The Ladies who propose to attend Her Majesty's Drawing Room, at Buckingham Palace, are requested to bring with them two large cards with their names *clearly written* thereon, one to be left with the Queen's Page in Attendance, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to The Queen.

PRESENTATIONS.

Any Lady who proposes to be presented to The Queen must leave at the Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace, *before twelve o'clock*, two clear days before the Drawing Room, a card with her name written thereon, and with the name of the Lady by whom she is to be presented. In order to carry out the existing regulations, that no presentation can be made at a Drawing Room excepting by a Lady actually attending that Court, it is also necessary that an intimation from the Lady who is to make the presentation, of her intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's approbation. It is Her Majesty's command, that no presentations shall be made at the Drawing Room, except in accordance with the above regulations.

It is particularly requested that in every case the names be *very distinctly written* upon the cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to The Queen.

It is not expected that Gentlemen will present themselves at Drawing Rooms, except in attendance on the Ladies of their families.

Any Gentleman who under these circumstances should desire to be presented to The Queen, will observe the same regulations as are in force for Her Majesty's Levees.

PRESENTATIONS.

Any Nobleman or Gentleman who proposes to be presented, must leave at the Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace, *before twelve o'clock*, two clear days before the Levee, a card with his name written thereon, and with the name of the Nobleman or Gentleman by whom he is to be presented. In order to carry out the existing regulations that no presentation can be made at a Levee excepting by a person actually attending that Levee, it is also necessary that an intimation from the Nobleman or Gentleman who is to make the presentation, of his intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's approbation. It is Her Majesty's command that no presentations shall be made at the Levee, except in accordance with the above regulations.

It is particularly requested, that in every case the names be *very distinctly written* upon the

cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to His Royal Highness.

EUROPEAN COMMISSION OF THE
DANUBE.

POLICE AND NAVIGATION REGULATIONS.

The European Commission of the Danube adopted on the 29th November and the 12th December, 1879, respectively, the following new

readings of Articles 79 and 87 of the Police and Navigation Regulations:—

Art. 79. A boat is held in readiness to take pilots on board vessels which make for the port from the sea—during the day, as soon as the lookout on the lighthouse signals their approach; during the night, as soon as a vessel herself makes the customary signal for the pilot.

Pilots are bound to go a mile to seaward of the head of the North Pier to meet vessels, and vessels are bound to await them by reducing their speed, or by stopping, if necessary, and if the weather permits.

If the pilot boat is prevented from leaving the port, and if the state of the weather, or any other overpowering circumstance, does not admit of the vessel remaining in the roads, the captain has the faculty of entering the port without a pilot, on his own responsibility.

Art. 87. Sailing-vessels pay, for the compulsory pilotage of the voyage down stream, the dues determined in francs and centimes, according to the following Tables, viz.:—

Sailing-vessels pay, for the optional pilotage of the voyage up stream, and in case they have employed a pilot for such voyage, four-fifths only of the dues determined by the preceding Tables.

Steam-vessels pay for the up, as well as for the down voyage, one half only of the preceding dues determined on for sailing-vessels; and steamers which make their voyages between the ports of the

Danube and the ports of the Black Sea or of the Bosphorus may be freed from all dues for river pilotage, provided that the ship's pilot is furnished with a licence as river pilot.

Rafts and floats of timber pay the pilotage due for their voyage to Sulina on the footing of 125 fr. from Galatz, 100 fr. from Reni, and 75 fr. from Toulcha.

The river pilotage dues are paid for the up, as well as for the down voyage, into the hands of the Director of the Cash Office at Sulina, at the moment when the vessel piloted clears the navigation dues on departure. The Director of the said Cash Office can alone give a valid receipt for their amount, but it is allowed to the captain of the vessel piloted to pay directly to his pilot the half of the due as an advance.

When a vessel has not been conducted on the up voyage by the same river pilot as on the down voyage, the captain is bound to present to the Director of the Cash Office the receipt for the sum which he shall have paid as an advance to the pilot of the up voyage, and the Cash Office, in this case, only levies the balance owing to the up voyage pilot, at the same time giving a receipt for the entire due.

When vessels employed as lighters restore to the vessels lightened by them the goods they took on board, without accompanying them as far as Sulina, the pilot of the lighter is entitled to receive the whole of the sum due to him as soon as the lightened goods have been reshipped.

The calculation of tonnage for the payment of the river pilotage dues is made according to the rules laid down by the Tariff of Navigation Dues in force at Sulina.

THE FAIRS ACT, 1873. NOTTINGHAM GOOSE FAIR.

IN pursuance of the above-mentioned Act, I, the Right Honourable Richard Assheton Cross, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, hereby notify as follows:

1. By Memorial, dated the 19th day of January, 1880, a representation has been duly made to me by the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the borough of Nottingham, as owners, that a Fair, known as Goose Fair, has been annually held within the borough of Nottingham, commencing on the first Tuesday in the month of October, and continuing for the following four days, and that it would be for the convenience and advantage of the public that such Fair should hereafter com-

mence in each year on the first Thursday in October instead of the first Tuesday in October, and that the Fair should continue during the two following days, and no longer:

2. On the 26th day of February, 1880, I shall take the aforesaid representation into consideration, and all persons are to intimate, before that day, any objection they may desire to offer to the said proposed alterations in the time for holding the said Fair.

TREASURY WARRANT.

WE, the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury in exercise of all the powers enabling us in this behalf do by this Warrant, made on the representation of Her Majesty's Postmaster-General (testified by his signing the same), and under the hands of two of us, the said Commissioners, order, direct, and declare as follows:—

1. So much of the Treasury Warrant of the 29th May, 1879, as relates to the countries and places specified in Schedule No. 1, hereunder written, is, so far as it relates to such countries and places, hereby repealed.

2. The rates of postage and additional sums for registration to be henceforth charged by or under the authority of the Postmaster-General, in lieu of the rates and sums now payable in respect of postal packets conveyed or delivered for conveyance by post to and from the several countries and places by the route and means of conveyance mentioned and described in the Schedules Nos. 1 and 2, hereunder written, shall be the rates of postage and additional sums which are fixed and specified by and in such Schedules respectively.

3. All such postal packets as are hereinbefore referred to in Clause 2 shall be posted, forwarded, conveyed, and delivered under and subject to the several regulations, conditions, prohibitions, and restrictions applicable thereto, respectively contained in the Schedules Nos. 1 and 2, hereunder written, and in Schedule No. 4 of the Treasury Warrant of the 29th May, 1879.

4. Such parts of any Treasury Warrant as relate to the rates and sums now payable for the conveyance by post by the route of Brindisi, of letters, newspapers, printed papers, and pattern or sample packets to and from the countries and places specified in Schedules Nos. 3 and 4, hereunder written, are hereby repealed.

5. The rates of postage and additional sums for registration to be henceforth charged by or under the authority of the Postmaster-General in lieu of the rates and sums now payable in respect of letters, newspapers, printed papers, and pattern or sample packets conveyed or delivered for conveyance by post to and from the several countries and places by the route and means of conveyance mentioned and described in the Schedules Nos. 3 and 4, hereunder written, shall be the rates of postage and additional sums which are fixed and specified by and in such Schedules respectively.

6. All such letters, newspapers, printed papers, and pattern or sample packets as are hereinbefore referred to in Clause 5 shall be posted, forwarded, conveyed, and delivered under and subject to the several regulations, conditions, prohibitions, and restrictions applicable thereto, respectively contained in the Schedules Nos. 3 and 4, hereunder written, and in any other Treasury Warrant now in force relating to the countries and places specified in the Schedules Nos. 3 and 4, hereunder written.

7. This Warrant shall come into operation on the 1st day of February, 1880.

SCHEDULE No. 1.

FACTORY AND WORKSHOP ACT, 1878.
41 Vict., c. 16, s. 39.

PLACES FORBIDDEN FOR MEALS.
(Order of Secretary of State extending Special Prohibition.)

WHEREAS "The Factory and Workshop Act, 1878," section 39, contains a special prohibition to the effect that a child, young person, or woman, shall not be allowed to take a meal, or to remain during the times allowed for meals in the parts of the factories or workshops to which the section applies :

And whereas this special prohibition is by the Act declared to apply to the factories named in the second schedule of the Act ;

And whereas it appears to me that by reason of the nature of the processes in the factories and workshops, and parts thereof named in the schedule hereunder, the taking of meals therein is specially injurious to health ;

Now I, the Right Honourable Richard Assheton Cross, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, by this Order, made under Part II of the said Act, extend the said prohibition to such factories and workshops, and parts thereof.

This Order shall come into effect on the 1st February, 1880. *Richard Assheton Cross.*

To the Highway Board for each of the Highway Districts of Chulmleigh, Crockernwell, Dulverton, and Honiton ;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by Section 4 of "The District Auditors Act, 1879," it is enacted that the Local Government Board may from time to time assign to District Auditors their Duties, and the Districts in which such Auditors respectively are to act ;

And whereas by an Order dated the 9th day of October, 1879, the Local Government Board certified the appointment of the said Robert Coard Tucker as a District Auditor, and ordered and prescribed that the District in which he should in future act as Auditor, and which was thereby assigned to him, should, until the said Board otherwise prescribed, comprise the area for the time being included in the several Unions named in the Schedule to that Order, and that such

District should be termed "The Devonshire Audit District ;"

And whereas it is prescribed by Article 2 of the said Order that it shall be the duty of the said District Auditor to audit the Accounts of the Guardians and the Overseers specified in Nos. (1) and (2) of that Article, as well as the Accounts of the other Authorities (and of their Officers) referred to in Nos. (3) and (4) in the following terms :—

"(3.) The several other Authorities for the time being whose Accounts are or may be by law subject to be audited by a District Auditor, and whose Districts or the areas of whose jurisdiction are for the time being wholly situated within the said Audit District."

"(4.) Such of the said other Authorities whose Accounts are or may be by law subject to be so audited, and whose Districts or the areas of whose jurisdiction are for the time being partly situated within the said Audit District, as We may by Order under Seal hereafter prescribe."

And whereas the School Board for the said United School District of Hillfarrance, Oake, and Heathfield, and the Highway Board for each of the said Highway Districts of Chulmleigh, Crockernwell, Dulverton, and Honiton, are respectively Authorities whose Accounts are subject to be audited by a District Auditor, and the District of each of the said Authorities is partly situated within the said Audit District :

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, hereby Order and Prescribe that it shall be the duty of the said Robert Coard Tucker to audit the Accounts of the said School Board, and of each of the said Highway Boards, and of their Officers, in conformity with the provisions contained in Article 3 of the above cited Order ; and for the purpose of such Audit the District of the said School Board and of each of the said Highway Boards shall be deemed to be within the said Devonshire Audit District.
