**N**OTICE is hereby given, that His Royal Highness The Prince of Wales will, by command of The Queen, hold a Levee at St. James's Palace, on behalf of Her Majesty, on Wednesday, the 25th of June, at two o'clock.

It is The Queen's pleasure that Presentations to His Royal Highness at this Levee shall be considered as equivalent to Presentations to Her Majesty.

#### REGULATIONS

TO BE OBSERVED AT THE QUEEN'S LEVEE TO BE HELD BY HIS ROYAL HIGHNESS THE PRINCE OF WALES, ON BEHALF OF HER MAJESTY, AT ST. JAMES'S PALACE.

*By Her Majesty's Command,*

The Noblemen and Gentlemen, who propose to attend Her Majesty's Levee, at St. James's Palace, are requested to bring with them two large cards, with their names *clearly written* thereon, one to be left with the Queen's Page in attendance in the Corridor, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to His Royal Highness.

#### PRESENTATIONS.

Any Nobleman or Gentleman who proposes to be presented, must leave at the Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace, *before twelve o'clock*, two clear days before the Levee, a card with his name written thereon, and with the name of the Nobleman or Gentleman by whom he is to be presented. In order to carry out the existing regulations that no presentation can be made at a Levee excepting by a person actually attending that Levee. It is also necessary that an intimation from the Nobleman or Gentleman who is to make the presentation, of his intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's approbation. It is Her Majesty's command that no presentations should be made at the Levee, except in accordance with the above regulations.

It is particularly requested, that in every case the names be *very distinctly written* upon the cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to his Royal Highness.

The State Apartments will be opened for the reception of Company coming to Court at one o'clock.

**A**T the Council Chamber, Whitehall, the 23rd day of June, 1879.

By the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

**T**HE Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do hereby define the following part of the Port of Glasgow, in the county of Lanark, as a foreign animals wharf:

All that space in the port and burgh of Glasgow being a part of the timber wharf and dépôt of the Trustees of the Clyde Navigation, situate on the south-east side of the road leading from Point-house to Partick, called the Ferry Road, bounded by a line commencing at a point on the south-east side of the said Ferry Road where the same is intersected by the water edge of the said timber wharf, thence passing in a south-easterly direction for a distance of two hundred and fifty-seven feet six inches or thereabouts along the coping which forms the water edge of the said wharf, thence running at a right angle from the water edge of the said wharf for a distance of ninety-five feet nine inches or thereabouts, thence at a right angle with the last described boundary and parallel with the coping or water edge of the said wharf for a distance of two hundred and twenty-two feet or thereabouts until it intersects the south-east side of the said Ferry Road, thence south-westwardly along the south-east side of the said Ferry Road for a distance of one hundred and two feet or thereabouts to the point first described as the commencement of this boundary, all which space is bounded by a wooden fence and is edged yellow on the plan of part of the port of Glasgow deposited at the Privy Council Office, a copy of which is deposited at the office of the Town Clerk of the burgh of Glasgow.

Whereas it has been represented unto Us that it is expedient that enquiry should be made into the several matters hereinafter mentioned, now know ye, that We, reposing great trust and confidence in your ability and discretion have nominated, constituted, and appointed, and do by these presents nominate, constitute, and appoint you the said James Plaisted, Baron Penzance; Alexander George Russell (commonly called Lord Alexander George Russell); Frederick, Bishop of Exeter; Robert Lowe; and George Tomkyns Chesney to be Our Commissioners to enquire and report what funds were subscribed, and upon what footing, for the purposes of providing a College for the education, bringing up, maintaining, and clothing of the children of deceased officers in Our Army, or in the Army of the then East India Company, and none others, now known as Wellington College; what moneys have since been received by the Governors, by gift, bequest, or otherwise, for the purposes of the said College, and how such funds have been applied; what number of boys are now maintained and educated on the foundation of the said College, and at what expense to the said College; and what other boys are educated in the said College and on what terms, and whether, having regard to the circumstances and objects under and for which the said College was founded, the funds and property thereof have been administered, so as to confer upon the orphan sons of officers of Our army the full amount of benefit which was intended for them, and to make such recommendations in the premises as to you shall seem fit.

And for the better discovery of the truth in the premises, We do by these presents give and grant unto you, or any three or more of you, full power and authority to call before you, or any three or more of you, such persons as you shall judge necessary, by whom you may be the better

informed of the truth in the premises, and to inquire of the premises, and every part thereof, by all other lawful ways and means whatsoever, and also to call for and examine all such books, documents, papers, and records as you shall judge likely to afford you the fullest information on the subject of this Our Commission.

And Our further will and pleasure is, that you, Our said Commissioners, do, with as little delay as possible, report to Us, in writing, under your hands and seals, or under the hands and seals of any three or more of you, your several proceedings under and by virtue of this Our Commission, together with what you shall find touching or concerning the premises.

And We further will and command, and by these presents ordain, that this Our Commission shall continue in full force and virtue, and that you, Our said Commissioners, or any three or more of you, shall and may from time to time proceed in the execution thereof, and of every matter and thing therein contained, although the same be not continued from time to time by adjournment.

And for the purpose of aiding you in such matters, We hereby appoint Our trusty and well-beloved Henry Bargrave Deane, Esq., Barrister-at-Law, to be Secretary to this Our Commission.

Given at Our Court at *Saint James's*, the twentieth day of *June*, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine, in the forty-third year of Our reign.

#### THE FAIRS ACT, 1871.

##### "BURSLEM WAKES" FAIR.

WHEREAS a representation has been duly made to me, as Secretary of State for the Home Department, by the Town Council of Burslem, as owners, that a Fair, commonly called "Burslem Wakes" has been annually held on the Saturday before the first Sunday after the 24th June, and continuing on the Monday and Tuesday next following, in the borough of Burslem, Staffordshire, and that it would be for the convenience and advantage of the public that the said Fair should be abolished:

And whereas notice of the said representation, and of the time when I should take the same into consideration, has been duly published in pursuance of "The Fairs Act, 1871:"

And whereas, on such representation and consideration, it appears to me that it would be for the convenience and advantage of the public that the said Fair should be abolished:

Now, therefore, I, as the Secretary of State for the Home Department, in exercise of the powers vested in me by "The Fairs Act, 1871," do hereby order that the Fair which has been annually held on the Saturday before the first Sunday after the 24th June, and continuing on the Monday and Tuesday next following, in the borough of Burslem, Staffordshire, shall be abolished as from the date of this Order.

#### GENERAL ORDER of the Local Government Board (Amendment of Regulations: Separate Workhouse Schools):—

To the Guardians of the Poor of the several Unions and Separate Parishes named in the Schedule to this Order:—

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by certain Orders, addressed by the Poor Law Commissioners, the Poor Law Board, and the Local Government Board, respectively, to the Guardians of the Poor of each of the Unions and Separate Parishes named in the Schedule to this Order, provision is made for the appointment by such Guardians, from time to time, of persons to hold certain offices, and amongst them the following; namely,—

Superintendent or	} of the separate Workhouse School belonging to such Union or Parish;
Master,	
Matron, or Assistant Matron,	
Schoolmaster and	
Schoolmistress,	

and the following regulations, or regulations to the like effect, are contained in or made applicable by the said Orders, with respect to the continuance in office of such Officers:

"Every Officer appointed to or holding any office under this Order, other than a Medical Officer, shall continue to hold the same until he die, or resign, or be removed by the Commissioners, or be proved to be insane, to the satisfaction of the Commissioners."

"If any Master and Matron hereafter appointed be husband and wife, and one of them should be dismissed by Order of the Commissioners, or should otherwise vacate his or her office, or should die, the other, or survivor, shall, at the expiration of the then current quarter, cease to hold his or her office of Master or Matron, as the case may be."

And whereas it is expedient that the regulations above recited should be altered as hereinafter mentioned :

Now therefore, we, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given to us by the statutes in that behalf, hereby Order as follows :—

ARTICLE I.—Instead of the regulations above recited, the following regulations numbered (1.) and (2.) respectively shall apply to the officers therein mentioned :—

(1.) Every Superintendent or Master, Matron or Assistant Matron, Schoolmaster, and Schoolmistress of a Separate Workhouse School, appointed after the first day of August, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine, shall continue to hold office until he or she die, or resign, or be dismissed by the Guardians, subject to the consent of the Local Government Board, or by the Local Government Board, or be proved to be insane by evidence which that Board shall deem sufficient.

Provided that the Guardians may, with the like consent, determine the appointment of any such officer at any time before, or at, the expiration of the first year of his or her service, by giving to the officer three months previous notice, in writing, signed by their Clerk, of such their intention.

(2.) In every case where both the Superintendent or Master and the Matron are appointed after the first day of August, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine, and whether they be husband and wife or not, the termination of the office of either of them by death, resignation, insanity, or dismissal as aforesaid, shall render the office of the other vacant at the expiration of the then current quarter.

And whereas by the above-mentioned Orders, and by other Orders of the Poor Law Board and the Local Government Board, the duties of Medical Officers for Separate Workhouse Schools are prescribed, and it is expedient to make further provision in that behalf :

Now therefore, we hereby further Order as follows :

ARTICLE II.—Every Medical Officer appointed by the Guardians after the first day of August, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine, for a Separate Workhouse School, shall immediately upon the occurrence of any case of contagious, infectious, or epidemic disease of a dangerous character amongst the pauper patients under his care, give notice thereof to the Clerk of the Sanitary Authority of the Urban or Rural Sanitary District, as the case may be, within which the School Building is situated, or to the Medical Officer of Health of such authority.

He shall also furnish from time to time to the Medical Officer of Health of such Sanitary Authority such information with respect to the cases of sickness and the deaths amongst the

pauper patients under his care as the Local Government Board may direct, and whenever the Local Government Board shall make regulations for all or any of the purposes specified in section 134 of the Public Health Act, 1875, he shall observe such regulations as far as the same relate to or concern his office.

ARTICLE III.—In this Order—

The word "Union" includes any Union of parishes incorporated or united for the relief or maintenance of the Poor under any Act of Parliament ;

The term "Separate Parish" means a parish or place which is under a separate Board of Guardians ;

The word "Guardians" includes any Governors, Directors, Acting Guardians, Vestrymen, or other officers appointed or entitled to act in the distribution or ordering of relief to the poor from the Poor Rates under any Act of Parliament.
