

vicarage of the said new parish of Saint Paul Halliwell and also as one of the patrons of the vicarage of the said new parish of Saint Peter Halliwell and with the consent of Richard Rainshaw Rothwell of Sharples Hall, Bolton-le-Moors in the said county of Lancaster Esquire commonly called the Marquis de Rothwell, and with the consents of James Cross Ormrod of East Bank, Halliwell aforesaid Esquire and of John Stanning of Leyland near Preston in the said county of Lancaster Esquire as the remaining patrons of the said vicarage of the new parish of Saint Peter Halliwell (in testimony whereof they the said consenting parties have respectively signed and sealed this representation) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England humbly represent that it would in our opinion be expedient that all those contiguous portions of the said new parish of Saint Paul Halliwell and of the said new parish of Saint Peter Halliwell which are described in the schedule hereunder written, all which portions, together with the boundaries thereof, are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed should be united and formed into one consolidated chapelry for the said church of Saint Thomas situate within the limits of the new parish of Saint Paul Halliwell as aforesaid and that the same should be named 'The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Thomas Halliwell.'

"We therefore humbly pray that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your Royal consideration and to make such order in respect thereto as to your Majesty in your Royal Wisdom shall seem meet.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Thomas Halliwell being :

"All that portion of the new parish of Saint Paul Halliwell in the county of Lancaster and in the diocese of Manchester which is bounded on the north-east by the new parish of Astley Bridge on the east by the district chapelry of Bolton-le-Moors on the south-east by the new parish of Saint Matthew Bolton-le-Moors on the south by the new parish of Saint Peter Halliwell all in the county and diocese aforesaid and on the remaining side that is to say on the north-west by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint Peter Halliwell from the new parish of Saint Paul Halliwell aforesaid at the point where Holy Arbour-lane is joined by Nuttall-street, and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of the said street for a distance of eighteen chains or thereabouts to its junction with Halliwell New-road and with Peak-street and extending thence first north-eastward and then northward along the middle of the last-mentioned street for a distance of six and three-quarter chains or thereabouts to its junction with Regan-street and Makant's-lane and extending thence first north-eastward and then eastward along the middle of the last-named lane for a distance of eleven and three-quarter chains or thereabouts to the point opposite to the south-eastern corner of the buildings called or known as Garnett Taylor's Mills where the said last-named lane abuts upon the stream called or known as Astley Brook and continuing thence eastward and in a direct line to a point in the middle of the said stream and extending thence first south-eastward and then north-eastward along the middle of the same stream for a distance of nine and a half chains or thereabouts to the boundary on the eastern side of the Sharples and Halliwell Mills which boundary divides the said new parish of

Saint Paul Halliwell from the new parish of Astley Bridge aforesaid.

"And also all that contiguous portion of the said new parish of Saint Peter Halliwell which is bounded on the south by the consolidated chapelry of Saint Luke Halliwell in the county and diocese aforesaid on the east by the said new parish of Saint Matthew, Bolton-le-Moors on the north by the new parish of Saint Paul Halliwell aforesaid and on the remaining side that is to say on the west by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the last-mentioned new parish from the new parish of St. Peter Halliwell aforesaid at the point on the eastern side of the houses called or known as Bennet's where Church-road and Holy Arbour-lane aforesaid joins Roper's-lane and extending thence first southward and then westward along the middle of the last-named lane for a distance of eighteen and a quarter chains or thereabouts to the boundary at the bridge which carried the same lane over the stream flowing from Doffcocker to the Mortfield Bleach Works which boundary divides the said new parish of St. Peter Halliwell from the consolidated chapelry of Saint Luke Halliwell aforesaid."

And whereas the said representation has been approved by Her Majesty in Council: now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Manchester.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the fifth and sixth years of Her Majesty; chapter one hundred and eight, and of the Act of the twenty-first and twenty-second years of Her Majesty chapter fifty-seven which are known as "The Ecclesiastical Leasing Acts," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the twenty-ninth day of May, in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine, in the words following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the fifth and sixth years of your Majesty chapter one hundred and eight and of the Act of the twenty-first and twenty-second years of your Majesty chapter fifty-seven which are known as 'The Ecclesiastical Leasing Acts,' have prepared and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council the following scheme for making better provision for the cure of souls within the district chapelry and new parish of Saint Mary-the-Virgin, Pilsley, in the county of Derby and in the diocese of Lichfield, out of the revenues of the rectory of the parish of North Wingfield in the same county and diocese.

"Whereas the said district chapelry and new parish of Saint Mary-the-Virgin, Pilsley was taken out of the said parish of North Wingfield.

"And whereas the annual value of the said rectory of North Wingfield has been improved
