THE Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows :

1. The area described in Part I of the Schedule to this Order, being an area wherein is situate the place infected with foot-and-mouth disease described in Part II of that Schedule, is hereby declared to be an area infected with foot-and-mouth disease.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the thirty-first day of July, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine.

PART I.

Area Infected with Foot-and-Mouth Disease.

An area comprising the whole of the petty sessional division of Bottisham, and so much of the petty sessional division of Newmarket as lies to the north of the line of the Great Eastern Railway, both in the county of Cambridge, and also the detached portion of the petty sessional division of Wickhambrook, in the county of Suffolk, which is surrounded by the county of Cambridge.

PART II.

Place Infected with Foot-and-Mouth Disease situate within the foregoing Area.

A field, known by the name of Low Fen, in the parish of Horningsea, in the county of Cambridge.

THE Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do hereby define the following parts of the port of Liverpool, in the counties of Chester and Lancaster, as foreign animals wharves :

(1.) All that space at the Wallasey Dock, in the borough of Birkenhead, and the township of Pooton-cum-Seacombe, in the county of Chester, situate on the east and the north sides of the said dock, bounded by a line commencing on the Wallasey landing-stage at a point seventy-eight feet or thereabouts from the south-east corner of the said stage, thence running in a westwardly direction thirty-six feet or thereabouts, thence in an angular direction northwardly two hundred and ten feet or thereabouts, thence westwardly two hundred and twenty feet or thereabouts along the south side of the north bridge connecting the said landing-stage with the river wall, thence running in a straight line northwardly six hundred and fifty feet or thereabouts, thence in a north-westwardly direction ninety feet or thereabouts to the south-east corner of certain cattle-pens, slaughter-houses

and premises, thence in a straight line westwardly one thousand and sixty-nine feet or thereabouts to the north-east corner of a passage nine feet in width or thereabouts leading southwardly for a distance of sixty feet into certain other cattle-pens and premises on the north side of the Wallasey Dock, thence eastwardly three hundred feet or thereabouts to the north-east corner of the said cattle-pens and premises, thence southwardly eighty-five feet or thereabouts, thence westwardly five hundred and thirty-four feet or thereabouts, thence northwardly eighty-five feet or thereabouts, thence eastwardly two hundred and twenty-five feet or thereabouts to the south-west corner of the said passage, thence northwardly sixty-nine feet or thereabouts, thence eastwardly for a distance of six hundred and thirty feet or thereabouts to the south-west corner of certain cattle-pens, slaughter-houses and premises, thence northwardly for a distance of three hundred and sixteen feet or thereabouts along the said cattle-pens, slaughter-houses and premises to the north-west corner of the said cattle-pens, slaughter-houses and premises, thence in an eastwardly and southwardly direction for a distance of five hundred and seventy feet or thereabouts, thence eastwardly for a distance of forty-nine feet or thereabouts to the north-east corner of the said cattle-pens, slaughter-houses and premises, thence southwardly for a distance of nine hundred feet or thereabouts to or near the top of the said north bridge to the said stage, thence eastwardly two hundred and ten feet or thereabouts along the north side of the said north bridge connecting the said landing-stage with the river wall, thence eastwardly in an angular direction on the said landing-stage for a length of ninety-five feet or thereabouts, and thence southwardly along the eastern face of the said landing-stage for a length of two hundred and sixty-two feet or thereabouts to the point of commencement aforesaid near the south-east corner of the said landing-stage, all which space is coloured pink on the plan of part of the borough of Birkenhead and township of Poolton-cum-Seacombe deposited for the purposes of this Order at the Privy Council Office, copies of which are deposited at the offices of the Town Clerk of the borough of Birkenhead, and the Clerk of the Peace for the county of Chester :

(2.) All that space at the Woodside enclosure, in the borough of Birkenhead, in the county of Chester, situate between the floating roadway to the Woodside landing-stage and the warehouses to the southward of the Morpeth Branch Dock, commencing at the north-east corner of the said Woodside landing-stage and extending southwardly along the eastern or river front of the said landing-stage for three hundred and one feet or thereabouts, thence running westwardly for thirty-seven feet or thereabouts, thence northwardly one hundred and seventy feet or thereabouts, thence in an angular direction westwardly for forty-three feet or thereabouts to the foot of the north bridge of the said landing-stage, thence westwardly one hundred and fifty feet or thereabouts along the south side of the cartway of the said bridge to the junction between the said bridge and the river wall, thence in a straight line southwardly for one hundred and seventy feet or thereabouts along the river frontage to the south-east corner of certain cattle-pens, slaughter-houses, stores, loading-staiths and premises, thence westwardly eighty-six feet or thereabouts, thence southwardly for one hundred and thirty-seven feet or thereabouts to the south-east corner of the said cattle-pens, slaughter-houses, stores, loading-staiths and

premises, thence westwardly for four hundred and sixty feet or thereabouts along the south side of the said cattle-pens, slaughter-houses, stores, loading-staiths and premises, thence in a north-westwardly direction for three hundred and eighty feet or thereabouts along the said cattle-pens, slaughter-houses, stores, loading-staiths and premises, thence running eastwardly for four hundred and fifty feet or thereabouts along the north side of the said cattle-pens, slaughter-houses, stores, loading-staiths and premises, thence forty-three feet or thereabouts in a northwardly direction, thence westwardly one hundred feet or thereabouts, thence northwardly one hundred and forty-two feet or thereabouts, thence eastwardly three hundred and seven feet or thereabouts to the north-east corner of the said cattle-pens, slaughter-houses, stores, loading-staiths and premises, thence southwardly one hundred and seventy-two feet or thereabouts to or near the top of the north bridge of the said landing-stage, thence eastwardly along the north side of the cartway of the said bridge for one hundred and sixty-seven feet or thereabouts to the western margin of the said landing-stage, thence in an angular direction eastwardly forty-three feet or thereabouts on the said landing-stage, thence northwardly seventy-one feet or thereabouts along the said landing-stage, thence eastwardly thirty-seven feet or thereabouts on the said landing-stage terminating at the point of commencement aforesaid at the north-east corner of the said landing-stage, all which space is also coloured pink on the said plan and copies deposited as aforesaid :

(3.) All that space between the Canada Dock and the Huskisson Branch Dock, No. 2, in the borough of Liverpool, in the county of Lancaster, bounded by a line commencing at twenty-five feet or thereabouts from the westernmost angle of the north wall of the Huskisson Branch Dock, No. 2, thence running northwardly for a distance of one hundred and forty feet or thereabouts, thence eastwardly one hundred and twenty-eight feet or thereabouts along the north side of a passage ten feet in width leading to a certain slaughter-house, yard and premises, thence northwardly fifty-four feet to the north-west angle of the said slaughter-house, yard and premises, thence in an eastwardly direction two hundred and sixteen feet or thereabouts along the north side of the said slaughter-house, yard and premises, thence northwardly one hundred and thirty-eight feet or thereabouts along the western side of certain cattle-pens and premises, thence eastwardly one hundred and twenty-four feet or thereabouts along the northern end of the said cattle-pens and premises, thence in a southwardly direction two hundred and four feet or thereabouts to the south-east angle of the aforesaid cattle-pens and premises, thence westwardly four hundred and forty-three feet or thereabouts along the southern side of the said cattle-pens, slaughter-house, yard, premises, and passage ten feet in width, thence southwardly one hundred and thirty feet or thereabouts, thence westwardly twenty-five feet or thereabouts terminating at the point of commencement aforesaid near the westernmost angle of the north wall of the Huskisson Branch Dock, No. 2, all which space is coloured pink on the plan of part of the borough of Liverpool deposited for the purposes of an Order of Council of the fourth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine, at the Privy Council Office, a copy of which is deposited at the office of the Town Clerk of the borough of Liverpool.
