WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her Majesty, chapter thirty-seven, duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the sixth day of November, in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine, in the words and figures following, that is to say:

"We the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England in pursuance of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of your Majesty chapter thirty-seven have prepared and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council the following scheme for constituting a separate district for spiritual purposes out of the parish of Ripley in the county of York and in the diocese of Ripon and out of the parish of Knaresborough in the same county and diocese.

"Whereas it has been made to appear to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular portions of the said parish of Ripley and of the said parish of Knaresborough which are hereinafter mentioned and described should be constituted a separate district in manner hereinafter set forth.

"And whereas there is not at present within the limits of the said proposed separate district any consecrated church or chapel in use for the purposes of Divine worship.

"And whereas by a certain deed bearing date on or about the thirteenth day of May in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine and made or expressed to be made under the authority of the New Parishes Acts 1843 1844 and 1856 or of some or one of them and being under the hands and seals of the Reverend Thomas Charles Thompson, rector or incumbent of the rectory of the said parish of Ripley and of Sir Henry Day Ingilby of Ripley in the West Riding of the said county of York Baronet the patron of the rectory of the same parish and of the Right Reverend Robert Bishop of the said diocese of Ripon and being also under the common seal of us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England (which deed is intended to be enrolled in the Chancery Division of your Majesty's High Court of Justice) the said Thomas Charles Thompson did grant convey surrender and release unto the minister of the

said proposed district and when such district shall have become a new parish under the provisions of the first above-mentioned Act then to the incumbent of such new parish and to their respective successors one clear yearly rent-charge or sum of two hundred and fourteen pounds to be for ever issuing and payable out of and charged upon the endowments of the rectory of the parish of Ripley aforesaid.

"And whereas the said yearly rent-charge or sum of two hundred and fourteen pounds has been so granted conveyed surrendered and released as aforesaid upon the understanding that (such arrangement appearing to us to be expedient) the whole right of patronage of the said proposed district and so soon as the said district shall have become a new parish as aforesaid then of the said new parish and of the nomination of the minister or incumbent thereof should be assigned in the manner hereinafter recommended and proposed.

"Now therefore, with the consent of the said Robert Bishop of the said diocese of Ripon (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners humbly recommend and propose that all those portions of the said parish of Ripley and of the said parish of Knaresborough which are described in the schedule hereunder written, all which portions together with the boundaries thereof are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed shall upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme become and be constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes and that the same shall be named 'The District of Saint Thomas the Apostle, Killinghall.'

"And we further recommend and propose that the whole right of patronage of the said district of Saint Thomas the Apostle Killinghall and so soon as the said district shall have become a new parish as aforesaid then of the said new parish and of the nomination of the minister or incumbent thereof shall without any assurance in the law other than this scheme and any duly gazetted Order of your Majesty in Council ratifying the same and upon and from the day of the date of the publication of such Order in the London Gazette as aforesaid be assigned to and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be fully and freely exercised by the said Thomas Charles Thompson so long as he shall remain rector or incumbent of the rectory of the parish

of Ripley aforesaid and that upon and from the next avoidance of the same rectory the same right of patronage and nomination shall become absolutely vested in and shall and may thenceforth and for ever thereafter be fully and freely exercised by the person or persons to whom the patronage of the rectory of the parish of Ripley aforesaid may for the time being belong.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of either of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

"The District of Saint Thomas the Apostle Killinghall, being:—

"All that portion of the parish of Ripley in the county of York and in the diocese of Ripon which is comprised within and is co-extensive with the limits of the township of Killinghall.

"And also all that portion of the parish of Knaresborough in the same county and diocese which is isolated and detached from the main body of such parish and which lies wholly within and is bounded on all sides by the township of Killinghall aforesaid and is situate on the northern side of the Skipton and Knaresborough turnpike-road near Oaker Bank a little to the east of the mile-stone on such road indicating five miles from Knaresborough and nineteen miles from Skipton."

And whereas drafts of the said scheme have, in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Act, been transmitted to the patrons and to the incumbents of the two parishes out of which it is intended that the district recommended in such scheme to be constituted shall be taken, and such patrons and incumbents have respectively signified their assent to such scheme:

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council: Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Ripon.

"Whereas it appears to us to be expedient that a district chapelry should be assigned to the said church of Saint Peter situate within the limits of the parish or parochial chapelry of Drypool as aforesaid.

"Now therefore with the consent of the Right Honourable and Most Reverend William Archbishop of York (testified by his having signed and sealed this representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent, that it would in our opinion be expedient that all that portion of the said parish or parochial chapelry of Drypool and also all that contiguous portion of extra-parochial territory called or known as Garrison Side, in the town county and diocese aforesaid both which portions of territory are described in the schedule hereunder written and are together with the boundaries thereof delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be assigned as a district chapelry to the said church of Saint Peter situate within the limits of the parish or parochial chapelry of Drypool as aforesaid and that the same should be named 'The District Chapelry of Saint Peter Drypool.'

"And with the like consent of the said William Archbishop of York (testified as aforesaid) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners further represent, that it appears to us to be expedient that banns of matrimony should be published and that marriages baptisms churchings and burials should be solemnized or performed at the said church of Saint Peter situate within the limits of the parish or parochial chapelry of Drypool as aforesaid, and that the fees to be received in respect of the publication of such banns and of the solemnization or performance of the said offices should be paid and belong to the minister of the same church for the time being: Provided always that so long as the Reverend Thomas Davis Clerk in Holy Orders the vicar or incumbent of the vicarage of the said parish or parochial chapelry of Drypool shall continue to be such vicar or incumbent all the fees which may be received in respect of the said publication of banns and solemnization or performance of Church offices for or on behalf of the inhabitants of that portion of the said district chapelry of Saint Peter Drypool which shall have been taken out of the said parish or parochial chapelry of Drypool shall be paid over by the minister of the said district chapelry to the said Thomas Davis and provided also that nothing herein contained shall be construed as expressing any intention on the part of us the said Commissioners to concur in or approve the taking of any fee for the performance of the said office of baptism or for the registration thereof.

"We therefore humbly pray that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your Royal consideration and to make such

Order with respect thereto as to your Majesty in your Royal wisdom shall seem meet.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The District Chapelry of Saint Peter Drypool being:—

"All that portion of the parish or parochial chapelry of Drypool in the town and county of the town of Kingston-upon-Hull and in the diocese of York which is bounded on the south by the southern boundary of the said parish or parochial chapelry of Drypool in the middle of the River Humber on the south-west by the hereinafter described portion of extra-parochial territory called or known as Garrison Side in the town county and diocese aforesaid on the north-west by the new parish of Saint Mark Hull in the same town county and diocese and upon all other sides that is to say on the north-east and on the east by an imaginary line commencing on the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint Mark Hull from the parish or parochial chapelry of Drypool aforesaid at the point on the western side of Dansom-lane opposite to the middle of the north-western end of Wilton-street and extending thence south-eastward across the said lane and along the middle of Wilton-street aforesaid for a distance of eight chains or thereabouts to its junction with Holderness-road and with Williamson-street and continuing thence still south-eastward for a distance of twenty-three chains or thereabouts along the middle of the last-named street to its junction with Hedon-road and continuing thence still south-eastward and in a direct line across the last-named road to the point where the line of the North-Eastern Railway is joined by the line of railway called or known as the Timber Pond Line which passes along the western side of the New Timber Pond belonging to the Hull Dock Company and along the eastern side of the Old Timber Pond belonging to the same Company and extending thence southward along the middle of the last-described line of railway for a distance of thirty chains or thereabouts to the southern end of the same line of railway opposite to the south-eastern corner of the said Old Timber Pond and continuing thence still southward and in a direct line for a distance of forty-seven chains or thereabouts to the southern boundary of the said parish or parochial chapelry of Drypool in the middle of the River Humber aforesaid.

"And also all that contiguous portion of extra-parochial territory called or known as Garrison Side as aforesaid which is not comprised within the limits of the new parish of Saint Mark Hull aforesaid and which is bounded on the north by the last-named new parish on the north-east and on the east by the hereinbefore described portion of the parish or parochial chapelry of Drypool aforesaid on the south by the southern boundary of the said extra-parochial territory in the middle of the River Humber aforesaid and on the remaining side that is to say on the north-west by the Old Harbour or in other words partly by portions of the parish of the Holy Trinity Kingston-upon-Hull and partly by portions of the parish or parochial chapelry of Saint Mary Kingston-upon-Hull both in the said town and county of the town of Kingston-upon-Hull and in the diocese of York aforesaid."

And whereas the said representation has been approved by Her Majesty in Council: now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said representation, and to order and direct that the

same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of York.

"And whereas there is not at present within the limits of the said proposed district any consecrated church or chapel in use for the purposes of Divine worship.

"And whereas by a certain deed bearing date on or about the sixth day of August in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine and made or expressed to be made under 'The New Parishes Acts, 1843, 1844, and 1856' or of some or one of them and being under the hand and seal of Thomas Greenhalgh of Thornydykes in Sharples in the said county of Lancaster Esquire, and being also under the common seal of us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners (which deed is intended to be enrolled in the Chancery Division of your Majesty's High Court of Justice) the said Thomas Greenhalgh did give grant and convey unto the minister or incumbent of the said proposed district so soon as one shall have been appointed and licensed in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore secondly mentioned Act and to his successors or (as the case may be) to the vicar or incumbent of the new parish (when the proposed district shall have become a new parish under the provisions of the said secondly hereinbefore mentioned Act) and to his successors two several pieces or parcels of land or ground with the messuages or tenements thereon erected situate in the town of Bolton as

the same pieces or parcels of land or ground are more particularly delineated in the plan drawn in the margin of the said deed subject nevertheless to the several indentures of lease the particulars whereof and the yearly rents amounting together to the sum of eighty-seven pounds sixteen shillings and seven pence or thereabouts which are reserved thereby are set forth in the schedule appended to such deed the said yearly rents so reserved as aforesaid to be to the use of the said minister or incumbent for the time being of the said proposed district or new parish for ever.

"And whereas for the purpose of providing a further endowment for the said proposed district the said Thomas Greenhalgh has purchased a sum of three hundred and six pounds four pounds per centum debenture stock of the Great Northern Railway Company and has caused the same sum to be transferred into our name in the books of the said Company in order that the said sum may be held in trust by us as and for a permanent endowment for the minister or incumbent for the time being of the said proposed district or new parish and the amount of the annual interest and dividends to accrue due on account of the said sum of stock to be receivable by the said minister or incumbent for the time being when he shall have been duly licensed as aforesaid.

"And whereas the said pieces or parcels of land or ground with the messuages and buildings thereon erected together with the annual rents reserved thereon have been so given granted and conveyed as aforesaid and the said sum of debenture stock of the Great Northern Railway Company has been so provided as aforesaid upon the understanding that we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England should out of our common fund created by the hereinbefore firstly mentioned Act pay to the minister or incumbent for the time being of the said proposed district or new parish when duly licensed as aforesaid a grant of fifty pounds per annum and upon the further understanding that (such arrangement appearing to us to be expedient) we should recommend and propose to your Majesty in Council that the whole right of patronage of the said proposed district or new parish and of the nomination of the minister or incumbent thereto should be assigned in the manner hereinafter mentioned.

"And whereas we have agreed and undertaken to make such grant of fifty pounds per annum as aforesaid by an instrument to be executed by us under our common seal in accordance with the provisions of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of your Majesty chapter one hundred and eleven.

"Now therefore with the consent of the Right Reverend James Bishop of the said diocese of Manchester (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners humbly recommend and propose that all that part of the said district chapelry of Saint James Bolton-le-Moors which is described in the schedule hereunder written all which part together with the boundaries thereof is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed shall upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme become and be constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes and that the same shall be named 'The District of All Souls Bolton-le-Moors.'

"And we further recommend and propose that the whole right of patronage of the said proposed district and when the said district shall

have become a new parish as aforesaid then of the said new parish and of the nomination of the minister or incumbent thereof shall without any assurance in the law other than this scheme and any duly gazetted Order of your Majesty in Council ratifying the same and upon and from the day of the date of the publication of such Order in the London Gazette as aforesaid be assigned to and become absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised jointly by the said Thomas Greenhalgh by Thomas Lever Rush-ton, of Moor Platt Horwich in the said county of Lancaster Esquire, by Thomas Thwaites, of Bank House Sharples in the said county Esquire by George Hesketh of Seymour-road Astley Bridge in the same county Esquire and Henry Murton of Birkdale Southport in the same county Esquire their heirs and assigns for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or to any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of either of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

"The District of All Souls Bolton-le-Moors being:—

"All that part of the district chapelry of Saint James Bolton-le-Moors within the original limits of the parish of Bolton-le-Moors in the county of Lancaster and in the diocese of Manchester which is bounded on the east by the new parish of Tonge on the north by the new parish of Astley Bridge all within the original limits of the the said parish of Bolton-le-Moors on the west by the consolidated chapelry of Saint Thomas Halliwell within the original limits of the parish of Deane in the county and diocese aforesaid on the south-west by the new parish of Saint Matthew Bolton-le-Moors also within the original limits of the parish of Bolton-le-Moors aforesaid and upon the remaining sides that is to say on the south-east and on the south by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint Matthew Bolton-le-Moors from the district chapelry of Saint James Bolton-le-Moors aforesaid at the point where Halliwell-road is joined by Draycott-street and extending thence first north-eastward and then eastward along the middle of the last-named street for a distance of about thirteen chains (thereby crossing Blackburn-road) to the junction of Draycott-street aforesaid with Latham-street and extending thence southward along the middle of the last-named street for a distance of nearly one chain to its junction with Charles Rupert-street and extending thence eastward along the middle of the last-named street for a distance of nine chains or thereabouts to its junction with Harcastle-street and extending thence northward along the middle of the last-named street for a distance of two and a half chains or thereabouts to its junction with Chalfont-street and with the public footpath leading past the northern and eastern sides of Back-o'-th'-Bank Houses to the River Tonge and extending thence first eastward then south-eastward and then again eastward along the middle of the said public footpath for a distance of twelve and a half chains or thereabouts to the boundary on the western side of the said river which boundary divides the said district chapelry of Saint James Bolton-le-Moors from the new parish of Tonge aforesaid."

And whereas drafts of the said scheme have, in accordance with the provisions of the secondly hereinbefore mentioned Act, been transmitted to the patron and to the incumbent of the said district chapelry of Saint James, Bolton-le-Moors out of which it is intended that the district recommended in such scheme to be constituted shall be taken.

And whereas the said patrons of the district chapelry of Saint James, Bolton-le-Moors aforesaid have respectively signified their assent to the said scheme and the said incumbent of the same district chapelry has offered certain objections or observations to or upon the said scheme.

And whereas the said scheme has notwithstanding such objections or observations as last mentioned been approved by Her Majesty in Council: now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Manchester.

"Now therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Christopher, Bishop of the said diocese of Lincoln (testified by his having signed and sealed this representation) we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent, that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all that part of the said parish of Clee which is described in the schedule hereunder written, all which part, together with the boundaries thereof, is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be assigned as a district chapelry to the said church of Saint John the Evangelist situate

at New Clee as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The District Chapelry of Saint John the Evangelist, New Clee.'

"And with the like consent of the said Christopher Bishop of the said diocese of Lincoln (testified as aforesaid), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, further represent, that it appears to us to be expedient that banns of matrimony should be published, and that marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials should be solemnized or performed at the said church of Saint John the Evangelist situate at New Clee as aforesaid, and that the fees to be received in respect of the publication of such banns and of the solemnization or performance of the said offices should be paid and belong to the minister of the same church for the time being: Provided always, that nothing herein contained shall be construed as expressing any intention on the part of us the said Commissioners to concur in or approve the taking of any fee for the performance of the said office of baptism or for the registration thereof.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The District Chapelry of Saint John the Evangelist, New Clee, being:—

"All that part of the parish of Clee in the county of Lincoln and in the diocese of Lincoln which is bounded on the north by the northern boundary of the said parish in the estuary of the River Humber, on the west for the most part by the new parish of Saint Andrew Great Grimsby in the county and diocese aforesaid and upon all other sides that is to say on the remaining part of the west on the south and on the east by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint Andrew Great Grimsby from the parish of Clee aforesaid at the point where East Marsh Drain is joined by Weelsby Drain and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of the last-named drain for a distance of eighteen chains or thereabouts, thereby crossing Wellington-street, to the junction of the same drain with Carrs Drain and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of the last-named drain for a distance of thirty-one chains or thereabouts to a point in the middle of the road leading from Clee to New Clee and called or known in part as Carrs occupation-road and extending thence first north-westward and then north-eastward along the middle of the last-mentioned road for a distance of forty-two chains or thereabouts to its north-eastern end at its junction with Stirling-street on the southern side of the line of the Manchester Sheffield and Lincolnshire Railway and containing thence in the same direction that is in a straight line north-eastward across the said line of railway and across the foreshore of the estuary of the River Humber aforesaid to the northern boundary of the parish of Clee aforesaid."
