AT the Court at Windsor, the 29th day of November, 1879.

PRESENT,

The QUEEN'S Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the first session of Parliament holden in the first and second years of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "An Act to abridge the holding of benefices in plurality, and to make better provision for the residence of the clergy," it is, amongst other things enacted, "That whenever it shall appear to the Archbishop of the Province, with respect to his own diocese, and whenever it shall be represented to him by the bishop of any diocese, or by the bishops of any two dioceses, that two or more benefices, or that one or more benefice or benefices, and one or more spiritual sinecure rectory or rectories, vicarage or vicarages, in his or their diocese or dioceses, being either in the same parish or contiguous to each other, and of which the aggregate population shall not exceed one thousand five hundred persons, and the aggregate yearly value shall not exceed five hundred pounds, may, with advantage to the interests of religion, be united into one benefice, the said Archbishop of the Province shall inquire into the circumstances of the case; and if on such inquiry it shall appear to him that such union may be usefully made, and will not be of inconvenient extent, and that the patron or patrons of the said benefices, sinecure rectory or rectories, vicarage or vicarages respectively, is or are consenting thereto, such consent being signified in writing under the hands of such patron or patrons, the said Archbishop shall, six weeks before certifying such inquiry and consent to Her Majesty as herein-after directed, cause, with respect to his own diocese, a statement in writing of the facts and in other cases a copy in writing of the aforesaid representation, to be affixed on or near the principal outer door of the church, or in some public and conspicuous place in each of such benefices, sinecure rectories or vicarages with notice to any person or persons interested, that he, she, or they, may, within such six weeks show cause in writing under his, her, or their hand or hands, to the said Archbishop, against such union; and if no sufficient cause be shown within such time, the said Archbishop shall certify the inquiry and consent aforesaid to Her Majesty in Council, and thereupon it shall be lawful for Her Majesty in Council to

"make and issue an Order or Orders for uniting such benefices, sinecure rectory or rectories, vicarage or vicarages, into one benefice, with cure of souls, for ecclesiastical purposes only."

And whereas by an Act passed in the session of Parliament holden in the 13th and 14th years of the reign of Her present Majesty intituled; "An Act to amend the law relating to the holding of benefices in plurality," it is amongst other things enacted that the hereinbefore recited provision of the said Act shall extend and be applicable, notwithstanding the aggregate yearly value shall exceed five hundred pounds.

And whereas the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, pursuant to the provisions of the said Act, hath duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a certificate in writing, bearing date the tenth day of November, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine, in the words following, that is to say:—

"To the QUEEN'S Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

"We, the undersigned, Archibald Campbell, Lord Archbishop of the province of Canterbury, Primate of all England and Metropolitan, do hereby certify to your Majesty in Council:—

"That the Right Reverend William Connor, Lord Bishop of Peterborough, as Bishop of the diocese within which are situate the rectory of Aldwinckle All Saints, in the county of Northampton, and the rectory of Aldwinckle St. Peter, in the same county, having represented unto us that the said benefices being contiguous to each other and of which the aggregate population does not exceed one thousand persons and the aggregate yearly value does not exceed eight hundred pounds, might with advantage to the interests of religion be united into one benefice we enquired into the circumstances of the case.

"That on such enquiry it appeared to us that such union might be usefully made and would not be of inconvenient extent and that the Right Honourable Thomas Lyttelton Baron Lilford of Lilford Hall in the county of Northampton being the patron or person entitled to present to the said benefices if the same respectively were now vacant has signified his consent in writing to the union of the said benefices into one benefice with cure of souls for ecclesiastical purposes.

"That six weeks and upwards before certifying such inquiry and consent to your Majesty in Council we caused a copy in writing of the aforesaid representation of the said Lord Bishop to be

affixed on the principal outer door of the parish church of each of the said benefices with notice to any person or persons interested that he she or they might within such six weeks show cause in writing under his her or their hand or hands to us the said Archbishop against such union and no such cause has been shown.

"The representation and scheme of the said Lord Bishop of Peterborough our inquiry into the circumstances of the case the statement of circumstances in reply thereto the consent in writing of the patron and the copies of the representation and notice before mentioned are hereunto annexed.

"And we do hereby certify the inquiry and consent aforesaid to your Majesty in Council to the intent that your Majesty in Council may in case your Majesty in Council shall think fit so to do make and issue an Order for uniting the said benefices into one benefice with cure of souls for ecclesiastical purposes only.

"As witness our hand this tenth day of November in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine,

Now therefore Her Majesty in Council by and with the advice of Her said Council is pleased to order and it is hereby ordered that the rectory of Aldwinckle All Saints, in the county of Northampton and diocese of Peterborough, and the rectory of Aldwinckle Saint Peter, in the same county and diocese, shall be united into one benefice, with cure of souls for ecclesiastical purposes only.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the first session of the Parliament holden in the first and second years of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "An Act to abridge the holding of benefices in plurality, and to make better provision for the residence of the clergy," after reciting that "Whereas in some instances tithings, hamlets, chapelries, and other places or districts may be separated from the parishes or mother churches to which they belong with great advantage, and places altogether extra-parochial may in some instances with advantage be annexed to parishes or districts to which they are contiguous, or be constituted separate parishes for ecclesiastical purposes," it is, amongst other things, enacted "That when, with respect to his own diocese, it shall appear to the Archbishop of the Province, or when the Bishop of any diocese shall represent to the said Archbishop that any such tithing, hamlet, chapelry, place or district within the diocese of such Archbishop, or the diocese of such Bishop, as the case may be, may be advantageously separated from any parish or mother church, and either be constituted a separate benefice by itself or be united to any other parish to which it may be more conveniently annexed, or to any other adjoining tithing, hamlet, chapelry, place, or district, parochial or extra-parochial, so as to form a separate parish or benefice, or that any extra-parochial place may with advantage be annexed to any parish to which it is contiguous, or be constituted a separate parish for ecclesiastical purposes; and the said Archbishop or Bishop shall draw up a scheme in writing (the scheme of such Bishop to be transmitted to the said Archbishop for his consideration), describing the

mode in which it appears to him that the alteration may best be effected, and how the changes consequent on such alteration in respect to ecclesiastical jurisdiction, glebe lands, tithes, rent-charges, and other ecclesiastical dues, rates, and payments, and in respect to patronage and rights to pews, may be made with justice to all parties interested; and if the patron or patrons of the benefice or benefices to be affected by such alteration shall consent in writing under his or their hands to such scheme, or to such modification thereof as the said Archbishop may approve, and the said Archbishop shall, on full consideration and inquiry, be satisfied with any such scheme, or modification thereof, and shall certify the same and such consent as aforesaid, by his report to Her Majesty in Council, it shall be lawful for Her Majesty in Council to make an Order for carrying such scheme, or modification thereof, as the case may be, into effect; and such Order being registered in the registry of the diocese which the Registrar is hereby required to do, shall be forthwith binding on all persons whatsoever, including the incumbent or incumbents of the benefice or benefices to be affected thereby if he or they shall have consented thereto in writing under his or their hands."

And whereas the Lord Bishop of Hereford hath made a representation in writing to his Grace the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"To the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Archibald Campbell by Divine Providence Lord Archbishop of the Province of Canterbury.

"We the Right Reverend James Lord Bishop of Hereford do hereby represent to your Grace as follows:—

"1. That within the county of Hereford and our diocese of Hereford are the vicarage and parish church of Froome Bishop the parish whereof comprises amongst other places the township or hamlet of Eggleton the limits and boundaries whereof are well known and defined.

"2. That the population of the parish of Froome Bishop including the said township or hamlet of Eggleton is one thousand and eighty-four, the population of the said township or hamlet of Eggleton being estimated at one hundred and thirty-five.

"3. That the parish church of Froome Bishop affords accommodation for four hundred persons or thereabouts and is distant about three miles from the township or hamlet of Eggleton.

"4. That the net annual income of the said vicarage of Froome Bishop amounts to six hundred and eighty-five pounds or thereabouts.

"5. That within the said county and our diocese of Hereford are the vicarage and parish church of Stretton Grandison with the chapel of Ashperton.

"6. That the said township or hamlet of Eggleton although forming part of the said vicarage and parish of Froome Bishop is in fact close to the parish church of Stretton Grandison and the inhabitants of the said township or hamlet attend the said parish church of Stretton Grandison.

"7. That the parish of Stretton Grandison with Ashperton contains a population of six hundred and twenty-one and the churches of the said parish of Stretton Grandison with Ashperton afford accommodation for four hundred and ten persons or thereabouts.

"8. That the net annual value of the said

vicarage of Stretton Grandison with Ashperton is six hundred pounds or thereabouts.

"9. That the patronage of the said vicarage and parish church of Froome Bishop belongs to John Hopton of Canon Froome in the said county of Hereford Esquire and the patronage of the said vicarage and parish church of Stretton Grandison with Ashperton also belongs to the said John Hopton.

"10. That the Reverend Edward Machen Clerk in Holy Orders is the vicar of the said vicarage and parish church of Froome Bishop and the Reverend John Buckle Clerk in Holy Orders is the vicar of the said vicarage and parish church of Stretton Grandison with Ashperton.

"11. That it appears to us that under the provisions of the Act of Parliament passed in the session holden in the first and second years of the reign of Her present Majesty chapter 106 'to abridge the holding of benefices in plurality and to make other provisions for the residence of the clergy' the said township or hamlet of Eggleton may be advantageously separated from the said vicarage and parish of Froome Bishop and be united to the said vicarage and parish of Stretton Grandison with Ashperton for ecclesiastical purposes.

"12. That pursuant to the directions contained in the twenty-sixth section of the said Act of Parliament we have drawn up a scheme in writing appended to this representation describing the mode in which it appears to us that the alteration above proposed may best be effected and how the changes consequent on such alteration in respect of ecclesiastical jurisdiction dues rates and payments and in respect of rights to pews may be made with justice to all parties interested and we do submit the same to your Grace together with the consents in writing of the aforesaid patron of the said vicarages and parish churches and of the incumbent of the said vicarage and parish church of Froome Bishop and of the incumbent of the said vicarage and parish church of Stretton Grandison with Ashperton to the intent that your Grace may if on full consideration and inquiry you shall be satisfied with such scheme certify the same and with such consents as aforesaid by your report to Her Majesty in Council.

"Given under our hand this twenty-sixth day of September one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine.

And whereas the scheme and consents referred to in the said representation are in the words and figures following:—

"The SCHEME above referred to:

"1. That the township or hamlet of Eggleton at present belonging to and forming part of the vicarage and parish of Froome Bishop in the county and diocese of Hereford shall be separated from the said vicarage and parish and be united to and be deemed part of the vicarage and parish of Stretton Grandison with Ashperton in the said county and diocese for ecclesiastical purposes.

"2. That the said township or hamlet of Eggleton shall be subject to the same ecclesiastical jurisdiction as the said vicarage and parish of Stretton Grandison with Ashperton and the vicar of the said vicarage and parish church of Stretton Grandison with Ashperton shall have exclusive cure of souls within the limits of the same township or hamlet.

"3. That all fees and other ecclesiastical dues and payments for marriages churchings burials and other ecclesiastical offices solemnized and performed in respect of persons belonging to the said township or hamlet of Eggleton shall henceforth

belong to the vicar of the said vicarage and parish church of Stretton Grandison with Ashperton.

"4. That the parishioners of and residing in the said township or hamlet of Eggleton shall not hereafter be entitled to accommodation in the said parish church of Froome Bishop but shall be entitled in common with the inhabitants of the said parish of Stretton Grandison with Ashperton to accommodation in the parish church of Stretton Grandison with Ashperton and shall be exempted from all liability to repair the parish church of Froome Bishop but shall be liable (subject to the provisions of the Compulsory Church Rates Abolition Act, 1868) to the repair of the said parish church of Stretton Grandison with Ashperton.

"CONSENTS.

"We John Hopton of Canon Froome Court in the county of Hereford Esquire the patron or person entitled to present or nominate to the vicarage of Froome Bishop in the county and diocese of Hereford in case the same was now vacant and being also the patron or person entitled to present or nominate to the vicarage of Stretton Grandison with Ashperton in the same county and diocese in case the same was now vacant the Reverend Edward Machen Clerk in Holy Orders the vicar of the said vicarage and parish church of Froome Bishop and the Reverend John Buckle Clerk in Holy Orders the vicar of the said vicarage and parish church of Stretton Grandison with Ashperton do hereby signify our consents to the scheme above proposed and set forth and to every matter and thing therein contained.

"In witness whereof we have hereunto respectively set our hands this twenty-sixth day of September one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine.

And whereas the said Lord Bishop hath transmitted the said scheme to the said Lord Archbishop, together with the said consents.

And whereas the said Lord Archbishop being on full consideration and enquiry satisfied with such scheme hath certified the same and such consents as aforesaid by his report to Her Majesty in Council dated the 4th day of November 1879, which report is in the words and figures following:—

"To the QUEEN'S Most Excellent Majesty in Council:

"We the undersigned Archibald Campbell Lord Archbishop of the Province of Canterbury, do hereby report to your Majesty in Council that the Right Reverend James Lord Bishop of Hereford has represented unto us (amongst other things):

"That within the county of Hereford and diocese of Hereford are the vicarage and parish church of Froome Bishop the parish whereof contains amongst other places the township or hamlet of Eggleton which is distant about three miles from the parish church of Froome Bishop.

"That within the said county and diocese are the vicarage and parish church of Stretton Grandison with the chapel of Ashperton.

"That the said township or hamlet of Eggleton is close to the parish church of Stretton Grandison.

"That it appears to the said Lord Bishop that the said township or hamlet of Eggleton may be advantageously separated from the said vicarage and parish of Froome Bishop and be united to the said vicarage and parish of Stretton Grandison with Ashperton for ecclesiastical purposes.

"That the said Lord Bishop has drawn up a scheme in writing describing the mode in which it appears to him the proposed alteration may best be effected and how the changes consequent upon such alteration in respect of ecclesiastical jurisdiction dues rates and payments and in respect of rights to pews may be made with justice to all parties interested which scheme together with the consents thereto in writing of the patron and incumbents of the benefices to be affected has been transmitted by the said Lord Bishop to us for our consideration.

"The representation and scheme of the said Lord Bishop and the consents before referred to are hereunto annexed.

"And we the said Archbishop being on full consideration and enquiry satisfied with the said scheme do hereby pursuant to the Act of the first and second years of your Majesty's reign chapter 106, certify the same and such consents as aforesaid to your Majesty in Council to the intent that your Majesty in Council may in case your Majesty in Council shall think fit so to do make and issue an Order for carrying the said scheme into effect.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the first session of the Parliament holden in the first and second years of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "An Act to abridge the holding of benefices in plurality, and to make better provision for the residence of the clergy," after reciting that "Whereas, in some instances, tithings, hamlets, chapeltries, and other places or districts may be separated from the parishes or mother churches to which they belong with great advantage, and places altogether extra-parochial may in some instances with advantage be annexed to parishes or districts to which they are contiguous, or be constituted separate parishes for ecclesiastical purposes," it is, amongst other things, enacted, "That when, with respect to his own diocese, it shall appear to the Archbishop of the Province, or when the bishop of any diocese shall represent to the said archbishop that any such tithing, hamlet, chapelry, place, or district within the diocese of such archbishop, or the diocese of such bishop, as the case may be, may be advantageously separated from any parish or mother church, and either be constituted a separate benefice by itself or be united to any other parish to which it may be more conveniently annexed, or to any other adjoining tithing, hamlet, chapelry, place, or district, parochial or extra-parochial, so as to form a separate parish or benefice, or that any extra-parochial place may with advantage be annexed to any parish to which it is contiguous, or be constituted a separate parish for ecclesiastical purposes; and the said archbishop or bishop shall draw up a scheme, in writing (the scheme of such bishop to be transmitted to the said archbishop for his consideration), describing the

mode in which it appears to him that the alteration may best be effected, and how the changes consequent on such alteration in respect to ecclesiastical jurisdiction, glebe lands, tithes, rent-charges, and other ecclesiastical dues, rates, and payments, and in respect to patronage and rights to pews, may be made with justice to all parties interested; and if the patron or patrons of the benefice or benefices to be affected by such alteration shall consent, in writing, under his or their hands to such scheme, or to such modification thereof as the said Archbishop may approve, and the said Archbishop shall, on full consideration and inquiry, be satisfied with any such scheme, or modification thereof, and shall certify the same and such consent as aforesaid, by his report to Her Majesty in Council, it shall be lawful for Her Majesty in Council to make an Order for carrying such scheme, or modification thereof, as the case may be, into effect."

And whereas by another Act of Parliament passed in the second and third years of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "An Act to make better provision for the assignment of Ecclesiastical Districts to Churches or Chapels augmented by the Governors of the Bounty of Queen Anne; and for other purposes," it is amongst other things, further enacted "That when, by any Order of Her Majesty in Council as aforesaid, a separate parish for ecclesiastical purposes is constituted, the same shall, on registration thereof, and with the consent, in writing, of the incumbent or incumbents of the benefice or benefices to be thereby affected, become a perpetual curacy and benefice, and the minister thereof, duly nominated and licensed thereto, and his successors, shall be a body politic and corporate, with perpetual succession, and may receive and take to himself and his successors all such lands, tenements, tithes, rent-charges, and hereditaments as shall be granted unto him or them, and such perpetual curate shall thenceforth have, within the limits of the district parish formed under the Church Building Acts, for the church of such perpetual curacy sole and exclusive cure of souls, and shall not in anywise be subject to the control or interference of the incumbent or incumbents of the benefice or benefices to be affected by such Order, if he or they shall have consented to such Order as aforesaid."

And whereas the Lord Bishop of St. Davids hath made a representation in writing to his Grace the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury in the words and figures following that is to say:—

"To the Most Reverend Archibald Campbell Lord Archbishop of the Province of Canterbury.

"I the Right Reverend William Basil Lord Bishop of Saint Davids do hereby represent to your Grace that there is in the county of Carmarthen and my diocese of Saint Davids the perpetual curacy of Llanstephan with the chapelry of Llangunnock otherwise Llangynog annexed also in the same county and diocese.

"That Llanstephan is a distinct and separate civil parish defined by well known metes and bounds, the population whereof at the census of 1871 was 967.

"That Llangunnock otherwise Llangynog is also a separate and distinct civil parish defined by well known metes and bounds and having a population which at the census of 1871 was 646.

"That the parish church of the benefice is situate in the village of Llanstephan at the

southern end of the parish of Llanstephan and there is a chapel of ease or church known as Llangynog in the parish of Llangunnoch otherwise Llangynog and distant from the parish church of Llanstephan two miles or thereabouts.

"That the present net annual value of the said benefice of Llanstephan with Llangunnoch is one hundred and fifty-three pounds arising from farms lands and houses in the counties of Carmarthen and Pembroke, a yearly stipend of ten pounds payable by the impropiators, and by the interest of a sum of four hundred and twenty-six pounds three shillings and three pence Consols.

"That it appears to me that the whole of the said civil parish of Llangunnoch otherwise Llangynog may under the provisions of the Acts of Parliament of the first and second years of Her present Majesty chapter 106 and the second and third years of Her said Majesty chapter 49 be advantageously separated for ecclesiastical purposes from the said civil parish of Llanstephan and be made a separate and distinct ecclesiastical parish or benefice of which the said chapel or church of Llangunnoch otherwise Llangynog shall be the parish church.

"That it is proposed that such intended benefice when created shall be endowed without applying to it any part of the income or endowment including the said stipend of ten pounds of the benefice of Llanstephan in the following way:—

"That pursuant to the direction contained in the twenty-sixth section of the said first-mentioned Act of Parliament I the said Lord Bishop have drawn up a scheme in writing appended to this representation describing the mode in which it appears to me that the alteration above proposed may be best effected and how the changes consequent on such alterations in respect to ecclesiastical jurisdiction glebe lands tithe rent-charges and other ecclesiastical dues rates and payments and in respect to patronage and rights to pews may be made with justice to all parties interested. And I do submit the same to your Grace together with the consents in writing of Llewellyn Lloyd Lloyd and Walter Owen Price the patrons of the said perpetual curacy of Llanstephan with Llangunnoch otherwise Llangynog and of the Reverend Benjamin Evans the present incumbent of such benefice that your Grace may if on full consideration and inquiry you shall be satisfied with the said scheme certify the same and such consents to Her Majesty in Council.

And whereas the scheme and consents referred

to in the said representation are in the words following:—

"SCHEME.

"That the said civil parish of Llangunnoch otherwise Llangynog be separated for ecclesiastical purposes from the civil parish of Llanstephan to which the former parish now belongs for ecclesiastical purposes and that the said civil parish of Llangunnoch otherwise Llangynog be constituted a separate parish for ecclesiastical purposes and a perpetual curacy of which the chapel or church within the limits of the said civil parish of Llangunnoch otherwise Llangynog and known as Llangynog Church shall be the parish church.

"That such perpetual curacy shall be subject to the same ecclesiastical jurisdiction as the said perpetual curacy of Llanstephan with Llangunnoch otherwise Llangynog is now subject to.

"That baptisms, churchings, marriages, and burials, in respect of the inhabitants of the parish so to be constituted shall hereafter be performed in the church of Llangunnoch otherwise Llangynog and that the fees for all such offices and all ecclesiastical dues offerings and other emoluments arising from or in respect of the said parish and benefice and usually payable to the incumbent of a benefice shall belong to the incumbent of the said intended perpetual curacy or benefice of Llangunnoch otherwise Llangynog saving always all the rights of the impropiators of the said benefice.

"That the incumbent of the said intended perpetual curacy of Llangunnoch otherwise Llangynog shall have exclusive cure of souls within the limits of the parish thereof.

"That the right of nominating a minister to the church of such perpetual curacy and benefice shall be for ever vested and be in the said Llewellyn Lloyd Lloyd and Walter Owen Price and their heirs executors administrators or assigns.

"That the inhabitants of the parish so to be constituted shall be exonerated from all liability to repair the parish church of Llanstephan or any other church or chapel now or hereafter to be erected in the said parish of Llanstephan but shall be exclusively liable to the repairs of the said church at Llangunnoch otherwise Llangynog or any other church hereafter erected in substitution for that church.

"CONSENTS.

"We Llewellyn Lloyd Lloyd of Glangwilly in the parish of Llanallawddog in the county of Carmarthen Esquire and Walter Owen Price of Castle Pigyn in the parish of Abergwili, in the same county, Gentleman, being the patrons or persons entitled to present to the perpetual curacy of Llanstephan with Llangunnoch otherwise Llangynog annexed in the county of Carmarthen if the same were now vacant, and I the Reverend Benjamin Evans, of Llanstephan in the county of Carmarthen the perpetual curate of such perpetual curacy do hereby respectively signify to your Grace our consent to the scheme above proposed for separating the civil parish of Llangunnoch otherwise Llangynog from the civil parish of Llanstephan and for constituting the same a separate benefice and a perpetual curacy.

“To the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Archibald Campbell Lord Archbishop of Canterbury Primate of All England and Metropolitan.

“I the Right Reverend William Basil Lord Bishop of Saint Davids do hereby represent to your Grace that there is in the county of Radnor and my diocese of Saint Davids the vicarage of Llowes with the perpetual curacy or chapelry of Llanddewifach also in the same county and diocese.

“That Llowes is a distinct and separate civil parish defined by well known metes and bounds the population whereof at the last census was three hundred and twenty-one.

“That Llanddewifach is also a separate and distinct civil parish defined by well known metes and bounds and having a population which at the last census was one hundred and twenty-eight.

“That the churches of Llowes and Llanddewifach are about five miles distant from each other by the nearest road which lies over a high and bleak range of hills.

“That the gross annual value of the said benefice of Llowes with Llanddewifach is two hundred and ninety-eight pounds arising from commuted tithe rent-charge, that of the parish of Llowes being one hundred and seventy pounds, and that of the parish of Llanddewifach one hundred and twenty-eight pounds and the said benefice has no residence glebe land or other source of income save surplice fees.

“That it appears to me that the whole of the said civil parish of Llowes may under the provisions of the Acts of Parliament of the first and second years of Her present Majesty chapter one hundred and six and the second and third years of Her said Majesty chapter forty-nine be advantageously separated for ecclesiastical purposes from the said civil parish of Llanddewifach and each be made a separate and distinct ecclesiastical parish or benefice of which the said respective churches shall be the parish churches respectively.

“That I am informed that the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have undertaken to augment the benefice of Llowes if and when the same shall be disunited from Llanddewifach by an annual grant of eighty pounds and a capital sum of one thousand and five hundred pounds for building a house of residence.

“That pursuant to the direction contained in the twenty-sixth section of the said first mentioned Act of Parliament I the said Lord Bishop have drawn up a plan in writing appended to this representation describing the mode in which it appears to me that the alteration above proposed may be best effected and how the changes consequent on such alteration in respect to ecclesiastical jurisdiction glebe lands, tithes, rent-charges, and other ecclesiastical dues rates and payments and in respect to patronage and rights to pews may be made with justice to all parties interested and I do submit the same to your Grace together with the consents in writing of the Venerable Henry de Winton Archdeacon of the Archdeaconry of Brecon the patron, as Archdeacon, of the said present benefice of Llowes with Llanddewifach that your Grace may if on full consideration and enquiry you shall be satisfied with the said scheme, certify the same and such consents to Her Majesty in Council.

“That Llowes be a vicarage of which the church of Llowes shall be the parish church.

“That the respective incumbents of the said intended respective vicarage and perpetual curacy shall have exclusive cure of souls within the limits of his said respective parish.

“That the present endowments of the existing benefice of Llowes with Llanddewifach be apportioned as follows (that is to say):—The tithe rent-charge of the parish of Llowes now payable to the vicar or incumbent of the existing benefice be payable to the vicar of the said proposed vicarage of Llowes, and the tithe rent-charge of the parish of Llanddewifach now payable to the vicar of the said existing benefice be payable to the incumbent of the said proposed perpetual curacy of Llanddewifach.

“That the right of nominating a minister to each of the churches of such vicarage and perpetual curacy shall be for ever vested and be in the Archdeacon of the Archdeaconry of Brecon aforesaid (the patron of the said present benefice of Llowes with Llanddewifach) and his successors for the time being archdeacons of the said archdeaconry.

“That the inhabitants of each of the respective parishes to be constituted shall be exonerated from all liabilities to repair the parish church of the other of such parishes or any other chapel or church now or hereafter to be erected in such other parish respectively but shall be exclusively liable to the repairs of the said church in their own respective parish or any other church hereafter erected in substitution for that church.

the county of Radnor, and vicar of such vicarage of Llowes with Llanddewifach, do hereby respectively signify to your Grace our consent to the scheme above proposed for separating the civil parish of Llowes from the civil parish of Llanddewifach and for constituting such two parishes respectively separate benefices.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the thirty-third and thirty-fourth years of Her Majesty, chapter thirty-nine, and of the Acts therein mentioned, duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the seventh day of August, in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine, in the words following, that is to say:—

"We the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England in pursuance of the Act of the thirty-third and thirty-fourth years of your Majesty chapter thirty-nine, and of the Acts therein mentioned, have prepared and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council the following scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the church and cure of Bourton otherwise Flax Bourton in the county of Somerset and diocese of Bath and Wells (which said church and cure are hereinafter called 'the benefice of Flax Bourton') which said benefice of Flax Bourton was sometime a chapelry within the parish of Nailsea in the said county and diocese, but has been separated from that parish and has been made a separate parish, by an Order of your Majesty in Council made under the Act of the first and second years of your Majesty chapter one hundred and six and bearing date the nineteenth day of June in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-four and by an instrument under the common seal of us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England bearing date the twenty-sixth day of July in the year one thousand eight hundred and sixty-six has been declared to be a rectory.

"Whereas the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Flax Bourton was by the said Order vested in and still remains vested in the rector or incumbent for the time being of the said parish of Nailsea, as such rector or incumbent.

"And whereas Antony Gibbs, of Tynesfield in the said county of Somerset Esquire has to our satisfaction made a certain benefaction in augmentation of the endowment of the said benefice of Flax Bourton upon the understanding and condition that a transfer of the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the same benefice from the rector or incumbent for the time being of the said parish of Nailsea (in whom as such rector or incumbent the same is now vested as aforesaid) to him the said Antony Gibbs and his heirs and assigns shall be effected by the agency of us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England.

"And whereas the Reverend John Johnson, Clerk in Holy Orders, now rector or incumbent of the parish of Nailsea aforesaid and as such

rector or incumbent, patron of the said benefice of Flax Bourton as aforesaid is willing that the said advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Flax Bourton should be transferred to the said Antony Gibbs and his heirs and assigns as aforesaid, and in testimony of such his willingness, and in order to effect the same transfer has executed this scheme as hereinafter is mentioned.

"And whereas John Frederick Thorpe of Hornhill Vicarage, Faversham in the county of Kent, Clerk in Holy Orders, William Frederick Langworthy of the city and county of Bristol Gentleman and Thomas Johnson of Llanely in the county of Carmarthen, Gentleman are the patrons of the rectory of the said parish of Nailsea and are consenting to the said proposed transfer, and have executed this scheme accordingly as hereinafter mentioned, and the Right Honourable and Right Reverend Arthur Charles Bishop of the said diocese of Bath and Wells is consenting as diocesan to the same proposed transfer, and in token of such his consent (which consent is by the Acts in the hereinbefore mentioned Act mentioned or by some or one of them made necessary) he the said Bishop has also executed this scheme as hereinafter mentioned.

And whereas it appears to us that the transfer of the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Flax Bourton which is hereinbefore mentioned and hereinafter recommended and proposed will under and in consequence of the circumstances hereinbefore set forth tend to make better provision for the cure of souls in the district or parish in or in respect of which the same right of patronage or advowson arises or exists that is to say in the parish of Flax Bourton aforesaid.

Now therefore with the consent of the said Arthur Charles acting as Bishop of the said diocese of Bath and Wells and with the consent of the said John Frederick Thorpe, William Frederick Langworthy and Thomas Johnson acting as patrons as aforesaid of the rectory of the said parish of Nailsea and with the consent of the said John Johnson now rector or incumbent of the said parish of Nailsea and as such rector or incumbent patron as aforesaid of the said benefice of Flax Bourton (in testimony of which consent he the said Arthur Charles Bishop of Bath and Wells has hereunto set his hand and his episcopal seal and they the said, John Frederick Thorpe William Frederick Langworthy and Thomas Johnson and John Johnson have hereunto set their respective hands and seals) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order, the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Flax Bourton now vested in him the said John Johnson as such rector or incumbent as aforesaid shall be transferred from him the said John Johnson and from his successors rectors or incumbents of the said parish of Nailsea to the said Antony Gibbs and his heirs and assigns and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Antony Gibbs and his heirs and assigns for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any

of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of either of them or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Bath and Wells.

"We the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England in pursuance of the Act of the eighth and ninth years of your Majesty, chapter seventy, of the Act of the fourteenth and fifteenth years of your Majesty, chapter ninety-seven, of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of your Majesty, chapter fifty-five; and of the Act of the thirty-fourth and thirty-fifth years of your Majesty, chapter eighty-two, have prepared and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council the following representation as to the assignment of a consolidated chapelry to the consecrated church of Saint Lleian situate at Gorslâs in the parish of Llanarthney in the county of Carmarthen and in the diocese of Saint David's.

"Whereas at certain extremities of the said parish of Llanarthney, of the parish of Llandebie, in the said county of Carmarthen, and in the said diocese of Saint David's, and of the parish or parochial chapelry of Llanvihangel Aberbythych in the same county and diocese which said extremities lie contiguous one to another and are described in the schedule hereunder written there is collected together a population which is situate at a distance from the several churches of such respective cures.

"And whereas it appears to us to be expedient that such contiguous portions of the said parish of Llanarthney, of the said parish of Llandebie, and of the said parish or parochial chapelry of Llanvihangel Aberbythych should be formed into a consolidated chapelry for all ecclesiastical purposes and that the same should be assigned to the said church of Saint Lleian situate at Gorslâs as aforesaid.

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend William Basil, Bishop of the said diocese of Saint David's, as such Bishop and also as the patron in right of his See, both of the vicarage of the said parish of Llanarthney, and of

the vicarage of the said parish of Llandebie, and with the consent of the Right Honourable John Frederick Vaughan Earl of Cawdor, the patron of the vicarage of the said parish or parochial chapelry of Llanvihangel Aberbythych (in testimony whereof they the said consenting parties have respectively signed and sealed this representation) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England humbly represent, that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all those contiguous portions of the said parish of Llanarthney, of the said parish of Llandebie, and of the said parish or parochial chapelry of Llanvihangel Aberbythych, which are described in the schedule hereunder written, all which portions together with the boundaries thereof are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be united and formed into one consolidated chapelry for the said church of Saint Lleian situate at Gorslås as aforesaid and that the same should be named 'The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Lleian, Gorslås.'

"We therefore humbly pray that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your Royal consideration, and to make such Order in respect thereto as to your Majesty in your Royal wisdom shall seem meet.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Lleian, Gorslås, being:—

"All those contiguous portions of the parish of Llanarthney, of the parish of Llandebie, and of the parish or parochial chapelry of Llanvihangel Aberbythych, all in the county of Carmarthen and in the diocese of Saint David's which are comprised with in and are bounded by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the parish of Llanddarog in the said county and diocese from the parish of Llanarthney aforesaid at the point where the stream called or known as the Dulais is crossed by the road leading from Maesdulais Mill past the northern side of the Wick Rock and past the houses called or known respectively as Heolddu, Myrtle Hill, Llidiart-mawr, and Ffynnon Wen, to the house called or known as Hendre-faes, and extending thence that is from the said parish boundary generally north-eastward along the middle of the said road for a distance of nearly three miles and a quarter to the point at or near to the house called or known as Hendre-faes as aforesaid upon the boundary which divides the said parish of Llanarthney from the parish or parochial chapelry of Llanvihangel Aberbythych at which point the same road joins the road leading from Dryslwyn past the houses called or known respectively as Hendre-faes as aforesaid Cwmbach, Llynnyfran, Castellrhingyll, Pant-y-clai, Brynmelyn, Pen-y-groes, Pant-y-blodau, and Pen-y-bont, to Capel Hendre and extending thence, that is, from the last-mentioned parish boundary first generally south-eastward and then southward along the middle of the last-described road for a distance of about three miles and fifty chains (thereby crossing the boundary which divides the said parish or parochial chapelry of Llanvihangel Aberbythych from the parish of Llandebie aforesaid) to the point at the house called or known as Waterloo where the said last-described road joins the road leading from Capel Hendre past the houses called or known respectively as Greenhill and Gorsgorch Colliery to Gorslås and extending thence generally north-westward along the middle of the last-described road for a distance of thirty chains or thereabouts to its junction with the roadway

leading to Thornhill House, and extending thence south-westward along the middle of the last-described roadway for a distance of twenty chains or thereabouts to the point where the same roadway bends sharply towards the north-west and continuing thence still south-westward and in a direct line for a distance of thirteen and a half chains or thereabouts to the point where the road leading from the house called or known as Morfa otherwise called or known as Pen-y-rheol to the house called or known as Rhyd-y-ffynon is joined by the road leading past the house called or known as Cwm-rhos-ddu towards Carmarthen and extending thence that is from the last-described point of junction first westward and then north-westward along the middle of the last-described road for a distance of thirty-four chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said parish of Llandebie from the parish or parochial chapelry of Llannon, in the county and diocese aforesaid and extending thence northward along the last-mentioned boundary for a distance of twenty-seven and a half chains or thereabouts to its junction with the boundary dividing the said parish or parochial chapelry of Llannon from the parish of Llanarthney aforesaid and extending thence first north-westward, then westward, and then south-westward along the last-described boundary for a distance of nearly four miles and a half (thereby passing along the valley called or known as Cwm Gwendraeth-fawr) to the point where the same boundary joins the boundary dividing the said parish of Llanarthney from the parish of Llanddarog aforesaid and extending thence first generally north-eastward and then generally northward along the last-described boundary for a distance of nearly two miles and three quarters to the first-described point where the stream called or known as the Dula's, is crossed by the road leading from Maesdulais Mill to Hendre-faes past the northern side of the Wick Rock and past the houses called or known respectively as Heolddu, Myrtle Hill, Llidiart-mawr, and Ffynnon Wen to the house called or known as Hendre-faes as aforesaid at which point the said imaginary line commenced."

And whereas the said representation has been approved by Her Majesty in Council: now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Saint David's.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the fifty-ninth year of His Majesty King George the Third, chapter one hundred and thirty-four; of the Act of the second and third years of your Majesty, chapter forty-nine; and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of your Majesty, chapter fifty-five, have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following representation as to the assignment of a district chapelry to the consecrated church of Saint Andrew situate at Llwynypia in the parish or parochial chapelry of Ystradyfodwg, in the county of Glamorgan, and in the diocese of Llandaff.

"Whereas it appears to us to be expedient that that a district chapelry should be assigned to the said church of Saint Andrew situate at Llwynypia as aforesaid.

"Now therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Alfred, Bishop of the said diocese of Llandaff (testified by his having signed and sealed this representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent, that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all that part of the said parish or parochial chapelry of Ystradyfodwg which is described in the schedule hereunder written, all which part, together with the boundaries thereof, is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be assigned as a district chapelry to the said church of Saint Andrew situate at Llwynypia as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The District Chapelry of Saint Andrew Llwynypia.'

"And with the like consent of the said Alfred Bishop of the said diocese of Llandaff (testified as, aforesaid), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, further represent that it appears to us to be expedient that banns of matrimony should be published, and that marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials, should be solemnized or performed at the said church of Saint Andrew situate at Llwynypia as aforesaid, and that the fees to be received in respect of the publication of such banns and of the solemnization or performance of the said offices should be paid and belong to the minister of the same church for the time being: Provided always, that so long as the Reverend William Lewis, Clerk in Holy Orders, the present Incumbent of the said parish or parochial chapelry of Ystradyfodwg, shall continue to be such Incumbent, all the fees which may be received in respect of such publication, solemnization or performance of the said offices at the said church of Saint Andrew situate at Llwynypia as aforesaid, shall be paid over by the minister thereof to the said William Lewis, and provided also that nothing herein contained shall be construed as expressing any intention on the part of us the said Commissioners to concur in or approve the taking of any fee for the performance of the said office of baptism or for the registration thereof.

"We, therefore, humbly pray that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your Royal consideration and to make such Order with respect thereto as to your Majesty, in your Royal wisdom, shall seem meet.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The District Chapelry of Saint Andrew Llwynypia, being:—

"All that part of the parish or parochial chapelry of Ystradyfodwg in the county of Glamorgan and in the diocese of Llandaff which is bounded on the south-west by the parish of

Llandyfodwg on the south by the parish of Llantrisant, on the east and on the north-east by the parish or parochial chapelry of Llanwonno, all in the county and diocese aforesaid, and upon the remaining side, that is to say on the north by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said parish or parochial chapelry of Llanwonno from the parish or parochial chapelry of Ystradyfodwg aforesaid at the point at or near to Pont-y-gwaith, where the Rhondda-fach River is joined by the stream called or known as Nant-cwm-waun-newydd, and extending thence first westward and then north-westward along the middle of the last-named stream for a distance of thirty-five chains or thereabouts to the point where it is crossed by the road leading from Pont-y-gwaith aforesaid past the house called or known as Pen Rhys-ap-Tewdwr towards Ystradyfodwg and extending thence first north-westward and then south-westward along the middle of the said road for a distance of fifteen chains or thereabouts to its junction with the roadway leading to the house called or known as Penrhys-isaf and with the footpath leading past the well called or known as Ffynnon-fair towards Pont Rhondda and continuing thence still south-westward along the middle of the last-described footpath for a distance of twenty-four chains or thereabouts to the point a little to the north-west of Pont Rhondda Cottage where the same footpath joins the road leading from Trealaw towards Ystradyfodwg aforesaid at which point the last-mentioned road abuts upon the turnpike-road leading from Ystradyfodwg to Llwynypia, and continuing thence, that is from the last-described point of junction, still south-westward to and along the middle of the said turnpike-road for a distance of five and a half chains or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge called or known as Pont Rhondda which carries the same turnpike-road over the Rhondda Fawr River and continuing thence first westward and then southward along the middle of the same turnpike-road for a further distance of thirteen chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the south-eastern end of the fence which divides the close numbered 979 upon the map of the ordnance survey of the said parish or parochial chapelry of Ystradyfodwg on the $\frac{1}{2500}$ scale and published in the year 1877, and upon the map hereunto annexed, from the close numbered 978 upon the same maps and extending thence that is, from the last-described point in the middle of the turnpike-road aforesaid, north-westward to and along the said fence for a distance of four chains or thereabouts to the north-western end of the same fence on the eastern side of the line of the Rhondda Branch of the Taff Vale Railway and extending thence south-westward and in a direct line diagonally across the said branch line of railway to a point on the western side of the same branch line of railway at the eastern end of the fence dividing the close numbered 968 upon the said maps from the close numbered 970 upon the same maps and continuing thence still south-westward for a distance of seventeen chains or thereabouts along the last-described fence, and along the line of fences dividing the closes numbered respectively 969 and 966 upon the said maps from the closes numbered respectively 970 aforesaid and 965, upon the same maps, to the point where the said line of fences joins the fence which divides the said close numbered 966 from that part of the mountain which is called or known as Mynydd Llwynypia and which is numbered 963 upon the maps aforesaid, and extending thence generally north-westward for a distance of thirteen chains

or thereabouts along the last-mentioned fence and along the fence which divides the said part of the mountain from the wood called or known as Craig Pont Rhondda and numbered 962 upon the said maps to the point where the last-described fence joins the wall or fence dividing that part of the mountain which is called or known as Mynydd Llwynypia and which is numbered 963 as aforesaid from that part of the mountain which is called or known as Mynydd-y-Gelli, and which is numbered 920 upon the same maps and extending thence first south-westward then southward and then again south-westward along the last-described wall or fence for a distance of forty-eight chains or thereabouts to its junction with the wall or fence which divides the closes numbered respectively 919 918 917 and 915 upon the said maps from that part of the mountain which is called or known as Mynydd-y-Gelli as aforesaid and extending thence first northward then westward and then north-westward along the last-described wall or fence for a distance of fifty-eight chains or thereabouts to its junction with the wall or fence which divides the said close numbered 915 from that part of the mountain which is called or known as Mynydd Bwlfa and which is numbered 858 upon the maps aforesaid, and extending thence south-westward along the last-described wall or fence for a distance of eighteen and a half chains or thereabouts to its junction with the ditch or water-course which divides the last-described part of the mountain which is numbered 858 as aforesaid, from that part of the mountain which is numbered 1111 upon the said maps (and which is called or known in one part as Mynydd Ffynnon Dwym and in another part as Gwyneb-yr-Haul) and from that other part of the mountain which is called or known as Mynydd William Meyrick and which is numbered 1117 upon the same maps, and extending thence, that is from the last-described point of junction first south-westward and then generally westward along the last-described ditch or watercourse for a distance of one mile and thirty-two chains or thereabouts to a point upon the boundary which divides the said parish or parochial chapelry of Ystradyfodwg from the parish of Llandyfodwg aforesaid such point being at a distance of half a mile or thereabouts (measured along the last-mentioned parish boundary) to the north-west of the point called or known as Garn Fawr."

And whereas the said representation has been approved by Her Majesty in Council: now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Llandaff.

in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act of the sixth and seventh years of your Majesty chapter thirty-seven, sections six and eight, have prepared and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council the following scheme for authorizing the sale and disposal of certain property which was formerly vested in the Fen Chapels Trustees and is now vested in us.

"Whereas under and by virtue of "The Ecclesiastical Commissioners (Fen Chapels) Act 1875" certain lands and hereditaments theretofore vested in the trustees constituted under the several Acts specified in the schedule to the said Act were transferred to and vested in us subject to the provisions of the same Act, and of the Acts applicable to other hereditaments and property vested in us, so far as they are not inconsistent with the same Act.

"And whereas the lands and hereditaments so vested in us as aforesaid are not subject to any outstanding beneficial lease or grant, but are now in possession, but some portions thereof, on account of their character or situation, are unsuitable or inconvenient to be held or applied for the purposes for which estates vested in us are applicable under the Acts by which our proceedings are governed.

"And whereas with a view to the advantageous appropriation of the same, or of the proceeds thereof, for the ultimate improvement of our common fund, it is expedient that the said lands and hereditaments, or such part or parts thereof as we shall at any time, and from time to time think fit, should be sold or disposed of, and accordingly that we should be empowered to sell or dispose of our interest in such lands and hereditaments or in any part or parts thereof, in such manner as shall appear to us advisable.

"Now therefore, we humbly recommend and propose that we may be authorized and empowered by instrument or instruments in writing duly executed according to law from time to time to sell or dispose of and duly to convey according to the provisions of the said Act all or any of the said lands and hereditaments so vested in us as aforesaid, with their appurtenances, and all our estate right title and interest therein or in any part or parts thereof, unto and to the use of any person or persons desirous or willing to purchase the same and his or their heirs executors administrators or assigns, or otherwise as he or they shall direct or appoint, and for such consideration as shall upon due calculation and inquiry appear to us to be just and reasonable, it being our intention to invest the proceeds of such sale from time to time as occasion may arise in the purchase of other lands, tithes, rent-charges, tenements or hereditaments, or of some estate or interest therein convenient to be held by us for the purposes of the Acts by which our proceedings are governed as aforesaid, and in the meantime to invest the said proceeds in some Government or Parliamentary stock or other public securities in England.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any other Act of Parliament.

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said

Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Act; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Lincoln.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her Majesty, chapter thirty-seven, duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the sixth day of November, in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“We the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England in pursuance of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of your Majesty chapter thirty-seven have prepared and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council the following scheme for constituting a separate district for spiritual purposes out of the parochial chapelry of Daresbury in the parish of Runcorn and in the county of Chester and in the diocese of Chester and out of the particular district or new parish of Saint Thomas Stockton Heath also in the county and diocese aforesaid.

“Whereas it has been made to appear to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular portions of the said parochial chapelry of Daresbury in the parish of Runcorn aforesaid and of the said particular district or new parish of Saint Thomas Stockton Heath which are hereinafter mentioned and described should be constituted a separate district in manner hereinafter set forth.

“And whereas there is not at present within the limits of the said proposed separate district any consecrated church or chapel in use for the purposes of Divine worship.

“And whereas by a certain deed of indenture bearing date on or about the fifth day of August in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine and made or expressed to be made under the authority of the New Parishes Acts 1843 1844 and 1856 or of some or one of them and being under the hand and seal of Sir Gilbert Greenall of Walton Hall in the said county of Chester, Baronet, a Member of the Commons House of Parliament and being also under the common seal of us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England (which deed is intended to be enrolled in the Chancery Division of your Majesty's High Court of Justice) the said Gilbert Greenall did appoint grant and convey unto us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners as and for an endowment for the said proposed district one perpetual clear yearly rent-charge of one hundred and fifty pounds sterling charged upon certain lands and hereditaments in the township of Higher Walton in the said parish of Runcorn.

“And whereas the said perpetual yearly rent-charge has been so appointed granted and conveyed as aforesaid upon the understanding that (such arrangement appearing to us to be expedient) the whole right of patronage of the said proposed district and when such district shall have become a new parish under the provisions of

the above-mentioned Acts then of the said new parish and of the nomination of the minister or incumbent thereof should be assigned in the manner hereinafter recommended and proposed.

“Now therefore with the consent of the Right Reverend William Bishop of the said diocese of Chester (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners humbly recommend and propose that all those portions of the said parochial chapelry of Daresbury in the parish of Runcorn aforesaid and of the said particular district or new parish of Saint Thomas Stockton Heath which are described in the schedule hereunder written all which portions together with the boundaries thereof are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed shall upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme become and be constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes and that the same shall be named ‘The District of Saint John the Evangelist Walton.

“And we further recommend and propose that the whole right of patronage of the said district of Saint John the Evangelist Walton and so soon as the said district shall have become a new parish as aforesaid then of the said new parish and of the nomination of the minister or incumbent thereof shall without any assurance in the law other than this scheme and any duly gazetted Order of your Majesty in Council ratifying the same and upon and from the day of the date of the publication of such Order in the London Gazette as aforesaid be assigned to and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be fully and freely exercised by the said Gilbert Greenall his heirs and assigns for ever.

“And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Act of the sixth and seventh years of your Majesty chapter thirty-seven or of any other Act of Parliament.

“The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

“The District of Saint John the Evangelist Walton being:—

“All that portion of the parochial chapelry of Daresbury in the parish of Runcorn in the county of Chester and in the diocese of Chester which is bounded on the east partly by the district parish of Siretton and partly by the particular district or new parish of Saint Thomas Stockton Heath both in the county and diocese aforesaid on the north-east by the last-named particular district or new parish on the north and on the north-west by the county of Lancaster or in other words by the River Mersey on the west by the new parish of Halton in the said county of Chester and in the diocese of Chester aforesaid and on the remaining sides that is to say on the south and on the south-west by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of Halton from the parochial chapelry of Daresbury aforesaid at or near to the point where Lapwing-lane diverges from the said boundary in an easterly direction and extending thence first eastward and then southward to and along the middle of the said lane for a distance of forty chains or thereabouts to its junction at Moore Turn Bridge over the Mersey and Irwell Canal with the road leading to Moore and extending thence that is from the said canal bridge south-

eastward along the middle of the last-described road for a distance of fifty-eight chains or thereabouts (thereby passing over the lines of London and North Western Railway and of the Birkenhead and Cheshire Junction Railway) to the point on the south-eastern side of the last-named line of railway where the said last-described-road joins the road leading from Moore to Higher Walton and extending thence first north-eastward and then south-eastward along the middle of the last-mentioned road for distance of thirty chains or thereabouts to its junction on the southern side of Porch House Farm-house with the road leading over Acton Grange Bridge on the Shropshire Union Canal to Holly Hedge Farm-house and continuing thence that is from the said Porch House Farm-house still south-eastward along the middle of the last-described road for a distance of twenty-seven and a half chains or thereabouts to its junction on the southern side of Holly Hedge Farm-house aforesaid with the turnpike-road leading from Frodsham to Warrington and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of the said turnpike-road for a distance of one chain and twenty-five links or thereabouts to its junction with the road leading to Rowswood Farm-house and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of the last-described road for a distance of six chains or thereabouts to the boundary on the western side of the last-named farm-house which boundary divides the township of Acton Grange from the township of Walton Superior otherwise called or known as Higher Walton and extending thence southward along the said township boundary for a distance of forty-two chains or thereabouts to its junction in Row's Wood with the boundary dividing the last-named township from the township of Hatton and extending thence eastward along the last-mentioned township boundary for a distance of forty-six chains or thereabouts to the boundary in the wood called or known as Bog Rough which boundary divides the said parochial chapelry of Daresbury from the district parish of Stretton aforesaid.

"And also all that contiguous portion of the particular district or new parish of Saint Thomas Stockton Heath aforesaid which is bounded on the north-east on the north and on the north-west by the county of Lancaster aforesaid or in other words by the River Mersey aforesaid on the south-west on the south and on the south-east by the above-described portion of the said parochial chapelry of Daresbury and on the remaining side that is to say on the east by an imaginary line commencing at the point in the middle of the stream flowing from the reservoir called or known as the Warrington Reservoir past Walton Mill into the River Mersey where the boundary which divides the said parochial chapelry of Daresbury from the particular district or new parish of Saint Thomas Stockton Heath aforesaid diverges from the said stream in a south-westerly direction such point being a little to the south-east of the bridge or culvert which carries the turnpike-road leading from Frodsham to Warrington as aforesaid over the same stream and extending thence that is from the last-mentioned boundary first north-westward and then northward along middle of the said stream for a distance of twenty-four chains or thereabouts (thereby passing under the said turnpike-road and through the mill pond supplying Walton Mill aforesaid and following at the said mill the waste water branch of the same stream and crossing the Mersey and Irwell Canal aforesaid) to the junction of the same stream with the River Mersey aforesaid and

continuing thence still northward and in a direct line to the county boundary in the middle of the said river which boundary divides the said county of Chester from the county of Lancaster aforesaid."

And whereas drafts of the said scheme have, in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore firstly mentioned Act, been transmitted to the patron and to the incumbents of the said parochial chapelry of Daresbury and of the said particular district or new parish of Saint Thomas Stockton Heath out of which it is intended that the district recommended in such scheme to be constituted shall be taken.

And whereas one calendar month has expired since drafts of the said scheme were so transmitted as aforesaid and no objections have been made to such scheme.

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council: now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her said Majesty chapter thirty-seven, and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Chester.

SAINT GREGORY THE GREAT, CANTERBURY, KENT.—Forthwith wholly in the Church of Saint Gregory the Great, Canterbury, in the county of Kent; and in the churchyard, except in existing vaults and walled graves,

every coffin buried in which shall be separately entombed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented, and except in earthen graves which can be opened to the depth of five feet without the exposure of coffins, or the exposure of undecayed bones, to be used for the burial of those whose relatives have been buried in the churchyard.

MARDEN.—Forthwith wholly in Marden Church, in the county of Kent; and in the churchyard, except in vaults and walled graves, every coffin buried in which shall be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented, and except in earthen graves which can be opened to the depth of five feet without the exposure of coffins.

DAWLEY MAGNA.—Forthwith wholly in Dawley Magna Church, in the county of Salop; and in the churchyard, except in vaults and walled graves, every coffin buried in which shall be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented, and except in earthen graves, which can be opened to the depth of five feet without the exposure of coffins.

FULBOURNE (SAINT VIGORS).—Forthwith wholly in Fulbourne (Saint Vigors) Church, in the county of Cambridge; and in the churchyard, except in vaults and walled graves, every coffin buried in which shall be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented, and except in earthen graves which can be opened to the depth of five feet without the exposure of coffins or the disturbance of offensive remains.

SAWSTON.—Forthwith wholly in Sawston Church, in the county of Cambridge; and in the churchyard, except in vaults and walled graves, every coffin buried in which shall be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented; and except in earthen graves, which can be opened to the depth of five feet without the exposure of coffins or the disturbance of offensive remains.

Now, therefore, Her Majesty in Council is pleased hereby to give notice of such representation, and to order that the same be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council on the fifteenth day of January next:

And Her Majesty is further pleased to direct that this Order be forthwith published in the London Gazette; and that copies thereof be affixed on the doors of the churches or chapels of, or on some conspicuous places within, the parishes affected by such representation one month before the said fifteenth day of January.
