The QUEEN'S Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her Majesty, chapter thirty-seven, duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the sixth day of November, in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine, in the words and figures following, that is to say:

"We the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England in pursuance of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of your Majesty chapter thirty-seven have prepared and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council the following scheme for constituting a separate district for spiritual purposes out of the parish of Ripley in the county of York and in the diocese of Ripon and out of the parish of Knaresborough in the same county and diocese.

"Whereas it has been made to appear to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular portions of the said parish of Ripley and of the said parish of Knaresborough which are hereinafter mentioned and described should be constituted a separate district in manner hereinafter set forth.

"And whereas there is not at present within the limits of the said proposed separate district any consecrated church or chapel in use for the purposes of Divine worship.

"And whereas by a certain deed bearing date on or about the thirteenth day of May in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine and made or expressed to be made under the authority of the New Parishes Acts 1843 1844 and 1856 or of some or one of them and being under the hands and seals of the Reverend Thomas Charles Thompson, rector or incumbent of the rectory of the said parish of Ripley and of Sir Henry Day Ingilby of Ripley in the West Riding of the said county of York Baronet the patron of the rectory of the same parish and of the Right Reverend Robert Bishop of the said diocese of Ripon and being also under the common seal of us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England (which deed is intended to be enrolled in the Chancery Division of your Majesty's High Court of Justice) the said Thomas Charles Thompson did grant convey surrender and release unto the minister of the

said proposed district and when such district shall have become a new parish under the provisions of the first above-mentioned Act then to the incumbent of such new parish and to their respective successors one clear yearly rent-charge or sum of two hundred and fourteen pounds to be for ever issuing and payable out of and charged upon the endowments of the rectory of the parish of Ripley aforesaid.

"And whereas the said yearly rent-charge or sum of two hundred and fourteen pounds has been so granted conveyed surrendered and released as aforesaid upon the understanding that (such arrangement appearing to us to be expedient) the whole right of patronage of the said proposed district and so soon as the said district shall have become a new parish as aforesaid then of the said new parish and of the nomination of the minister or incumbent thereof should be assigned in the manner hereinafter recommended and proposed.

"Now therefore, with the consent of the said Robert Bishop of the said diocese of Ripon (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners humbly recommend and propose that all those portions of the said parish of Ripley and of the said parish of Knaresborough which are described in the schedule hereunder written, all which portions together with the boundaries thereof are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed shall upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme become and be constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes and that the same shall be named 'The District of Saint Thomas the Apostle, Killinghall.'

"And we further recommend and propose that the whole right of patronage of the said district of Saint Thomas the Apostle Killinghall and so soon as the said district shall have become a new parish as aforesaid then of the said new parish and of the nomination of the minister or incumbent thereof shall without any assurance in the law other than this scheme and any duly gazetted Order of your Majesty in Council ratifying the same and upon and from the day of the date of the publication of such Order in the London Gazette as aforesaid be assigned to and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be fully and freely exercised by the said Thomas Charles Thompson so long as he shall remain rector or incumbent of the rectory of the parish
