WHEREAS by "The Common Law Procedure Act, 1860," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for Her Majesty; from time to time, by an Order in Council, to direct that all or any part of the provisions of the said Act shall apply to all or any Court or Courts of Record in England and Wales, and that within one month after such Order shall have been made and published in the London Gazette, such provisions shall extend and apply in manner directed by such Order, and that any such Order may be, in like manner, from time to time altered and annulled; and that in and by such Order Her Majesty may direct by whom any powers or duties incident to the provisions applied under the said Act shall and may be exercised with respect to matters in such Court or Courts, and may make any orders or regulations which may be deemed requisite for carrying into operation in such Court or Courts the provisions so applied:

And whereas it has seemed fit to Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, that certain of the provisions of the said Act should be extended and applied to all the Courts of Record established under the provisions of "The County Courts Act, 1846," and also to the City of London Court of Record as constituted by "The County Courts Act, 1867."

"Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice aforesaid, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the provisions contained in section thirteen of "The Common Law Procedure Act, 1860," shall apply to the said Courts of Record in respect of any goods seized in execution by any High Bailiff or Bailiff of any of the said Courts of Record under process of such Courts.

And Her Majesty is further pleased, by and with the advice aforesaid, to direct that the powers and duties incident to the above-mentioned provisions of "The Common Law Procedure Act, 1860," with respect to matters in the said Courts of Record, shall and may be exercised by the Judges of the said Courts respectively, or their respective deputies, and to order that the statutes, rules of practice, orders, and forms for the time being in force and used in the said Courts of Record shall be adopted with reference to proceedings had in such Courts under the above-mentioned pro-

visions of "The Common Law Procedure Act, 1860," so far as the same are applicable, mutatis mutandis.

"We the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England in pursuance of the Act of the eighth and ninth years of your Majesty chapter seventy, of the Act of the fourteenth and fifteenth years of your Majesty chapter ninety-seven, of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of your Majesty chapter fifty-five and of the Act of the thirty-fourth and thirty-fifth years of your Majesty chapter eighty-two have prepared and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council the following representation as to the assignment of a consolidated chapelry to the consecrated church of the Holy Trinity situate within the limits of the parish of Emmanuel Loughborough in the county of Leicester and in the diocese of Peterborough.

"Whereas at certain extremities of the said parish of Emmanuel Loughborough and of the parish of Loughborough in the said county of Leicester and in the said diocese of Peterborough which said extremities lie contiguous one to another and are described in the schedule hereunder written there is collected together a population which is situate at a distance from the several churches of such respective parishes.

"And whereas it appears to us to be expedient that such contiguous portions of the said parish of Emmanuel Loughborough, and of the said parish of Loughborough should be formed into a consolidated chapelry for all ecclesiastical purposes and that the same should be assigned to the said

church of the Holy Trinity situate within the limits of the parish of Emmanuel Loughborough as aforesaid.

"Now therefore with the consent of the Right Reverend William Connor Bishop of the said diocese of Peterborough as such Bishop and with the consent of the Master Fellows and Scholars of Emmanuel College in the University of Cambridge the patrons of the rectory of the said parish of Emmanuel Loughborough and also of the rectory of the said parish of Loughborough (in testimony whereof the said William Connor Bishop of the said diocese of Peterborough has signed and sealed this representation and the said Master Fellows and Scholars of Emmanuel College in the University of Cambridge have affixed their common or corporate seal to this representation) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England humbly represent that it would in our opinion be expedient that all those contiguous portions of the said parish of Emmanuel Loughborough and of the said parish of Loughborough which are described in the schedule hereunder written all which portions together with the boundaries thereof are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed should be united and formed into one consolidated chapelry for the said church of the Holy Trinity situate within the limits of the parish of Emmanuel Loughborough as aforesaid and that the same should be named 'The Consolidated Chapelry of the Holy Trinity Loughborough.'

"We therefore humbly pray that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your Royal consideration and to make such Order in respect thereto as to your Majesty in your Royal wisdom shall seem meet.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The Consolidated Chapelry of the Holy Trinity Loughborough being:—

"All that portion of the parish of Emmanuel Loughborough in the county of Leicester and in the diocese of Peterborough and also all that contiguous portion of the parish of Loughborough in the said county and diocese which said portions of such parishes are comprised within and are bounded by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the new parish of Saint Bartholomew Quorndon in the said county and diocese from the parish of Emmanuel Loughborough aforesaid at a point in the middle of the Leicester-road at or near to its junction with the road leading to Woodthorpe and extending thence north-westward along the middle of the said Leicester-road for a distance of one mile and eight chains or thereabouts to its junction with Barrow-street and with Southfield-road and extending thence westward along the middle of the last-named road for a distance of forty-three yards or thereabouts to its junction with Pack Horse-lane and extending thence north-westward along the middle of the last-named lane for a distance of ninety-seven yards or thereabouts to its junction with the street called or known as Wood-gate and continuing thence still north-westward and in a direct line for a distance of sixteen yards or thereabouts (thereby passing between the houses called or known respectively as No. 76, Wood-gate and No. 77, Wood-gate) to a point at the back of the said houses upon the boundary which divides the said parish of Emmanuel Loughborough from the parish of Loughborough aforesaid and extending thence first north-eastward then eastward and then southward along the last-mentioned boundary for a distance of one hundred and seventy yards or

thereabouts (thereby passing in rear of the houses situate on the northern side of the last-named street and crossing High-street and passing in rear of some of the houses situate on the northern side of the street called or known as Pinfold-gate and passing between the houses called or known respectively as No. 59 Pinfold-gate and No. 58 Pinfold-gate) to a point in the middle of the last-named street and extending thence that is from the said boundary north-eastward along the middle of the same street for a distance of thirty-four yards or thereabouts to a point opposite to the north-western end of the wall or fence forming the south-western boundary of the buildings and premises called or known as 'The Warner Schools' and extending thence south-eastward to and along the said wall or fence for a distance of thirty-five yards or thereabouts to its junction with the wall or fence forming the south-eastern boundary of the said school buildings and premises and extending thence north-eastward along the last-described wall or fence for a distance of thirty-three yards or thereabouts to its north-eastern end on the south-western side of School-street and continuing thence still north-eastward and in a direct line to a point in the middle of the last-named street and extending thence north-westward along the middle of the same street for a distance of thirty-five yards or thereabouts to its junction with the street called or known as Pinfold-gate aforesaid and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of the last-named street for a distance of one hundred and thirty-six yards or thereabouts to its junction with the street called or known as Sparrow-hill and with Hume-street and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of the last-named street for a distance of one hundred and fifteen yards or thereabouts to its junction with Cobden-street and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of the last-named street for a distance of one hundred and thirty yards or thereabouts to its junction with Freehold-street and extending thence northward and in a direct line diagonally across the last-named street to the arched gateway between the houses called or known respectively as No. 31 Freehold-street and No. 30 Freehold-street and extending thence north-eastward and in a direct line for a distance of two hundred and eighty-four yards or thereabouts to a point in the middle of that canal or branch of the River Soar which is called or known as 'The Leicester Navigation' opposite to the south-eastern angle of the buildings and premises called or known as Messrs. Cartwright and Warner's Factory on the western bank of the said canal and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of the same canal for a distance of eight hundred and twenty-nine yards or thereabouts to the boundary on the northern side of the bridge which carries Moor-lane over the same canal which boundary divides the said parish of Loughborough from the parish of Emmanuel Loughborough aforesaid and extending thence first southward then south-eastward and then eastward along the last-described boundary for a distance of one mile and a half or thereabouts thereby following in part the eastern bank of the same canal to the point in the middle of the main stream of the said River Soar where the said last-described boundary joins the boundary which divides the said parish of Emmanuel Loughborough from the parish of Walton-on-the-Wolds, in the county and diocese aforesaid and extending thence south-eastward along the last-mentioned boundary for a distance of four chains or thereabouts (thereby following the course of the main stream of the River Soar aforesaid to

the junction of the said last-mentioned boundary with the boundary dividing the said parish of Emmanuel Loughborough from the new parish of Saint Bartholomew Quorndon as aforesaid and extending thence westward along the last-described boundary for a distance of one mile and ten chains or thereabouts to the first-described point in the middle of the said Leicester-road at or near to its junction with the road leading to Woodthorpe at which point the said imaginary line commenced."

And whereas the said representation has been approved by Her Majesty in Council : now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts ; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Peterborough.

" We the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England in pursuance of the Act of the eighth and ninth years of your Majesty, chapter seventy, of the Act of the fourteenth and fifteenth years of your Majesty, chapter ninety-seven ; of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of your Majesty, chapter fifty-five, and of the Act of the thirty-fourth and thirty-fifth years of your Majesty chapter eighty-two, have prepared and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following representation as to the assignment of a consolidated chapelry to the consecrated church of Saint Gabriel situate at Canning Town in the parish of West Ham in the county of Essex and in the diocese of Saint Albans.

" Whereas at certain extremities of the said parish of West Ham, of the new parish of Saint Mary, Plaistow, in the said county of Essex and in the said diocese of Saint Albans and of the new parish of Saint Andrew, Plaistow, in the same county and diocese which said extremities lie contiguous one to another, and are described in the schedule hereunder written there is collected together a population which is situate at a distance from the several churches of such parish and new parishes respectively.

" And whereas it appears to us to be expedient that such contiguous portions of the said parish of West Ham, of the said new parish of Saint Mary, Plaistow, and of the said new parish of Saint Andrew, Plaistow, should be formed into a consolidated chapelry for all ecclesiastical purposes, and that the same should be assigned to the said

church of Saint Gabriel, situate at Canning Town as aforesaid,

" We, therefore, humbly pray that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your Royal consideration and to make such Order in respect thereto as to your Majesty in your Royal wisdom shall seem meet.

" The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

" The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Gabriel, Canning Town, being :—

" All that portion of the parish of West Ham, in the county of Essex and in the diocese of Saint Albans, wherein the present incumbent of such parish now possesses the exclusive cure of souls which is bounded on part of the west and on the south-west by the boundary which divides the said county of Essex and diocese of Saint Albans from the county of Middlesex and from the diocese of London or in other words by that part of the River Lea which is called or known as Bow Creek on the south-east partly by the consolidated chapelry of the Holy Trinity, Barking-road, and partly by the hereinafter described detached portion of the new parish of Saint Mary, Plaistow, both in the said county of Essex and in the diocese of Saint Albans aforesaid on the east partly by another detached portion of the said new parish of Saint Mary, Plaistow, and partly by the new parish of Saint Andrew, Plaistow, in the last-mentioned county and diocese and upon all other sides that is to say on the north on the north-west and on the remaining part of the west by an imaginary line commencing at the point in the middle of the embankment of the Northern Outfall Sewer where the boundary dividing the said new parish of Saint Andrew, Plaistow, from the parish of West Ham aforesaid joins the boundary dividing the last-named parish from the main body of the new parish of Saint Mary, Plaistow aforesaid, such point being opposite to the northern corner of the East London Cemetery

and extending thence first north-westward and then westward along the middle of the said embankment for a distance of forty-six chains or thereabouts to the centre of the viaduct which carries the said Northern Outfall Sewer over the Channel Sea River and extending thence first southward and then south-westward along the middle of the last-named river for a distance of forty-one chains or thereabouts to its junction with Bow Creek aforesaid and extending thence in a direction generally southward along the middle of the said Bow Creek for a distance of seventy chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said county of Essex and diocese of Saint Albans from the county of Middlesex and diocese of London aforesaid.

"And also all that contiguous portion of the said new parish of Saint Andrew, Plaistow, which is bounded on the west by the hereinbefore described portion of the parish of West Ham aforesaid and upon all other sides that is to say on the south-east on the east and on the north by an imaginary line commencing at the point where the boundary dividing the said parish of West Ham from the new parish of Saint Andrew, Plaistow, aforesaid crosses the middle of Hermit-road and extending thence first northward and then north-eastward along the middle of the last-named road for a distance of sixteen chains or thereabouts to its junction with Grange-road and with the roadway forming the southern entrance to the East London Cemetery aforesaid and extending thence northward across the said Grange-road and along the middle of the last-described roadway for a distance of two chains or thereabouts to the cemetery gates and extending thence westward to and along the fence forming the southern boundary of the said cemetery for a distance of two chains and seventy links or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint Andrew, Plaistow, from the parish of West Ham aforesaid."

And whereas the said representation has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Saint Albans. *C. WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the thirty-seventh and thirty-eighth years of Her Majesty, chapter sixty-three, and of the Acts therein mentioned duly prepared and laid before

Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the third day of July, in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England in pursuance of the Act of the thirty-seventh and thirty-eighth years of your Majesty chapter sixty-three and of the Acts therein mentioned have prepared and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council the following scheme for constituting a new archdeaconry within the diocese of Rochester and for endowing the same in manner and to the extent hereinafter mentioned.

"Whereas by an Order of your Majesty in Council bearing date the eighteenth day of April one thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight and published in the London Gazette on the third day of May in the same year certain portions of the said diocese of Rochester were constituted into and became one new archdeaconry by the name 'The Archdeaconry of Southwark.'

"And whereas by another Order of your Majesty in Council bearing date the thirtieth day of December one thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight and published in the London Gazette on the tenth day of January one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine certain alterations were made in the names and areas of the rural deaneries or some of them comprised within the said Archdeaconry of Southwark.

"And whereas the Right Reverend Anthony Wilson Bishop of the said diocese of Rochester has proposed to us and has represented to us that it is in his opinion desirable that a new archdeaconry should be constituted within the diocese of Rochester and should comprise and consist of a certain portion of the said Archdeaconry of Southwark; to wit, that portion of the same archdeaconry which is described in the first schedule to this scheme annexed.

"And whereas it appears to us to be expedient that the said proposals of the said Bishop should be carried into effect in manner hereinafter recommended and proposed.

"And whereas it has been made to appear to us that the average net annual income of the said proposed archdeaconry from fees, dues and emoluments will be of nominal amount.

"Now therefore with the consent of the said Anthony Wilson Bishop of the said diocese of Rochester (in testimony of which consent he hath set his hand and his episcopal seal to this scheme) we humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day on which any Order of your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme shall be published in the London Gazette the said Archdeaconry of Southwark shall be divided into and become and be two archdeaconries, whereof the one archdeaconry shall be styled 'The Archdeaconry of Kingston-upon-Thames' and shall comprise and consist of those rural deaneries now portion of the said Archdeaconry of Southwark the names of which are set forth in the said first schedule to this scheme annexed and that the other archdeaconry shall as heretofore be styled 'The Archdeaconry of Southwark' and shall comprise and consist of those rural deaneries, the names of which are set forth in the second schedule to this scheme annexed which said last-mentioned rural deaneries together with the rural deaneries named in the said first schedule to this scheme annexed form the whole of the present undivided Archdeaconry of Southwark.

"And we further recommend and propose that the rural deans and other the clergy and inhabitants of the said Archdeaconry of Kingston-

upon-Thames and of the said Archdeaconry of Southwark respectively shall respectively be under and subject to the archidiaconal jurisdiction authority and control of the archdeacon for the time being of that one of the said two archdeaconries of which they are inhabitants as aforesaid and that each of the said two archdeacons shall have and exercise all the rights powers and duties of an archdeacon within the limits of his archdeaconry.

"And we further recommend and propose that we be authorized to pay yearly and every year out of the common fund created by the Act of the third and fourth years of your Majesty chapter one hundred and thirteen to the Archdeacon of the Archdeaconry of Kingston-upon-Thames hereinbefore recommended and proposed to be created and to his successors in the same archdeaconry the sum of two hundred pounds per annum such yearly payment to be made upon the first day of January in every year in respect of the twelve calendar months ended that day: Provided always that the first payment so to be made by us as aforesaid shall be proportional to the period which shall have elapsed between the date of the institution of the first Archdeacon of the said Archdeaconry of Kingston-upon-Thames and the first day of January next following the date of such institution and that every such yearly payment as aforesaid shall be apportionable between the archdeacon (or as the case may be the representatives of an archdeacon) who has resigned or otherwise avoided the said Archdeaconry of Kingston-upon-Thames on any other than the first day of January in any year and the archdeacon who shall next thereafter be instituted to the same archdeaconry and that every such yearly payment shall be made by us only after we shall have been satisfied that the archdeacon who applies (or whose representatives apply) for it has during the previous year complied with the conditions as to residence which at the date of such application are required by law.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from hereafter recommending and proposing any other matter or thing relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

"The FIRST SCHEDULE in the foregoing Scheme mentioned.

"The Archdeaconry of Kingston-upon Thames comprising and consisting of the following six rural deaneries namely:—

1. The Rural Deanery of Barnes.
2. The Rural Deanery of Beddington.
3. The Rural Deanery of Godstone.
4. The Rural Deanery of Kingston.
5. The Rural Deanery of Reigate.
6. The Rural Deanery of Streatham.

"The SECOND SCHEDULE in the foregoing Scheme mentioned.

"The Archdeaconry of Southwark comprising and consisting of the following seven rural deaneries, namely:—

1. The Rural Deanery of Battersea.
2. The Rural Deanery of Camberwell.
3. The Rural Deanery of Clapham.
4. The Rural Deanery of Kennington.
5. The Rural Deanery of Lambeth.
6. The Rural Deanery of Newington.
7. The Rural Deanery of Southwark."

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her

Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Rochester.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, chapter seventy-seven, and of the Act of the fifth year of Her Majesty (Session 2) chapter twenty-six, duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the tenth day of July, in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England in pursuance of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth chapter seventy-seven and of the Act of the fifth year of your Majesty (Session 2) chapter twenty-six have prepared and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council the following scheme for authorising certain alterations and improvements at the episcopal residence belonging to the See of Lichfield which is situate in the city of Lichfield.

"Whereas the Right Reverend William Dalrymple Bishop of the diocese of Lichfield is desirous that certain permanent improvements should be made at the said episcopal residence at Lichfield and has submitted to us the particulars of such proposed improvements and we have approved the same.

"And whereas the said Bishop is also desirous and it appears to us to be expedient that towards the cost of effecting the said proposed improvements a sum of eight hundred and seventy pounds (being a sum which does not exceed two years income of the See) should be provided by borrowing the same by way of mortgage upon the security of all and every part of the lands tenements and hereditaments or endowments which now belong or may hereafter belong to the Bishoprick of Lichfield.

"Now therefore with the consent of the said William Dalrymple Bishop of the said diocese of Lichfield testified by his having affixed his signature and episcopal seal to this scheme we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England humbly recommend and propose that the said Bishop be authorized to borrow from the Governors of the Bounty of Queen Anne and that the said Governors be empowered to lend under the provisions of the above-mentioned Acts the sum of eight hundred and seventy pounds and that as a security for the same the said Bishop do mortgage all and every part of the lands tenements and hereditaments and endowments which now belong or may hereafter belong to his said See to the said Governors by deed for the term of thirty-five years or until the said sum of eight hundred and seventy pounds with the interest for the same as hereinafter mentioned and all costs and charges which may attend the recovery thereof shall be fully paid and satisfied and that such principal sum shall be repaid with

interest in manner following that is to say during and in respect of the first period of twelve months of the said term computed from the day of the date of the mortgage no part of the said principal sum shall be repayable, but the said Bishop or his successors shall yearly at the end of the second period of twelve months so computed and at the end of every such like period of twelve months thereafter pay to the said Governors their successors or assigns one thirtieth part of the said principal sum until the whole thereof shall be repaid and shall also at the end of the first and each succeeding period of twelve months computed as aforesaid pay interest at the rate of four pounds per centum per annum on the said principal sum or on so much thereof as shall from time to time remain unpaid and if and when, it shall happen that either the principal or interest directed to be paid as hereinbefore mentioned shall be in arrear and unpaid for the space of forty days after the same shall have become due it shall and may be lawful for the said Governors their successors and assigns to recover the same and the costs and charges attending the recovery thereof by distress and sale in the like manner as rents may be recovered by landlords or lessors from their tenants by the laws in force at the time of such distress and sale and that such mortgage deed shall be in the form and to the effect to be approved by us and shall bind as well the said William Dalrymple now Bishop of the said diocese of Lichfield as every succeeding Bishop of the same diocese until the principal money and interest costs and charges shall have been paid off and discharged.

"And we further recommend and propose that the said sum of eight hundred and seventy pounds shall be paid to us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners and that the receipt of our Joint Treasurers for the time being endorsed on the said mortgage deed shall be a good and sufficient discharge to the said Governors and their successors for the same who shall not be bound or require to see to the application thereof and that upon the receipt of the said sum of eight hundred and seventy pounds the whole or any part or parts thereof shall be applied by us at such times and in such manner as shall appear to us to be expedient towards effecting the said proposed improvements at the episcopal residence aforesaid.

"And we further recommend and propose that the Bishop of the said diocese of Lichfield for the time being shall at his personal charge and expense insure and keep insured the episcopal house of residence aforesaid from loss or damage by fire in one of the public offices of assurance in London or Westminster to be approved by us in a sum of not less than seven thousand pounds and that such Bishop shall within fourteen days after any premium for such assurance shall have become due and payable deliver to us the receipt for the same and that in case of any loss or damage by fire to the said house any and every sum of money receivable under such insurance shall become and be payable and be paid to and deposited with us in trust to be applied and the same together with any interest and accumulations thereof shall be applied by us towards the rebuilding or repairing and reinstating of the said house or of any part thereof which may have so suffered loss or damage in such manner as shall be determined on by us with the concurrence of the Bishop of the said diocese of Lichfield for the time being.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them

in conformity with the provisions of the herein named Acts or of either of them or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Lichfield.

"Whereas at certain extremities of the said parish of Dewsbury of the new parish of Saint Paul Hanging Heaton in the said county of York and in the said diocese of Ripon, and of the new parish of Saint Peter Earls Heaton in the same county and diocese which said extremities lie contiguous one to another and are described in the schedule hereunder written there is collected together a population which is situate at a distance from the several churches of such parish and new parishes respectively.

"And whereas it appears to us to be expedient that such contiguous portions of the said parish of Dewsbury of the said new parish of Saint Paul, Hanging Heaton and of the said new parish of Saint Peter Earls Heaton should be formed into a consolidated chapelry for all ecclesiastical purposes and that the same should be assigned to the said church of Saint Philip situate in Leeds-road in the parish of Dewsbury as aforesaid.

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Robert Bishop of the said diocese of Ripon as such Bishop, and also as the patron in right of his See of the vicarage of the said parish of Dewsbury, and with the consent of the Reverend

John Richard Baldwin Clerk in Holy Orders vicar or incumbent of the said vicarage of the parish of Dewsbury and as such vicar or incumbent the patron both of the vicarage of the said new parish of Saint Paul Hanging Heaton and of the vicarage of the said new parish of Saint Peter Earls Heaton (in testimony whereof they the said consenting parties have respectively signed and sealed this representation) we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly represent, that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all those contiguous portions of the said parish of Dewsbury of the said new parish of Saint Paul Hanging Heaton, and of the said new parish of Saint Peter Earls Heaton which are described in the schedule hereunder written, all which portions together with the boundaries thereof, are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed should be united and formed into one consolidated chapelry for the said church of Saint Philip situate in Leeds-road in the parish of Dewsbury as aforesaid and that the same should be named 'The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Philip Dewsbury.'

"We, therefore, humbly pray that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your Royal consideration and to make such Order in respect thereto as to your Majesty, in your Royal wisdom, shall seem meet.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Philip Dewsbury, being:—

"All that portion of the parish of Dewsbury in the county of York and in the diocese of Ripon wherein the present incumbent of such parish now possesses the exclusive cure of souls and also all those contiguous portions of the new parish of Saint Paul Hanging Heaton and of the new parish of Saint Peter Earls Heaton both in the county and diocese aforesaid which said portions of such cures are comprised within and are bounded by an imaginary line commencing at the point where the boundary dividing the said parish of Dewsbury from the new parish of Saint Peter Earls Heaton aforesaid crosses the middle of Wakefield Old-road a little to the east of its junction with Wakefield-road and extending thence first south-eastward and then north-eastward along the middle of the said Wakefield Old-road for a distance of twenty-one and a half chains or thereabouts to its junction with Sugar-lane and extending thence first north-westward and then northward along the middle of the said lane for a distance of twenty-five and a half chains or thereabouts (thereby crossing at the south-eastern end of the said lane the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint Peter Earls Heaton from the new parish of Saint Paul Hanging Heaton aforesaid) to the junction of the same lane with the Leeds-road and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of the last-named road for a distance of exactly forty yards to a point opposite to a boundary-stone inscribed 'D. And whereas the said representation has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts: and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Ripon.

"We the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England in pursuance of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of your Majesty chapter thirty-seven and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of your Majesty chapter one hundred and four have prepared and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council the following scheme for constituting a separate district for spiritual purposes out of the new parish of Saint Michael and All Angels Bromley within the metropolis of London in the county of Middlesex and in the diocese of London.

"Whereas it appears to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular part of the said new parish of Saint Michael and All Angels Bromley which is hereinafter mentioned and described should be constituted a separate district in manner hereinafter recommended and proposed.

"And whereas there is not at present within the limits of the said proposed district any consecrated church or chapel in use for the purposes of Divine worship.

"And whereas by an Order of your Majesty in Council dated the twenty-first day of July in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-six and published in the London Gazette on the fourth day of August following for uniting (as therein mentioned) two benefices situate within the city and diocese of London to wit the benefice (being a rectory) of Saint Mary-le-Bow with Saint Pancras Soper-lane and All Hallows Honey-lane and the benefice (being a rectory) of All Hallows

Bread-street with Saint John the Evangelist it was (amongst other things) provided that upon the union of the said two benefices taking effect the church of All Hallows Bread-street should be taken down and its materials and a certain specified portion of its site should be sold and that out of the net proceeds realized by the sales thus effected there should be set apart and appropriated a sum of not less than nine thousand pounds to be expended in acquiring a site for and in erecting a church within the limits of the metropolis in connection with which church a district to be called 'All Hallows' should be constituted and that a further sum should out of the said proceeds be set apart and appropriated such as would when invested in Three Pounds per Centum Consolidated Bank Annuities provide an endowment of one hundred and twenty pounds a year for the minister or incumbent of the said district so to be constituted in connection with the said proposed church of All Hallows as aforesaid and it was also by the same Order of your Majesty in Council provided that upon the union of the two benefices taking effect as aforesaid all the properties constituting the endowments of the said united benefices should be subject to a rent-charge of three hundred pounds per annum to be applied in and towards the further endowment of the said proposed district.

"And whereas it was by the same Order of your Majesty in Council further provided that the whole advowson and perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the cure of the said proposed district and of the church thereof should as from the date of the constitution or formation of the same cure be vested in the Archbishop of Canterbury for the time being and his successors.

"And whereas the union of the said benefice of Saint Mary-le-Bow with Saint Pancras Soper-lane and All Hallows Honey-lane and of the said benefice of All Hallows Bread-street with Saint John the Evangelist has now taken effect.

"And whereas the said church of All Hallows Bread-street has now been taken down and its materials and the specified portion of its site aforesaid have been sold and out of the net proceeds of sales we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners after setting apart a capital sum of not less than nine thousand pounds for the acquisition of a site and for the erection of a church as aforesaid have invested a sum in Three Pounds per Centum Consolidated Bank Annuities sufficient to provide an endowment of one hundred and twenty pounds a year for the minister or incumbent of the said proposed district.

"And whereas a site for the proposed church of All Hallows has been acquired in the East India Dock-road within the limits of the metropolis as aforesaid and within the limits of the district hereinafter recommended and proposed and the said proposed church is now being erected upon such site.

"Now therefore with the consent of the Right Honourable and Right Reverend John Bishop of the said diocese of London (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners humbly recommend and propose that all that part of the said new parish of Saint Michael and All Angels Bromley which is described in the schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto annexed and which amongst other territory contains and comprises the site of the said proposed new church of All Hallows in the East India Dock-road as aforesaid shall upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of your Majesty in Council

ratifying this scheme become and be constituted separate district for spiritual purposes and that the same shall be named 'The District of All Hallows East India Docks.'

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts of Parliament or of any of them or in accordance with any other Act or Acts of Parliament.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

"The District of All Hallows East India Docks being:—

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Act; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Durham.

"All that portion of the parish of Wrexham situate partly in the county of Denbigh and partly in the county of Flint and wholly in the diocese of Saint Asaph which is comprised within and is co-extensive with the limits of the main body of the township of Eclusham Below and of the township of Erthig otherwise called Erddig both in the county of Denbigh aforesaid.

immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts and Her Majesty by and with the like advice is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Manchester.
