WHEREAS by the second section of an Act passed in the session of the 29th and 30th years of Her Majesty's reign chapter 115, entitled "An Act to provide for the Government of the Straits Settlements" it is enacted that it shall be lawful for Her Majesty by Order or Orders in Council to be by Her from time to time made, with the advice of Her Privy Council, to establish all such Laws, Institutions and Ordinances, and to constitute such courts and officers, and to make such provisions and regulations for the proceedings in such Courts, and for the administration of justice, and for the raising and expenditure of the public revenue as may be deemed advisable for the peace, order and good government of Her Majesty's subjects and others within the said Settlements, or within any territory which may at any time be part of or dependant upon the same, any law statute or usage to the contrary in anywise notwithstanding.

And whereas it is expedient to provide for the surrender by the Governor of the said Settlements to Foreign States in the case of which the Extradition Act 1870 does not apply of persons accused of the commission of certain crimes within the jurisdiction of such States.

Now therefore it is hereby ordered by Her Majesty by and with the advice of Her Privy Council as follows :

1. If requisition be made to the Governor of the Straits Settlements by any Foreign State in the case of which the Extradition Act, 1870 does not for the time being apply or by any person recognised by him as an authorized minister or officer consul or vice-consul of such State for

the surrender of a fugitive criminal of such State who is or is suspected of being in any part of the Straits Settlements, the Governor may issue an order under his hand and seal to any magistrate of the said Settlements directing him to enquire into the truth of the charge.

2. Every such order for inquiry shall signify that the requisition for surrender has been made, shall state the nature of the crime charged, the name or designation (if the name be not known) and any other description that may be thought necessary of the fugitive criminal and shall require the magistrates to whom it shall be directed or any of them to inquire into the truth of the charge and proceed in pursuance of this Order in Council.

3. The order for enquiry shall be a sufficient proof of the requisition having been made, and a sufficient justification for all acts done in pursuance thereof and upon production thereof to the magistrate to whom it is directed he shall have the same powers as if the crime charged had been committed within his jurisdiction.

4. If the evidence adduced shall be such a would in the opinion of the magistrate justify the apprehension of the fugitive criminal named or designated in the order, if the crime charged had been committed within his jurisdiction he shall issue his warrant for the apprehension of the fugitive criminal. The warrant shall be issued in the same manner as if the crime charged had been committed within the jurisdiction of the magistrate issuing it and shall contain a memorandum stating that it is issued under this Order in Council.

5. Every warrant for the apprehension of a fugitive criminal issued under this Order in Council may be executed in any part of the Straits Settlements.

6. A fugitive criminal apprehended on a warrant issued under this Order in Council shall be forthwith brought before a magistrate within whose jurisdiction he shall be apprehended, and such magistrate shall deal with the case in the same manner as if the fugitive criminal were charged with an indictable offence committed within his jurisdiction.

7. If any fugitive criminal shall, in pursuance of this Order in Council, be brought before a magistrate other than the magistrate who issued the warrant for his apprehension, the depositions and documents upon which the warrant was issued, or copies thereof certified under the hand of the magistrate by whom the warrant was issued, shall, upon the requisition of the magistrate before

whom the fugitive criminal shall be brought, be forwarded to such last-mentioned magistrate.

8. Depositions, statements on oath, or affirmations taken in a foreign State, and copies of such original depositions or statements on oath or affirmations may, if duly authenticated, be received in evidence in proceedings under this Order in Council. Such depositions, statements, or affirmations, and copies thereof, shall be deemed to be duly authenticated, for the purposes of this Order in Council, if they purport to be certified under the hand of a judge, magistrate, or officer of the foreign State where the same were taken, to be the original depositions, statements, or affirmations, or to be true copies thereof, as the case may require; and if they are authenticated by the oath of some witness, or by being sealed with the official seal of some Minister of State; and all courts of justice and magistrates in the Straits Settlements shall take judicial notice of such official seal.

9. The magistrate before whom a fugitive criminal shall be brought, in pursuance of this Order in Council, shall, if such evidence is produced as would, according to the law of the Straits Settlements, justify the committal for trial of the fugitive criminal, if the crime of which he is accused had been committed in the Straits Settlements, commit him to some prison in the Straits Settlements, but otherwise shall order him to be discharged. If the magistrate commits the fugitive criminal to prison, he shall inform such fugitive criminal that he will not be surrendered until after the expiration of fifteen days, and that during such fifteen days he may appeal to any Judge of the Supreme Court of the Straits Settlements.

10. Every magistrate who shall commit a fugitive criminal to prison under this Order in Council, shall forthwith report the result of his proceedings to the Governor, together with any remarks which he may deem it necessary or proper to make upon the case, and together with a copy of all depositions and documents used before him.

11. Upon receipt of a magistrate's report of the committal of a fugitive criminal under the provisions of this Order in Council, the Governor may after the expiration of fifteen days from the date of committal or after the decision of the Judge before whom the appeal of the fugitive criminal is brought, as the case may be, or after such further period as may be allowed in either case by the Governor by warrant under his hand and seal, order the fugitive criminal to be surrendered to such person as may in his opinion be duly authorized to receive the fugitive criminal by the Foreign State from which the requisition for his surrender proceeded, and such fugitive criminal shall be surrendered accordingly. Provided always, that no fugitive criminal shall be surrendered under this Order in Council if (1), the offence in respect of which his surrender is demanded is of a political character, or if it is shown to the satisfaction of the Governor that the requisition for his surrender has been made with a view to try or punish him for an offence of a political character, nor (2) unless provision is made by the law of the State from which the requisition for his surrender proceeds or by arrangement that he shall not until he has been restored to Her Majesty's Dominions, be detained or tried in that State for any offence committed before his surrender other than the crime in respect of which he is surrendered.

12. It shall be lawful for the person to whom a fugitive criminal shall be so ordered to be surrendered to receive, hold in custody and convey

within the jurisdiction of the Foreign State from which the requisition for his surrender came such fugitive criminal, and if such fugitive criminal escapes out of the custody of such person it shall be lawful to retake him in the same manner as any person accused of any crime against the laws of the Straits Settlements may be retaken upon an escape from lawful custody.

13. If any fugitive criminal committed to prison under this Order in Council, shall not be surrendered and conveyed out of the Straits Settlements within two calendar months after his committal, it shall be lawful for any Judge of the Supreme Court of the Straits Settlements upon application by or on behalf of the fugitive criminal, and upon proof that notice of the application has been given to the Governor or to the Colonial Secretary to order the fugitive criminal to be discharged out of custody unless sufficient cause is shown to the contrary.

14. For the purposes of this Order in Council every Colony Dependency and constituent part of a Foreign State shall be deemed to be within the jurisdiction of such Foreign State.

15. In this Order in Council the term "Fugitive Criminal" means any person accused of any crime committed either before or after the date of this Order in Council, which if committed in England or within English jurisdiction would be one of the crimes described in the schedule to this Order in Council and the term "Fugitive Criminal of a State," means a person accused of any such crime as aforesaid committed within the jurisdiction of that State, and the term "Governor" means the person for the time being administering the government of the Straits Settlements, and words in the masculine gender include the feminine.

16. Every person who is accused of having counselled, procured, commanded, aided or abetted the commission of any such crime as aforesaid or of being accessory before or after the fact to any such crime shall be deemed for the purposes of this Order in Council to be accused of having committed such crime.

17. The schedule to this Order in Council annexed shall be taken to be part of this Order in Council.

THE SCHEDULE.

The following list of crimes is to be construed according to the law existing in the Straits Settlements at the date of the alleged crime:—

- Murder and attempt, and conspiracy to murder.
- Manslaughter.
- Counterfeiting and altering money, and uttering counterfeit or altered money.
- Forgery, counterfeiting, and altering and uttering what is forged of counterfeited or altered.
- Embezzlement and larceny.
- Obtaining money or goods by false pretences.
- Crimes by bankrupts against Bankruptcy Law.
- Fraud by a bailee, banker, agent, factor, trustee, or director or member or public officer of any Company made criminal by any Act for the time being in force.
- Rape.
- Abduction.
- Child stealing.
- Burglary and housebreaking.
- Arson.
- Robbery with violence.
- Threats by letter or otherwise with intent to extort.
- Piracy by law of nations.
- Sinking or destroying a vessel at sea, or attempting or conspiring to do so.

Assaults on board a ship on the high seas with intent to destroy life or to do grievous bodily harm.
 Revolt or conspiracy to revolt by two or more persons on board a ship on the high seas against the authority of the master.

Kidnapping and false imprisonment.

Perjury and subornation of perjury, whether under common or statute law.

Any indictable offence under the Larceny Act, 1861, or any Act amending or substituted for the same, which is not specifically mentioned in this schedule.

Any indictable offence under the Act of the session of the twenty-fourth and twenty-fifth years of the reign of Her present Majesty, chapter ninety-seven. "To consolidate and amend the Statute Law of England and Ireland relating to malicious injuries to property," or any Act amending or substituted for the same which is not specifically mentioned in this schedule.

Any indictable offence under the Act of the session of the twenty-fourth and twenty-fifth years of the reign of Her present Majesty, chapter ninety-eight. "To consolidate and amend the Statute Law of England and Ireland relating to indictable offences by forgery," or any Act amending or substituted for the same, which is not specifically mentioned in this schedule.

Any indictable offence under the Act of the session of the twenty-fourth and twenty-fifth years of the reign of Her present Majesty, chapter ninety-nine. "To consolidate and amend the Statute Law of the United Kingdom against offences relating to the coin," or any Act amending or substituted for the same which is not specifically mentioned in this schedule.

Any indictable offence under the Act of the session of the twenty-fourth and twenty-fifth years of the reign of Her present Majesty, chapter one hundred. "To consolidate and amend the Statute Law of England and Ireland relating to offences against the person," or any Act amending or substituted for the same which is not specifically mentioned in this schedule.

Any indictable offence under the laws for the time being in force in relation to bankruptcy, which is not specifically mentioned in his schedule.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the first session of Parliament holden in the first and second years of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "An Act to abridge the holding of benefices in plurality, and to make better provision for the residence of the clergy," it is, amongst other things, enacted, "That whenever it shall appear to the Archbishop of the Province, with respect to his own diocese, and whenever it shall be represented to him by the Bishop of any diocese, or by the Bishops of any two dioceses, that two or more benefices, or that one or more benefice or benefices, and one or more spiritual sinecure rectory or rectories, vicarage or vicarages, in his or their diocese or dioceses, being either in the same parish or contiguous to each other, and of which the aggregate population shall not exceed one thousand five hundred persons, and the aggregate yearly value shall not exceed five hundred pounds, may, with advantage to the interests of religion, be united into one benefice, the said Archbishop of the Province shall inquire into the circumstances of

the case; and if on such inquiry it shall appear to him that such union may be usefully made, and will not be of inconvenient extent, and that the patron or patrons of the said benefices, sinecure rectory or rectories, vicarage or vicarages respectively, is or are consenting thereto, such consent being signified in writing under the hands of such patron or patrons, the said Archbishop shall, six weeks before certifying such inquiry and consent to Her Majesty; as herein-after directed, cause, with respect to his own diocese, a statement in writing of the facts, and in other cases a copy in writing of the aforesaid representation, to be affixed on or near the principal outer door of the church, or in some public and conspicuous place in each of such benefices, sinecure rectories or vicarages, with notice to any person or persons interested, that he, she, or they, may, within such six weeks, show cause in writing under his, her, or their hand or hands, to the said Archbishop, against such union; and if no sufficient cause be shown within such time, the said Archbishop shall certify the inquiry and consent aforesaid to Her Majesty in Council, and thereupon it shall be lawful for Her Majesty in Council to make and issue an Order or Orders for uniting such benefices, sinecure rectory or rectories, vicarage or vicarages, into one benefice, with cure of souls, for ecclesiastical purposes only; and it shall be lawful for Her Majesty in Council to give directions for regulating the course and succession in which the patrons, if there be more than one patron, shall present or nominate to such united benefice, from time to time, as the same shall become vacant."

And whereas the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury pursuant to the provisions of the said Act, hath duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a certificate in writing, bearing date the first day of April in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"To the QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

"We the undersigned Archibald Campbell Lord Archbishop of the Province of Canterbury Primate of all England and Metropolitan do hereby certify to your Majesty in Council.

"That the Right Reverend Thomas Legh Lord Bishop of St. Albans as Bishop of the diocese within which are situate the rectory of Salcot Virley in the county of Essex and the perpetual curacy of Salcot in the same county having represented unto us that the said benefices being contiguous to each other and of which the aggregate population does not exceed one thousand five hundred persons might with advantage to the interests of religion be united into one benefice we enquired into the circumstances of the case.

"That on such enquiry it appeared to us that such union might be usefully made and would not be of inconvenient extent and that Sir William Neville Abdy, of No. 39 Queen's Gate in the county of Middlesex Baronet being the patron or person entitled to present to the said rectory of Salcot Virley the same being now vacant and Edward Coxwell of No. 7 Gloucester-square Southampton in the county of Southampton, being the person entitled to present to the said rectory upon the next succeeding and every alternate vacancy thereof and the Reverend Frederick Watson of the Warrens in the parish of Peering in the county of Essex Clerk and William Henry Hall of Six Mile Bottom in the county of Cam-

bridge Esquire being the patrons or persons entitled to present to the said perpetual curacy of Salcot the same being now vacant have respectively signified their consents in writing to the union of the said benefices into one benefice with cure of souls for ecclesiastical purposes and to the course and succession hereinafter proposed in which the respective patrons shall present to the united benefice from time to time as the same shall become vacant.

"That six weeks and upwards before certifying such enquiry and consent to your Majesty in Council we caused a copy in writing of the aforesaid representation of the said Lord Bishop to be affixed on the principal outer door of the parish church of each of the said benefices with notice to any person or persons interested that he she or they might within such six weeks show cause in writing under his her or their hand or hands to us the said Archbishop against such union and no such cause has been shown.

"The representation of the said Lord Bishop of St. Albans our enquiry into the circumstances of the case the statement of circumstances in reply thereto, the consents in writing of the patrons and the copies of the representation and notice before-mentioned are hereunto annexed.

"And we do hereby certify the enquiry and consent aforesaid to your Majesty in Council to the intent that your Majesty in Council may in case your Majesty in Council shall think fit so to do make and issue an Order for uniting the said benefices into one benefice with cure of souls for ecclesiastical purposes and for declaring that the course and succession in which the respective patrons for the time being shall present to such united benefice from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, the first turn or right of patronage shall belong to and be exercised by the said Edward Coxwell his heirs and assigns the next succeeding turn or right of patronage shall belong to and be exercised by the said Frederick Watson and William Henry Hall their heirs and assigns the next turn or right of patronage shall belong to and be exercised by the said Sir William Neville Abdy his heirs and assigns and afterwards the right of patronage shall be in like order course and succession for ever.

"As witness our hand this first day of April, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine. "A. C. Cantuar."

Now therefore Her Majesty in Council by and with the advice of Her said Council is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered that the said rectory of Salcot Virley and the perpetual curacy of Salcot both situate in the county of Essex and diocese of St. Albans shall be united into one benefice, with cure of souls for ecclesiastical purposes only.

And Her Majesty in Council is pleased to give directions and declare that the course and succession in which the respective patrons for the time being shall present or nominate to the said united benefice from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say: the first turn or right of patronage shall belong to and be exercised by Edward Coxwell his heirs and assigns, the next succeeding turn or right of patronage shall belong to and be exercised by Frederick Watson and William Henry Hall their heirs and assigns, the next turn or right of patronage shall belong to and be exercised by Sir William Neville Abdy his heirs and assigns and afterwards the right of patronage shall be in like order course and succession for ever.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the fifty-ninth year of His Majesty King George the Third, chapter one hundred and thirty-four; of the Act of the second and third years of Her Majesty, chapter forty-nine; and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her Majesty, chapter fifty-five, duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a representation, bearing date the twenty-fourth day of April, in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine, in the words and figures following; that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the fifty-ninth year of His Majesty King George the Third, chapter one hundred and thirty-four; of the Act of the second and third years of your Majesty, chapter forty-nine; and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of your Majesty, chapter fifty-five, have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following representation as to the assignment of a district chapelry to the consecrated church of Saint John the Evangelist, situate within the limits of the parish of Weston, in the county of Somerset, and in the diocese of Bath and Wells.

"Whereas it appears to us to be expedient that a district chapelry should be assigned to the said church of Saint John the Evangelist situate within the limits of the parish of Weston as aforesaid.

"Now therefore, with the consent of the Right Honourable and Right Reverend Arthur Charles Bishop of the said diocese of Bath and Wells (testified by his having signed and sealed this representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent, that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all that part of the said parish of Weston which is described in the schedule hereunder written, all which part, together with the boundaries thereof, is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be assigned as a district chapelry to the said church of Saint John the Evangelist, situate within the limits of such parish as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The District Chapelry of Saint John Weston.'

"And with the like consent of the said Arthur Charles, Bishop of the said diocese of Bath and Wells (testified as aforesaid), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, further represent, that it appears to us to be expedient that banns of matrimony should be published, and that marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials, should be solemnized or performed at the said church of Saint John the Evangelist situate within the limits of the parish of Weston as aforesaid, and that the fees to be received in respect of the publication of such banns and of the solemnization or performance of the said offices should be paid and belong to the minister of the same church for the time being: Provided always, that nothing herein contained shall be construed as expressing any intention on the part of us the said Commissioners to concur in or approve the taking of any fee for the performance of the said office of baptism or for the registration thereof.

"We, therefore, humbly pray that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your Royal consideration and to make such Order with respect thereto as to your Majesty, in your Royal wisdom, shall seem meet.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference:

"The District Chapelry of Saint John Weston being:—

"All that part of the parish of Weston in the county of Somerset and in the diocese of Bath and Wells, which is bounded on the west by the parish of Kelston anciently called or known as Kelweston in the county and diocese aforesaid on the south by the River Avon or in other words partly by the parish of Newton Saint Loe and partly by the parish of Twerton-on-Avon anciently called or known as Twiverton, both in the said county and diocese on the east by the parish of Trinity Walcot, in the same county and diocese and upon the remaining side, that is to say on the north partly by the parish of St. Swithin Walcot, in the same county and diocese and partly by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the last-named parish from the parish of Weston aforesaid at a point in Weston-road otherwise called or known as Weston-lane opposite to a boundary stone inscribed 'W. St. J. D. C. 1879, No. 1,' and placed at the junction of the same road with the Park-gardens branch of Audley-road at the northern end of the wall or fence forming the eastern, south-eastern and southern boundaries of the house and grounds called or known as Fern Lodge, and extending thence first southward to such boundary stone and then southward south-westward and westward along the said wall or fence for a distance of one hundred and thirty-three yards or thereabouts to its junction with the wall or fence forming the southern boundary of the land attached to the house called or known as Sunnyside and continuing thence westward for a distance of one hundred and three yards or thereabouts, along the last-described wall or fence and along the wall or fence forming the southern boundary of the land attached to the house called or known as Weston Villa to the junction of the last-described wall or fence with the wall or fence forming the eastern boundary of the grounds attached to the house called or known as The Priory and extending thence southward along the last-described wall or fence for a distance of twelve yards or thereabouts to its junction with the wall or fence forming the southern boundary of the grounds attached to the last-named house and extending thence westward for a distance of one hundred and sixty-eight yards or thereabouts along the last-described wall or fence and along the walls or fences forming the southern boundaries of the houses and gardens called or known respectively as Apthorp Villa Henley Lodge and The Retreat to a boundary stone inscribed 'W. St. J. D. C., 1879, No. 2,' and placed on the western end of the last-described wall or fence on the eastern side of the road called or known as Audley-road and extending thence westward and in a direct line for a distance of forty-four chains or thereabouts (thereby crossing the last-named road and crossing Portway-road at a point indicated by a boundary stone inscribed 'W. St. J. D. C. 1879, No. 3,' and placed on the eastern side of the said Portway-road at a distance of twenty-one and a half chains to the north of the junction of the same road with the Upper Bristol-road) to a boundary stone inscribed 'W. St. J. D. C. 1879, No. 4' and placed at the northern end of the occupation-road leading from the close numbered 343 upon the tithe commutation map of the said parish of Weston, and upon the map hereunto annexed past the eastern side of the buildings called or known as Partis College into the Upper Bristol-road aforesaid and extend-

ing thence that is from such last-described boundary stone southward along the middle of the said occupation-road for a distance of seven and three-quarter chains or thereabouts to its junction at the south-eastern corner of the said college buildings with the Upper Bristol-road aforesaid and extending thence first north-westward and then westward along the middle of the last-named road for a distance of nearly one mile to the boundary at the south-western angle of the grounds attached to the house called or known as Kelston Knowl which boundary divides the said parish of Weston from the parish of Kelston anciently called or known as Kelweston aforesaid."

And whereas the said representation has been approved by Her Majesty in Council: now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Bath and Wells.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the thirteenth and fourteenth years of Her Majesty, chapter forty-one; and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her Majesty, chapter fifty-five duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the twenty-ninth day of May, in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine, in the words following, that is to say:

"We the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England in pursuance of the Act of the thirteenth and fourteenth years of your Majesty chapter forty-one and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of your Majesty chapter fifty-five have prepared and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council the following scheme for setting out and constituting a district for spiritual purposes and annexing such district to the consecrated church of All Saints situate within the limits of the new parish of Saint James Gorton (some time part of the original parish of Manchester) in the county of Lancaster and in the diocese of Manchester.

"Whereas it appears to us to be expedient that a district for spiritual purposes should be set out and constituted for and annexed to the said church of All Saints situate within the limits of the new parish of Saint James, Gorton aforesaid.

FACTORY AND WORKSHOP ACT, 1878. 41 Vict. c. 16. s. 53.

OVERTIME.—ADDITIONAL TWO HOURS.

Order of Secretary of State extending Special Exception.

WHEREAS the Factory and Workshop Act, 1878, contains a special exception to the effect that the regulations of the Act with respect to the employment of young persons and women shall not prevent the employment in the factories and workshops or parts thereof to which the exception applies of young persons and of women during a period of employment beginning at 6 A.M. and ending at 8 P.M., or beginning at 7 A.M. and ending at 9 P.M., or beginning at 8 A.M. and ending at 10 P.M., if they are employed in accordance with the following conditions; namely,

- (1.) There shall be allowed to every such young person and woman for meals during the period of employment not less than two hours, of which half an hour shall be after five o'clock in the evening; and
- (2.) Any such young person or woman shall not be so employed on the whole for more than 5 days in any one week, nor for more than 48 days in any 12 months.

And whereas the special exception is by the Act declared to apply to the factories and workshops referred to in the said section;

And whereas it has been proved to my satisfaction that in the non-textile factories and workshops of the classes mentioned in the schedule hereunder it is necessary, by reason of press of work arising at certain recurring seasons of the year, and of the liability of the business to a sudden press of orders arising from unforeseen events, to employ male young persons in manner authorized by this exception, and that such employment will not injure the health of the male young persons affected thereby:

Now I, the Right Honourable Richard Assheton Cross, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, by this Order, made under Part 2 of the said Act, extend this exception accordingly, so far only as relates to male young persons.

This Order shall come into effect on 30th June, 1879, and shall, unless previously revoked, continue in force until 31st December, 1882, and no longer.
