Lincolnshire.—Holland.

AT the General Quarter Sessions of the Peace of our Sovereign Lady the Queen, held at the Sessions-house, Boston, in the parts of Holland, in the county of Lincoln, on Monday, the 30th day of June, 1879.

Whereas six Justices of the Peace of the said parts of Holland, in the said county of Lincoln, by writing under their hands, required the Clerk of the Peace to add to or send with the notice required by law to be given of the holding of this Court of General or Quarter Sessions a notice that, at the Court of General or Quarter Sessions, a proposal would be made to constitute the following parishes or places, viz.:—Brothertoft, Kirton Fen, Sutterton Fen, Algarkirk Fen, Fosdyke Fen, North Forty Foot Bank, Pelham's Lands, Hart's Grounds, Dogdike (part of), Swineshead (part of), Chapel Hill, Langrville (part of), Coningsby (part of), Frampton (part of), Wyberton (part of), Ferry Corner Plot, and Amber Hill, in the county of Lincoln, a Highway District; and also to send by post, in a prepaid letter, the same notice to the Churchwardens or Overseers of every parish or place above-mentioned. And whereas such requisition has been duly complied with.

Now, therefore, after due consideration, it is provisionally ordered, under the Highway Act, 1862, and the Highway Act, 1864, as follows:—That the several parishes or places hereinafter mentioned and described shall constitute a Highway District for the more convenient management of highways, that is to say:—Brothertoft, Kirton Fen, Sutterton Fen, Algarkirk Fen, Fosdyke Fen, North Forty Foot Bank, Pelham's Lands, Hart's Grounds, that part of Swineshead which is known by the name of Chapel Hill, that part of Frampton which is situate within the boundaries hereinafter described, that part of Wyberton which is situate within the boundaries hereinafter described, Ferry Corner Plot, and Amber Hill, all situate within the said parts of Holland, in the said county of Lincoln; and those two portions of Dogdike which lie on the west side of the River Witham, within the boundaries hereinafter described, and are situate in the parts of Kesteven, in the said county of Lincoln, and that part of Langrville which lies on the west side of the River Witham, and that part of Coningsby which is situate within the boundaries hereinafter described, which two last-mentioned places are situate in the parts of Lindsey, in the said county of Lincoln, all which district is bounded on the
