THE FAIRS ACT, 1871.

TUNSTALL "WAKES" OR FAIR.

WHEREAS a representation has been duly made to me, as Secretary of State for the Home Department, by the Local Board of Health for the district of Tunstall, Staffordshire, as owners, that a Fair has been annually held on the Saturday before the third Sunday in July, and continued on the Sunday, Monday, and Tuesday next following, in the district of Tunstall, in the county of Stafford, and that it would be for the convenience and advantage of the public that the said Fair should be abolished:

And whereas notice of the said representation, and of the time when I should take the same into
