The Silvertown Land Company Limited.

AT an Extraordinary General Meeting of the Members of the said Company, duly convened and held at the office of Mr. John William Marsh, No. 2, Fen-court, Fenchurch-street, in the city of London, on the 13th day of November, 1879, the following Special Resolutions were duly passed; and at a subsequent Extraordinary General Meeting of the Members of the said Company, also duly convened and held at the same place, on the 27th day of November, 1879, the following Special Resolutions were duly confirmed:—

“That the said Silvertown Land Company Limited should be wound up voluntarily.

“That Alexander Scrutton, John Atherton, John Henry Nettleship, and John Joseph Smith, should be appointed Liquidators with authority, without any further sanction by Extraordinary or Special Resolution of the Company or otherwise,

to exercise the powers specified in sec. 159, 160, and 161 of the Companies Act, 1862, and all other powers which by the said Act Liquidators could by Extraordinary or Special Resolution of the Company or otherwise be empowered to exercise, and that any such powers should from time to time, or at any time, be exercisable by any two of the said Liquidators.

“That the said Alexander Scrutton, John Atherton, John Henry Nettleship, and John Joseph Smith should be entitled to retain and be indemnified out of the assets of the said Company all costs, charges, damages, and expenses which they should incur or sustain in respect of the said Company, or the affairs thereof, including their remuneration as such Liquidators.
