THE SWINE FEVER ORDER OF 1879.

At the Council Chamber, Whitehall, the 14th day of July, 1879.

By the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

PRESENT:

Lord President

Lord Privy Seal.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The

Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Preliminary.

1. This Order may be cited as The Swine Fever Order of 1879.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the twentieth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine.

3. This Order extends to England and Wales and Scotland only.

4. In this Order—

The Act of 1878 means The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878:

Other terms have the same meaning as in the Act of 1878.

Revocation of former Order.

5. The Typhoid Fever of Swine Order of 1878 is hereby revoked: but nothing herein shall invalidate or make unlawful anything done under that Order before the date when this Order takes effect, or interfere with the institution or prosecution of any proceeding in respect of any offence committed against, or any penalty incurred under, that Order.

Extension of Act of 1878.

6. Swine fever, that is to say, the disease called or known as typhoid fever of swine, soldier, purples, red disease, hog cholera, or swine plague, shall be a disease for the purposes of the following Sections of the Act of 1878 (namely):

Section twenty-eight (infected places).

Section thirty (slaughter and compensation).

Section thirty-one (notice of disease).

Section thirty-two (Orders of Council).

Section fifty (powers of police).

Section fifty-one (power of entry).

Section fifty-four (exclusion of strangers).

and of all other Sections of the Act containing provisions relative to or consequent on the provisions of those Sections, including such Sections as provide for offences and procedure.

Extension of Orders of Council.

7. The provisions of the undermentioned Articles of the following Orders shall, as far as they are applicable, apply to swine fever and to places where that disease is found to exist (namely):

(a.) The Animals Order of 1878—

Articles eighteen and nineteen (movement or exposure of animals).

Article twenty (movement of dung).

Article twenty-two (digging up carcasses).

Articles twenty-three, twenty-four, twenty-five, twenty-six, twenty-seven, twenty-nine, thirty, thirty-one, thirty-two and thirty-three (general provisions).

(b.) The Cleansing and Disinfection Order of 1878—

Articles ten, eleven, twelve, thirteen and fourteen (cleansing and disinfection).

Declaration of Place infected with Swine Fever.

8.—(1.) Where it appears to an Inspector of a Local Authority that swine fever exists, or has within ten days existed, in a pig-sty, shed, or other place, he shall forthwith make and sign a declaration thereof.

(2.) He shall serve a notice, signed by him, of the declaration on the occupier of that pig-sty, shed, or other place.

(3.) Thereupon that pig-sty, shed, or other place shall become and be a place infected with swine fever, subject to the determination and declaration of the Local Authority.

(4.) The Inspector shall, with all practicable speed, inform the Local Authority of his declaration and notice, and shall send his declaration and a copy of his notice to the Local Authority.

(5.) The Local Authority shall forthwith on receipt of that information inquire into the correctness of the Inspector's declaration, with the assistance and advice of a Veterinary Inspector, or of a person qualified according to the Act of 1878 to be such.

(6.) If the Local Authority are satisfied of the correctness of the Inspector's declaration as regards the existence or past existence of disease, they shall by order determine and declare accordingly, and prescribe the limits of the place infected with swine fever, and may, if they think fit, include within those limits any lands or building adjoining or near to the pig-sty, shed, or other place to which the Inspector's declaration relates.

(7.) The Local Authority may include in a place infected with swine fever any adjoining part of the district of another Local Authority, with the previous consent in writing of that Authority, but not otherwise.

(8.) If the Local Authority are not satisfied of the correctness of the Inspector's declaration as regards the existence or past existence of disease, they shall by order determine and declare accordingly; and thereupon, as from the time specified in that behalf in their order, the pig-sty, shed, or other place to which the Inspector's declaration relates shall cease to be a place infected with swine fever.

(9.) The Local Authority shall forthwith report to the Privy Council the declaration of the Inspector, and the proceedings of the Local Authority thereon.

Movement out of Place infected with Swine Fever.

9. The following rules shall have effect in relation to a pig-sty or other place which has become a place infected with swine fever (namely):

(a.) No swine shall be moved alive out of a place infected with swine fever.

(b.) No carcase of swine shall be moved out of a place infected with swine fever, except either with a certificate of an Inspector of the Local Authority certifying that the carcase moved did not belong to a head of swine affected with swine

fever, or with a licence of an Inspector of the Local Authority for the purpose of being buried or destroyed.

(c.) The licence shall be available for twelve hours, and no longer.

(d.) The licence shall specify the place to which the carcase is to be moved for burial or destruction, and it shall not be moved to any other place.

(e.) If the carcase is to be moved into the district of another Local Authority, there shall also be requisite a licence of that other Local Authority indorsed on or referring to the first-mentioned licence.

(f.) If moved for burial or destruction, the carcase shall be moved to the specified place under the direction and in charge of an Inspector or other officer of the Local Authority out of whose district it is moved; and he shall enforce and superintend the immediate burial or destruction thereof of the carcase, and shall forthwith report to both the Local Authorities the fact of the burial or destruction there.

(g.) No swine shall be moved into a pig-sty, shed, or other place where swine fever has existed, unless and until an Inspector of the Local Authority has certified that all the swine in that pig-sty, shed, or other place have died or been slaughtered, and that the pig-sty, shed, or other place has been, as far as practicable, cleansed and disinfected.

Slaughter in Swine Fever.

10.—(1.) A Local Authority shall cause all swine affected with swine fever to be slaughtered within two days after the existence of the disease is known to them.

(2.) A Local Authority may, if they think fit, cause any swine being or having been in the same pig-sty or shed, or in contact with swine affected with swine fever to be slaughtered.

(3.) The Local Authority shall, out of the local rate, pay compensation as follows for swine slaughtered under this Article:

(a.) Where the head of swine slaughtered was affected with swine fever, the compensation shall be one half of its value immediately before it became so affected, but so that the compensation do not in any such case exceed forty shillings.

(b.) In every other case the compensation shall be the value of the head of swine immediately before it was slaughtered, but so that the compensation do not in any case exceed four pounds.

Declaration of Freedom from Swine Fever.

11. Where a Local Authority have declared a place to be infected with swine fever, they may, if they think fit, at any time after the expiration of twenty-eight days from the date of the cessation therein of that disease, but not sooner, declare by order that place to be free from swine fever.

Disposal of Swine when seized.

12. Where a head of swine is seized in accordance with the provisions of Article 19 of The Animals Order of 1878 the same shall be slaughtered in accordance with the provisions of this Order.

Disposal of Carcasses.

13. The Local Authority shall cause the carcase of every head of swine that has died of swine fever or that has been slaughtered in consequence of being affected with that disease to be buried as soon as possible in its skin in some proper place,

and to be covered with a sufficient quantity of quicklime or other disinfectant, and with not less than six feet of earth, and with a view to the carrying of this Article into effect the Local Authority may, from time to time, make regulations for prohibiting or regulating the removal of any such carcase or for securing the burial of the same, or the Local Authority may, if authorized by licence from the Privy Council, cause the carcase to be destroyed, under the inspection of the Local Authority, in the mode described, and subject to the provisions set forth, in Article 21 paragraphs (2.) (3.) and (4.) of The Animals Order of 1878.

Keeping of Swine in Slaughter-Houses.

14. It shall not be lawful for any person, in any case in which the slaughter of any animal is authorized or required by or under the Act of 1878, or any Order of Council, to use for such slaughter any slaughter-house in which swine are kept.

Regulation by Local Authorities of Markets, Fairs, and other Places.

15. A Local Authority authorized by the Privy Council to put in operation this Article, but not otherwise, may, from time to time, prohibit or regulate the exposure or sale of swine in any specified market, fair, auction, sale, or place of exhibition.

Acts of Local Authorities.

16. All orders and regulations made by a Local Authority under The Typhoid Fever of Swine Order of 1878 and in force at the commencement of this Order shall, as far as the same are not varied by or inconsistent with this Order, remain in force until altered or revoked by the Local Authority.

"THE European Commission of the Danube on the 29th May, 1879, adopted the following resolutions:—

"The tax of 50 centimes per ton, levied according to Article 7 of the tariff of the 10th November, 1875, on vessels which load or unload cargo in the roadstead of Sulina, and which also enter the port, but without accomplishing there any commercial operation of a nature to render them liable to the payment of the dues established by Articles 1, 2, or 5 of the tariff, is reduced to 25 centimes per ton.

"The tax of 50 centimes per ton, levied according to Article 10 of the said tariff, on vessels of more than 100 tons which enter the port of Sulina, and depart from it with less than the third of their cargo, and on sea-going vessels acting temporarily as lighters, is equally reduced to 25 centimes per ton.

"These resolutions will take effect on the 1st July, 1879."

This account is credited with the interest produced by the principal capital, and is debited with the payments made by the Commission on account of the Ottoman Government, such as the salaries of the Officials of the General Inspection of the Navigation at Toultscha, and of the Port Office at Sulina, &c., &c.

The principal capital is repayable by annuities of 180,000 francs at least, to be met half-yearly, commencing from the 30th of June, 1883.

The balance of the account-current is to be liquidated on the same terms, after the complete amortization of the principal debt.

cipality of Bulgaria had been named in such before mentioned Warrant of the 29th day of May, 1879, or the schedules thereunder written.

3. This Warrant shall come into operation on the day of the date thereof.

The townships of Caerfallwch, Golfryn, Kelsterton, Leadbrook Major, Leadbrook Minor, Northop, Soughton, and Wepre (all of which are situate in and form part of the parish of Northop), and the several townships of Nerquis and Bodidris], the said Provisional Order was varied, by excluding from such district the township of Bodidris, and in like manner with respect to the said Hawarden and Hope Highway District [comprising the townships of Aston, Bannel, Bretton, Broadlane, Broughton, Ewloe Wood, Ewloe Town, Hawarden, Mancott, Manor and Rake, Moor, Pentrobin, Sealand and Shotton (all of which are situate in and form part of the parish of Hawarden). Now, therefore, at this Court of General Quarter Sessions of the Peace, held at the County Hall, in Mold, in and for the said county, on Wednesday, the 2nd day of July, 1879, the Justices assembled thereat having considered the premises, and it having been shown to the Court that all notices required by law to be given have been duly given, do by this, their Final Order, confirm the said Provisional Order, with respect to the said Mold Highway District and the said Hawarden and Hope Highway District, as altered as aforesaid. And it is ordered by this Court, that the first election of Waywardens as Members of the Highway Boards, for each of the said last-mentioned districts, shall take place within such districts respectively, on Thursday, the 24th day of July instant, and that the first meetings of the High-

way Boards of such districts shall be held on Tuesday, the 5th day of August next, at eleven o'clock in the forenoon, that for the Mold Highway District at the County Hall, in Mold, and that for the Hawarden and Hope Highway District at the Broughton Union Workhouse.
