WHEREAS by the "Merchant Shipping Act Amendment Act, 1862," it is enacted that whenever it is made to appear to Her Majesty that the rules concerning the measurement of tonnage of merchant ships for

the time being in force under the principal Act have been adopted by the Government of any foreign country, and are in force in that country, it shall be lawful for Her Majesty, by Order in Council, to direct that the ships of such foreign country shall be deemed to be of the tonnage denoted in their certificate of registry or other national papers, and thereupon it shall no longer be necessary for such ships to be re-measured in any port or place in Her Majesty's dominions, but such ships shall be deemed to be of the tonnage denoted in their certificates of registry or other papers in the same manner, to the same extent, and for the same purposes, in, to, and for which the tonnage denoted in the certificate of registry of British ships is to be deemed the tonnage of such ships.

And whereas it has been made to appear to Her Majesty that the rules concerning the measurement of tonnage of merchant ships now in force under "The Merchant Shipping Act, 1854," have been adopted by the Government of His Majesty the King of Greece, with the exception of a difference in the mode in certain steamers of estimating the allowance for engine room, and such rules are now in force in that country, having come into operation on the 1st day of July, 1878, Her Majesty is hereby pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to direct as follows:—

1. As regards sailing ships, that merchant sailing ships of the said Kingdom of Greece, the measurement whereof after the said 1st day of July, 1878, has been ascertained and denoted in the registers and other national papers of such sailing ships, testified by the date thereof, shall be deemed to be of the tonnage denoted in such registers and other national papers in the same manner, and to the same extent, and for the same purpose, in, to, and for which the tonnage denoted in the certificate of registry of British sailing ships is deemed to be the tonnage of such ships.
2. As regards steam ships, that merchant ships belonging to the said Kingdom of Greece which are propelled by steam or any other power requiring engine room, the measurement whereof shall, after the said 1st day of July, 1878, have been ascertained and denoted in the registers and other national papers of such steam ships, testified by the dates thereof, shall be deemed to be of the tonnage denoted in such registers or other national papers in

the same manner, and to the same extent, and for the same purpose, in, to, and for which the tonnage denoted in the certificate of registry of British ships is deemed to be the tonnage of such ships; Provided nevertheless, that if the owner or master of any such Greek steamship desires the deduction for engine room in his ships to be estimated under the rules for engine room measurement and deduction applicable to British ships instead of under the Greek rule, the engine room shall be measured and the deduction calculated according to the British rules.

And whereas it has been made to appear to the Board of Trade that new denominations of standards of apothecaries' weight and measure, being multiples and aliquot parts of the imperial weights and measures ascertained by the said Act, are required, and they have caused the same to be made and duly verified and deposited in their custody:

And whereas the Board of Trade have given to the said new standards of apothecaries' weight and measure the several denominations set forth in the Schedule hereto:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by virtue of the power vested in Her by the said Act, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, is pleased to approve the several denominations of standards of apothecaries' weight and measure set forth in the Schedule hereto as new denominations of standards, and doth direct that the same shall be Board of Trade Standards in like manner as if they were mentioned in the Second Schedule to "The Weights and Measures Act, 1878."

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the third and fourth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and thirteen, of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her Majesty, chapter thirty-seven, and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and four, duly prepared and laid Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the first day of May, in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine, in the words following, that is to say:—

“We the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the third and fourth years of your Majesty chapter one hundred and thirteen; of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of your Majesty chapter thirty-seven; and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of your Majesty, chapter one hundred and four; have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme for constituting a separate district for spiritual purposes out of the parish of Brancepeth, in the county of Durham and in the diocese of Durham.

“Whereas it has been made to appear to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular part of the said parish of Brancepeth, which is hereinafter mentioned and described, should be constituted a separate district in manner hereinafter recommended and proposed.

“And whereas there is not at present within the limits of the said proposed district any consecrated church or chapel in use for the purposes of Divine worship.

“And whereas, during the year now last past, a scheme was prepared by us relating to the rectory and parish of Brancepeth aforesaid, and the said scheme was submitted by us with the consent of certain persons therein named to your Majesty in Council, and the said scheme was ratified by an Order of your Majesty in Council, dated the fourteenth day of August, in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight, and published in the London Gazette on the twenty-seventh day of the same month.

“And whereas we had previously agreed with the said persons parties to the said scheme that we would (inter alia) in due course and partly in consideration of their said consent to the said scheme recommend and propose to your Majesty in Council the constitution of an ecclesiastical district or new parish to be formed out of some part of the said parish of Brancepeth, and to include the hamlet or place known as Waterhouses, and the assignment of the patronage of such ecclesiastical district or new parish to the rector or incumbent for the time being of the said parish of Brancepeth.

“And whereas in pursuance of the said Order of your Majesty in Council we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, for the purpose of providing an endowment for the said proposed district, agreed that upon the constitution of the said district being effected as hereinafter recommended and proposed, we would grant and secure out of our common fund to the minister or incumbent for the time being of the said proposed district, and so soon as the said district shall have become a new parish under the provisions of the hereinbefore secondly mentioned Act, then of the said new parish the yearly sum of one hundred and eighty-

eight pounds five shillings and eight pence, the same grant to be so made and secured by an instrument to be executed by us under our common seal, in accordance with the provisions of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of your Majesty chapter one hundred and eleven.

“Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Joseph Barber Bishop of the said diocese of Durham (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme) we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that all that part of the said parish of Brancepeth which is described in the schedule hereunder written wherein is included the hamlet or place known as Waterhouses as aforesaid, all which part, together with the boundaries thereof, is delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto annexed, shall upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of your Majesty in Council ratifying this present scheme, become and be constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes, and that the same shall be named ‘The District of Waterhouses.’

“And we further recommend and propose (the arrangement appearing to us to be expedient) that the whole right of patronage of the said proposed district, and so soon as the said district shall have become a new parish as aforesaid, then of the said new parish, and of the nomination of the minister or incumbent thereof, shall without any assurance in the law other than this present scheme and any duly gazetted Order of your Majesty in Council ratifying the same, and upon and from the day of the date of the publication of such Order in the London Gazette as aforesaid, be assigned to and be absolutely vested in, and shall and may from time to time be fully and freely exercised by the rector or incumbent for the time being of the said rectory of the parish of Brancepeth aforesaid.

“And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or to any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.

“The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

“The District of Waterhouses being:—

“All that part of the parish of Brancepeth in the county of Durham and in the diocese of Durham wherein the present incumbent of such parish now possesses the exclusive cure of souls which includes amongst other territory the hamlet or place known as Waterhouses and which is bounded on the south-west partly by the new parish of Stanley and partly by the parish or district of Satley both in the county and diocese aforesaid, on the north partly by the last-named parish or district partly by the new parish of Saint John the Baptist Hamsteels in the said county and diocese, partly by the parish or district of Esh, in the same county and diocese, and partly by the new parish of Saint John the Evangelist Brandon in the county and diocese aforesaid, on the east partly by the last-named new parish and upon all other sides that is to say on the remaining part of the east and on the south by an imaginary line commencing at the point at Tallyho Gate on the southern side of Pithouse-lane where the boundary dividing the township of Brandon and Byshottles from the township of Brancepeth leaves the boundary dividing the said

new parish of Saint John the Evangelist Brandon from the parish of Brancepeth aforesaid, and extending thence, that is from Tallyho Gate aforesaid first southward, then south-westward and then westward along the said township boundary for a distance of one mile and eleven chains or thereabouts to the point where the same boundary strikes the Wolsingham-road at the junction of the last-named road with the footpath leading in a northerly direction to the house called or known as West Brandon, and extending thence, that is, from the last-described point, first southward to a point in the middle of the said Wolsingham-road and then westward along the middle of the same road for a distance of one mile or thereabouts to a point midway between the northern end of Low Wooley-road and the house called or known as Wooley Smithy, and extending thence that is from the last-described point northward to a point on the northern side of the said Wolsingham-road on the eastern side of the house called or known as Wooley Smithy aforesaid upon the boundary which divides a certain detached portion of the said township of Brancepeth from the township of Brandon and Byshotles aforesaid and extending thence that is from the last-described point first north-westward then south-westward and then westward along the last-mentioned township boundary for a distance of fifty-six and a half chains or thereabouts, thereby passing over Wooley Hill to the point in the middle of Stanley Brook where the same township boundary joins the boundary which divides the said parish of Brancepeth from the new parish of Stanley aforesaid."

And whereas drafts of the said scheme have, in accordance with the provisions of the secondly hereinbefore mentioned Act, been transmitted to the patron and to the incumbent of the said parish of Brancepeth, out of which it is intended that the district recommended in such scheme to be constituted shall be taken, and such patron and incumbent have respectively signified their assent to such scheme :

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council : now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts ; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Durham.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of "The Ecclesiastical Commission Act, 1868," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the fifteenth day of May, in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine, in the words and figures following, that is to say :—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of 'The Ecclesiastical Commission Act 1868' section three have pre-

pared and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council the following scheme for effecting an exchange of a part of the property of the Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral Church of Canterbury for certain property belonging to us.

"Whereas the tithe rent-charges particularly described in the schedule hereunto annexed and marked A are a part of the property of the Dean and Chapter of Canterbury and the said Dean and Chapter have agreed that the said tithe rent-charges shall be transferred to us in consideration of the transfer to them of certain lands and hereditaments now belonging to us, being the lands and hereditaments particularly described and set forth in the schedule hereunto annexed and marked B and of the money payment hereinafter proposed to be made by us.

"And whereas the terms of such transfer are in our opinion fair and reasonable.

"Now, therefore, we humbly recommend and propose with the consent of the said Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral Church of Canterbury and with the consent of the Most Reverend Archibald Campbell Archbishop of Canterbury as Visitor of the said Dean and Chapter certified by their having hereunto affixed their respective corporate seals that upon and from the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme and without any further conveyance or act in the law the tithe rent-charges particularly described in the schedule hereunto annexed and marked A with their appurtenances shall subject always to the liabilities and charges to which the said rent-charges are now specifically liable be transferred to us in the manner contemplated in the said Act and that we shall be entitled to the rents profits and proceeds thereof as from the twenty-ninth day of September in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight and that in consideration for such transfer to us as aforesaid the lands and hereditaments particularly described in the schedule hereunto annexed and marked B together with the benefit of the perpetual land tax charged thereon which has been redeemed shall subject always to the liabilities and charges to which the said lands and hereditaments are now specifically liable be transferred to the said Dean and Chapter in the manner contemplated by the said Act and that the said Dean and Chapter shall become entitled to the rents profits and proceeds thereof as from the said twenty-ninth day of September in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight and that in further consideration for such transfer to us as aforesaid there shall be set apart by us immediately upon the publication of such Order as aforesaid a capital sum of five thousand and five hundred pounds to be expended by the said Dean and Chapter in the erection of farm buildings and in making improvements upon the estates belonging to them, and that interest after the rate of three pounds per centum per annum shall be allowed and paid by us to the said Dean and Chapter as and from the said twenty-ninth day of September in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight upon the said capital sum of five thousand and five hundred pounds and upon the balances thereof from time to time remaining in our hands.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid in conformity with the provisions of the said recited Act or of any other Act of Parliament.

THE following Statute, made on the 19th day of July, 1879, by the University of Oxford Commissioners, appointed under the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877, concerning a Fellowship in the Queen's College, Oxford, held by the Senior Bursar thereof, has been submitted for the approval of Her Majesty in Council, and notice of its having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions contained in the said Act.

WHEREAS by the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877, we, the University of Oxford Commissioners, appointed under the same Act, are empowered, from and after the end of the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight, to make, by writing under our seal, Statutes for any College in the University of Oxford;

Now, we, the said Commissioners, do hereby, in execution of the powers so given to us by the said Act, by this present writing under our seal, make the following Statute, in relation to and wholly for the Queen's College, in the said University; that is to say:—

It shall be lawful for the Senior Bursar for the time being of the said College, if a Fellow of the College, to hold his Fellowship so long as he shall continue to hold the office of Senior Bursar, although he be married; and every Senior Bursar, who at the expiration of his year of office may be re-appointed thereto, shall be deemed to continue to hold the same office. This Statute shall apply to any Senior Bursar holding that office, and being a Fellow, at the time when it shall be approved by Her Majesty in Council, who may then be married; notwithstanding the provision for vacating his Fellowship at the expiration of twelve calendar months from the day of his marriage, contained in the Ordinances made by the Commissioners under the Oxford University Acts of 1854, 1856, and 1857: Provided, that any such Senior Bursar, who, if this Statute had not been made, would have vacated his Fellowship at the end of twelve calendar months after his marriage, shall, from and after the expiration of such twelve calendar months, hold his Fellowship upon such terms as to emolument and otherwise, and generally in such manner as shall be provided by any other statutes to be at any time duly made by us, the said Commissioners for the said College, under the powers of the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877.

When Vieille Tour light changes from red to green, haul to the westward for the anchorage.
