A DESPATCH, of which the following is a copy, has been received by the Secretary of State for War from General Sir Garnet Wolseley, G.C.M.G., K.C.B., commanding the Forces in South Africa:—

*Army Head Quarters, Camp, Ulundi,
Zululand, September 3, 1879.*

SIR,
I HAVE the honour to report that after a well-sustained pursuit through a most difficult country, extending over sixteen days, Ketchwayo, the ex-King of Zululand, was captured on the 28th ultimo by a patrol under the command of Major Marter, King's Dragoon Guards, to whom every praise is due for the skilful manner in which the capture was effected.

Ketchwayo is now on his way to Cape Town, accompanied by some of his wives and servants. He will be detained as a State prisoner at large in the Cape Colony, under the authority of an Act to be passed for that purpose by the Cape Parliament.

On the 1st instant I held a meeting attended by nearly all the great chiefs of Zululand, most of those who from bodily infirmities, or other sufficient causes were unable to attend, being represented by their principal councillors. I explained to the assembled chiefs how the country is in future to be divided amongst them, and the terms upon which they are to be appointed to rule over their respective territories as independent chiefs. I have addressed a despatch to the Secretary of State for the Colonies giving full details of the arrangements I have made for the future government of the country, through which I have every reason to believe that peace will be permanently secured, and the Zulu military power, which has so long threatened the peace of South Africa, be for ever broken up.

I now feel, therefore, in a position to report that the Zulu War has been satisfactorily concluded. Her Majesty's troops can now return to Natal, where, with the exception of those to be retained for the garrisons of South Africa, they will be encamped at Pinetown to await the arrival of transports to take them to their respective destinations. The 1st Battalion 13th Light Infantry and the 1st Battalion 24th Regiment have already embarked for England.

Lieutenant-Colonel Clarke's Column is now on the march to Natal, via St. Paul's and Entumeni. It will cross the Tugela at the Middle Drift. Upon reaching Natal, all the levies and irregular troops

belonging to it will be disbanded. Lieutenant-Colonel Baker Russell's Column will be broken up as soon as Oham, Ketchwayo's brother, has been re-established in his own district, and when, with the assistance of Lieutenant-Colonel Honourable G. Villiers, whom I appointed Special Commissioner to Oham's armed forces, Lieutenant-Colonel Russell has obtained the submission of the turbulent and semi-independent tribes inhabiting the north-west corner of Zululand, and the disputed territory there bordering upon the Transvaal. I expect that a show of force in the district will be sufficient to effect this object in a very short time.

I have already had the honour of reporting to you the strength of the garrisons I propose retaining at least for the present in the several provinces of South Africa, and from which detachments will be provided for Mauritius and Saint Helena.

Almost all the hired land transport is now being discharged, and I hope I may soon be in a position largely to reduce the amount of Government transport still retained.

To-morrow I intend marching from this with the Head Quarter Staff and a small personal escort direct to Utrecht, en route for Pretoria, which place I hope to reach about the 1st proximo.

Our patrols have visited the most distant localities of Zululand, testing thereby the completeness of the submission of the chiefs, and the peaceable condition of the country. I have in this way been able to extend our topographical knowledge of Zululand, and by actual survey, as well as by reconnaissances, to lay down on paper with very tolerable accuracy its rivers, mountains, &c.

I believe that at least 5,000 stand of arms have been now collected and destroyed. Those upon whom I rely most for information estimate at about 8,000 the total number of guns in Zululand before the war. Assuming that this somewhat under estimates the number, I think we may calculate that at least one-half of the firearms in the country have been taken or voluntarily surrendered by the chiefs coming in to submit. A considerable amount of gunpowder and ammunition has also been destroyed.

The successful action fought near this spot on the 4th July last, has been the only engagement with the enemy since I assumed command of the troops in South Africa. In that action I took no part, Lieutenant-General Lord Chelmsford having commanded there in person, and made all pre-

liminary arrangements, all the merit of that victory is due to him. The subsequent operations have happily been of a bloodless character, but their successful accomplishment depended upon a nicety of calculation and a precision of arrangement only to be expected from a very able and experienced staff, such as that which I am fortunate enough to have with me, presided over by that ablest of Staff Officers Brigadier-General Sir George Pomeroy Colley.

These operations, immediately leading to the capture of the King have been carried out by the troops of the column under Lieutenant-Colonel Clarke, 57th Regiment, who has performed the duties of his responsible command in the most highly efficient manner. The officers and men under him have worked most cheerfully, though the stimulus to exertion given by the presence of an armed enemy was wanting; indeed the conduct of all the troops in the field, British and Colonial, since I assumed command, has been admirable.

Of those who have toiled unremittingly throughout this war, no one is more deserving of special mention than Major-General the Honourable H. H. Clifford. Since his arrival in South Africa, he has been in charge of the base, and of the lines of communication, a charge which I thought it

necessary to extend when I assumed command. On him has devolved the heaviest part of the work connected with the concluding operations and reduction of the force. No one could have worked with more earnest zeal than he has done, not only to keep the troops in the field supplied with everything they required, but to do so without unnecessary or extravagant expenditure of public money. By him great economy was introduced into the administration, and a most salutary check established over the outlay of all public money.

As this Despatch is to announce to Her Majesty's Government the successful termination of the military operations in Zululand, and the peaceable settlement of the country, I venture to send it to you in charge of my Aide-de-Camp, Captain Lord Gifford, V.C., whom I recommend to your favourable consideration. Lord Gifford was actively engaged in pursuit of Ketchwayo from the day when the first patrol was sent out; and, at the time when the capture was made, was watching with a small body of men the kraal into which he had traced the King, with the intention of effecting the capture at night-fall.

THE Queen has been graciously pleased to signify Her intention to confer the decoration of the Victoria Cross upon the undermentioned Officer and Non-Commissioned Officer of Her Majesty's Army, whose claims have been submitted for Her Majesty's approval, for their several acts of valour in endeavouring to save the lives of soldiers during the reconnaissance made before Ulundi, on the 3rd July, 1879, as recorded against their names:—

Regiment.	Names.	Acts of Courage for which recommended.
Frontier Light Horse	Captain (now Commandant) Cecil D'Arcy	For his gallant conduct on the 3rd July, 1879, during the reconnaissance made before Ulundi by the Mounted Corps, in endeavouring to rescue Trooper Raubenheim, of the Frontier Light Horse, who fell from his horse as the troops were retiring. Captain D'Arcy, though the Zulus were close upon them, waited for the man to mount behind him; the horse kicked them both off, and though much hurt by the fall and quite alone, Captain D'Arcy coolly endeavoured to lift the trooper, who was stunned, on to the horse, and it was only when he found that he had not strength to do so that he mounted and rode off. His escape was miraculous as the Zulus had actually closed upon him.
Frontier Light Horse	Sergeant Edmund O'Toole.	For his conspicuous courage and bravery on several occasions during the campaign, and especially for his conduct on the 3rd July, 1879, at the close of the reconnaissance before Ulundi, in assisting to rescue Sergeant Fitzmaurice, 1st Battalion 24th Mounted Infantry, whose horse fell and rolled on him, as the troops retired before great numbers of the enemy. When lifted up behind him by Lord William Beresford, the man, being half stunned by the fall, could not hold on, and he must have been left had not Sergeant O'Toole, who was keeping back the advancing Zulus, given up his carbine and assisted to hold Sergeant Fitzmaurice on the horse. At the time the Zulus were rapidly closing on them, and there was no armed man between them and Sergeant O'Toole.

GENERAL ORDER of the Local Government Board. Altering Consolidated Order :—
Out-door Labour Test :—

Durham Union.

To the Guardians of the Poor of the Durham Union, in the county of Durham :—

To the Churchwardens and Overseers of the Poor of the several Parishes and Places comprised in the said Union :—

And to all others whom it may concern.

WE, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given to us by the Statutes in that behalf, hereby order, with respect to the relief of the poor in the Durham Union, in the county of Durham, as follows :—

ARTICLE 1. Every able-bodied male pauper who may receive relief within the Union, and may be relieved out of the Workhouse, with the approbation of the Local Government Board, according to Article VI. of the General Order of the Poor Law Commissioners, dated the 21st day of December, 1844, in force in the Union, shall be relieved in the following manner; that is to say :—

Half at least of the relief given to such pauper shall be given in food, clothing, and other articles of necessity.

No such pauper shall receive relief from the Guardians, or any of their officers, or any Overseer of any parish in the Union, while he is employed for wages or other hire or remuneration by any person; but every such pauper so relieved shall be set to work by the Guardians.

ARTICLE 2. The Guardians shall, within fourteen days after the day when this Order comes into force, and from time to time afterwards as the Local Government Board may require, report to the Local Government Board the place or places at which able-bodied male paupers shall be so set to work in the Union, the sort or sorts of work in which they or any of them shall be employed, the times and mode of work, and all such other

matters relating to the employment of such able-bodied paupers as the said Guardians shall deem material to be communicated to the Local Government Board, or as the Local Government Board shall require.

ARTICLE 3. If the Guardians shall depart, in any particular instance, from any of the regulations hereinbefore contained, and shall, within fifteen days after such departure, report the same and the grounds thereof, to the Local Government Board, and if the Local Government Board shall approve of such departure, then the relief granted in such particular instance shall, if otherwise lawful, not be deemed to be unlawful, or be subject to be disallowed.

ARTICLE 4. The word "Parish" in this Order means any place for which a separate Poor Rate is or can be made, or for which a separate Overseer is or can be appointed.

And whereas provision is made in a General Order of the Poor Law Commissioners, bearing date the twenty-fourth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and forty-seven, in force in the said Union, for the appointment of an officer, to be termed a Superintendent of Out-door Labour, and for the continuance in office of such officer, and it is expedient to provide for the suspension of such officer on other occasions than those provided for by the last-mentioned Order;

We therefore further Order, that if at any time the number of able-bodied male paupers requiring relief shall be so small as to render the services of such an officer unnecessary, the Guardians may suspend him from the performance of his duties until a further occasion shall arise.

BYE-LAWS and REGULATIONS made by the Croydon Tramways Company, under the powers conferred on the Company by "The Tramways Act, 1870," for preventing the Commission of any Nuisance in or upon any Carriage, or in or against any Premises belonging to them, and for Regulating the Travelling in or upon any carriage belonging to them.

THE Bye-laws and Regulations hereinafter set forth shall extend and apply to all carriages of the Company, and to all places with respect to which the Company have power to make Bye-laws and Regulations.

2. No passenger or other person shall smoke inside any carriage or waiting-room.

3. No passenger or other person shall, while in or upon any carriage or in any waiting-room, play or perform upon any musical instrument.

4. A person in a state of intoxication shall not be allowed to enter or mount upon any carriage, or to enter any waiting-room, and if found in or upon any carriage or in any waiting-room, shall be immediately removed by or under the direction of the conductor or other duly authorized officer of the Company.

5. No person shall swear or use obscene or offensive language whilst in or upon any carriage or in any waiting-room, or commit any nuisance in or upon or against any carriage or waiting-room, or other premises of the Company, or wilfully interfere with the comfort of any passenger or intending passenger.

6. No person shall wilfully scratch, cut, tear, soil, or damage, any carriage, or the cushions, linings, or panels thereof, or remove or deface any number plate, table of fares, Bye-laws, printed or other notice, or writing in or on any carriage or waiting-room, or break or scratch any window of, or otherwise wilfully damage, any carriage or waiting-room, or soil, deface, or damage the paint or paper, or the furniture or fittings, of any waiting-room, or otherwise wilfully damage any property whatever of the Company.

Any person acting in contravention of this Regulation shall be liable to the penalty prescribed by these Bye-laws and Regulations in addition to the liability to pay for any damage done.

7. A person whose dress or clothing might, in the opinion of the conductor or other duly authorized officer of the Company, soil or injure the linings or cushions of the carriage, or the dress or clothing of any passenger or intending passenger, or who, in the opinion of the conductor or other duly authorized officer of the Company, might for any other reason be offensive to passengers or intending passengers, shall not be entitled to enter or remain in the interior of any carriage or waiting-room, and may be prevented from entering the interior of any carriage or waiting-room, and shall not enter the interior of any carriage or waiting-room after having been requested not to do so by the conductor or other duly authorized officer of the Company, and if found in the interior of any carriage or waiting-room shall, on the request of the conductor or other duly authorized officer of the Company, leave the interior of the carriage or waiting-room upon the fare, if previously paid, being returned.

8. Each passenger shall, upon demand, pay to the conductor or other duly authorized officer of the Company the fare legally demandable for the journey.

9. Each passenger shall show his ticket, if any, when required so to do, to the conductor or any duly authorized servant of the Company, and shall also, when required so to do, either deliver up his ticket or pay the fare legally demandable.

10. A passenger, not being an artisan, mechanic, or daily labourer, within the true intent and meaning of the Acts of Parliament relating to the Company, shall not use or attempt to use any ticket intended only for such artisans, mechanics, or daily labourers.

11. Personal or other luggage, including the tools of artisans, mechanics, and daily labourers shall, unless otherwise permitted by the conductor, be placed on the front or driver's platform, and not in the interior or on the roof of any carriage.

12. No passenger or other person, not being a servant of the Company, shall be permitted to travel on the steps or platform of any carriage, or stand either on the roof, or in the interior, or sit on the outside rail on the roof of any carriage, and shall cease to do so immediately on request by the conductor.

13. No person except a passenger or intending passenger, or a police officer in the execution of his duty, shall enter or mount any carriage, or use any waiting-room, and no person shall hold or hang on by or to any part of any carriage, or travel therein otherwise than on a seat provided for passengers.

14. When any carriage contains the full number of passengers which it is licensed to contain, no additional person shall enter, mount, or remain in or on any such carriage when warned by the conductor not to do so.

15. When a carriage contains the full licensed number of passengers, a notice to that effect shall be placed, in conspicuous letters, and in a conspicuous position, on the carriage.

16. The conductor shall not permit any passenger beyond the licensed number to enter, or mount, or remain in or upon any part of a carriage.

17. No person shall enter, mount, or leave, or attempt to enter, mount, or leave any carriage whilst in motion.

18. No dog or other animal shall be allowed in or on any carriage, or in any waiting-room, except by permission of the conductor or other duly authorized officer of the Company, nor in any case in which the conveyance or admittance of such dog or other animal might be offensive or an annoyance. No person shall take a dog or other animal into any carriage or waiting-room after having been requested by the conductor or other duly authorized officer of the Company not to do so. Any dog or other animal taken into or on any carriage, or into any waiting-room, in breach of this regulation, shall be removed by the person in charge of such dog or other animal from the carriage or waiting-room immediately upon request for the purpose by the conductor or other duly authorized officer of the Company, and, in default of compliance with such request, may be removed by or under the direction of the conductor or other duly authorized officer of the Company.

19. No person shall travel in or on any carriage of the Company with loaded fire-arms, or with any combustible or dangerous substance or material.

20. No passenger or intending passenger shall wilfully obstruct or impede any officer or servant of the Company in the execution of his duty upon or in connection with any carriage, tramway, or waiting-room or premises of the Company.

21. The conductor of each carriage shall enforce or prevent the breach of any of these Bye-laws or Regulations to the best of his ability.

22. Any person offending against or committing a breach of any of these Bye-laws or Regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding forty shillings for each and every such offence.

23. The expression "conductor" shall include any officer or servant in the employment of the Company and having charge of a carriage.

24. There shall be placed and kept placed in a conspicuous position, inside each carriage in use, and in each waiting-room, a printed copy of these Bye-laws and Regulations.

25. These Bye-laws shall come into operation on the third day of December, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine.

Entering or leaving Cars.

III. The conductor shall be bound to stop the car when requested by any passenger who desires to enter or leave the same, except where the gradients or curves of the route, afford a reasonable excuse for his not doing so, or at the crossing of the several streets, or where prevented by the Regulations of the Police.

Penalty for Offences.

IV. For every offence against any of the foregoing Bye-laws by any driver or conductor of any car, or other person using the tramways, such driver or conductor or other person shall be liable to a penalty of forty shillings.

Provided nevertheless, that the Justices or Court before whom any complaint may be made for a breach of any of the foregoing Bye-laws and Regulations may, if they think fit, reduce the amount of penalty hereinbefore prescribed as they may deem advisable.

Further notice is hereby given, that such Bye-laws and Regulations will forthwith be laid before the Board of Trade, and that the same will come into effect at the expiration of two calendar months therefrom, unless in the meantime the Board of Trade shall disallow the same or any of them.
