THE Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do hereby revoke their Order, bearing date the seventeenth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight, defining a part of the Port of Plymouth, in the county of Devon, as a foreign animals wharf: Provided that nothing herein shall be deemed to invalidate or make unlawful anything done under the said Order before the date of this revocation, or interfere with the institution or prosecution of any proceeding in respect of any offence committed against, or any penalty incurred under, the said Order.

THE Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do hereby define the following parts of the Ports of Plymouth and Portsmouth, in the counties of Devon and Southampton, respectively, as foreign animals wharves for Naval purposes only:

Port of Plymouth.

All that space at Stonehouse on which are situate the Government wharf, stores, lairs, slaughter-houses; and premises, known by the name of the Royal William Victualling Yard, all which space is coloured pink on the plan of Plymouth, Devonport, and Stonehouse, deposited for the purposes of an Order of Council of the seventeenth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight, at the Privy Council Office, copies of which are deposited at the offices of the Town Clerk of the borough of Plymouth, and the Clerk of the Peace for the county of Devon.

Port of Portsmouth.

All that space at Gosport on which are situate the Government wharf, stores, lairs, slaughter-houses, and premises, known by the name of the Royal Clarence Victualling Yard, all which space is coloured green on the plan of Portsmouth, Portsea, Landport, Southsea, and Gosport, deposited for the purposes of this Order at the Privy Council Office, a copy of which is deposited at the office of the Clerk of the Peace for the county of Southampton.
