequent on such alteration in respect to ecclesiastical jurisdiction dues and payments may be made with justice to all parties interested.

"And I do hereby submit the same to your Grace and in case you shall on full consideration and enquiry be satisfied therewith I request that your Grace will be pleased to certify the same by your report to Her Majesty in Council.

"Given under my hand this twentieth day of March one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine.

And whereas the scheme and consents mentioned in the said representation are in the words following:—

"The SCHEME referred to in the foregoing Representation.

"It is proposed that the place or district known as the parish of Denton near Gravesend (the same being a place for ecclesiastical purposes altogether extra-parochial) shall be annexed for ecclesiastical purposes to the parish of Milton-next-Gravesend to which the same is contiguous.

"That the incumbent of the benefice of Milton aforesaid shall have the cure of souls within the said place or district as well as within the said parish of Milton and that all the fees for churchings, marriages and burials and other ecclesiastical offices solemnized and performed at the church and churchyard of Milton aforesaid in respect of the inhabitants of the said place or district shall belong to and be received by the incumbent of the benefice of Milton aforesaid.

"That the inhabitants of the said place or district shall be entitled to the same rights in the church and churchyard of Milton aforesaid as are now enjoyed of common right by the inhabitants of the parish of Milton aforesaid.

"I the Right Honourable Hugh McCalmont Earl Cairns Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain on behalf of Her Most Gracious Majesty the Queen the patron in respect of two out of every three turns of the benefice of Milton-next-Gravesend in the county of Kent and diocese of Rochester and I the Reverend William Downes Johnston Clerk incumbent of the said benefice do

hereby respectively signify to your Grace our consent to the scheme above proposed for annexing for ecclesiastical purposes the extra-parochial place or district known as the parish of Denton near Gravesend in the said county of Kent to the parish of Milton-next-Gravesend aforesaid.

"We Anthony Wilson Bishop of Rochester the patron in right of our See in respect of one out of every three turns of the benefice of Milton-next-Gravesend in the county of Kent and our diocese of Rochester do hereby signify to your Grace our consent to the scheme above proposed for annexing for ecclesiastical purposes the extra-parochial place or district known as the parish of Denton near Gravesend in the said county of Kent to the parish of Milton-next-Gravesend aforesaid.

And whereas by another Act of Parliament



passed in the second and third years of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "An Act to make better provision for the assignment of Ecclesiastical Districts to Churches or Chapels augmented by the Governors of the Bounty of Queen Anne; and for other purposes," it is amongst other things, further enacted "That when, by any Order of Her Majesty in Council as aforesaid, a separate parish for ecclesiastical purposes is constituted, the same shall, on registration thereof, and with the consent, in writing, of the incumbent or incumbents of the benefice or benefices to be thereby affected, become a perpetual curacy and benefice, and the minister thereof, duly nominated and licensed thereto, and his successors, shall be a body politic and corporate, with perpetual succession, and may receive and take to himself and his successors all such lands, tenements, tithes, rent-charges and hereditaments as shall be granted unto him or them, and such perpetual curate shall thenceforth have, within the limits of the district parish formed under the Church Building Acts, for the church of such perpetual curacy sole and exclusive cure of souls, and shall not in anywise be subject to the control or interference of the incumbent or incumbents of the benefice or benefices to be affected by such Order, if he or they shall have consented to such Order as aforesaid."

And whereas the Lord Bishop of Hereford hath made a representation in writing to his Grace the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury in the words and figures following, that is to say :

"To the Most Reverend Archibald Campbell Lord Archbishop of the Province of Canterbury.

"I the Right Reverend James Lord Bishop of Hereford do hereby represent to your Grace that there is in the county of Hereford and my diocese of Hereford the vicarage and parish church of Llangarren to the parish of which belongs a chapelry known by the name of Saint Weonards the boundaries whereof are well known and defined.

"That the said chapelry contains a church long since erected the distance of which church from the said parish church of Llangarren is two miles or thereabouts.

"That according to the census of 1871 the population of the said parish of Llangarren exclusive of the said chapelry of Saint Weonards is 1156 and the population of the said chapelry of Saint Weonards amounts according to the same census to 694.

"That the said chapelry of Saint Weonards appears to have been immemorially treated as a separate parish for all civil purposes and it also appears that baptisms churchings marriages and burials have heretofore been and are now performed in the said church of Saint Weonards for the inhabitants thereof.

"That the inhabitants of the said chapelry have from time immemorial resorted to the said church within their said chapelry and have repaired the said church by separate rates levied on the said chapelry of Saint Weonards for the separate and distinct repair thereof and in such chapelry the inhabitants thereof have elected from among themselves churchwardens overseers and other parish officers for the same.

"That the said chapelry is not in anyway connected with the parish of Llangarren in respect to rates of any kind nor are the inhabitants of the said chapelry entitled to any accommodation in the said parish church of Llangarren nor are the

inhabitants of Llangarren entitled to accommodation in the said church of Saint Weonards.

"That the net annual value of the said vicarage of Llangarren including the said chapelry of Saint Weonards is £480 arising partly from rent-charges given in commutation of tithes and partly from glebe and partly from surplice fees and Easter offerings.

"That the patronage of the said vicarage and parish church of Llangarren belongs to the Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral Church of Hereford and the Reverend Henry John Potts is the present incumbent thereof.

"That it appears to me that the said chapelry of Saint Weonards may under the provisions of the Acts of Parliament of the 1st and 2nd years of the reign of Her present Majesty chapter 106 and of the second and third years of the same reign cap. 49 be advantageously separated from the said vicarage and parish church of Llangarren and be constituted a separate parish for ecclesiastical purposes and a perpetual curacy and benefice which shall be endowed with a clear yearly income of £180 or thereabouts.

"That pursuant to the directions contained in in the 26th section of the said first-mentioned Act of Parliament I the said Lord Bishop have drawn up a scheme in writing appended to this representation describing the mode in which it appears to me that the alteration above proposed may be best effected and now the changes consequent on such alteration in respect to ecclesiastical jurisdiction ecclesiastical dues rates and payments and in respect to patronage and rights to pews may be made with justice to all parties interested and I do submit the same to your Grace together with the consents in writing of the Very Reverend the Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral Church of Hereford the patrons of the said vicarage of Llangarren and of the said Reverend Henry John Potts the present incumbent thereof to the intent that your Grace may if on full consideration and inquiry you shall be satisfied with the said scheme certify the same and such consents to Her Majesty in Council.

And whereas the scheme and consents mentioned in the said representation are in the words and figures following :—

"SCHEME referred to in the foregoing Representation.

"That the said chapelry of Saint Weonards shall be separated from the said vicarage and parish church of Llangarren and be constituted a separate parish for ecclesiastical purposes and a perpetual curacy and benefice by the name or style of 'The Perpetual Curacy of Saint Weonards' of which the church within the said chapelry shall be the parish church.

"That such perpetual curacy of Saint Weonards shall be subject to the same ecclesiastical jurisdiction as the said vicarage of Llangarren and the incumbent of such perpetual curacy and benefice shall have exclusive cure of souls within the limits of the same.

"That so soon as the said chapelry shall have been separated and constituted a perpetual curacy and benefice there shall be assigned and attached thereto by the vicar of Llangarren aforesaid under the provisions of the Act of the 1st and 2nd years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth cap. 45 or otherwise the vicarial tithe rent-charges arising within the limits of the said perpetual curacy and parish of Saint Weonards

commuted under the Tithe Commutation Acts at the gross annual sum of £210 3s. which are estimated to produce a net income of £180 or thereabouts.

"That all fees and other ecclesiastical dues and payments for churchings marriages burials and other ecclesiastical offices solemnized and performed within the said proposed separate parish and benefice of the perpetual curacy of Saint Weonards and all such other ecclesiastical dues offerings and emoluments usually payable to the incumbent of a parish or benefice as shall arise within the said proposed separate parish or benefice shall belong to the incumbent thereof.

"That the right of patronage of or right of nomination to the proposed separate benefice so to be constituted and styled 'The Perpetual Curacy of Saint Weonards' shall be for ever vested in the Dean and Chapter of the said Cathedral Church of Hereford.

"That the inhabitants of the said proposed separate parish of Saint Weonards shall be exonerated as heretofore from all liability to repair the parish church of Llangarren or any other church or chapel now or hereafter to be erected in such parish and shall not be entitled to accommodation in any other church than the church of Saint Weonards nor shall the parishioners of Llangarren be entitled to any accommodation in the church of the said separate benefice.

"To the Most Reverend Archibald Campbell, Lord Archbishop of the Province of Canterbury.

"We the Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral Church of Hereford the patrons entitled to present to the vicarage of Llangarren in the county of Hereford and diocese of Hereford in case the same were now vacant and I the Reverend Henry John Potts B.A. Clerk vicar of the said vicarage do hereby respectively signify to your Grace our consent to the scheme above proposed for separating the chapelry of Saint Weonards from the parish of Llangarren and for constituting the said chapelry a separate benefice.

"That the said Lord Bishop has drawn up a scheme in writing describing the mode in which it appears to him the proposed alterations may best be effected and how the changes consequent on such alterations in respect to ecclesiastical jurisdiction glebe lands, tithe rent-charges and other ecclesiastical dues rates and payments and in respect to patronage and rights to pews may be made with justice to all parties interested which scheme together with the consents thereto in writing of the patrons and incumbent of the said benefice and parish church of Llangarren has been transmitted by the said Lord Bishop to us for our consideration.

"The representation and scheme of the said Lord Bishop and the consents before referred to are hereunto annexed.

"And we the said Archbishop being on full consideration and enquiry satisfied with the said scheme do hereby pursuant to the Act of Parliament of the first and second years of your Majesty's reign certify the same and such consents as aforesaid to your Majesty in Council to the intent that your Majesty in Council may in case your Majesty in Council shall think fit so to do make and issue an Order for carrying the said scheme into effect.

HONITON.—Forthwith wholly in the chapel of ease of St. Michael, within the parish of Honiton, in the county of Devon.

CHITTLEHAMPTON.—Forthwith wholly in the Chittlehampton Church, in the county of Devon, and in the churchyard; and in the portion thereof south of the church, except in now existing walled graves, every coffin buried in which shall be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented.

STATHERN.—Forthwith wholly in Stather Church, in the county of Leicester; and in the churchyard after the thirty-first of December, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine, except in existing walled graves, every coffin buried in which shall be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented.

MARKFIELD.—Forthwith wholly in Markfield Church, in the county of Leicester; and in the churchyard, except in graves not less than five feet deep, which can be opened without the exposure of coffins, and except in vaults or walled graves, every coffin buried in which shall be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented.

LONG CLAWSON.—Forthwith wholly in Long Clawson Church, in the county of Leicester; and in the churchyard, except in graves which are free from water, and can be opened without the exposure of coffins.

BELGRAVE.—Forthwith wholly in Belgrave Church, in the county of Leicester; and in the churchyard, after the thirty-first of

December, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine, except in vaults and walled graves existing on the thirty-first of March, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine, every coffin buried in which shall be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented.

NORTH CURRY.—Forthwith wholly in North Curry Church, in the county of Somerset; and in the churchyard, after the thirtieth of June next, except in vaults or graves which are free from water and remains to the depth of five feet.

LYNBY.—Forthwith wholly in the Lynby Church, in the county of Nottingham; and in the churchyard, except in graves which can be opened without the exposure of coffins.

SALTLEY.—Forthwith wholly in Saltley Church, in the county of Warwick; and in the churchyard, except in existing graves to be used only for the burial of members of the families of those interred in them, and except in new graves to be used only for the burial of parishioners of Saltley, and of those who may die within the parish: no coffin to be placed within a foot of any other coffin, or less than four feet beneath the surface, unless it be in a walled grave or vault, and separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented.

SAINT NEOTS.—Forthwith wholly in Saint Neots Church, and in the Independent and Baptist Chapels of that place; and in the Saint Neo's churchyard, and Saint Neots Independent and Baptist Burial-grounds after the thirty-first of March, one thousand eight hundred and eighty, except in vaults and walled graves which can be opened without the disturbance of soil that has been buried in, and which are free from water, every coffin buried in which shall be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented.

Now, therefore, Her Majesty in Council is pleased hereby to give notice of such representation, and to order that the same be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council on the third day of July next:
