WE, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and eleven, section five, do hereby grant and convey to the Incumbent of the vicarage of the Holy Trinity, Sittingbourne, in the county of Kent, and in the diocese of Canterbury, and to his successors, Incumbents of the same vicarage, all that piece or parcel of land and hereditaments, together with the appurtenances thereunto belonging, particularly described in the schedule hereunto annexed, and now vested in us: To have and to hold the said piece or parcel of land and hereditaments with their appurtenances to the use of the said Incumbent and his successors for ever: Provided always, that the Incumbent for the time being of the same vicarage shall be entitled to receive from us, or on our account, the net amount of the rents, profits, and proceeds of the said piece or parcel of land and hereditaments for and in respect of the period intervening between the twenty-ninth day of November, in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight, and the date of the publication of these presents in the London Gazette.

All that piece or parcel of land situate in the new parish of Holy Trinity, Sittingbourne, within the ancient limits of the parish of Sittingbourne, in the county of Kent, containing one rood and seventeen perches or thereabouts, bounded on or towards the north-east by the site of Holy Trinity Church, on or towards the south-east by a road called Dover-street, on or towards part of the south-west by land in the occupation of John Tong, of Faversham, Stationer, and on or towards other part of the south-west by land belonging to Arden Hinckley, and on the remaining part of the south-west, and on the north-west by land belonging to the Trustees of the Reverend Henry Hilton, and which said piece or parcel of land is more particularly delineated on the plan hereunto annexed and is thereon coloured green.

WE, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and eleven, sections five and eleven, do hereby grant to the Incumbent of the vicarage of Saint Paul, in the city and county of the city of Norwich, and in the diocese of Norwich, and to his successors, Incumbents of the same vicarage, one yearly sum or stipend of one hundred and fourteen pounds, such yearly sum or stipend to be payable out of the common fund under our control, and to be calculated as from the first day of

November in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight, and to be receivable in equal half-yearly portions, on the first day of May and on the first day of November in each and every year: And we do also hereby grant and convey to the Incumbent of the said vicarage of Saint Paul, Norwich, and to his successors, Incumbents of the same vicarage, all that annual sum or pension of six shillings and eight pence, heretofore payable in respect of the said vicarage, and formerly receivable by the Dean and Chapter of Norwich, and recently by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, to have and to hold the said annual sum or pension to the use of the said Incumbent and his successors for ever: And we do further hereby grant and appropriate out of our said common fund to the said vicarage of Saint Paul, Norwich, one capital sum of one thousand and five hundred pounds sterling, to be applicable towards defraying the cost of providing a parsonage or house of residence for the said vicarage, according to plans and a specification approved or to be approved by us, such capital sum, or the balance thereof unapplied to such purpose, to remain in the meantime in our hands at interest after the rate of three pounds per centum per annum, and such interest to be paid to the Incumbent for the time being of the said vicarage of Saint Paul, Norwich: Provided always, that if at any time lands, tithes, or other hereditaments sufficient, in our opinion, to produce the said yearly sum or stipend of one hundred and fourteen pounds, or any part thereof, shall be annexed by us to the said vicarage, in substitution for such yearly sum or stipend, or for such part thereof, our liability for the payment of such yearly sum or stipend, or of such part thereof, as the case may be, shall thereupon and thereafter cease and determine.
