PRESENT,
The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the first session of the Parliament holden in the first and second years of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "An Act to abridge the holding of benefices in plurality, and to make better provision for the residence of the clergy," after reciting that "Whereas in some instances tithings, hamlets, chapelries, and other places or districts may be separated from the parishes or mother churches to which they belong with great advantage, and places altogether extra-parochial may in some instances with advantage be annexed to parishes or districts to which they are contiguous, or be constituted separate parishes for ecclesiastical purposes," it is, amongst other things, enacted, "That when, with respect to his own diocese, it shall appear to the Archbishop of the Province, or when the Bishop of any diocese shall represent to the said Archbishop that any such tithing, hamlet, chapelry, place, or district within the diocese of such Archbishop, or the diocese of such Bishop, as the case may be, may be advantageously separated from any parish or mother church, and either be constituted a separate benefice by itself or be united to any other parish to which it may be more conveniently annexed, or to any other adjoining tithing, hamlet, chapelry, place, or district, parochial or extra-parochial, so as to form a separate parish or benefice, or that any extra-parochial place may with advantage be annexed to any parish to which it is contiguous, or be constituted a separate parish for ecclesiastical purposes; and the said Archbishop or Bishop shall draw up a scheme, in writing (the scheme of such Bishop to be transmitted to the said Archbishop for his consideration), describing the mode in which it appears to him that the alteration may best be effected, and how the changes consequent on such alteration in respect to ecclesiastical jurisdiction, glebe lands, tithes, rent-charges, and other ecclesiastical dues, rates, and payments, and in respect to patronage and rights to pews, may be made with justice to all parties interested; and if the patron or patrons of the benefice or benefices to be affected by such alteration shall consent in writing under his or their hands to such scheme, or to such modification thereof as the said Archbishop may

approve, and the said Archbishop shall, on full consideration and inquiry, be satisfied with any such scheme, or modification thereof, and shall certify the same and such consent as aforesaid, by his report to Her Majesty in Council, it shall be lawful for Her Majesty in Council to make an Order for carrying such scheme, or modification thereof, as the case may be, into effect; and such Order being registered in the registry of the diocese, which the Registrar is hereby required to do shall be forthwith binding on all persons whatsoever including the Incumbent or Incumbents of the benefice or benefices to be affected thereby, if he or they shall have consented thereto in writing under his or their hands."

And whereas the Lord Bishop of Worcester hath made a representation in writing to his Grace the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"To the Most Reverend and Right Honourable Archibald Campbell, Lord Archbishop of the Province of Canterbury.

"I, Henry, Bishop of Worcester, beg leave to represent to your Grace, that the parish of Yardley in the county and diocese of Worcester comprises among other places a portion of land bounded on the south by the new parish of Yardley Wood, on the west by the new parish of King's Heath, on the north by the new parish of Moseley, and separated from the remaining part of the parish of Yardley on the east by that part of Stony-lane which lies to the south of the point where Belle-walk enters into the said lane, to where the said lane crosses the Wake Green-road, thence by that part of the Wake Green-road which lies between the said Stony-lane and Sarehole, at which place the said road enters into the adjoining new parish of Yardley Wood.

"That the said portion of land contains about 350 acres with a population of about 200 persons.

"That the nearest point of the said portion of land is distant about 3½ miles from the parish church of Yardley, and that no part of it is distant more than 1½ miles from the parish church of Moseley.

"That the persons dwelling in the said portion of land have been accustomed for many years to resort to the parish church of Moseley for Divine service, in consequence of their distance from their own parish church of Yardley.

"That according to the last census of 1871, the population of the said parish of Yardley was

2780, and the population of the said parish of Moseley 1500, and that since that date the new parish of Saint Anne Moseley, has been taken from Moseley parish.

"That in the event of the separation of the said portion of land from the parish of Yardley, and its annexation to the parish of Moseley for ecclesiastical purposes, it is proposed to erect a building to serve as a chapel of ease to the parish church of Moseley, whereby sufficient accommodation will be provided for Divine service for the people of the parish.

"That a suitable site has been offered for such building, and a considerable sum of money has been provided for the purpose.

"That in view of all these circumstances, it appears to me desirable that the said portion of land should under the provisions of the Acts of Parliament 1 and 2 Vic. c. 106, and 2 and 3 Vic. c. 49, be separated from the said parish of Yardley, and be annexed to the said parish of Moseley for ecclesiastical purposes.

"That pursuant to the directions contained in the 26th section of the said first-mentioned Act of Parliament, I have drawn up a scheme in writing, appended to this representation describing the mode in which it appears to me that the alteration above proposed may be best effected, and how the changes consequent on such alteration in respect to ecclesiastical jurisdiction, fees and other payments, and rights to pews or seats may be made with justice to all parties interested; and I beg leave to submit the same to your Grace together with the consents in writing of the Reverend Joseph Dodd, patron of the benefice of Yardley, of the Reverend George William Murray, patron of the benefice of Moseley, of the Reverend Frederic Sutton Dodd, vicar of Yardley, and of the Reverend William Harrison Colmore, vicar of Moseley.

"Given under my hand at Hartlebury this 24th day of April, 1879. "H. Worcester."

And whereas the scheme and consents mentioned in the said representation are in the words following:—

"SCHEME.

"It is proposed to separate the portion of land described in the foregoing representation from the parish of Yardley to which it now belongs, and to annex it to the parish of Moseley for ecclesiastical purposes.

"That the vicar of Moseley shall have exclusive cure of souls within the limits of the said portion.

"That baptisms, churchings, marriages and burials shall be performed for the inhabitants of the said portion of land in the church of the said parish of Moseley, and that the fees for all such offices shall belong to the vicar of Moseley.

"That the inhabitants of the said portion of land shall not be entitled to accommodation in the church of the said parish of Yardley, except any person or persons (if any) possessing a legal right by faculty or otherwise to the exclusive use of any pews or seats therein, and who may not be willing to give up the same." "H. Worcester."

"CONSENTS.

"I, Joseph Dodd, Clerk, the patron or person entitled to present to the vicarage of Yardley, in case the same were now vacant, and I, George William Murray, Clerk, the patron or person entitled to present to the vicarage of Moseley, in case the same were now vacant, and I, Frederic Sutton Dodd, vicar of Yardley, and I, William

Harrison Colmore, vicar of Moseley, do hereby signify our consent to the scheme above proposed.

And whereas the Lord Bishop of Worcester hath transmitted the said scheme to the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury together with the said consents.

And whereas the said Lord Archbishop being on full consideration and enquiry satisfied with such scheme hath certified the same and such consents as aforesaid by his report to Her Majesty in Council, which report is dated the 6th day of May, 1879, and is in the words and figures following:—

"To the QUEEN'S Most Excellent in Majesty in Council.

"We the undersigned Archibald Campbell Lord Archbishop of the Province of Canterbury do hereby report to your Majesty in Council.

"That the Right Reverend Henry Lord Bishop of Worcester has represented unto us (amongst other things):

"That the parish of Yardley in the county and diocese of Worcester comprises amongst other places a portion of land bounded on the south by the new parish of Yardley Wood on the west by the new parish of King's Heath on north by the new parish of Moseley and separated from the remaining part of the parish of Yardley on the east by that part of Stony-lane which lies to the south of the point where Belle-walk enters into the said lane to where the said lane crosses the Wake Green-road thence by that part of the Wake Green-road which lies between the said Stony-lane and Sarehole at which place the said road enters into the adjoining new parish of Yardley Wood.

"That it appears to the said Lord Bishop that the said portion of land may be advantageously separated from the said parish of Yardley and be united for ecclesiastical purposes to the said parish of Moseley.

"That the said Lord Bishop has pursuant to the directions contained in the twenty-sixth section of the Act of the first and second years of your Majesty's reign chapter 106 drawn up a scheme in writing appended to the said representation describing the mode in which it appears to him the proposed alteration may best be effected and how the changes consequent upon such alteration in respect to ecclesiastical jurisdiction fees and other payments and rights to pews or seats may be made with Justice to all parties interested which scheme together with the consents thereto in writing of the patrons and incumbents of the said benefices to be affected has been transmitted by the said Lord Bishop to us for our consideration.

"The representation and scheme of the said Lord Bishop and the consents before referred to are hereunto annexed.

"And we the said Archbishop being on full consideration and enquiry satisfied with the said scheme do hereby pursuant to the Act of the first and second years of your Majesty's reign chapter 106 certify the same and such consents as aforesaid to your Majesty in Council to the intent that your Majesty in Council may in case your Majesty in Council shall think fit so to do make and issue an Order for carrying the said scheme into effect.

1. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the third day of June, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine.

2. The Orders of Council described in the Schedule to this Order are hereby revoked.

3. Nothing in this Order shall be deemed to invalidate or make unlawful anything done under the said Orders, or either of them, before the date when this revocation takes effect, or interfere with the institution or prosecution of any proceeding in respect of any offence committed against, or any penalty incurred under, the said Orders, or either of them.

Order of Council of 8 May, 1879, permitting cattle brought from the United States of America to the Port of London to be transhipped in the Millwall Docks for conveyance to the Foreign Cattle Market at Deptford.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the third day of June, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine.

2. Words in this Order have the same meaning as in The Foreign Animals Order.

3. Notwithstanding anything in The Foreign Animals Order or in any other Order of Council, animals brought from the United States of America to the Port of London may be transhipped in the River Thames or in any Dock within the Port of London approved by the Privy Council from the vessel in which they are brought into another

vessel for conveyance to the foreign animals wharf, known as the Foreign Cattle Market at Deptford, subject to the following conditions:

First. That the vessel (in this Order called the landing-vessel) into which the animals are transhipped be provided by the Local Authority for the City of London, and be specially fitted and appropriated for the purpose of conveying such animals.

Second. That the Local Authority for the City of London have received the special permission of the Commissioners of Customs so to employ the landing-vessel under this Order.

4. Those animals shall be transhipped in the presence and under the supervision and control of an Officer of Customs; and an Officer of Customs shall remain in charge of the animals on board the landing-vessel until its arrival at the Foreign Cattle Market at Deptford.

5. The landing-vessel shall proceed direct to that market, and the animals shall be landed there in the presence and under the supervision and control of an Officer of Customs.

6. The landing-vessel shall not be used for any other purpose during the time of its being so appropriated, and shall, immediately after each occasion of use, and before being again used, be cleansed and disinfected in manner provided respecting vessels by Article 5 of The Cleansing and Disinfection Order of 1878.

7. Animals so transhipped shall continue to be deemed foreign animals.

8. If anything is done or omitted to be done in contravention of any of the provisions of this Order, the owner or consignee of the animals, and the owner and the master of the landing-vessel, and in the case of the animals being transhipped in a Dock the Company or person owning the Dock, each according to and in respect of his or the Company's own acts or omissions, shall be deemed guilty of an offence against The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. This Order may be cited as The Schleswig-Holstein Order of 1879.

2. This Order extends to England and Wales and Scotland only.

3. In this Order words have the same meaning as in The Foreign Animals Order.

4. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the thirty-first day of May, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine, and shall cease to have effect from and immediately after the thirty-first day of December, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine, except as regards the recovery of any penalty incurred thereunder before that day.

5. Notwithstanding anything in the Order of Council dated the seventeenth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight, relating to (among other things) cattle brought

from the German Empire; cattle brought from a port or place in either of the parts of the German Empire respectively known as Schleswig and as Holstein, (in this Order referred to as Schleswig-Holstein cattle,) and sheep and goats brought from Schleswig or Holstein in the same vessel with Schleswig-Holstein cattle, may be landed for slaughter in a foreign animals wharf, but not elsewhere.

6. The landing of Schleswig-Holstein cattle in a foreign animals wharf shall be subject to the condition that they are accompanied by a declaration and certificates, such as are indicated in the forms in the Schedule to this Order, or to the like effect.

7. If the declaration accompanying any cattle imported under this Order is untrue in any particular, as regards any one of the cattle to which it relates, the master of the vessel shall be deemed guilty of an offence against The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, with respect to all the cattle to which the declaration relates, unless he shows to the satisfaction of the Justices before whom he is charged, that he did not know of the same being so untrue, and that he could not with reasonable diligence have obtained that knowledge.
