

and extending thence first north-westward and then westward along the middle of the said embankment for a distance of forty-six chains or thereabouts to the centre of the viaduct which carries the said Northern Outfall Sewer over the Channel Sea River and extending thence first southward and then south-westward along the middle of the last-named river for a distance of forty-one chains or thereabouts to its junction with Bow Creek aforesaid and extending thence in a direction generally southward along the middle of the said Bow Creek for a distance of seventy chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said county of Essex and diocese of Saint Albans from the county of Middlesex and diocese of London aforesaid.

"And also all that contiguous portion of the said new parish of Saint Mary, Plaistow, which is detached from the main body of the same new parish and situate on the north-western side of Barking-road which said portion of such new parish is bounded on the west and on the north by the hereinbefore described portion of the said parish of West Ham and on the north-east and on the south-east by the consolidated chapelry of the Holy Trinity, Barking-road, aforesaid.

"And also all that contiguous portion of the said new parish of Saint Andrew, Plaistow, which is bounded on the west by the hereinbefore-described portion of the parish of West Ham aforesaid and upon all other sides that is to say on the south-east on the east and on the north by an imaginary line commencing at the point where the boundary dividing the said parish of West Ham from the new parish of Saint Andrew, Plaistow, aforesaid crosses the middle of Hermit-road and extending thence first northward and then north-eastward along the middle of the last-named road for a distance of sixteen chains or thereabouts to its junction with Grange-road and with the roadway forming the southern entrance to the East London Cemetery aforesaid and extending thence northward across the said Grange-road and along the middle of the last-described roadway for a distance of two chains or thereabouts to the cemetery gates and extending thence westward to and along the fence forming the southern boundary of the said cemetery for a distance of two chains and seventy links or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint Andrew, Plaistow, from the parish of West Ham aforesaid."

And whereas the said representation has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Saint Albans. *C. The QUEEN'S Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the thirty-seventh and thirty-eighth years of Her Majesty, chapter sixty-three, and of the Acts therein mentioned duly prepared and laid before

Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the third day of July, in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England in pursuance of the Act of the thirty-seventh and thirty-eighth years of your Majesty chapter sixty-three and of the Acts therein mentioned have prepared and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council the following scheme for constituting a new archdeaconry within the diocese of Rochester and for endowing the same in manner and to the extent hereinafter mentioned.

"Whereas by an Order of your Majesty in Council bearing date the eighteenth day of April one thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight and published in the London Gazette on the third day of May in the same year certain portions of the said diocese of Rochester were constituted into and became one new archdeaconry by the name 'The Archdeaconry of Southwark.'

"And whereas by another Order of your Majesty in Council bearing date the thirtieth day of December one thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight and published in the London Gazette on the tenth day of January one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine certain alterations were made in the names and areas of the rural deaneries or some of them comprised within the said Archdeaconry of Southwark.

"And whereas the Right Reverend Anthony Wilson Bishop of the said diocese of Rochester has proposed to us and has represented to us that it is in his opinion desirable that a new archdeaconry should be constituted within the diocese of Rochester and should comprise and consist of a certain portion of the said Archdeaconry of Southwark; to wit, that portion of the same archdeaconry which is described in the first schedule to this scheme annexed.

"And whereas it appears to us to be expedient that the said proposals of the said Bishop should be carried into effect in manner hereinafter recommended and proposed.

"And whereas it has been made to appear to us that the average net annual income of the said proposed archdeaconry from fees, dues and emoluments will be of nominal amount.

"Now therefore with the consent of the said Anthony Wilson Bishop of the said diocese of Rochester (in testimony of which consent he hath set his hand and his episcopal seal to this scheme) we humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day on which any Order of your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme shall be published in the London Gazette the said Archdeaconry of Southwark shall be divided into and become and be two archdeaconries, whereof the one archdeaconry shall be styled 'The Archdeaconry of Kingston-upon-Thames' and shall comprise and consist of those rural deaneries now portion of the said Archdeaconry of Southwark the names of which are set forth in the said first schedule to this scheme annexed and that the other archdeaconry shall as heretofore be styled 'The Archdeaconry of Southwark' and shall comprise and consist of those rural deaneries, the names of which are set forth in the second schedule to this scheme annexed which said last-mentioned rural deaneries together with the rural deaneries named in the said first schedule to this scheme annexed form the whole of the present undivided Archdeaconry of Southwark.

"And we further recommend and propose that the rural deans and other the clergy and inhabitants of the said Archdeaconry of Kingston-
