TO BE OBSERVED WITH REGARD TO THE LEVEE  
AT BUCKINGHAM PALACE.**

*By Her Majesty's Command,*  
The Noblemen and Gentlemen who propose to attend Her Majesty's Levee, at Buckingham Palace, are requested to bring with them two large cards, with their names *clearly written* thereon, one to be left with the Queen's Page in Attendance, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to The Queen.

**PRESENTATIONS.**

Any Nobleman or Gentleman who proposes to be presented to The Queen, must leave at the Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace, *before twelve o'clock*, two clear days before the Levee, a card with his name written thereon, and with the name of the Nobleman or Gentleman by whom he is to be presented. In order to carry out the existing regulations that no presentation can be made at a Levee excepting by a person actually attending that Levee, it is also necessary that an intimation from the Nobleman or Gentleman who is to make the presentation, of his intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's approbation. It is Her Majesty's command that no presentation shall be made at Levees, except in accordance with the above regulations.

It is particularly requested that in every case the names be *very distinctly written* upon the cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to The Queen.

**ADDRESSES.**

Notice is hereby given, that all persons having Petitions or Addresses to present to The Queen at Her Majesty's Levee, are to deliver a card (having on it their names, a statement of the object of such Petitions or Addresses, and the names of the persons from whom they come), to the Lord Chamberlain's Office, *before twelve o'clock* two clear days previous to the Levee; and that

two other cards, having on them precisely what is written upon that sent to the Lord Chamberlain's Office, are to be taken to the Levee; one of the two cards to be delivered to the Page, in the Corridor, and the other to the Lord Chamberlain, who will read its contents to The Queen; and on these occasions, no other statement is to be addressed to Her Majesty.

A Deputation to present an Address is not to exceed Four Persons.

The State Apartments will be opened for the reception of Company coming to Court at two o'clock.

TO BE OBSERVED AT THE QUEEN'S DRAWING  
ROOM AT BUCKINGHAM PALACE.**

*By Her Majesty's Command,*

The Ladies who propose to attend Her Majesty's Drawing Room, at Buckingham Palace, are requested to bring with them two large cards with their names *clearly written* thereon, one to be left with the Queen's Page in Attendance, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to The Queen.

**PRESENTATIONS.**

Any Lady who proposes to be presented to The Queen must leave at the Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace, *before twelve o'clock*, two clear days before the Drawing Room, a card with her name written thereon, and with the name of the Lady by whom she is to be presented. In order to carry out the existing regulations, that no presentation can be made at a Drawing Room excepting by a Lady actually attending that Court, it is also necessary than an intimation from the Lady who is to make the presentation, of her intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's approbation. It is Her Majesty's command, that no presentations shall be made at the Drawing

Room, except in accordance with the above regulations.

It is particularly requested that in every case the names be *very distinctly written* upon the cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to The Queen.

It is not expected that Gentlemen will present themselves at Drawing Rooms, except in attendance on the Ladies of their families.

Any Gentleman who under these circumstances should desire to be presented to The Queen, will observe the same regulations as are in force for Her Majesty's Levees.

**H**ER Majesty in Council was this day pleased, on a representation of the Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Council on Education in Scotland, to appoint John Lindsay Robertson, Esquire, M.A., University of Edinburgh, to be one of Her Majesty's Inspectors of Schools.

**W**HEREAS by "The Foreign Deserters Act," 1852, it is provided that whenever it is made to appear to Her Majesty that due facilities are or will be given for recovering and apprehending seamen who desert from British merchant ships in the territories of any foreign power, Her Majesty may, by Order in Council stating that such facilities are or will be given, declare that seamen not being slaves who desert from merchant ships belonging to a subject of such power when within Her Majesty's dominions shall be liable to be apprehended and carried on board their respective ships and may limit the operation of such Order, and may render the operation thereof subject to such conditions and qualifications, if any, as may be deemed expedient:

And whereas it hath been made to appear to Her Majesty that due facilities for recovering and apprehending seamen (not being German subjects) who desert from British merchant ships in the territories belonging to His Imperial Majesty the Emperor of Germany will be given under an agreement between the Governments of Great Britain and Germany signed at London on the 5th November 1879:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by virtue of the powers vested in Her by the said "Foreign Deserters Act," 1852, and by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, is pleased to order and declare, and it is hereby ordered and declared, that from and after the publication hereof in the London Gazette seamen not being slaves (and not being British subjects), who desert from merchant ships belonging to subjects of the Emperor of Germany within Her Majesty's dominions shall be liable to be apprehended and carried on board their respective ships; provided always, that if any such deserter has committed any crime in Her Majesty's dominions he may be detained until he

has been tried by a competent Court, and until his sentence (if any) has been fully carried into effect.

And Her Majesty, by virtue of the powers vested in Her by the said "Foreign Deserters Act," 1852, and by and with the advice of Her Privy Council is further pleased to order and declare that, upon and after the publication hereof in the London Gazette, the Order in Council made by virtue of the said Act, on the 16th day of October 1852 and published in the London Gazette on the 26th day of October 1852, so far as it relates to seamen who desert from merchant ships belonging to citizens of the Free Hanseatic Cities of Lubeck, Bremen, and Hamburg and the Order in Council relating to seamen who desert from the merchant ships belonging to subjects of the Grand Duke of Oldenburg, made, by virtue of the said Act on the 13th day of June 1853 and published in the London Gazette on the 14th day of June 1853 and the Order in Council relating to seamen who desert from the merchant ships belonging to subjects of the Grand Duke of Mecklenburg-Schwerin made, by virtue of the said Act, on the 9th day of March 1854, and published in the London Gazette on the 10th day of March 1854, and the Order in Council relating to seamen who desert from the merchant ships belonging to subjects of the King of Hanover, made, by virtue of the said Act, on the 8th day of June 1854, and published in the London Gazette on the 13th day of June 1854, shall be revoked, and the same are hereby revoked accordingly.

And the Secretary of State for the Home Department, the Secretary of State for the Colonies, and the Secretary of State for India in Council, are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

**W**HEREAS by "The Sea Fisheries Act, 1868," it is (among other things) enacted that it shall be lawful for Her Majesty from time to time by Order in Council to make, alter, and revoke regulations for carrying into execution the said Act and the intent and object thereof, and for the maintenance of good order among sea-fishing boats and the persons belonging thereto:

And whereas by the said Act it is further enacted that it shall be lawful for Her Majesty by Order in Council from time to time to do all or any of the following things, viz. :—

- (a.) To make regulations for carrying out, enforcing, and giving effect to both the entry and registry of British sea fishing boats, and also Articles four, five, six, seven, and eight of the Convention then recently concluded between Her Majesty and the Emperor of the French concerning the Fisheries in the seas adjoining the British Islands and France, and set out in the first schedule to the Act.
- (b.) To adopt in such regulations any existing system of registering or lettering and numbering of boats, and to provide for bringing any such system into conformity with the requirements of the said Convention and the Act, and with the said regulations.
- (c.) To define the boats or classes of boats to which such regulations, or any of them, are to apply, and to provide for the exemption of any boats or classes of boats from such regulations, or any of them, and from the provisions of Part II. of the Act with respect to

entry or registry, and the possession of a certificate of registry and official papers.

(d.) To apply to the entry and registry, respectively of sea fishing boats so defined, and to all matters incidental thereto, such (if any) of the enactments contained in any Act relating to the registry of British ships, and with such modifications and alterations as may be found desirable.

(e.) To impose penalties not exceeding twenty pounds for the breach of any regulations made by any Order in Council for the breach of which a punishment cannot be provided, by the application of the enactments contained in any Act relating to the registry of British ships.

(f.) To alter and revoke an Order so made, and that every such Order shall be of the same force as if it were enacted in the said recited Act:

And whereas Her Majesty did, in pursuance of the said recited Act on the 18th day of June 1869, by Order in Council, make certain regulations for the lettering, numbering, and registering of British sea fishing boats under Part II. of the Act, and did on the 23rd day of October 1877, by a further Order in Council, make certain additional regulations for the same purpose, all of which regulations are now in force.

And whereas it has been made to appear that it is expedient that the said Order of the 23rd day of October 1877 should be revoked, and that the Regulations in the Schedule hereto annexed should be substituted for the Regulations annexed to the said Order of the 23rd day of October 1877:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, in exercise of the powers vested in Her by the said recited Act, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, is pleased to revoke the said Order so made on the 23rd day of October 1877, and is pleased to make, in lieu of the Regulations to the said Order annexed, the Regulations which are set forth in the Schedule hereto annexed, and to direct that the same shall come into force from the date of the present Order.

SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Order refers.

Additional Regulations, for the Lettering, Numbering, and Registering of British Sea Fishing Boats, under Part II. of the Sea Fisheries Act, 1868 (31 and 32 Victoria, chap. 45).

1. All open or undecked boats employed in fishing or dredging for purposes of sale on the coasts of England, Wales, and the Islands of Guernsey, Jersey, Alderney, Sark, and Man, and not going outside.

(a.) The distance of 3 miles from low-water mark along the whole extent of the said coasts;

(b.) In cases of bays less than 10 miles wide, the line joining the headlands of such bays; shall not be subject to the Regulations for the lettering, numbering, and registering of British Sea Fishing Boats under Part II. of the Sea Fisheries Act, 1868, made by Her Majesty on the 18th day of June, 1869.

2. If any boat required to have its name and that of the Port to which it belongs, painted on the stern in pursuance of the Regulations for the lettering, numbering, and registering of British Sea Fishing Boats under Part II. of the Sea Fisheries Act, 1868, made by Her Majesty on the 18th day of June, 1869, and not having the name and Port so painted, is used as a Sea Fishing Boat, the Owner and Master shall each be liable to a penalty not exceeding twenty pounds.

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3. The Owner and Master of any boat required to be registered, lettered, and numbered, or otherwise marked in pursuance of the said Regulations, who shall, in the absence of any reasonable cause for the same (proof whereof shall lie on him) efface, cover, or conceal, or cause to be effaced, covered, or concealed, in any manner whatsoever, the letters, numbers, and names placed on such boats or their sails, shall each be liable to a penalty not exceeding twenty pounds.

4. For the purpose of carrying out the two foregoing Regulations, any Sea Fishery Officer may seize and detain the boat, and prevent it from going to sea, and from Sea Fishing, and may for that purpose, if it is at sea, take it back into the nearest or most convenient British Port.

5. Whenever the Owner of any registered British Sea Fishing Boat proves to the satisfaction of the proper Officer of Customs or Coast Guard or any Sea Fishery Officer that he has lost or been deprived of any Certificate of Registry already granted to him under Part II. of the Sea Fisheries Act, 1868, and the Regulations made thereunder, and a copy of such Certificate is made out, and delivered to such Owner, a fee of one shilling shall be paid by him to the Officer delivering the same

WHEREAS by "The Weights and Measures Act, 1878," it is (among other things) provided that the Board of Trade shall from time to time cause such new denominations of Standards, being either equivalent to or multiples or aliquot parts of the imperial weights and measures ascertained by the said Act, as appear to them to be required in addition to those mentioned in the second schedule to the said Act, to be made and duly verified, and that those new denominations of Standards, when approved by Her Majesty in Council, shall be Board of Trade Standards in like manner as if they were mentioned in the said Schedule:

And whereas it has been made to appear to the Board of Trade that a new denomination of Standard measure of Four Bushels, being a multiple of the imperial measure of capacity of a bushel ascertained by the said Act, is required, and they have caused the same to be made and duly verified and deposited in their custody:

And whereas the Board of Trade have given to the said new Standard measure of capacity the denomination of "Four Bushel Measure:"

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by virtue of the power vested in Her by the said Act, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, is pleased to approve of the "Four Bushel Measure" as a new denomination of Standard, and doth direct that the same shall be a Board of Trade Standard in like manner as if it was mentioned in the second schedule to "The Weights and Measures Act, 1878."

WHEREAS by "The Weights and Measures Act, 1878," it is (among other things) enacted, that where the Board of Trade, upon the application of any Local Authority from time to

time represent to Her Majesty that it would be expedient to alter the fees taken in respect of the verification and stamping of weights and measures by the Inspectors of such authority under the said Act (whether specified in the Fifth Schedule to the said Act, or in any Order previously made under the 47th section of the said Act), or for the purpose of adapting those fees to the local standards provided by such authority, to add to the said fees, it shall be lawful for Her Majesty, by Order in Council, from time to time to alter or add to the said fees :

And whereas the Board of Trade have, upon the application of the Local Authority for the city of Edinburgh, the Local Authority for the city of Dublin, and the Local Authority for the borough of Sheffield, represented to Her Majesty that it would be expedient to alter and add to the scale of fees taken in respect of such verification and stamping of weights and measures by the Inspectors of such three local authorities in the manner set forth in the schedule hereto annexed :

And whereas it has been made to appear that the alterations and additions contained in the said schedule are reasonable and proper :

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by virtue of the power vested in Her by the said Act, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, is pleased to alter and add to the fees heretofore taken by the Inspectors of the Local Authority for the city of Edinburgh, the Local Authority for the city of Dublin, and the Local Authority for the borough of Sheffield, in the manner set forth in the schedule hereto annexed ; and the fees specified therein shall be taken accordingly in lieu of the fees specified in the Fifth Schedule to the said Act.

**W**HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the third and fourth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and thirteen, of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her Majesty, chapter thirty-seven, and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and four, duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the twenty-second day of January, in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty, in the words and figures following, that is to say :—

"We the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England in pursuance of the Act of the third and fourth years of your Majesty chapter one hundred and thirteen of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of your Majesty chapter thirty-seven and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of your Majesty chapter one hundred and four have prepared and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council the following scheme for constituting a separate district for spiritual purposes to be taken out of the parish of Brasted out of the parish of Hever out of the parish of Chiddingstone out of the parish of Edenbridge and out of the new parish of the Holy Trinity Crockham Hill all in the county of Kent and in the diocese of Canterbury.

"Whereas it has been made to appear to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular portions of the said parish of Brasted of the said parish of Hever of the said parish of Chiddingstone of the said parish of Edenbridge and of the said new parish of the Holy Trinity Crockham Hill which are hereinafter mentioned and described should be constituted a separate district in manner hereinafter recommended and proposed.

"And whereas there is not at present within the limits of the said proposed district any consecrated church or chapel in use for the purposes of Divine worship.

"And whereas by a deed of indenture bearing date on or about the seventh day of June in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine made under the authority of the 'New

Parishes Acts, 1843, 1844, and 1856' or some or one of them and being under the hand and seal of the Reverend James William Rynd the rector of the rectory of the said parish of Brasted Clerk in Holy Orders and under the hand and seal of the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Archibald Campbell Archbishop of Canterbury both as the patron of the said rectory of the parish of Brasted and also as the diocesan and being also under the common seal of us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners (which deed is intended to be enrolled in the Chancery Division of your Majesty's High Court of Justice) the said James William Rynd did grant and confirm unto the minister or incumbent of the said proposed district and when the same district shall have become a new parish under the provisions of the hereinbefore secondly mentioned Act then of the said new parish and to his successors one clear yearly rent-charge or sum of fifty pounds issuing and payable out of and charged upon the endowments of the said rectory of Brasted.

"And whereas by another deed of indenture also bearing date the seventh day of June in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine and also made under the authority of the 'New Parishes Acts 1843, 1844, and 1856' aforesaid or some or one of them and being under the hand and seal of the Reverend Edward Henry Lee rector of the rectory of the said parish of Chiddingstone Clerk in Holy Orders under the hand and seal of the said Archibald Campbell Archbishop of Canterbury both as patron of the said rectory of Chiddingstone and also as diocesan and being also under the common seal of us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners (which last-named deed is likewise intended to be enrolled in the Chancery Division of your Majesty's High Court of Justice) the said Edward Henry Lee did grant and confirm unto the minister or incumbent of the said proposed district or (as the case may be) new parish and to his successors one clear yearly rent-charge or sum of twenty-five pounds issuing and payable out of and charged upon the endowments of the said rectory of Chiddingstone.

"And whereas for the purpose of providing an additional endowment for the said proposed district or (as the case may be) new parish a capital sum of eight hundred and sixty-three pounds sterling has been contributed and paid over to the credit of the account of us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners at the Bank of England by and at the instance of certain persons on whose behalf the Reverend John Erskine Campbell-Colquhoun of Chartwell in the said county of Kent Clerk in Holy Orders has acted and we have in respect of such last-mentioned sum undertaken to pay to the minister or incumbent of the said proposed district or (as the case may be) new parish the annual sum of twenty-eight pounds fifteen shillings and four pence.

"And whereas the said rent-charge of fifty pounds has been made upon the endowments of the rectory of Brasted and the said rent-charge of twenty-five pounds has been made upon the endowments of the rectory of Chiddingstone and the said sum of eight hundred and sixty-three pounds has been contributed and paid to the credit of our account as aforesaid upon the understanding that we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners should out of our common fund created by the firstly hereinbefore mentioned Act pay to the minister or incumbent of the said proposed district or (as the case may be) new parish a grant of forty-six pounds five shillings and four pence per annum and upon the further understanding and condition that (such arrangement appearing to us

to be expedient) we should recommend and propose to your Majesty in Council that the whole right of patronage of the said proposed district or (as the case may be) new parish and of the nomination of the minister or incumbent thereto should be assigned in the manner hereinafter mentioned.

"And whereas the said annual grant of forty-six pounds five shillings and four pence will be made and secured by an instrument to be executed by us under our common seal in accordance with the provisions of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of your Majesty chapter one hundred and eleven.

"And whereas the said James William Rynd, the said Edward Henry Lee and the said John Erskine Campbell-Colquhoun have nominated to us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners the said Archibald Campbell Archbishop of Canterbury and his successors as the patron or patrons of the said proposed district or new parish.

"Now therefore with the consent of the said Archibald Campbell Archbishop of Canterbury (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners humbly recommend and propose that all those portions of the said parish of Brasted of the said parish of Hever of the said parish of Chiddingstone of the said parish of Edenbridge and of the said new parish of the Holy Trinity Crockham Hill which are described in the schedule hereunder written all which portions together with the boundaries thereof are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed shall upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme become and be constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes and that the same shall be named 'The District of Four Elms.'

"And we further recommend and propose that the whole right of patronage of the said proposed district and when the said district shall have become a new parish as aforesaid then of the said new parish and of the nomination of the minister or incumbent thereto shall without any assurance in the law other than this scheme and any duly gazetted Order of your Majesty in Council ratifying the same and upon and from the day of the date of the publication of such Order in the London Gazette as aforesaid be assigned to and become absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Archibald Campbell Archbishop of Canterbury and by his successors Archbishops of Canterbury for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or to any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of either of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

"The District of Four Elms, being :—

"All those several contiguous portions of the parish of Brasted of the parish of Hever of the parish of Chiddingstone of the parish of Edenbridge and of the new parish of the Holy Trinity Crockham Hill all in the county of Kent and in the diocese of Canterbury which said portions of such parishes and of such new parish respectively are comprised within and are bounded by an imaginary line commencing at the point in the middle of the road leading from Coopers Corner to the hamlet of Four Elms near to the south-

western corner of Pond Wood where the boundary dividing that detached portion of the said parish of Hever wherein the said hamlet of Four Elms is situate from the new parish of Ide Hill in the county and diocese aforesaid joins the boundary dividing the last-named new parish from the parish of Brasted aforesaid and extending thence northward along the last-mentioned boundary for a distance of one mile and forty-seven chains or thereabouts to a point due east of a boundary stone inscribed 'F. E. D. 1880' and placed at the northern end of the building and premises called or known as the Fox and Hounds Inn (which inn stands near the crest of the hill) on the eastern side of the main road leading from Brasted over Brasted Chart to Four Elms, and extending thence that is, from the last-mentioned boundary in a direction due west and in a straight line for a distance of fifty-one chains or thereabouts to the said boundary stone and continuing thence that is from the last-mentioned boundary stone still in a direction due west and in a straight line for a distance of thirty-two chains or thereabouts to a point upon the boundary which divides the said parish of Brasted from the parish of Westerham in the county and diocese aforesaid and extending thence southward along the last-mentioned boundary for a distance of twenty-chains or thereabouts to its junction with the boundary dividing the said parish of Brasted from the new parish of the Holy Trinity Crockham Hill aforesaid and extending thence southward along the last-mentioned boundary for a distance of seventy-seven chains or thereabouts to a point at the north-eastern corner of Row Wood in the middle of the roadway or footpath leading from the house called or known as Obriss into Hever-road and extending thence westward along the middle of the said roadway or footpath for a distance of twenty chains or thereabouts to its junction with the Hever-road aforesaid and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of the last-mentioned road for a distance of two chains or thereabouts to its junction at or near to the house called or known as Pollards with the road leading to Crockham Grange and extending thence westward along the middle of the last-described road for a distance of nine and a half chains or thereabouts to the point where it crosses the stream flowing from Chartwell past the house called or known as Blunt's into the River Eden and extending thence alternately southward and south-westward along the middle of the said stream for a distance of fifty chains or thereabouts (thereby following the eastern branch thereof) to the point at the northern corner of Broxham Wood where the said eastern branch of the same stream crosses the Crockham-road such point being upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of the Holy Trinity Crockham Hill from the parish of Edenbridge aforesaid and extending thence first north-westward along the last-mentioned boundary for a distance of three chains or thereabouts (thereby following the south-western side of the last-named road) and then south-westward along the same boundary for a distance of twenty-five chains or thereabouts (thereby following in part the course of the said stream) to the point where such boundary diverges in a westerly direction from the course of the same stream and extending thence that is from the last-mentioned point first south-westward and then south-eastward along the middle of the said stream for a distance of ninety-five chains or thereabouts to the point where the same stream crosses Prettyman's lane and extending thence first southward and then south-eastward along the middle of the last-named lane for a distance of sixteen and a half-chains or

thereabouts to its south-eastern end at or near to the house called or known as Lockhurst and continuing thence still south-eastward for a distance of five and a half-chains or thereabouts along the middle of the roadway or footpath which leads from the said last-named lane past the said house called or known as Lockhurst and across the line of the South-Eastern Railway toward Medhurst-row to a point in the middle of the said line of railway and extending thence eastward along the middle of the same line of railway for a distance of sixty-six chains or thereabouts (thereby crossing the boundary which divides the said parish of Edenbridge from that detached portion of the said parish of Brasted whereon the house called or known as Whistler's is situate, and also crossing the boundary dividing the last-mentioned portion of the said parish of Brasted from that detached portion of the said parish of Hever wherein the hamlet of Four Elms is situate as aforesaid) to a point at the centre of the bridge which carries the road leading from Whistler's Green past Meachlands to Four Elms over the said line of railway at which point the same line of railway again crosses the last-described boundary and extending thence first northward and then eastward along the said last-described boundary for a distance of sixty-two chains or thereabouts (thereby following in part the course of the last-described road) to the point on the north-eastern side of Clinton Wood where the said last-mentioned boundary joins the boundary dividing the last-described portion of the said parish of Hever from the parish of Chiddingstone aforesaid and extending thence first north-eastward and then northward along the last-described boundary for a distance of seventy-eight chains or thereabouts to the point on the northern side of Chittenden Wood where the same boundary joins the boundary dividing the said detached portion of the parish of Hever from the new parish of Ide Hill aforesaid and continuing thence still northward along the last-mentioned boundary for a distance of thirty-two chains or thereabouts to its junction with the boundary dividing the said new parish of Ide Hill from the parish of Brasted aforesaid at the first described point in the middle of the said road leading from Coopers Corner to the hamlet of Four Elms near to the south-western corner of Pond Wood as aforesaid at which point the said imaginary line commenced."

And whereas drafts of the said scheme have, in accordance with the provisions of the secondly hereinbefore mentioned Act, been transmitted to the patrons and to the incumbents of the five several cures out of which it is intended that the district recommended in such scheme to be constituted shall be taken.

"And whereas the patrons of all the said five cures and the incumbents of four of the same cures have respectively signified their assent to the said scheme but the incumbent of the fifth cure that is to say the rector or incumbent of the parish of Chiddingstone has offered certain objections or observations to or upon the said scheme.

And whereas the said scheme has notwithstanding such objections or observations been approved by Her Majesty in Council: now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased

hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Canterbury.

And whereas the Right Honourable Richard Assheton Cross, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, after giving to the Incumbents and the Churchwardens of the parishes hereinafter mentioned ten days' previous notice of his intention to make such representation, has made a representation stating that, for the protection of the public health, no new burial-ground should be opened in the undermentioned parishes without the previous consent of one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, and that burials should be discontinued therein, with the modifications hereinafter specified:

And whereas Her Majesty was pleased, by Her Order in Council of the twenty-ninth day of November last, to give notice of such representation, and to order that the same should be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council on the fifteenth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and eighty, and such Order has been published in the London Gazette, and copies

ereof have been affixed, as required by the said Act:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that no new burial-ground shall be opened in the undermentioned parishes, without the previous approval of one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, and that burials in the said parishes shall be discontinued as follows, viz. :—

**LAMBORNE.**—Forthwith wholly in Lamborne Church, in the county of Berks; and in the churchyard, except in graves which can be opened without the exposure of coffins.

**BEARSTEAD.**—Forthwith in the old part of Bearstead Churchyard, in the county of Kent, except in existing vaults and walled graves, every coffin buried in which shall be separately entombed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented, and except in earthen graves to be used only for the burial of the widowers or widows of those already buried therein.

**SAINTE GREGORY THE GREAT, CANTERBURY, KENT.**—Forthwith wholly in the Church of Saint Gregory the Great, Canterbury, in the county of Kent; and in the churchyard, except in existing vaults and walled graves, every coffin buried in which shall be separately entombed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented, and except in earthen graves which can be opened to the depth of five feet without the exposure of coffins, or the exposure of undecayed bones, to be used for the burial of those whose relatives have been buried in the churchyard.

**MARDEN.**—Forthwith wholly in Marden Church, in the county of Kent; and in the churchyard, except in vaults and walled graves, every coffin buried in which shall be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented, and except in earthen graves which can be opened to the depth of five feet without the exposure of coffins.

**DAWLEY MAGNA.**—Forthwith wholly in Dawley Magna Church, in the county of Salop; and in the churchyard, except in vaults and walled graves, every coffin buried in which shall be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented, and except in earthen graves which can be opened to the depth of five feet without the exposure of coffins.

**FULBOURNE (SAINT VIGORS).**—Forthwith wholly in Fulbourne (Saint Vigors) Church, in the county of Cambridge; and in the churchyard, except in vaults and walled graves, every coffin buried in which shall be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented, and except in earthen graves which can be opened to the depth of five feet without the exposure of coffins or the disturbance of offensive remains.

**SAWSTON.**—Forthwith wholly in Sawston Church, in the county of Cambridge; and in the churchyard, except in vaults and walled graves, every coffin buried in which shall be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented, and except in earthen graves which can be opened to the depth of five feet without the exposure of coffins or the disturbance of offensive remains.

**T**HE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under

The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows :

1. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the third day of March, one thousand eight hundred and eighty; and words in this Order have the same meaning as in The Animals Order.

2. Notwithstanding anything in The Animals Order sheep, goats and swine brought from the port of Hamburg in the German Empire to the port of Hull may be transhipped in the River Humber or in any Dock in the port of Hull approved by the Privy Council from the vessel in which they are brought to another vessel for conveyance to the foreign animals wharf as defined by Order of Council dated the twenty-fifth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine, subject to the following conditions :

*First.* That the vessel (in this Order called the landing-vessel) into which the sheep, goats and swine are transhipped be specially fitted and appropriated for the purpose of conveying such sheep, goats and swine.

*Second.* That the owner, agent, or charterer of the landing-vessel has received the special permission of the Commissioners of Customs so to employ the landing-vessel under this Order.

3. Those sheep, goats and swine shall be transhipped in the presence and under the supervision and control of an Officer of Customs, who shall remain in charge of the sheep, goats and swine on board the landing-vessel until its arrival at the foreign animals wharf.

4. The landing-vessel shall proceed direct to that wharf, and the sheep, goats and swine shall be landed there in the presence and under the supervision and control of an Officer of Customs.

5. The landing-vessel shall not be used for any other purpose during the time of its being so appropriated, and shall, immediately after each occasion of use, be cleansed and disinfected in manner provided respecting vessels by Article 60 of The Animals Order.

6. Sheep, goats and swine so transhipped shall continue to be deemed foreign sheep, goats and swine.

7. If anything is done or omitted to be done in contravention of any of the provisions of this Order, the owner or consignee of the sheep, goats and swine, and the owner and the master of the landing-vessel, and the Dock Company at Kingston-upon-Hull, shall each be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1878.

3. All such letters, newspapers, printed papers, and pattern or sample packets as are hereinbefore referred to in Clause 2 shall be posted, forwarded, conveyed, and delivered under and subject to the several regulations, conditions, prohibitions, and restrictions applicable thereto, respectively contained in the Schedules Nos. 1 and 2, hereunder written, and in any other Treasury Warrant which may be for the time being in force relating to the countries and places specified in the Schedules Nos. 1 and 2 hereunder written.

4. This Warrant shall come into operation on the 1st day of March, 1880.

ORDER of the Local Government Board under the District Auditors Act, 1879: Assignment of Districts and Duties:—

Essex Audit District.

Port of Harwich, and Bardfield and Lexden and Winstree Highway Districts.

To George Henry Brett, of No. 7, West-villas, Colchester, in the county of Essex, Gentleman;

To the Port Sanitary Authority for the Port of Harwich;

To the Highway Board for each of the Highway Districts of Bardfield, and Lexden and Winstree;

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by Section 4 of "The District Auditors Act, 1879," it is enacted that the Local Government Board may from time to time assign to District Auditors their Duties, and the Districts in which such Auditors respectively are to act;

And whereas by an Order dated the 9th day of October, 1879, the Local Government Board certified the appointment of the said George Henry Brett as a District Auditor, and ordered and prescribed that the District in which he should in future act as Auditor, and which was thereby assigned to him, should, until the said Board otherwise prescribed, comprise the area for the time being included in the several Unions named in the Schedule to that Order, and that such District should be termed "The Essex Audit District;"

And whereas it is prescribed by Article 2 of the said Order that it shall be the duty of the said District Auditor to audit the Accounts of the Guardians and the Overseers specified in Nos. (1) and (2) of that Article, as well as the Accounts of the other Authorities (and of their Officers) referred to in Nos. (3) and (4) in the following terms:—

"(3.) The several other Authorities for the time being whose Accounts are or may be by law subject to be audited by a District Auditor, and whose Districts or the areas of whose jurisdiction are for the time being wholly situated within the said Audit District."

"(4.) Such of the said other Authorities whose Accounts are or may be by law subject to be so audited, and whose Districts or the areas of whose jurisdiction are for the time being partly situated within the said Audit District, as We may by Order under Seal hereafter prescribe."

And whereas the Port Sanitary Authority for the said Port of Harwich, and the Highway Board for each of the said Highway Districts of Bardfield, and Lexden and Winstree, are respectively Authorities whose Accounts are subject to be audited by a District Auditor, and the District of each of the said Authorities is partly situated within the said Audit District:

Now, therefore, We, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, hereby Order and Prescribe that it shall be the duty of the said George Henry Brett to audit the Accounts of the said Port Sanitary Authority, and of each of the said Highway Boards, and of their Officers, in conformity with the provisions contained in Article 3 of the above cited Order; and that for the purpose of such Audit the District of the said Port Sanitary Authority and of each of the said Highway Boards shall be deemed to be within the said Essex Audit District.
