TENDERS FOR LOANS ON TREASURY BILLS.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the 39th and 40th years of Her present Majesty Queen Victoria, entitled "An Act for the preservation of Wild Fowl," it was by the 2nd section provided that any person who shall kill, wound, or take, or attempt to kill, wound, or take any wild fowl as defined by the said Act, or use any boat, gun, net, or other engine or instrument for the purpose of killing, wounding, or taking any wild fowl, or shall have in his control or possession any wild fowl recently killed, wounded, or taken, between the 15th day of February and the 10th day of July in any year, shall be liable to the penalty therein mentioned, and by the 3rd section, power was given to the Home Office as to Great Britain, upon the application of the Justices in Quarter Sessions assembled of any county, to extend or vary the time during which the killing, wounding, and taking of wild fowl was prohibited by the said Act, such extension or variation to be made by Order, under the hand of one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State:

And whereas the Justices of the North Riding of the county of York, in Quarter Sessions assembled, have applied to me to the effect that an Order should be made directing that the time during which the killing, wounding, and taking of wild fowl, as defined by the said Act, is prohibited shall be varied in the North Riding of the county of York so as to be from the 1st day of March to the 1st day of August.

Now, therefore, I, the Right Honourable Richard Assheton Cross, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, in pursuance of the said Act, and on such application as aforesaid, hereby order as follows:—

The time during which the killing, wounding, and taking of wild fowl, as defined by the said Act, is prohibited, shall be varied in the North Riding of the county of York so as to be from the 1st day of March to the 1st day of August.

INCOME TAX.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the 28th year of Her Majesty, cap. 30, for granting to Her Majesty certain duties of Customs and Inland Revenue, power is given for increasing in certain cases the number of persons appointed under the provisions made by the Act passed in the 5th and 6th years of Her Majesty, cap. 35, Commissioners for the general purposes of the Income Tax Acts and persons to supply vacancies amongst such Commissioners in each district or division in Great Britain; and it appearing to the Board of Inland Revenue that the number of persons so

Lincolnshire.—Holland.

AT the General Quarter Sessions of the Peace of our Sovereign Lady the Queen, held at the Sessions-house, Boston, in the parts of Holland, in the county of Lincoln, on Monday, the 13th day of October, 1879.

Whereas at a Court of General Quarter Sessions held in and for the said parts of Holland, in the said county of Lincoln, on the 30th day of June, 1879, it was provisionally ordered, under the Highway Act, 1862, and the Highway Act, 1864, as follows:—That the several parishes or places hereinafter mentioned and described should constitute a Highway District for the more convenient management of highways, that is to say:—Brothertoft, Kirton Fen, Sutterton Fen, Algarkirk

Fen, Fosdyke Fen, North Forty Foot Bank, Pelham's Lands, Hart's Grounds, that part of Swineshead which is known by the name of Chapel Hill, that part of Frampton which is situate within the boundaries hereinafter described, that part of Wyberton which is situate within the boundaries hereinafter described, Ferry Corner Plot, and Amber Hill, all situate within the parts of Holland, in the said county of Lincoln; and those two portions of Dogdyke which lie on the west side of the River Witham, within the boundaries hereinafter described, and are situate within the parts of Kesteven, in the said county of Lincoln, and that part of Langrville which lies on the west side of the River Witham, and that part of Coningsby which is situate within the boundaries hereinafter de-

scribed, which two last-mentioned places are situate in the parts of Lindsey, in the said county of Lincoln; all which district is bounded on the north by the road from Billingham to Tattershall Bridge; on the east by the River Witham, Boston West, Wyberton, and the road from Toft Tunnel to Hubbard Bridge, otherwise Hubbert's Bridge, including the said road; on the south-east by the road from Hubbard Bridge, otherwise Hubbert's Bridge, to the eastern boundary of the parish of Wigtoft; on the south-west by the parish of Wigtoft; on the north-west by the western boundary of the parish of Wigtoft, and thence by an imaginary line across the South Forty Foot Drain and its banks to the Great Northern Railway Branch from Boston to Sleaford, and inclusive of the said branch railway on the south; along the south side thereof from the said last-mentioned point by the said Great Northern Railway Branch from Boston to Sleaford to the Skirith Drain; and on the west by the Skirith Drain, the Hurn, Holland Dyke, Kyme Ean, and Billingham Dales; and is delineated and shown in the map or plan annexed to the said Provisional Order, marked A, and is to be known by the name "Holland Fen Highway District." And that one Waywarden be elected for each of the said parishes or places, except the several parts of Frampton, Wyberton, and Coningsby hereinbefore respectively mentioned and described. And that the several parts of Frampton, Wyberton, and Coningsby, respectively hereinbefore mentioned and described, be combined into and become one Highway Parish. And that one Waywarden be elected for such parish.

And whereas notices were duly given that the confirmation of the said Provisional Order by a Final Order would be taken into consideration by the Justices at the present Court of General or Quarter Sessions.

Now, therefore, after due consideration, it is ordered that the said Provisional Order be confirmed by a Final Order, and that the same is hereby finally confirmed accordingly.

And it is also ordered that the first election of Waywardens as Members of the Highway Board for the said Holland Fen Highway District shall take place on Monday, the 3rd day of November, 1879.

And it is also further ordered, that the first meeting of the Highway Board for the said Holland Fen Highway District shall be held at the Wheat Sheaf Inn, Hubbert's Bridge, in the said District, on the 10th day of November, 1879, in pursuance of the said statutes, at the hour of twelve o'clock at noon.
