PRESENT,

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the twenty-third and twenty-fourth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and forty-two, duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme bearing date the fourth day of July, in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Act of the twenty-third and twenty-fourth years of your Majesty, chapter one hundred and forty-two, have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme for effecting an union of two benefices, situate within the city and diocese of London; to wit the benefice (being an united rectory) of Saint Nicholas, Cole Abbey, with Saint Nicholas Olave, and Saint Mary, Somerset, with Saint Mary, Mounthaw, and the benefice (being a rectory) of Saint Benet, Paul's Wharf, with Saint Peter, Paul's Wharf.

“Whereas the Right Honourable and Right Reverend John, Bishop of the said diocese of London, has caused proposals for a scheme for effecting an union of the said two benefices to be laid before us, which proposals are prepared under the seventh and eighth sections of the said Act, and are approved by the said John, Bishop of the said diocese of London, and are assented to by the Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral Church of Saint Paul, in the city and diocese of London, who are the patrons of the said united rectory of Saint Nicholas, Cole Abbey, with Saint Nicholas Olave, and Saint Mary, Somerset, with Saint Mary, Mounthaw, and who are also the patrons of the said rectory of Saint Benet, Paul's Wharf, with Saint Peter, Paul's Wharf, and the same proposals are also assented to by the vestries of the six parishes concerned; that is to say, by the joint vestry of the four parishes of the said united rectory, and by the joint vestry of the two parishes of the said rectory of Saint Benet, Paul's Wharf, and Saint Peter, Paul's Wharf.

“And whereas it appears to us to be expedient that the said proposed union of the said two benefices should be effected, and that such arrangements relating thereto and to the other matters

hereinafter contained should be made as are hereinafter mentioned.

“And whereas the said John, Bishop of the said diocese of London, and the said patrons of the said two benefices, and the said vestries of the said six parishes, are willing that the scheme for effecting the said union should embody certain modifications of the said proposals, and this present scheme does embody the same modifications accordingly, but otherwise is based upon the said proposals.

“Now, therefore, with the consent of the said John, Bishop of the said diocese of London (in testimony whereof he hath to this scheme set his hand and episcopal seal), and with the consent of the said Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral Church of Saint Paul, in the said city and diocese of London (in testimony whereof they have to this scheme set their common or corporate seal), and with the consent of the joint vestry of the said four parishes of Saint Nicholas, Cole Abbey, and Saint Nicholas Olave and Saint Mary, Somerset, and Saint Mary, Mounthaw, and of the joint vestry of the said two parishes of Saint Benet, Paul's Wharf, and Saint Peter, Paul's Wharf, (in testimony whereof this scheme is signed in the case of each vestry by the chairman of a meeting of the same vestry duly convened for the purpose of giving such consent), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose all that is in this scheme contained under the several parts or headings hereinafter mentioned, as follows:

“PART I.

“As to the said proposed union itself, and certain immediate incidents thereof affecting incumbents, we recommend and propose:

“1. That the said benefice of Saint Nicholas, Cole Abbey, with Saint Nicholas Olave, Saint Mary, Somerset, with Saint Mary, Mounthaw, and the said benefice of Saint Benet, Paul's Wharf, with Saint Peter, Paul's Wharf, be united into one benefice under the style of ‘The United Rectory of Saint Nicholas, Cole Abbey, Saint Nicholas Olave, Saint Mary, Somerset, and Saint Mary Mounthaw, with Saint Benet, Paul's Wharf, and Saint Peter, Paul's Wharf.

“2. That if upon the day when this present scheme, being duly ratified by an Order of your Majesty in Council, shall be published in the London Gazette, both of the said present benefices shall be vacant, the union shall forthwith take effect; and if one only shall be then vacant, the union shall also forthwith take effect if the incum-

bent of the other of the said present benefices shall consent to become the incumbent of the united benefice; but if he shall not so consent, then the union shall take effect upon the then next avoidance of his benefice, and the then incumbent of the other of the said present benefices shall be the first incumbent of the united benefice; and if upon the day when this present scheme shall be so published as aforesaid both of the said present benefices shall be full then the union shall take effect upon the next avoidance of either of them if the incumbent for the time being of the other of the said present benefices shall consent to become the incumbent of the united benefice, and he shall be the first incumbent of the united benefice; but if he shall not so consent, then the union shall take effect immediately upon the next avoidance of his benefice, and the then incumbent of the other of the said present benefices shall be the first incumbent of the united benefice; and that in either case it shall be lawful for the Bishop to admit to the united benefice such first incumbent (if an incumbent for the time being of either of the existing benefices) without any form or fee of or for presentation, and he shall thereupon become the incumbent of the united benefice. Provided always, that until the time of the union taking effect, the said two present benefices shall remain separate, and the rights and liabilities of each of them, and of the incumbent of each of them as such, shall remain unaffected; and provided also, and with the consent of the Reverend Herbert Kynaston, Clerk in Holy Orders, Doctor in Divinity (in testimony of which consent he has signed and sealed this scheme), we recommend and propose that the right which by virtue of a certain Order of your Majesty in Council gazetted on the thirteenth day of November in the year one thousand eight hundred and sixty-six is now vested in him, the said Herbert Kynaston, of succeeding to the incumbency of the said present benefice of Saint Nicholas, Cole Abbey, with Saint Nicolas Olave, and Saint Mary, Somerset, with Saint Mary, Mounthaw, upon the next avoidance thereof, shall as from the day in this present clause first mentioned cease to exist.

"3. That if after the day aforesaid, and before the union shall have taken effect, the incumbent for the time being of either of the said present benefices shall with the consent of the Bishop of the diocese retire from his incumbency in order that the union may take immediate effect, the incumbent so retiring from his incumbency shall be entitled during the period hereinafter specified to receive out of the annual income of the united benefice and by way of compensation an annual sum equal to the net annual value of the tithe and tithe rent-charge and other endowments belonging to his incumbency (not reckoning the house of residence as an item of value) which annual compensation shall be computed on the average receipts belonging to such retiring incumbent in respect of the endowments of his benefice during and in respect of the three years immediately preceding the year in which the said incumbent shall so retire and shall commence as from the day on which the union shall take effect and shall be payable by equal half-yearly payments in every year, the first half-yearly payment thereof to become due at the end of six calendar months next after the day on which the union shall take effect, the said annual compensation to be payable to the retiring incumbent during the remainder of his life, or until he shall accept any other church preferment of equal or greater net annual value, to be ascertained without reference to and exclusively of the house of residence (if any); upon

his accepting which preferment the said annual compensation shall absolutely cease to be payable, but if he shall accept other church preferment of a less net annual value (to be ascertained as lastly before mentioned) then the said annual compensation shall be reduced in each year by a sum equal in amount to the net annual sum (to be ascertained as aforesaid) which is payable to him for the same year in respect of such other preferment, but if the same annual compensation shall cease by his death or by his acceptance of such church preferment (as the case may be) on any other than one of the half-yearly days of payment, then he or his executors or administrators shall be entitled to a proportionate part of the said annual compensation for the period which at the time of such ceasing shall have elapsed of the current half year, the same proportionate part to be payable at the end of the current half year.

"4. That the said annual compensation shall be charged upon the annual income of the united benefice, and shall be payable out of the same by the incumbent for the time being of the united benefice, and that, as between the incumbent for the time being of the united benefice and the retiring incumbent and his assigns, the said annual compensation shall be a first charge at law and in equity upon the income of the united benefice, and the incumbent of the united benefice shall be deemed to have accepted the same benefice subject to a trust to pay to the retiring incumbent or his assigns the said annual compensation out of the income of the said united benefice, and for that purpose to use all due diligence to receive and collect the income of the said united benefice, and that if such annual compensation or any part thereof shall at any time be in arrear and unpaid for more than twenty-one days after any of the said half-yearly days of payment, and the fact of the same being so in arrear shall be verified by the declaration of the incumbent who shall have so retired or his assigns, or in such other manner as shall be required by the Bishop of the diocese, then it shall be lawful for the said Bishop to make an order upon the incumbent for the time being of the united benefice requiring him to pay the amount in arrear within a time to be specified in such order; and if the same be not paid within such period, then it shall be lawful for the said Bishop to sequester the profits of the united benefice until all such arrears, and the costs of the sequestration, shall have been paid and satisfied. But that the power to be so conferred on the said Bishop shall not in anywise abridge or interfere with the rights of the incumbent who shall have so retired or his assigns to recover the said annual compensation and all arrears thereof by proceedings at law or in equity, or with the legal and equitable rights of the incumbent for the time being of the united benefice to recover from a preceding incumbent of the united benefice, his executors or administrators, any arrears of the said annual compensation which ought to have been paid by such preceding incumbent.

"5. That if the union shall have taken immediate effect by reason of the incumbent for the time being of either of the existing incumbencies having retired from his incumbency, and such incumbent shall be living when the united benefice shall for the first time after such union become vacant, the incumbent who shall have so retired shall (if in the opinion of the said Bishop not disqualified by age or otherwise), be entitled to fill such vacancy, and may be admitted by the Bishop to the united benefice without any form or fee of or for presentation, and he shall upon such admission become the incumbent of the united

benefice, and the annual compensation hereinbefore made payable to him shall thenceforth absolutely cease to be payable.

"6. That inasmuch as the parsonage house which is mentioned in the said Order of your Majesty in Council, gazetted on the thirteenth day of November in the year one thousand eight hundred and sixty-six, has now been removed under statutory powers possessed by the Metropolitan Board of Works, a new parsonage house for the rector of the united benefice proposed to be hereby created shall be provided, the said house to be erected according to plans to be approved by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners and by the Bishop of London, and to be built upon land to be duly conveyed to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, and to be paid for out of a certain sum of four thousand and five pounds six shillings and tenpence New Three pounds per centum Consolidated Bank Annuities now belonging to the rector for the time being of the said united rectory of Saint Nicholas, Cole Abbey, with Saint Nicholas Olave and Saint Mary, Somerset, with Saint Mary, Mounthaw.

"PART II.

"As to the parish church of the united benefice and certain matters connected therewith, we recommend and propose :

"1. That upon the union taking effect the church of Saint Nicholas, Cole Abbey, shall become and thereafter continue to be the parish church of the united benefice.

"2. That from and after the union taking effect, the expense of maintaining the fabric of the parish church of the united benefice and providing the things requisite for Divine service therein shall (subject nevertheless to the provisions of the Compulsory Church Rate Abolition Act, 1868,) be defrayed by the six parishes of the united benefice, and shall be provided in the following manner: that is to say, as between the two benefices now proposed to be united, the said expense shall be apportioned in accordance with the ratio for the time being existing between the assessment to the poor rate of property within the area of the one benefice, and the like assessment of property within the area of the other benefice, the four parishes of the one benefice to provide as between themselves their portion of the said expense in manner set forth in the said Order of your Majesty in Council, gazetted on the thirteenth day of November in the year one thousand eight hundred and sixty-six, and the two parishes of the other benefice to provide as between themselves their portion of the said expense in the same manner in which their church expenses are now by them provided.

"3. That upon the union taking effect, the sacramental plate used in the church of Saint Benet, Paul's Wharf, shall be transferred to the parish church of the united benefice; but if not needed for such church, then that the same, or so much of the said plate as shall not be so needed, shall be appropriated for the use of such other church or chapel as the Bishop of London shall select.

"4. That from the date when the union shall take effect, the rents which are now payable for the use of lights opening into the graveyard of the parish of Saint Peter, Paul's Wharf, shall belong to and be recoverable by the churchwardens of the same parish, and shall be by them applied in paying the charges (if any) upon the said graveyard, and in keeping in proper and seemly condition the same graveyard and the fences thereof.

"5. That upon the union taking effect, if the table of fees used in the two churches of Saint

Nicholas, Cole Abbey, and Saint Benet, Paul's Wharf, be alike in all particulars, the table of fees used in the church which will become the church of the united benefice shall, until revised or altered by proper authority, be the table of fees for all the six parishes of the united benefice; but if the said tables of fees in use in the said two churches respectively be not alike in all particulars, then the same shall be of no authority, and a new table of fees shall be made by the proper authority for the use of the same six parishes, as if the same were one parish.

"6. That if upon the union taking effect the present organist, parish clerk, and sextoness, or any of them of the said church of Saint Benet, Paul's Wharf, shall still be in office, they and each of them shall thereupon cease to hold such office respectively, receiving by way of compensation for the loss of such office the sum which in that behalf is next hereinafter mentioned: that is to say, the organist the sum of one hundred pounds; the parish clerk the sum of two hundred pounds; and the sextoness the sum one hundred pounds, which said several sums the Committee of the Welsh Congregation in London, mentioned in Part III of this scheme, have undertaken to provide and to pay over to the said organist, parish clerk, and sextoness respectively.

"7. That upon the union taking effect, the persons who at that time shall hold the offices of parish clerk and of sexton of the parishes of Saint Nicholas, Cole Abbey, and Saint Nicholas Olave, and Saint Mary, Somerset, and Saint Mary, Mounthaw, shall, without any further appointment, become the parish clerk and the sexton respectively of all the six parishes of the united benefice; but no parish clerk or sexton of the said six parishes shall have any larger estate or interest in his or her office than he or she shall have possessed in his or her original office before the union.

"8. That the register books belonging to the church of Saint Benet, Paul's Wharf, and the iron safe or safes (except as is mentioned in Part III, clause 2, of this scheme) in which the said books have heretofore been kept, shall be removed to the custody of the incumbent of the united benefice, to be preserved along with the other register books of the same benefice.

"PART III.

"As to the church of Saint Benet, Paul's Wharf, we recommend and propose :

"1. That as soon as conveniently may be after the taking effect of the union the church of Saint Benet, together with the font, communion table, organ, and other furniture shall be (if the Bishop of London for the time being see fit) given over to the Committee of the Welsh Congregation in London to be held and used by them for the purpose of Divine worship in the Welsh language according to the use of the Church of England, so long as they shall continue to maintain the fabric, monuments, and tablets, and the services therein, and to keep the same church in due order to the satisfaction of the Bishop of London.

"2. That at hours when the said church of Saint Benet is not being used by the said Welsh Congregation the parishioners of Saint Benet and Saint Peter's parishes shall continue to have the right of using the vestry room thereof for the purpose of parochial or charity meetings, and also that the two iron safes in which the vestry clerks of the parishes of Saint Benet and Saint Peter have heretofore placed their books shall continue to be so used, but that the safe in which the sacramental plate has hitherto been kept shall be henceforth used by the said Welsh Congregation.

"3. That if at any time the said Committee of

the said Welsh Congregation, or other the legal or official representative or representatives for the time being of the said congregation, shall cease to use the said church of Saint Benet for such purpose as aforesaid, or shall fail to maintain the fabric, monuments, and tablets, and the services therein, or to keep the same church in due order to the satisfaction of the said Bishop of London, and the said Bishop shall certify this fact in writing to us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, we shall, so soon as conveniently may be, with the consent of the said Bishop, prepare and submit to your Majesty in Council for ratification a scheme or schemes (if more than one scheme shall appear to us to be necessary) authorizing the said church of Saint Benet to be taken down, and its materials together with its site to be sold at such time or times and in such manner as shall be provided for in such lastly-mentioned scheme or schemes.

"PART IV.

"Upon the subject of patronage, we recommend and propose as follows; namely,

"That the perpetual advowson and whole right of patronage of and presentation to the united benefice of Saint Nicholas, Cole Abbey, Saint Nicholas Olave, Saint Mary, Somerset, and Saint Mary, Mounthaw, with Saint Benet, Paul's Wharf, and Saint Peter, Paul's Wharf, shall belong to the Dean and Chapter of the said Cathedral Church of Saint Paul in the city and diocese of London and their successors, in whom the advowson of each of the two benefices which will form the said united benefice is now vested as aforesaid; and that upon and from the day when the said proposed union of the said two benefices of Saint Nicholas, Cole Abbey, with Saint Nicholas Olave, and Saint Mary, Somerset, with Saint Mary, Mounthaw, and Saint Benet, Paul's Wharf, with Saint Peter, Paul's Wharf, shall have taken effect as hereinbefore mentioned, the perpetual advowson and whole right of patronage of and presentation to a certain other benefice, to wit, the benefice (being a rectory) of Saint Martin, Ludgate, in the said city of London, which advowson, patronage, and presentation is now vested in the Bishop for the time being of the diocese of London, shall by virtue of any Order of your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme, and duly published in the London Gazette, and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order, be transferred from the Bishop of the said diocese of London and his successors, and become and be vested in the said Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral Church of Saint Paul in the city and diocese of London and their successors: to which transfer the consents of the said John, Bishop of London, and of the said Dean and Chapter alone are necessary, and are given as hereinbefore is mentioned.

"PART V.

"As to the endowments of the united benefice, we recommend and propose:

"That upon the union taking effect, all the property constituting the endowments of the united rectory of Saint Nicholas, Cole Abbey, with Saint Nicholas Olave, and Saint Mary Somerset, with Saint Mary, Mounthaw, and of the rectory of Saint Benet, Paul's Wharf, with Saint Peter, Paul's Wharf respectively, shall, without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than this scheme and any duly gazetted Order of your Majesty in Council ratifying the same, be transferred to and annexed to the united benefice as the endowment thereof, subject nevertheless to any pension to be paid to a retired incumbent as in Part I of this scheme is provided, and subject also to the pension payable to the said Herbert Kynaston under the provisions of the said

Order of your Majesty in Council gazetted on the thirteenth day of November in the year one thousand eight hundred and sixty-six; and provided always, and it is hereby to be taken as understood, that by means of a scheme or schemes to be prepared by us under the eleventh section of the said Act of the twenty-third and twenty-fourth years of your Majesty, chapter one hundred and forty-two, we shall or may hereafter, that is to say, upon or after the cesser and determination of the pension (if any) which may be payable to a retiring incumbent under Part I of this scheme as aforesaid, recommend and propose to your Majesty in Council that all the property which as aforesaid shall be transferred and annexed to the united benefice as the endowments thereof shall by virtue of any Order or Orders of your Majesty in Council ratifying such lastly-mentioned scheme or schemes be subject in perpetuity, firstly, to the payment of one annual rent-charge of two hundred and fifty pounds in favour of some one benefice in the metropolis or the vicinity thereof, which benefice shall at the time of the creation of such rent-charge be in the patronage of the said Bishop of London, and shall be designated to us in writing by the said Bishop of London as the recipient of the same rent-charge of two hundred and fifty pounds per annum, and secondly, to the payment of a further annual rent-charge of fifty pounds in favour of some one benefice in the metropolis or the vicinity thereof, which benefice shall at the time of the creation of such rent-charge be in the patronage of the said Dean and Chapter of the said Cathedral Church of Saint Paul in the said city and diocese of London, and shall be designated to us in writing by the said Dean and Chapter as the recipient of the same rent-charge of fifty pounds per annum. Provided further, that the said rent-charge of fifty pounds per annum shall not be made to commence until some person other than the Reverend Henry Stebbing, Clerk in Holy Orders, Doctor in Divinity, shall be incumbent of the said united benefice.

"Provided always, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said scheme has been laid before both Houses of Parliament for the space of two calendar months.

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Act; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of said diocese of London.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the eighth and ninth years of Her Majesty,

chapter seventy; of the Act of the fourteenth and fifteenth years of Her Majesty, chapter ninety-seven; of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her Majesty, chapter fifty-five; and of the Act of the thirty-fourth and thirty-fifth years of Her Majesty, chapter eighty-two; duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a representation, bearing date the twenty-fourth day of April, in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine, in the words following, that is to say:—

"We the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England in pursuance of the Act of the eighth and ninth years of your Majesty chapter seventy of the Act of the fourteenth and fifteenth years of your Majesty chapter ninety-seven of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of your Majesty chapter fifty-five and of the Act of the thirty-fourth and thirty-fifth years of your Majesty chapter eighty-two have prepared and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council the following representation as to the assignment of a consolidated chapelry to the consecrated church of Saint Thomas situate within the limits of the new parish of Saint Paul Halliwell in the county of Lancaster and in the diocese of Manchester. Whereas at certain extremities of the said new parish of Saint Paul Halliwell and of the new parish of Saint Peter Halliwell in the said county of Lancaster and in the said diocese of Manchester which said extremities lie contiguous one to another and are described in the schedule hereunder written there is collected together a population which is situate at a distance from the several churches of such respective new parishes.

"And whereas it appears to us to be expedient that such contiguous portions of the said new parish of Saint Paul Halliwell and of the said new parish of Saint Peter Halliwell should be formed into a consolidated chapelry for all ecclesiastical purposes and that the same should be assigned to the said church of Saint Thomas situate within the limits of the new parish of Saint Paul Halliwell as aforesaid.

"Now therefore with the consent of the Right Reverend James Bishop of the said diocese of Manchester, as such Bishop, with the consent of Richard Henry Ainsworth of Smithills Hall, Halliwell aforesaid Esquire, as the patron of the vicarage of the said new parish of Saint Paul Halliwell and also as one of the patrons of the vicarage of the said new parish of Saint Peter Halliwell and with the consent of Richard Rainshaw Rothwell of Sharples Hall, Bolton-le-Moors in the said county of Lancaster Esquire commonly called the Marquis de Rothwell, and with the consents of James Cross Ormrod of East Bank, Halliwell aforesaid Esquire and of John Stanning of Leyland near Preston in the said county of Lancaster Esquire as the remaining patrons of the said vicarage of the new parish of Saint Peter Halliwell (in testimony whereof they the said consenting parties have respectively signed and sealed this representation) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England humbly represent that it would in our opinion be expedient that all those contiguous portions of the said new parish of Saint Paul Halliwell and of the said new parish of Saint Peter Halliwell which are described in the schedule hereunder written, all which portions, together with the boundaries thereof, are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed should be united and formed into one consolidated chapelry for the said church of Saint Thomas situate within the limits of the new parish of Saint Paul Halliwell as aforesaid and

that the same should be named 'The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Thomas Halliwell.'

"We therefore humbly pray that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your Royal consideration and to make such order in respect thereto as to your Majesty in your Royal Wisdom shall seem meet.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Thomas Halliwell being:
