By the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The Order of Council bearing date the twenty-fifth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine, defining a part of the Port of Middlesbrough, in the North Riding of the county of York, as a foreign animals wharf is hereby revoked: Provided that nothing herein shall be deemed to invalidate or make unlawful anything done under the said Order before the date of this revocation, or interfere with the institution or prosecution of any proceeding in respect of any offence committed against, or any penalty incurred under, the said Order.

2. Article 14 of The Foreign Animals Order shall be read and have effect as if Middlesbrough was included in the list of Ports therein named.

WHEREAS the Governing Body of Westminster School, in virtue of the powers conferred upon them by "The Public Schools Act, 1868," and of every other power enabling them in that behalf, did, on the fifth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine, make certain amendments in the Statute for determining and establishing the constitution of the Governing Body of the school approved by Her Majesty in Council on the seventh of October, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-nine, and amended by Order in Council of twenty-eighth of June, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-five, and also in the body of Statutes for the school approved by Her Majesty in Council on the third of November, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-one, and amended by Order in Council of the twenty-sixth of March, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight.

And whereas the said amendments have been this day laid before Her Majesty in Council, the same are published in the London Gazette, in pursuance of the provisions of the said Act.

And notice is hereby given that it is lawful for the bodies or persons authorised so to do in that Act, within two months from the date of the publication of this notification, to petition Her Majesty in Council to withhold Her approval from the whole or any part of such amendments;

We, the Governing Body of St. Peter's College, Westminster, commonly called Westminster School, in virtue of the powers vested in us by the Public Schools Act, 1868, and of all other powers enabling us in that behalf, do hereby make the following further amendments in the Statute for determining and establishing the Constitution of the Governing Body, dated 7th October, 1869, and amended 28th June, 1875, and also in the body of Statutes dated 3rd November, 1871, and amended March 26th, 1878:—

Present Text.

1. In the Statute constituting the Governing Body, Clause 6, after the words "at any meeting of the Governing Body," and before the words "five shall be a quorum,"

Amendment.

Insert—

"Save as hereinafter expressly provided for the election or dismissal of the Head Master."

*Present Text.**Amendment.*

2. In the Body of Statutes:

Chapter V, before the present Clauses numbered (1.) and (2.),

Insert,

1. The Head Master of the School in future shall be appointed and may be dismissed by the Governing Body; but any motion for the appointment or dismissal of any Head Master shall require a clear majority of all the members of the Governing Body in its favour:—and if there be not such clear majority the motion shall be deemed to be lost, and of no effect.
2. Whenever it shall appear necessary to elect or dismiss a Head Master, notice of such intended election or dismissal shall be sent by post to the address of every member of the Governing Body at least fourteen days previous to the day of meeting.

3. The numbering of the Chapters of the Statutes shall be altered as follows:—

THE Queen has been graciously pleased to signify Her intention to confer the decoration of the Victoria Cross upon the undermentioned Non-Commissioned Officer of the Natal Native Contingent, whose claim has been submitted for Her Majesty's approval, for his gallant conduct during the recent operations in South Africa, as recorded against his name:—

Natal Native Contingent	Corporal Schiess	For conspicuous gallantry in the defence of Rorke's Drift Post on the night of the 22nd January, 1879, when, in spite of his having been wounded in the foot a few days previously, he greatly distinguished himself when the Garrison were repulsing, with the bayonet, a series of desperate assaults made by the Zulus, and displayed great activity and devoted gallantry throughout the defence. On one occasion when the Garrison had retired to the inner line of defence, and the Zulus occupied the wall of mealie bags which had been abandoned, he crept along the wall, without any order, to dislodge a Zulu who was shooting better than usual and succeeded in killing him, and two others, before he, the Corporal, returned to the inner defence.
