## THE MUNICIPAL CORPORATIONS (NEW CHARTERS) ACT, 1877.

THE following scheme for the adjustment of the powers, rights, privileges, duties, property, and liabilities of the Birkenhead Improvement Commissioners and other Local Authorities, and for other purposes, as settled by a Committee of the Lords of Her Majesty's Privy Council, is published in pursuance of Section 6 of the Municipal Corporations (New Charters) Act, 1877:—

WHEREAS by and under the Acts enumerated in the first schedule hereto (hereinafter called "The Improvement Acts"), the Birkenhead Improvement Commissioners (hereinafter called "The Commissioners") were incorporated, and became invested with various powers and duties, and possessed of property for purposes of public health and local government, the same as or similar to those of the Public Health Act, 1875; and they also acquired a certain ferry and a cemetery and other property, and became invested with powers and duties in relation thereto which do not relate to the purposes of the Public Health Act, 1875.

And whereas the limits of the Improvement Acts comprise the townships of Birkenhead and Cloughton-cum-Grange.

And whereas, by Royal Charter, dated the 13th day of August, 1877, the inhabitants of the town of Birkenhead (embracing the said townships of Birkenhead and Cloughton-cum-Grange and the local government districts of Oxtou and Trammere, and part of the local government district of Higher Bebington) were incorporated by the name of the mayor, aldermen, and burgesses of the borough of Birkenhead, under the Municipal Corporation Acts, and it was declared that the council of the borough (hereinafter called "The Council") should consist of a mayor, fourteen aldermen, and forty-two councillors.

And whereas on such incorporation all the powers, rights, duties, capacities, liabilities, obligations, and property exercisable by, attaching to, or vested in the Commissioners under the Improvement Acts for purposes the same as or similar to those of the Public Health Act, 1875, or under any General Act of Parliament, were by the provisions of the said Public Health Act, transferred to and became exercisable by and vested in the council of the said borough; but the Commissioners continued to exist as a corporate body, and to exercise and perform such powers and duties, and to hold such property, and to be subject to

such liabilities as have not been transferred to the council by virtue of the said provisions.

And whereas the Council and the Commissioners have presented a joint petition to Her Majesty under the Municipal Corporations (New Charters) Act, 1877, praying that a scheme may be settled for the transfer to and vesting in the mayor, aldermen, and burgesses of the borough of Birkenhead of the ferry and other property aforesaid, and of all the rights, powers, privileges, duties, and liabilities of the Commissioners with respect thereto, and of all other powers, rights, duties, capacities, obligations, and property of the said Commissioners which may not have passed to and became vested in the Council of the said borough under the Public Health Act, 1875.

And whereas it is expedient that a scheme be settled for effecting such transfer, and for making further provisions with respect to the powers, rights, duties, properties and liabilities transferred to the Council from the Commissioners, and from the Oxtou Local Board, and from the Trammere Local Board, by the Public Health Act, 1875, or by this scheme.

It is hereby ordered and declared as follows:—

1. This scheme may be cited for all purposes as the borough of Birkenhead Scheme, 1879.

2. This scheme shall come into operation on the day of 1879, which date is hereinafter referred to as the commencement of this scheme.

3. On the commencement of this scheme the Commissioners shall cease to exist as a corporate body, and all the powers, rights, privileges, duties, property, debts, and liabilities exercisable by or vested in or attaching to the Commissioners under any Act of Parliament, Order confirmed by Parliament, Order in Council, or otherwise, immediately before the commencement of this scheme, shall be transferred to and be exercised by vested in and attached to the mayor, aldermen, and burgesses of the borough of Birkenhead acting by the Council, but subject and according to the provisions of this scheme.

4. The ferry property of the Commissioners (which expression in this scheme includes the ferry, ferry rights, lands, and property described in the second schedule hereto) and the revenue thereof shall be held and administered, and the powers, rights, and duties of the Commissioners relating to that property and revenue under the Improvement Acts or any other Act of Parliament or Order confirmed by Parliament, shall be exercised and performed by the Council for the

benefit of the said townships of Birkenhead and Claughton-cum-Grange as if (as nearly as may be) the Council had been named or referred to in such Acts or Order instead of the Commissioners.

5. The cemetery property of the Commissioners (which expression in this scheme includes the cemetery lands and property described in the third schedule hereto) and the revenue thereof shall be held and administered and the powers, rights, and duties of the Commissioners relating to that property and revenue shall be exercised and performed by the Council for the benefit of the said townships of Birkenhead and Claughton-cum-Grange as if (as nearly as may be) the Council had been named instead of the Commissioners in the Improvement Acts, and in the Order in Council which constituted the Commissioners a Burial Board.

6. The markets, market places, and slaughter-houses and other property described in the fourth schedule hereto, and the rents, tolls, and other revenue thereof shall be held and administered, and the powers, rights, and duties of the Commissioners relating thereto under the Improvement Acts or any other Act of Parliament shall be exercised and performed by the Council for the benefit of the said townships of Birkenhead and Claughton-cum-Grange as if (as nearly as may be) the Council had been named or referred to in such Acts instead of the Commissioners.

7. The library and other property described in the fifth schedule hereto shall be held and administered by the Council for the benefit of the whole borough; and the sum of three thousand pounds owing at the date of the commencement of this scheme in respect of moneys borrowed by the Commissioners for the purpose of erecting and furnishing such library with all interest due or accruing thereon shall be charged on and paid by the Council out of such rate as the expenses of carrying the Public Libraries Act, 1855, into execution in any municipal borough are by the Public Libraries Amendment Act (England and Scotland), 1866, directed to be paid; and the yearly rent of twenty-seven pounds ten shillings formerly paid by the Library Committee of the Commissioners for the site of the said library, shall be paid as part of the expenses aforesaid, and shall be applied in or towards the discharge of any debts or liabilities of the Commissioners transferred to the Council by the Public Health Act, 1875, or by this scheme.

8. The lands described in the sixth schedule hereto shall be vested in and may be disposed of (subject to the provisions of the Improvement Acts) by the Council, and the rents and profits thereof, and any moneys arising from any sale, mortgage, or other disposition of the same shall be applied and administered by the Council for the benefit of the said townships of Birkenhead and Claughton-cum-Grange as if (as nearly as may be) the Council had been named in the Improvement Acts instead of the Commissioners.

9. The park described in Part I. of the seventh schedule hereto, and the police court, lock-ups, and other property described in Part II. of the same schedule shall be vested in and shall be maintained and managed by the Council, and all powers, rights, and duties relating thereto respectively under the Improvement Acts or any general Act of Parliament shall be exercised and performed by the Council for the benefit of the whole borough. All expenses incurred by the Council in the maintenance and management of the said park, and in the execution of their powers and duties in relation thereto shall be

defrayed by the Council out of the general district rates of the Borough, and all expenses incurred by the Council in the maintenance and management of the said police court, lock-ups, and other property, and in the execution of their powers and duties in relation thereto shall be defrayed by the Council out of the borough fund and rate. The Police Superannuation Fund (established under the Police Act, 1859) of the Borough, shall be, or continue to be, maintained and managed for the benefit of the police force of the whole Borough, under and subject to the provisions of the Police Act, 1859, the Police Superannuation Act, 1865, and any Act amending the same, or otherwise relating to the establishment, maintenance, or management of such fund.

10. Subject as hereinbefore mentioned, the debts and liabilities by this scheme transferred to the Council from the Commissioners, and the expenses incurred by the Council in the execution of the powers and duties by this scheme transferred to them from the Commissioners, shall be discharged and paid out of revenue or rates arising or levied within the said townships of Birkenhead and Claughton-cum-Grange in like manner as such debts, liabilities, and expenses would have been discharged and paid if this scheme had not been made and confirmed.

11. All the property of the Oxton Local Board and of the Tranmere Local Board which by the operation of the Public Health Act, 1875, has been transferred to the Council, and the rents, profits, and revenue thereof shall be held and administered or disposed of by the Council for the benefit of the areas within the borough coincident with the former districts of the Oxton Local Board and the Tranmere Local Board respectively, and all the debts and liabilities of the said Local Boards so transferred shall be discharged and satisfied by the Council out of revenue or general district rates arising or levied within the respective areas aforesaid, or out of moneys borrowed in manner hereinafter provided; and all contracts entered into by the said Local Boards, and pending at the date of the commencement of this scheme shall be carried into effect by the Council for the benefit of the respective areas aforesaid, and the expenses thereof shall be paid by the Council out of revenue or general district rates arising or levied within those respective areas or out of moneys borrowed in manner hereinafter provided. The estimates for the general district rate shall from time to time include all sums required to be raised by means of such rate within those respective areas for the purpose of giving effect to the provisions of this section, and all such sums shall be raised accordingly. Provided with respect to a contract dated the 31st day of October, 1877, and made between Matilda Orred, of Number 34, Rutland Gate, in the county of Middlesex, Widow, John Orred, of Ashwicke, in the county of Gloucester, Esquire, Frederick North, of Liverpool, in the county of Lancaster, Gentleman, and John Cavendish Orred, of Maidwell Hall, in the county of Northampton, late a Major in Her Majesty's 12th Royal Lancers (trustees and executors named in the last will and testament, with the four codicils thereto, of George Orred, late of Weston and Runcorn, and Lord of the Manor of Tranmere, Esquire, deceased), of the one part, and the Tranmere Local Board, of the other part, for the purchase of certain lands by the Tranmere Local Board for the purpose of a public park or recreation ground, that the expenses of purchasing, forming, laying out, and planting such park or recreation ground shall be paid by the Council out of revenue or general

district rates arising or levied within the area coincident with the former district of the Tranmere Local Board, or out of moneys borrowed in manner hereinafter provided; but that when the said park or recreation ground is completed and opened to the public, it shall be maintained by the Council for the benefit of, and out of the general district rates of, the whole borough. Provided also that the expenses of erecting and maintaining a pumping station and works in connection therewith on certain lands described in a certain other contract dated the 31st day of October, 1877, and made between the same parties, shall be paid by the Council out of revenue or general district rates arising or levied within the area coincident with the former district of the Tranmere Local Board, or (as regards the erection of the pumping station) out of moneys borrowed in manner hereinafter provided. Provided also that if any property transferred from the Oxton Local Board or from the Tranmere Local Board to the Council by the operation of the Public Health Act, 1875, is at any time sold by the Council the net proceeds of such sale shall be applied by the Council towards the discharge of debt or towards the cost of permanent works incurred for the benefit of the area coincident with the former district of such Local Board.

For the purpose of discharging any debts and liabilities and of paying any expenses by this section authorised to be discharged and paid respectively out of borrowed moneys, the Council may with the sanction of the Local Government Board from time to time borrow or re-borrow, such sums as they may require on the security of the general district rates of the whole borough, the exercise of such borrowing powers to be subject to the provisions of sub-sections 4, 5, and 6 of the 234th section of the Public Health Act, 1875; but as between the areas respectively above mentioned and the residue of the borough the Council shall take care that all sums so borrowed with all interest thereon, shall be repaid out of revenue or general district rates arising or levied within the area for the benefit of which such sums are borrowed.

12. Whereas under the provisions of section six of the London and North-Western Railway (Joint and Various Powers) Act, 1877, a sum of three hundred pounds was directed to be paid by the Tranmere Local Board to the London and North-Western Railway Company, or to the Great Western Railway Company, or either of them on the completion of the works therein mentioned, and the said works have been completed and the said sum is now due. It is therefore hereby provided that the Council shall pay to the said Companies, or one of them, the said sum of three hundred pounds out of revenue or general district rates arising or levied within the area within the borough, coincident with the former district of the Tranmere Local Board, or out of moneys borrowed in manner hereinbefore provided, and the provisions of the last preceding section shall as regards such borrowing and the repayment of any moneys borrowed apply with any necessary modification thereof.

13. The mayor, aldermen, and burgesses of the borough acting by the Council are hereby declared to be the Urban Sanitary Authority of the borough, pursuant to the provisions of the Public Health Act, 1875, and of this scheme.

14. Nothing in this scheme shall prejudicially affect any mortgage bond or other security granted by the Commissioners under the Improvement Acts, or any other Act of Parliament, or by the Oxton and Tranmere Local Boards; but all

such mortgages, bonds, and other securities shall continue in full force, and may be enforced against the Council and against the property, tolls, or rates comprised in each such mortgage, bond, or other security to the same extent and in the like manner, and with the like incidents (as nearly as may be) in all respects as they could have been enforced if the Commissioners and the said Local Boards had not been dissolved. Provided, as regards any mortgage or other security granted for securing the said sum of three thousand pounds hereinbefore mentioned, that the rate out of which the expenses of carrying the Public Libraries Act, 1855, into execution in any municipal borough are by the Public Libraries Amendment Act (England and Scotland), 1866, directed to be paid, shall be deemed to be substituted in such mortgage or other security for the rate therein mentioned, and such mortgage or other security shall be read and have effect and be enforceable accordingly.

#### SCHEDULE II.

The ferry described in the schedule to the Local Act, 5 Victoria, cap. v, as "All that Ferry, known by the name of the Woodside Ferry, from Birkenhead, in the county of Chester, to Liverpool, in the county of Lancaster," together with the foreshore conveyed by Her Majesty's Commissioners of Woods and Forests; and also all the offices, workshops, buildings, yards, quays, slips, landing stages, and bridges, lands and appurtenances thereunto belonging, including the road known as the "Woodside Ferry Approach-road," commencing at a junction with Chester-street, Hamilton-street, and Shore-road, and extending to the said ferry offices, together with the lines of rails laid thereon, and let to the Birkenhead Tramway Company and the Wirral Tramway Company respectively; together with all ferry rights, steam and other boats, plant, machinery, materials, stores, goods and chattels of, or in any way appertaining to, the said ferry; and together with all tolls, duties, and moneys taken at the said ferry in respect of all passengers, goods, or animals conveyed across the same, or in any way arising or accruing therefrom.

The buildings on the north side of the said Approach-road, in the occupation of the London and North Western and Great Western Railway Companies as offices.

The buildings on the south side of the said Approach-road adjoining the workshops hereinbefore mentioned.

The land at the north side of the said Approach-road, together with the rails laid thereon, and the offices let to the Hoylake and Birkenhead Rail and Tramway Company.

#### SCHEDULE III.

The lands and buildings held by the Commissioners under their powers as the Burial Board for the district of Birkenhead and Cloughton-cum-Grange, containing 21 acres, or thereabouts,

## SCHEDULE IV.

All the land and buildings known as the Birkenhead Market, together with all shops, stalls, standings, sheds, and other erections therein, vaults, cellars, reservoirs, cisterns, fixtures, areas, and appurtenances thereunto belonging.

The piece of land called or known by the name of the Market-square, on the north side of the said market.

The land and weighing machines situate in Market-place South, and the land and weighing machine situate at the junction of Cleveland-street and Bridge-street, and the buildings and offices connected therewith, and the weights and levers appurtenant thereto.

The piece of land known as the Haymarket, between Conway-street and Grange-lane.

The piece of land between Albion-street and Lower Ivy-street.

Land and slaughter-houses, bounded on the south, east, and west by land and buildings, used as gas works, situate at the south end of Jackson-street, together with all fixtures, offices, sheds, pens, chattels, and other things used therewith or appurtenant thereto.

## SCHEDULE V.

The building called or known by the name of the Free Public Library, situate on part of the Hamilton-street land, together with all fixtures, fittings, books, manuscripts, papers, chattels, and effects in any way appertaining thereto.

## SCHEDULE VI.

All those several pieces or parcels of land enumerated and described in the schedule to the Birkenhead Improvement Amendment Act, 1850, 13 Vic., c. 3, or such parts or parcels thereof as have not been sold or disposed of by the Commissioners, viz. :—

1. The lands scheduled as Park Lands and the lodges, and the sites thereof.

2. Conway-street (now called Laird-street) lands.

3. Hamilton-street land.

4. Land in Hamilton-square.

5. Land in Cleveland-street, called Bridewell land.
