WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the eighth and ninth years of Her Majesty, chapter seventy; of the Act of the eleventh and twelfth years of Her Majesty, chapter thirty-seven; of the Act of the fourteenth and fifteenth years of Her Majesty, chapter ninety-seven; of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her Majesty, chapter fifty-five; and of the Act of the thirty-fourth and thirty-fifth years of Her Majesty, chapter eighty-two; duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a representation, bearing date the sixth day of November, in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine, in the words following; that is to say:—

“We the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England in pursuance of the Act of the eighth and ninth years of your Majesty chapter seventy; of the Act of the eleventh and twelfth years of your Majesty chapter thirty-seven; of the Act of the fourteenth and fifteenth years of your Majesty chapter ninety-seven; of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of your Majesty chapter fifty-five and of the Act of the thirty-fourth and thirty-fifth years of your Majesty chapter eighty-two have prepared and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council the following representation as to the assignment of a consolidated chapelry to the consecrated church of Saint John the Evangelist situate at Ranmoor in the particular district of Christ Church Fulwood in the county of York and in the diocese of York.

“Whereas at certain extremities of the said particular district of Christ Church Fulwood; of the particular district of Saint Thomas Crookes in the said county of York and in the said diocese of York, and of the new parish of Saint Mark Broomhall in the same county and diocese which said extremities lie contiguous one to another and are described in the schedule hereunder written there is collected together a population which is situated at a distance from the several churches of such particular districts and new parish respectively.

“And whereas it appears to us to be expedient that such contiguous portions of the said particular district of Christ Church Fulwood of the said particular district of Saint Thomas Crookes and of the said new parish of Saint Mark Broom-

hall should be formed into a consolidated chapelry for all ecclesiastical purposes and that the same should be assigned to the said church of Saint John the Evangelist situate at Ranmoor as aforesaid.

“Now therefore with the consent of the Right Honourable and Most Reverend William Archbishop of York with the consent of the Right Reverend Rowley now Bishop of the diocese of Sodor and Man of the Reverend Augustus Adam Bagshawe Clerk in Holy Orders now vicar or incumbent of the vicarage of the new parish of Wormhill in the county of Derby of the Reverend Edward Newman Clerk in Holy Orders, now vicar or incumbent of the vicarage of the new parish of Ecclesall Bierlow in the said county of York of William Henry Greaves Bagshawe of Ford Hall in the parish of Chapel-en-le-Frith in the said county of Derby Esquire and of Henry Rodgers of Broomfield Sheffield in the said county of York Esquire the patrons of the perpetual curacy of the said particular district of Christ Church Fulwood with the consent of the said Rowley Bishop of the diocese of Sodor and Man of the said Augustus Adam Bagshawe of the said William Henry Greaves Bagshawe of Thomas William Rodgers of Endcliffe Vale Sheffield aforesaid Esquire and of the said Henry Rodgers the patrons of the perpetual curacy of the said particular district of Saint Thomas Crookes, and with the consent of the twelve capital burgesses and commonalty of the town and parish of Sheffield aforesaid the patrons of the vicarage of the said new parish of Saint Mark Broomhall (in testimony whereof they the said William Archbishop of York the said Rowley Bishop of Sodor and Man and the said Augustus Adam Bagshawe Edward Newman William Henry Greaves Bagshawe, Henry Rodgers and Thomas William Rodgers have respectively signed and sealed this representation and they the said twelve capital burgesses and commonalty of the town and parish of Sheffield have affixed their common seal to this representation) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England humbly represent that it would in our opinion be expedient that all those contiguous portions of the said particular district of Christ Church Fulwood of the said particular district of Saint Thomas Crookes and of the said new parish of Saint Mark Broomhall which are described in the schedule hereunder written all which portions together with the boundaries thereof are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed should be united and

formed into one consolidated chapelry for the said church of Saint John the Evangelist situate at Ranmoor as aforesaid and that the same should be named 'The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint John the Evangelist Ranmoor.'

"We therefore humbly pray that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your Royal consideration and to make such Order in respect thereto as to your Majesty in your Royal wisdom shall seem meet.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint John the Evangelist Ranmoor being :—

"All those contiguous portions of the particular district of Christ Church Fulwood of the particular district of Saint Thomas Crookes and of the new parish of Saint Mark Broomhall all within the original limits of the parish of Sheffield in the county of York and in the diocese of York which are comprised within and are bounded by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said particular district of Saint Thomas Crookes from the new parish of Saint Mark Broomhall aforesaid at the point where the Sheffield and Glossop Trust-road is joined by Lower Ranmoor-road and extending thence south-westward along the last-mentioned boundary for a distance of twenty-nine chains or thereabouts (thereby following the course of the last-named road) to the point where the said last-named road is joined by the public footpath leading into the road called or known as Endcliffe Vale and extending thence that is from the said last-mentioned boundary southward along the middle of the last-described footpath for a distance of nine chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road called or known as Endcliffe Vale aforesaid and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of the last-named road for a distance of ten chains or thereabouts to its junction with the private road leading from Endcliffe Vale to Jenkin-lane and extending thence south-westward in a straight line along the middle of the last-named road for a distance of thirteen and a half chains to the point where it commences to curve towards the north-west and continuing thence in the same direction that is still south-westward and in a straight line for a distance of five chains to a point upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint Mark Broomhall from the new parish of Ecclesall Bierlow within the original limits of the parish of Sheffield aforesaid such point being at or near to the weir where the mill stream supplying the grinding wheel called or known as Holmes' Wheel leaves the stream called or known as Porter Brook and extending thence that is from the last-described point westward along the last-mentioned boundary for a distance of ten chains or thereabouts thereby following the course of Porter Brook aforesaid to the point at the junction of the same brook with the stream called or known as Oak Brook where the said last-mentioned boundary joins the boundary dividing the said new parish of Ecclesall Bierlow from the particular district of Christ Church Fulwood aforesaid and extending thence first generally westward and then generally south-westward along the last-mentioned boundary for a distance of twenty-five chains or thereabouts thereby continuing to follow the course of Porter Brook aforesaid to a point at or near to the grinding wheel called or known as Ibbotson Wheel and opposite to the middle of the eastern end of Wheel-lane and extending thence that is from the said last-mentioned boundary to

and along the middle of the last-named lane for a distance of eleven and a half chains or thereabouts to its junction with Jenkin-lane and extending thence northward along the middle of the said Jenkin-lane for a distance of one chain or thereabouts to its junction with Nether Green-road and extending thence westward along the middle of the last-named road for a distance of twelve chains or thereabouts to its junction at Nether Green with Water-lane and extending thence generally northward along the middle of the said Water-lane for a distance of twenty-five chains or thereabouts to its junction with Upper Ranmoor-road and with Snaithing-lane and extending thence north-westward along the middle of the said Snaithing-lane for a distance of twenty-five chains and a half or thereabouts to its junction with Carsik Hill-road and extending thence first north-eastward and then north-westward along the middle of the last-named road for a distance of nine and a half chains or thereabouts to its junction with Barncliffe-road and extending thence generally north-eastward along the middle of the said Barncliffe-road for a distance of seven chains or thereabouts to its junction with Sandy Gate-road and with Bell Hagg-road and extending thence generally northward along the middle of the said Bell Hagg-road for a distance of forty-eight chains or thereabouts (thereby crossing the Sheffield and Glossop Trust-road aforesaid) to the boundary at the junction of the said Bell Hagg-road with Hagg-lane which divides the said particular district of Christ Church Fulwood from the particular district of Saint Thomas Crookes aforesaid and extending thence first eastward and then south-eastward along the last-mentioned boundary for a distance of twenty-eight chains or thereabouts to the point where Back-lane is joined by the public footpath which leads into the road or lane leading from Clough Field past Lydgate Hall into Lydgate-lane and extending thence that is from the said last-mentioned boundary eastward along the middle of the last-described public footpath for a distance of nine and a half chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road or lane leading from Clough Field past Lydgate Hall into Lydgate-lane as aforesaid and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of the last-described road or lane for a distance of seventeen and a half chains or thereabouts to its junction with Lydgate-lane aforesaid and extending thence south-westward along the middle of the said Lydgate-lane for a distance of two chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road called or known as Tapton Hill and extending thence first south-eastward and then southward along the middle of the last-named road for a distance of twenty-one chains or thereabouts to its junction with the Sheffield and Glossop Trust-road aforesaid and extending thence first south-eastward and then eastward along the middle of the said trust-road for a distance of thirty-four chains or thereabouts to the first-described point at the junction of the same trust-road with Lower Ranmoor-road as aforesaid upon the boundary which divides the said particular district of Saint Thomas Crookes from the new parish of Saint Mark Broomhall as aforesaid at which point the said imaginary line commenced."

And whereas the said representation has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in

law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of York.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the third and fourth years of Her Majesty chapter one hundred and thirteen, of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her Majesty chapter thirty-seven, and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her Majesty chapter one hundred and four, duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme bearing date the thirteenth day of November in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England in pursuance of the Act of the third and four years of your Majesty chapter one hundred and thirteen; of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of your Majesty chapter thirty-seven; and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of your Majesty chapter one hundred and four have prepared and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council the following scheme for constituting a separate district for spiritual purposes to be taken out of the parish of Watford in the county of Hertford and in the diocese of Saint Albans and out of the parish of Bushey in the same county and diocese.

"Whereas it has been made to appear to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular portions of the said parish of Watford and of the said parish of Bushey which are hereinafter mentioned and described should be constituted a separate district in manner hereinafter recommended and proposed.

"And whereas there is not at present within the limits of the said proposed district any consecrated church or chapel in use for the purposes of Divine worship.

"And whereas for the purpose of providing an endowment for the said proposed district a sum of two thousand five hundred pounds four pounds per centum debenture stock of the Great Northern Railway Company has been transferred into our name in the books of the same Company to be held in trust by us as and for a permanent endowment for the minister or incumbent for the time being of the said proposed district and the amount of the annual interest and dividends to accrue due on account of the said sum of stock to be receivable by the said minister or incumbent for the time being when he shall have been duly licensed according to the provisions of the hereinbefore secondly mentioned Act.

"And whereas Robert Russell Carew of Carpenden Park Watford Esquire, David Carnegie of Eastbury Watford Esquire, William Thomas Eley of Oxhey Grange Watford Esquire Thomas Blackwell Esquire and Thomas Francis Blackwell Esquire both of Harrow Weald and William Arthur Tooke of Pinner Hill Esquire have contributed the money for purchasing the said sum of two thousand five hundred pounds four pounds per centum debenture stock and have so contributed upon the understanding that we the said

Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England should out of our common fund created by the firstly hereinbefore mentioned Act pay to the minister or incumbent for the time being of the said proposed district when duly licensed as aforesaid a grant of fifty pounds per annum and upon the further understanding that (such arrangement appearing to us to be expedient) we should recommend and propose to your Majesty in Council that the whole right of patronage of the said proposed district and of the nomination of the minister or incumbent thereto should be assigned in the manner hereinafter recommended and proposed.

"And whereas we have agreed and undertaken to make such grant of fifty pounds per annum as aforesaid by an instrument to be executed by us under our common seal in accordance with the provisions of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of your Majesty chapter one hundred and eleven.

"Now therefore with the consent of the Right Reverend Thomas Legh Bishop of the said diocese of Saint Albans (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners humbly recommend and propose that all those portions of the said parish of Watford and of the said parish of Bushey which are described in the schedule hereunder written (all which portions together with the boundaries thereof are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed) shall upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme become and be constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes and that the same shall be named 'The District of Saint Matthew Oxhey.'

"And we further recommend and propose that the whole right of patronage of the said proposed district and of the nomination of the minister or incumbent thereof shall without any assurance in the law other than this scheme and any duly gazetted Order of your Majesty in Council ratifying the same and upon and from the day of the date of the publication of such Order in the London Gazette as aforesaid be assigned to and become absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be jointly exercised by the said Robert Russell Carew the said David Carnegie, the said William Thomas Eley the said Thomas Francis Blackwell and the said William Arthur Tooke their heirs and assigns for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or to any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of either of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

"The District of Saint Matthew, Oxhey, being:—

"All that portion of the parish of Watford in the county of Hertford and in the diocese of Saint Albans wherein the present incumbent of such parish now possesses the exclusive cure of souls which is bounded on the south-west partly by the parish of Rickmansworth in the said county and diocese and partly by that portion of the new parish of Northwood in the diocese of London which is situate in the said county of Hertford, on the south-east partly by the parish or parochial chapelry of Pinner and partly by the new parish of All Saints Harrow Weald both which cures are situate in the county of Middle-

sex and in the said diocese of London on the north-east by the parish of Bushey, in the said county of Hertford and in the diocese of Saint Albans aforesaid and on the remaining side, that is to say on the north-west by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said parish of Bushey from the parish of Watford aforesaid at the centre of Watford Bridge over the River Colne and extending thence first generally south-westward and then north-westward along the middle of the main stream of the said river for a distance of nearly two and a half miles (thereby passing to the north of the buildings called or known respectively as Rookery Mill and as Hamper Mills and also crossing and recrossing the line of the Watford and Rickmansworth Branch of the London and North-Western Railway) to the boundary which divides the said parish of Watford from the parish of Rickmansworth aforesaid.

"And also all that contiguous portion of the said parish of Bushey (comprising the territory called or known as New Bushey) wherein the present incumbent of such parish now possesses the exclusive cure of souls which is bounded on the north-west and on the south-west by the parish of Watford aforesaid and on all other sides that is to say on the south-east and on the north-east by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said parish of Watford from the parish of Bushey aforesaid at the point in the middle of Bucks-lane where it is crossed by the public footpath leading from Watford Heath into Merryhill-lane near to which point a boundary-stone inscribed 'O. D. 1879 No. 1' has been placed and extending thence that is from the last-mentioned parish boundary north-eastward along the middle of the said public footpath for a distance of thirty-six chains or thereabouts to its junction at the northern end of the pond in the grounds attached to the house called or known as Haydon Hill with the public footpath called or known as the Church-path near to which point of junction a boundary-stone inscribed 'O. D. 1879 No. 2' has been placed and extending thence north-westward along the middle of the said Church-path for a distance of twenty-nine chains or thereabouts to its junction with the London-road and extending thence north-eastward and in a direct line diagonally across the last-named road to a boundary stone inscribed 'O. D. 1879, No. 3' and placed on the northern side of the same road at the south-eastern end of the ditch which forms the south-western boundary of the close numbered 168 upon the ordnance survey map of the said parish of Bushey on the scale of $\frac{1}{3500}$ published in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-six, and upon the map hereunto annexed and extending thence that is from the said boundary-stone north-westward along the middle of the said ditch for a distance of twelve chains or thereabouts to a boundary stone inscribed 'O. And whereas the patron of the vicarage of the parish of Watford aforesaid and the rector of the rectory of the parish of Bushey aforesaid have respectively signified their assent to the said scheme and the patrons of the last-named rectory have offered no objections to the same scheme.

And whereas the vicar of the vicarage of the parish of Watford aforesaid has offered certain objections or observations to or upon the said scheme.

And whereas the said scheme has notwithstanding such objections or observations been approved by Her Majesty in Council, now therefore Her Majesty by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Saint Albans. "We the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England in pursuance of the Act of the sixteenth and seventeenth years of your Majesty chapter fifty and of the Act of the twenty-third and twenty-fourth years of your Majesty chapter one hundred and twenty-four have prepared and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council the following scheme for effecting an exchange of the patronage of the two benefices namely the benefice (being a vicarage and an ancient parish) of Saint Giles Pontefract situate in the county of York and in the diocese of York and the benefice (being a district parish) of All Saints Pontefract in the same county and diocese for the patronage of the benefice (being a vicarage) of Sutton on the Forest also situate in the said county and diocese of York.

Whereas the patronage of the two said benefices of Saint Giles, Pontefract and All Saints Pontefract belongs to the Crown and is exercised

on behalf of your Majesty by the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain for the time being in virtue of his office.

And whereas the patronage of the said benefice of Sutton on the Forest belongs to the Archbishop of York for the time being in right of his See.

And whereas the Right Honourable Hugh MacCalmont Earl Cairns now Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain as such Lord High Chancellor and the Right Honourable and Most Reverend William Archbishop of York as such Archbishop, have respectively signified to us their desire that the patronage of the said three benefices may be re-arranged by way of exchange in manner herein-after recommended and proposed.

And whereas we have made due inquiry and calculation as to the circumstances and relative values of the said three benefices and of the patronage thereof respectively and we do hereby certify to your Majesty in Council that the circumstances and present values of the said benefices respectively are as set forth in the schedule hereunto annexed.

"Now therefore with the consent of the said Hugh MacCalmont Earl Cairns Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain acting as such Lord High Chancellor on behalf of your Majesty and with the consent of the said William Archbishop of York acting as such Archbishop (in testimony whereof to this scheme the said Hugh MacCalmont Earl Cairns and the said William Archbishop of York have respectively affixed their hands and seals) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of

the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said two benefices of Saint Giles Pontefract and All Saints Pontefract and each of them and the churches thereof shall be transferred from your Majesty your heirs and successors and shall become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time and at all times be exercised by the said William Archbishop of York and his successors Archbishops of York for ever and that in exchange for the same the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Sutton-on-the-Forest and the church thereof shall in like manner and upon and from the same date be transferred from the said William Archbishop of York and from his successors Archbishops of York and shall become and be absolutely vested in your Majesty your heirs and successors and shall and may from time to time and at all times be exercised by the said Hugh MacCalmont Earl Cairns or other the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain for the time being acting on behalf of your Majesty in right of the Crown.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of either of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

"We the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England in pursuance of the Act of the eighth and ninth years of your Majesty chapter seventy, of the Act of the fourteenth and fifteenth years of your Majesty chapter ninety-seven, of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of your Majesty chapter fifty-five, and of the Act of the thirty-fourth and thirty-fifth years of your Majesty chapter eighty-two, have prepared and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council the following representation as to the assignment of a consolidated chapelry to the consecrated church of Saint Anthony situate in Globe-road in the parish of Saint Dunstan Stepney in the county of Middlesex and in the diocese of London.

"Whereas at certain extremities of the said parish of Saint Dunstan Stepney, and of the new parish of Saint Peter Stepney in the county and diocese aforesaid which said extremities lie contiguous one to another and are described in the schedule hereunder written, there is collected together a population which is situate at a distance from the several churches of such parish and new parish respectively.

"And whereas it appears to us to be expedient that such contiguous portions of the said parish of Saint Dunstan Stepney and of the said new parish of Saint Peter Stepney should be formed into a consolidated chapelry for all ecclesiastical purposes and that the same should be assigned to the said church of Saint Anthony situate in Globe-road as aforesaid.

"Now therefore with the consent of the Right Honourable and Right Reverend John Bishop of the said diocese of London as such Bishop and also as the patron in right of his See both of the rectory of the said parish of Saint Dunstan Stepney and also of the vicarage of the said new parish of Saint Peter Stepney (in testimony whereof he the said Bishop has signed and sealed this representation) we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England humbly represent that it would in our opinion be expedient that all those contiguous portions of the said parish of Saint Dunstan Stepney and of the said new parish of Saint Peter Stepney which are described in the schedule hereunder written all which portions together with the boundaries thereof are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed should be united and formed into one consolidated chapelry for the said church of Saint Anthony situate in Globe-road as aforesaid and that the same should be named 'The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Anthony Stepney.'

"We therefore humbly pray that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your Royal consideration, and to make such Order in respect thereto as to your Majesty in your Royal wisdom shall seem meet.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Anthony Stepney being:—

"All that portion of the parish of Saint Dunstan Stepney in the county of Middlesex and in the diocese of London wherein the present incumbent of such parish now possesses the exclusive cure of souls and which for ecclesiastical purposes is isolated and detached from the main body of the said parish all which portion of such parish is

bounded on the south by the hereinafter described portion of the new parish of Saint Peter Stepney in the county and diocese aforesaid (or in other words by the line of the Great Eastern Railway) on the west by the new parish of Saint John Bethnal Green in the said county and diocese on the north partly by the last-named parish and partly by the new parish of Saint Simon Zelotes Bethnal Green in the county and diocese aforesaid and on the remaining side that is to say on the north-east by the last-named new parish.

"And also all that contiguous portion of the new parish of Saint Peter Stepney aforesaid which is bounded on the north by the hereinbefore described portion of the said parish of Saint Dunstan Stepney on the west and on the south-west by the new parish of Saint Bartholomew Bethnal Green in the county and diocese aforesaid, and on all other sides that is to say on the south and on the south-east by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the last-named new parish from the new parish of Saint Peter Stepney aforesaid at the point where Cleveland-street is intersected by Devonshire-street and extending thence first eastward and then north-eastward along the middle of the last-named street for a distance of seven hundred yards or thereabouts to its junction with Carlton-road and with Morpeth-street and extending thence northward along the middle of the last-named street to the point at or near to the bridge which carries the line of the Great Eastern Railway aforesaid over the said last-named street where the boundaries of the said new parish of Saint Peter Stepney of the new parish of Saint Benet Stepney in the county and diocese aforesaid and of the hereinbefore described portion of the parish of Saint Dunstan Stepney aforesaid all meet."

And whereas the said representation has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of London.

ADDITIONAL RULES as to Investigations into Shipping Casualties.

The Merchant Shipping Act, 1876, 39 and 40 Vic., cap. 80.

The Shipping Casualties Investigations Act, 1879, 42 and 43 Vict., cap. 72.

39 and 40 Vict., c. 80 s. 30.

WHEREAS, by section 30 of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1876, it was provided as follows:—

“The Wreck Commissioner, Justices or other authority holding a formal investigation into a Shipping Casualty shall hold the same with the assistance of an assessor or assessors of nautical engineering or other special skill or knowledge, to be appointed by the Commissioner, Justices or authority out of a list of persons for the time being approved for the purpose by a Secretary of State.”

“The Commissioner, Justices or authority, when of opinion that the investigation is likely to involve the cancellation or suspension of the Certificate of a Master or Mate, shall, where practicable, appoint a person having experience in the Merchant Service to be one of the Assessors.”

42 and 43 Vict., c. 72, s. 3 (1.)

And whereas, by section 3 sub-section 1 of the Shipping Casualties Investigations Act, 1879, it was thus enacted:—

3. (1.) The list of persons approved as Assessors for the purpose of formal investigations into Shipping Casualties shall be in force for three years only, but persons entered in any such list may be approved for any subsequent list. The list of those persons in force, at the passing of this Act, shall continue in force until the end of the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty, but nothing in this section shall affect the power of the Secretary of State to withdraw his approval of any

name on any such list or to approve of any additional name.

And whereas the Secretary of State has directed that the Assessors shall, so far as in his opinion circumstances permit, be taken in order of rotation within each class or sub-class, and has further directed that the Assessors placed by him on the list of Assessors, on and after the 31st of March next, shall be classified according to their qualifications, as follows:—

QUALIFICATIONS.

CLASSES.

Class I.—Mercantile Marine Masters.

(a.) Five years' service as a Master in the Merchant Service, of which two years must have been service in command of a sailing ship, with a Certificate of Competency.

(b.) Five years' service as a Master in the Merchant Service, of which two years must have been service in command of a steamship, with a Certificate of Competency.

Class II.—Mercantile Marine Engineers.

Five years' service as an Engineer in the Merchant Service, with a first-class Certificate of Competency.

Class III.—Royal Navy.

Rank of Admiral or Captain and three years' service in command of one of Her Majesty's ships at sea, or rank of Staff Commander and three years' service in that rank in one of Her Majesty's ships at sea.

Class IV.—Persons of Nautical Engineering or other special Skill or Knowledge.

(a.) Such qualification as is in the opinion of the Secretary of State requisite for ordinary cases.

(b.) Such qualification as is in the opinion of the Secretary of State requisite for special cases.

42 and 43 Vict., c. 72, sec. 3 (2, 3.)

And whereas it was further provided by section 3, sub-sections 2 and 3 of the same Act, as follows:—

(2.) The Assessor or Assessors for each such investigation shall, instead of being appointed by the Commissioner, Justices or other authority holding the investigation, be appointed in such manner and according to such regulations as may be from time to time prescribed by general rules made under section 30 of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1876.

39 and 40 Vict., c. 80.

(3.) Where any such investigation involves, or appears likely to involve, any question as to the cancelling or suspension of the Certificate of a Master, Mate, or Engineer, it shall be held with the assistance of not less than two Assessors having experience in the Merchant Service.

Now under the authority of the above-mentioned Acts, I, the Right Honourable Hugh MacCalmont, Earl Cairns, Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, hereby make the following General Rules:

Short Title.

1. These Rules may be cited as “The Shipping Casualties Rules, 1879.”

Commencement.

2. These Rules shall, subject as hereinafter mentioned, come into operation on the 24th day of December, 1879.

Publication of Rules.

3. These Rules shall be published by Her Majesty's Stationary Office through its agents, and

a copy shall be kept at every Custom House and Mercantile Marine Office in the United Kingdom, and any person desiring to peruse them there shall be entitled to do so.

Appointment of Assessors.

4. The power of appointing Assessors for investigations into Shipping Casualties shall be vested in the Secretary of State.

5. If any investigation involves, or appears likely to involve, the cancelling or suspension of the Certificate of a Master, Mate, or Engineer, then, in order to satisfy the aforesaid statutory requirement of not less than two Assessors having experience in the Merchant Service there shall be appointed from the list not less than two Assessors from Class I. and Class II., or from either of those classes.

6. Subject to any special appointment or appointments which the Secretary of State may think it expedient to make in any case where special circumstances appear to him to require a departure from these Rules (the requirements of Rule 5 being always complied with), Assessors shall be appointed as follows:—

(1.) Where the investigation involves, or appears likely to involve, the cancelling or suspension of the Certificate of a Master or Mate, but not of an Engineer, at least two Assessors shall be appointed from Class I.

(2.) Where the investigation involves, or appears likely to involve, the cancelling or suspension of the Certificate of a Master or Mate of a sailing ship one at least of the Assessors shall be appointed from sub-section (a) of Class I, and where the investigation involves, or appears likely to involve, the cancelling or suspension of the Certificate of a Master or Mate of a steamship one at least of the Assessors shall be appointed from sub-section (b) of Class I.

(3.) Where the investigation involves, or appears likely to involve, the cancelling or suspension of the Certificate of an Engineer one at least of the Assessors shall be appointed from Class II.

7. The Board of Trade shall inform the Secretary of State when Assessors are required, and shall state from which of the aforesaid classes Assessors ought, in their opinion, to be appointed, in order to give due effect to the aforesaid classification and these rules; but the Board of Trade shall not request the appointment of any individual Assessor.

8. An appointment made by the Secretary of State of any Assessor or Assessors for an investigation shall not be open to question on the ground that it was not in accordance with these Rules, or does not give full effect to the requirements of these Rules.

9. Whereas it is necessary to make temporary provision for the appointment of Assessors until the classification referred to in these Rules can be effected. Therefore, Rules 5 to 7 (both inclusive) shall not come into operation until the 31st of March, 1880, and until those Rules come into operation the statutory requirements as to the appointment in certain cases of two Assessors having experience in the Merchant Service shall be deemed to be complied with by the appointment of persons who, in the existing list, appear as qualified by service in the Mercantile Navy.

NIGHT WORK.—MALE YOUNG PERSONS ABOVE 16.

Order of Secretary of State extending Special Exception.

WHEREAS the Factory and Workshop Act, 1878, sec. 58, contains a special exception to the effect that nothing in the Act shall prevent the employment, in factories to which the exception applies, of male young persons during the night, if they are employed in accordance with the following conditions:

(1.) The period of employment shall not exceed 12 consecutive hours, and shall begin and end at the hours specified in the notice in the Act mentioned; and

(2.) The provisions of Part One of the Act with respect to the allowance of times for meals to young persons during the period of employment shall be observed, with the necessary modifications as to the hour at which the times allowed for meals are fixed; and

(3.) A male young person employed during any part of the night shall not be employed during any part of the 12 hours preceding or succeeding the period of employment; and

(4.) A male young person shall not be employed on more than 6 nights, or in the case of blast furnaces or paper mills 7 nights, in any two weeks.

And the said Act declares that the provisions of the Act with respect to the period of employment on Saturday, and with respect to the allowance to young persons of 8 half holidays in every year or of whole holidays in lieu of them, shall not apply to a male young person employed in day and night turns in pursuance of this exception.

And whereas this special exception is by the Act declared to apply to the factories referred to in the said section;

And whereas it has been proved to my satisfaction that in non-textile factories of the class mentioned in the schedule hereunder it is necessary, by reason of the nature of the business requiring the process to be carried on throughout the night, to employ male young persons of sixteen or upwards at night, and that such employment will not injure the health of the male young persons employed:

Now, I, the Right Honourable Richard Assheton Cross, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries

of State, by this Order made under Part 2 of the said Act, extend the said exception to factories of such class so far as regards male young persons of sixteen or upwards, provided the department in which such young persons are so employed be separated to the satisfaction of the Inspector of Factories from the department in which the sugar is boiled.

This Order shall come into effect on 13th December, 1879, and shall, unless previously revoked, continue in force until 31st December, 1882, and no longer.

OVERTIME.—ADDITIONAL TWO HOURS.

Order of Secretary of State extending Special Exception.

WHEREAS the Factory and Workshop Act, 1878, contains a special exception to the effect that the regulations of the Act with respect to the employment of young persons and women shall not prevent the employment in the factories and workshops or parts thereof to which the exception applies of young persons and of women during a period of employment beginning at 6 A.M. and ending at 8 P.M., or beginning at 7 A.M. and ending at 9 P.M., or beginning at 8 A.M. and ending at 10 P.M., if they are employed in accordance with the following conditions; namely,

- (1.) There shall be allowed to every such young person and woman for meals during the period of employment not less than two hours, of which half an hour shall be after five o'clock in the evening; and
- (2.) Any such young person or woman shall not be so employed on the whole for more than 5 days in any one week, nor for more than 48 days in any 12 months.

And whereas the special exception is by the Act declared to apply to the factories and workshops referred to in the said section;

And whereas it has been proved to my satisfaction that in the non-textile factories of the classes mentioned in the schedule hereunder it is necessary, by reason of press of work arising at certain recurring seasons of the year, and of the liability of the business to a sudden press of orders arising from unforeseen events, to employ young persons and women in manner authorized by this exception, and that such employment will not injure the health of the young persons and women affected thereby:

Now I, the Right Honourable Richard Assheton Cross, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, by this Order, made under Part 2 of the said Act, extend this exception accordingly.

This Order shall come into effect on 13th December, 1879, and shall, unless previously revoked, continue in force until 31st December, 1880, and no longer.

To the other Authorities referred to in Article 2 (Nos. 3 and 4) of this Order;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by Section 4 of "The District Auditors Act, 1879," it is enacted that the Local Government Board may from time to time assign to District Auditors their Duties, and the Districts in which such Auditors respectively are to act;

And whereas by an Order dated the 9th day of October, 1879, the Local Government Board assigned to John Reed Donald, of Carlisle, in the county of Cumberland, Solicitor, who was a District Auditor duly appointed under the provisions of the Statutes in that behalf, a District in which he should act as Auditor, to comprise the several Unions and the Separate Parish named in the Schedules to this Order, and to be termed "The Northumberland, Cumberland, and Westmorland Audit District;—"

And whereas the said John Reed Donald is deceased, and the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the provisions contained in the said District Auditors Act, 1879, have, by an Instrument under Seal, bearing date the 6th day of December, 1879, appointed the said Charles Hunton to be a District Auditor:

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, hereby certify the appointment of the said Charles Hunton accordingly, and hereby Order and Prescribe as follows:—

ARTICLE 1.—The District in which the said Charles Hunton shall act as Auditor, and which We hereby assign to him, shall, until We otherwise prescribe, comprise the area for the time being included in the several Unions named in the said Schedule A. and in the Separate Parish named in the said Schedule B., termed as aforesaid "The Northumberland, Cumberland, and Westmorland Audit District."

ARTICLE 2.—It shall be the duty of the said District Auditor to audit the Accounts of the following Authorities and their Officers; namely,—

- (1.) The Guardians of the Poor of the said several Unions, and of the said Separate Parish.
- (2.) The Overseers of the Poor of the several Parishes comprised in the said several Unions, and of the said Separate Parish.
- (3.) The several other Authorities for the time being whose Accounts are or may be by law subject to be audited by a District Auditor, and whose Districts or the area of whose jurisdiction are for the time being wholly situated with the said Audit District.
- (4.) Such of the said other Authorities whose Accounts are or may be by law subject to be so audited, and whose Districts or the areas of whose jurisdiction are for the time being partly situated within the said Audit District, as We may by Order under Seal hereafter prescribe.

ARTICLE 3.—The said District Auditor shall audit the said Accounts according to the pro-

visions of the several Statutes and of the Orders issued by competent authority, in force for the time being in that behalf, and shall perform all such duties and exercise all such powers in connection with the Audit of such Accounts as are prescribed and conferred by the said Statutes and Orders.

ARTICLE 4.—Nothing in this Order shall affect or interfere with any Audit District formed prior to the passing of the said District Auditors Act, 1879, or the duties and powers of the Auditor of any such District, so far as regards any Audit already commenced by him or any proceedings in relation thereto.

ARTICLE 5.—In this Order—

The term "Parish" includes any place for which a separate Poor Rate is or can be made or for which a separate Overseer is or can be appointed.

The term "Overseers of the Poor" includes Churchwardens and Assistant Overseers.
