FACTORY AND WORKSHOP ACT, 1878.

DIFFERENT HOLIDAYS TO DIFFERENT SETS.
Order of Secretary of State granting Special Exception.

WHEREAS it has been proved to my satisfaction that the customs or exigencies of the trades carried on in non-textile factories and workshops of the classes mentioned in the Schedule hereunder, require that the special exception hereafter mentioned should be granted:

Now I, the Right Honourable Richard Assheton Cross, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, by this Order, made under Part 2 of the Factory and Workshop Act, 1878, grant to factories and workshops of such classes a special exception, authorising the occupier of any such factory or workshop to allow all or any of the half holidays, or whole holidays in lieu of them, on different days to any of the children, young persons, and women employed in his factory or workshop, or to any sets of such children, young persons, and women, and not on the same days.

This Order shall come into operation on 1st November, 1879, and shall, unless previously revoked, continue in force until 31st December, 1882, and no longer.
