

under and by virtue of a lease of certain minerals under a portion of the glebe lands of the said rectory bearing date the eighteenth day of August in the year one thousand eight hundred and sixty-six which was under the authority of the said Acts granted with the concurrence of us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners by the Reverend James Barrow the then rector or incumbent being also the patron of the said rectory to the lessees named in such lease for a term of twenty-five years from the twenty-fifth day of March in the year one thousand eight hundred and sixty-six and under and subject to certain rents and reservations in the same lease specified.

“And whereas certain sums of money have been under the provisions of the said lease received by us on account of the rents and royalties reserved under the same lease (the minimum or dead rent so payable to us in each year of the same lease amounting to three hundred pounds).

And whereas the moneys so paid to us as aforesaid have been invested from time to time in accordance with the provisions in that behalf contained in the said Acts in the purchase of three thousand six hundred and ninety one pounds eleven shillings and one penny Three Pounds per Centum Consolidated Bank Annuities or thereabouts which said Consolidated Bank Annuities are held by us in trust to pay over to the rector for the time being of the said parish of North Wingfield the annual interest or dividends from time to time arising from the same but subject nevertheless to the provisions contained in the said Acts with respect to making a certain portion of the improved value arising to the rectory of North Wingfield aforesaid payable to us for the benefit of our common fund or for the purposes of making better provision than now exists for the cure of souls within the said parish of North Wingfield.

“And whereas after making payable to or for the benefit of the incumbent of the district chapelry and new parish of Saint Mary-the-Virgin, Pilsley aforesaid such portion as is hereinafter mentioned of the improved value which has arisen as aforesaid to the said rectory of North Wingfield from the said lease the average annual income of the said rectory of North Wingfield will amount to one thousand pounds or thereabouts.

“Now, therefore, we humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme the yearly sum of one hundred pounds part of the annual interest or dividend arising from the Consolidated Bank Annuities so held by us as aforesaid shall be payable and paid by us to or for the benefit of the incumbent for the time being of the said district chapelry and new parish of Saint Mary-the-Virgin, Pilsley, and that no part of the capital sum of Consolidated Bank Annuities producing the said annual interest or dividend of one hundred pounds shall be hereafter so dealt with by us as to prejudice the right or prospective right of the incumbent for the time being of the district chapelry and new parish aforesaid to receive the same as herein recommended and proposed.

“And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of any other Act of Parliament.”

And whereas notice of the said scheme in accordance with the provision of the hereinbefore-

mentioned Acts has been given to the said Reverend James Barrow the patron of the rectory of the said parish of North Wingfield and the said Reverend James Barrow has signified his assent to the said scheme.

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Lichfield.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the fifty-ninth year of His Majesty King George the Third, chapter one hundred and thirty-four; of the Act of the second and third years of Her Majesty, chapter forty-nine; and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her Majesty, chapter fifty-five, duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a representation, bearing date the twenty-ninth day of May, in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine, in the words following; that is to say:

“We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the fifty-ninth year of His Majesty King George the Third, chapter one hundred and thirty-four; of the Act of the second and third years of your Majesty, chapter forty-nine; and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of your Majesty, chapter fifty-five, have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following representation as to the assignment of a district chapelry to the consecrated church situate within the limits of the township and chapelry of Pool in the parish of Otley, in the county of York, and in the diocese of Ripon.

“Whereas it appears to us to be expedient that a district chapelry should be assigned to the said church situate within the limits of the township and chapelry of Pool as aforesaid.

“Now therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Robert Bishop of the said diocese of Ripon (testified by his having signed and sealed this representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent, that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all that part of the said parish of Otley which is comprised within and is co-extensive with the limits of the said township and chapelry of Pool, all which part, together with the boundaries thereof, is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be assigned as a district chapelry to the said church situate within the limits of the said township and chapelry as aforesaid, and that the same should be named ‘The District Chapelry of Saint Wilfred Pool.’

“And with the like consent of the said Robert Bishop of the said diocese of Ripon (testified as aforesaid), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, further represent, that it appears to us to be expedient that banns of matrimony should be published, and that marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials, should be solemnized or per-
