Return of Casualties which have occurred in the Auxiliary Forces of the Cape of Good Hope between the 1st May and 31st May, 1879.

Private Rudolph Peterson, C. M. R. No. 2 Troop, 10 assegai wounds, died, 6th May, Morosi's Kop; address of nearest relative, Mr. William Williamson, New Market-street, Cape Town.

Private William E. O. England, C. M. R. No. 1 Troop, bullet wound in thigh, patient doing well, 6th May, Morosi's Kop.

Captain James Surmon, C. M. R. No. 4 Troop, died from effects of wound received in action at Morosi's Kop, 7th May; nearest relative, Miss Surmon, Albany, Eastern Province.

Lieutenant J. W. Gray, 1st C. M. Y., wounded in arm, 17th May, Quthing, Kowie Troop.

Corporal James Mack, 1st C. M. Y., wound in thigh, 17th May, Quthing, Kowie Troop.
